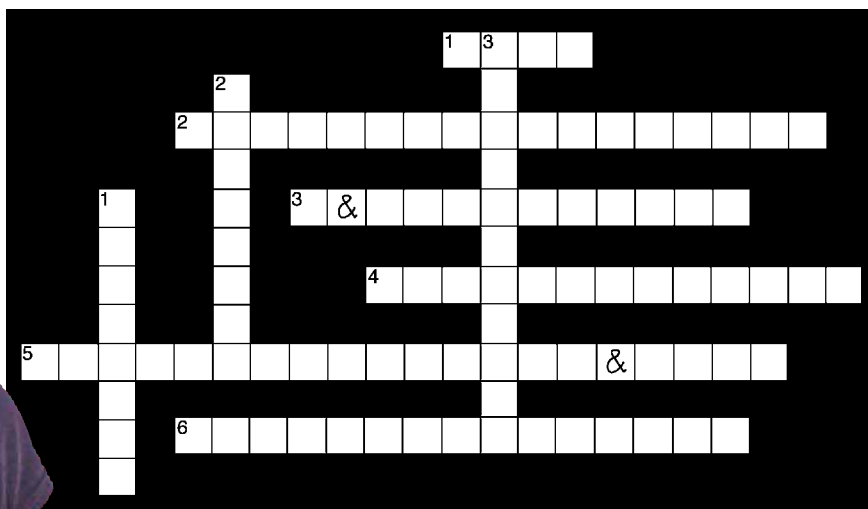

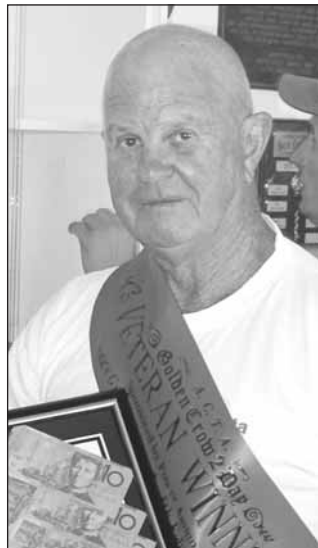

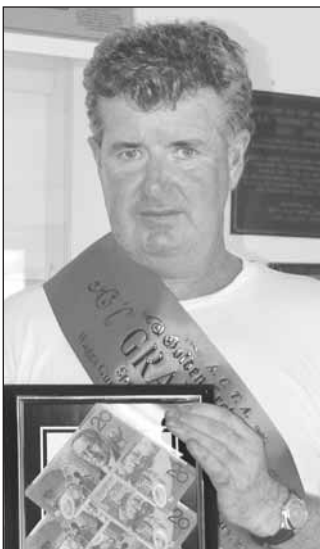

2006 Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix

Brisbane Gun Club, February, 2006

For the 12th year since its inception in 1995, The Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition was held on the last weekend of February at Brisbane Gun Club.

Originally conceived by a group of 'stalwarts' of the Olympic Disciplines from around South East Queensland, the annual Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" has lived up to its original intention of providing enthusiastic Olympic Discipline shooters the opportunity to compete along side visitors from interstate and overseas.

This year a total of nearly 80 competitors from Australia and Japan gathered for the three days to compete in the preliminary Australian 'Skins' competition and the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet.

Friday, the first day of competition, saw the local and interstate shooters get a head

start on their Japanese rivals who arrived mid way through the day when the 'Skins' event was almost completed. In typical fashion, the Japanese contingent of around 40 competitors, were straight off the bus and into the practice. Before long they were lined up for the re-introduction to warm weather and the Australian targets and the two spare Olympic Trap ranges were really running hot.

Meanwhile, the spoils were being shared around in the 'Skins' competition with the normal format of a combined AA and A

grade section and a combined B and C grade section being used. In the AA/A group, skins wins were recorded by Kevin Perkins (Illawarra), Daniel Allam (Cecil Park), Greg Newey (Warwick) and Alex Smith (Warwick). The B/C group also saw a good sharing of the prize money with Scott Dobeli (Brisbane), Mark Chounding (Brisbane), Tania Burke (Brisbane), Bob McNamara (Redcliffe), Peter Neubecker (Cairns) and David Menck (Brisbane) all receiving a few dollars to make the weekend more enjoyable.

The 100 target Badge match event held in conjunction with the 'Skins' competition also saw the spoils shared around.

A Grade 1st Frank Minici (Cecil Park), 2nd Greg Newey (Warwick), Daniel Allam (Cecil Park)

B Grade 1st Peter Neubecker (Cairns), 2nd David Menck (Brisbane), 3rd Tania Burke (Brisbane)

C Grade 1st Bob McNamara (Redcliffe), 2nd Warren Craig (Gold Coast).

Saturday morning and a few more weekend shooters arrived. In all, 11 squads of Olympic Trap shooters made up the field in the "Grand Prix" competition with shooters coming from as far away as Cairns, Sydney, Illawarra, Glen Innes and Newcastle. At the other end of the shooting range, a lesser field of 2 squads faced the starter in the ISSF Skeet event. The large contingent of Japanese shooters made up a big percentage of the field, which made it very enjoyable for all in attendance.

While the early squads got away to a good start, even though the normal early light conditions made it a little tricky to catch a few of the left hand targets, it soon became obvious that everyone in the field would have to take 'pot luck' with the rain showers. Brisbane had been subject to quite a few showery days during the week and it appeared that the weekend's conditions would not be much different.

After the first round of 25 targets, well known Cairns shooter Jar Smaniotto was ahead of the field with his 24/25; one target ahead of a group of Japanese

shooters - Tomoji Mochizuki, Masamichi Komatsu, Hiroshi Susuki, Kazuo Yagi, Hideo Sato and Sadao Namiki all on 23/25.

As the day continued, it appeared obvious to all that there were not going to be any world records established in this event. The light and abnormally showery weather was affecting everyone and the scores were indicating just that. By the end of the day only a handful of clean 25/25s were on the board including a very fine clean round by one of the Japanese ladies - Mikiko Susuki. Mikiko's husband, Hiroshi Susuki however, was the overall leader after 100 targets on 90/100, slightly ahead of Frank Minici of Cecil Park on 89/100 with last year's "Grand Prix" winner Kevin Perkins of Illawarra and Masamichi Komatsu of Japan one target further back on 88/100.

Day 2 of the "Grand Prix" and although the showers were not quite so evident, the humidity was up and the changing light was almost guaranteed to have an affect on everyone. The day's scores were up-and-down as expected with Frank Minici doing a 'Houdini trick' to follow his first round 19/25 with a good 25/25 to make it into the final. Masamichi Komatsu (135/150) held it together best to take the top spot in the final, followed by Minici (133), Hiroshi Susuki (131), Daniel Allam (129), Masami Kawai (129) and Jar Smaniotto (129).

The final was of course a single barrel affair with the 10 second 'delay' light being used on station one. Again it was evident that the

scores would fluctuate and they did with the lead changing a couple of times until Frank Minici finally got it together to take the lead and hang on with a target to spare.

The ISSF Skeet event was also hotly contested and although only two squads competed in the event, the competition was good and another hotly contested final was witnessed.

After the completion of the 150 targets, the final was made up of 3 shooters from Australia and 3 shooters from Japan - a real international affair. Top qualifier on 123/150 was Tony Kidman of Brisbane, the 2006 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Champion, followed one target back by Norio Komiya (122), Kenji Watanabe (119), James Hashmi (113), Mark Kempnich (111) and Osamu Yamaguchi (108).

Not to be out done by the Olympic Trap final, the Skeet final was also a good one with Norio Komiya (Japan) overtaking top qualifier Tony Kidman to take the honours and the championship spoils for the 2006 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix".

Psychological Skills for Shooting

LIES WE LIVE BY

Last month's article explored the seven lies we live by and that get in the road of our achieving our maximum potential. This month I intend to look further into Stephanie Burns' book, "Great Lies We Live By" to explore the 11 essential lessons that we need to learn so that we can dispel the lies that get in our way.

Lesson Number 1: You always were OK. As adults the problem most people have is that they do not have the brainpower or the skill to learn or do a task. It is this belief that we are incompetent, or incapable, that limits our ability to begin new projects or start new learning. Most of us remember the failures and the embarrassment that occurred while we were at school. Therefore we limit the discomfort by avoiding the opportunity to learn.

Lesson Number 2: Choosing the right path. There has been considerable debate in recent years about the teaching of reading. Two basic camps have been established. The first camp is the Bottom-up theory and the second is the Top-down theory. The Bottom-up theory says that you need to start at the bottom and learn the pre-requisite and requisite skills necessary and then practise. The Top-down theory says that you only need to watch and listen to good readers and you will learn from what you see and hear. These theories have big implications for coaching. I'm sure some people can watch good shots and then perform well but these people probably have the pre-requisite skills; good vision, good hand-eye coordination, good muscles strength and flexibility and so on. Some of us however have to learn these skills first and continue to learn more as we go.

Lesson Number 3: What you think is what you get - Positive thoughts get positive results. I have written several articles about self-talk and self-doubt. The only difference between the shooter who hits all the targets and the shooter who doesn't is that self-doubt interfered with the shooter who missed. Self-talk is related to our expectations, judgements, fears and beliefs about our ability and ourselves. Positive comments and thoughts won't guarantee that you'll win but negative self-talk will guarantee that you won't win. I am amazed at the number of shooters who speak very poorly of themselves, as they are about to shoot. I often ask them "How would you feel if I said those things about you?" They usually reply, I'd be angry or upset". If that's the case, then don't say those things about yourself either.

Lesson Number 4: Beliefs are a choice. Beliefs are not real, they are abstract; you can't pick them up, touch them or look at one. Beliefs do dictate how we approach life, learning, shooting, etc. Most people won't do things they think are dangerous or morally wrong; beliefs are the filter that stops you attempting something new or even taking a risk. If your beliefs are rational then all is well but if your beliefs are irrational then your behaviour will be skewed to accommodate your already distorted thinking.

Lesson Number 5: Learning the finer levels of distinction. Coaching is about adding distinctions to someone's existing skill base. Stephanie Burns believes, for the student, learning is about recognising that to improve is a matter of learning finer levels of distinction.

Lesson Number 6: How to eat an elephant. Often as learners the complexity or the enormity of the task daunts us. Break it up into smaller chunks. How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time! Big tasks need to be broken up into little ones: 100 target events are a lot easier to shoot if it is seen as 100 x 1 target events, rather than 1 x 100 target event. It is easier to maintain concentration and focus for 1 target and do it 100 times than it is to maintain your focus and concentrate for a full 100 targets.

Lesson number 7: Feelings are not facts. As humans we don't like feeling anxious. We like our comfort zone, we like the reassurance that we are competent and confident and as a result we often avoid those new and exciting situations that will help us learn, grow or develop. Sometimes what we already know gets in the way of new learning. So too, do the feelings that we may have experienced last time we tried to learn something new. Learning is about taking risks; "If you always do what you always did, then you'll always get what you always got!"

Lesson number 8: If you can't remember it, you didn't learn it. The problem here is that we are confusing not remembering with not being able to recall it. I usually drive with my lights on in the fog, but sometimes when you get to work you forget that you turned the lights on and the battery goes dead during the day. Now however, when I turn my lights on in the fog I also lock the driver's side door. This means that when I get to work and I can't open the door, I remember that the lights must be on. This aid to remembering is called pair association; as it helps me to recall that I have left the lights on. There are lots of tricks to help us remember things, and there's nothing wrong with using them.

Lesson number 9: The art of taking notes. We take notes as a mechanism for remembering or reviewing what we have learnt. We learn two types of things: skills (or things you do with your body) and knowledge (information, concepts, facts and ideas). If you are going to write down information then make sure it is written in a way that isn't boring and all the same: vary the style, the colour, use symbols or pictures.

Lesson number 10: The importance of words. In this lesson, Stephanie Burns argues the importance of us having a good vocabulary because it provides us with a greater understanding of the things we read or hear. Often in my practise I come across children who have learning and reading difficulties. It sometimes becomes apparent that these children come from BIG country. By this I mean that where they grew up everything was big: a big tree, a big tractor, a big truck, a big header, etc. Nothing is ever gigantic, enormous, massive, huge, etc. Growing up in big country limits our ability to take risks because we do not fully comprehend the words being used to teach us.

Lesson number 11: Being great is a choice. In Stephanie's last lesson she claims that great people are made not born. Great people have goals and the drive to achieve them and at the same time are not discouraged by failures but see them as important aspects in the learning process. Edison had 10,000 goes at making the light bulb before he had a success. When asked why did he keep going he said, "I know 9,999 ways of how not to make a light bulb."

This book is primarily about being an adult learner and avoiding those traps that prevent us from learning. Our existence is a life-long journey of learning and growing. Don't get stuck in a rut and avoid the choice of being something or someone different.

It's Your Call

Doubtless you will all be aware that "Deauville Doubles" is quite a sudden death event as far as normal trap shooting rules are concerned. Acceptance and non-acceptance of targets coupled with no allowable malfunctions can be quite confusing. So let us look at a typical scenario.

You as the referee have correctly placed your two teams on their appropriate lanes and tracks. You have established whom each team has nominated as the caller and you have informed the shooters about malfunctions for the event.

Two legal targets are released without any call being made. The non-caller shoots and breaks a target with his first barrel. He then fires at the next target and has a malfunction. His now bemused and frustrated mate who is the elected caller has not fired at all and turns to you for a decision.

IT'S YOUR CALL.

Those of you who said "No Target" are quite correct.

Under Rule 1.17 it clearly states that there are no allowable malfunctions of either cartridges or gun. Moreover, you have a firm belief that once a whole target is accepted you must abide by the result. Hence you could feel quite comfortable with your call of "Lost Target".

However, if you look further at Rule 1.17 you will find that the designated caller is the only person who can accept the targets. In this case he has not called, nor has he fired at either target. So notwithstanding the malfunction and acceptance by the non-caller, the targets are to be treated as No Target and are restored.

Here again we must exercise caution though. Even if there was no call and the Caller fires at the targets they are deemed to have been accepted and the shooters must abide by the result.

You may notice that we do not class the targets as a pair and the correct call for breaking both targets is "One". Naturally, if one or both of the targets are missed then the call is "LOST".

If you have any questions regarding rules or situations where you were unsure please write to the ACTA. I look forward to hearing from you.

I am grateful to the assistance of our Rules Chairman and his committee for their ongoing advice and encouragement with this project.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
 - (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".
- The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

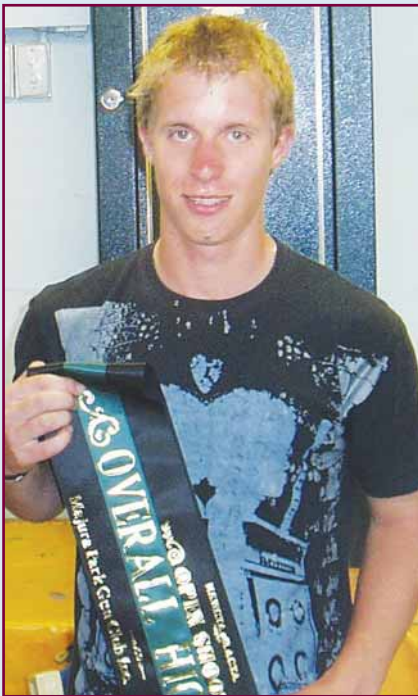


President Pat Hallam presents Heinz Klink with a new Miroku shotgun for winning the Handicap event

Dear Your Say

Having been a member of the ACTA for many years, I find I am a little weary of all the rule changes back and forth, seemingly to suit a small minority of members who are getting too old to cut the mustard or want the rules the same as overseas for the next trip.

The rule that really affects the smaller clubs financially is rule 4.04(a) and (b) that has reduced the flight distance from 50m to 46m and the angle from 45 degrees to 22 degrees. Mostly the same group of commentators started whingeing that they couldn't achieve break badge status, so the angles and distance were changed. They still couldn't achieve much so softer targets were found.

Now we have long shoot offs as common practice at most clubs and guess who pays for the targets, and stands around wasting time like stunned mullets while the hot shots play.

I feel that a return to 50m and 45 degrees will put some meaning back into break badges and cut costs for clubs and therefore members supplying shoot off targets.

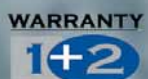
