7th World DTL Championships

The Australian Clay Target Association was proud to host the seventh World Down the Line Championships at the National Shooting ground in Wagga Wagga NSW April 7, 8 and 9.



World DTL Champion John Stafford

A field of 620 competitors from around Australia and the world vied for this prestigious event.

An international dinner, proudly sponsored by Casella Wines, was held on the 7th April to welcome all overseas and Australian teams. This was the official opening ceremony for the Championships.

National President, Mr. Bill Jones, welcomed some 250 guests to the dinner especially our overseas visitors from England, Ireland, Wales, Northern Ireland, South Africa and New Zealand. Mayor of the City of Wagga Wagga, Mr. Kerry Pascoe, also welcomed everyone to the City of "Good Sports". Team managers from representing countries were presented with commemorative plaques

Mr. David Coleman, NSW National Executive member, was then introduced to

auction three bottles, numbered one, 100 and seven, of a commemorative port with monies raised going to the local Ronald McDonald House charity. Some \$970 was raised which will assist with the running of this worthy charity.

The World DTL championships consists of a 250 target qualifying round, followed by a 50 target final for the top 10% of competitors in each section. The event is scored as a Points Score event and is shot five per lane (Mackintosh style). The team event is shot in conjunction with the first 200 targets of competition. There are sections for Overall, AA, A, B and C grades as well as Ladies, Juniors and Veteran sections.

Shooting for the event commenced at 8am sharp, with squads of five shooting five per lane. After the first 100 targets John Stafford from England was the only shooter with a perfect 300 points.

In the next 100 targets Michael Charlton was the only competitor to attain a perfect 300 points. Close behind was Max Medhurt, Jim Doherty (Ireland), Luke Higgins and Kriston Chadwick (New Zealand) all on 299 points. However, with two steady rounds

of 298 points, joint leaders after day two were Ross Liersch and Robert Hall on 596 points.

With 50 targets to go, and the weather taking a turn for the better, the competition was fierce to make the final with only the top 10% going through. Twenty-five shooters shot the 50 targets and gained maximum points of 150, leaving Ross Liersch in the lead on 745 points. Only one point behind was David Perri, John Stafford (England) and Robert Hall.

The final 50 targets were shot and six of the eighty-four shooters recorded the maximum points leaving Craig Fitzgerald (Australia) and John Stafford (England) tied on 893 points.

Both shooters now went to the tracks for a shoot out to determine the winner. At the world championships this is done in full round of 25 targets and after the first round both shooters were still tied. Another round of 25 targets and both shooters were still tied. Now it gets a little

The first ACTA Junior Development camp was held April 2006 at the National Ground. Twenty-two juniors have registered for the full year.

Speaking with some English juniors at the World Championship dinner, they do not have any Junior Development of any description and are envious of our camp procedure, this is despite having 25,000 registered shooters.

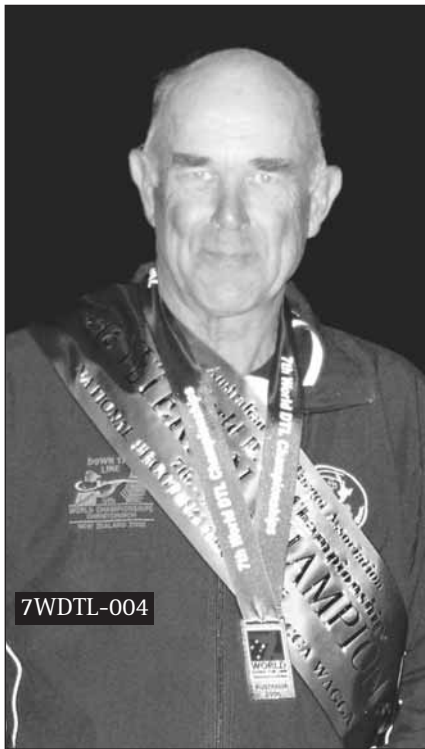

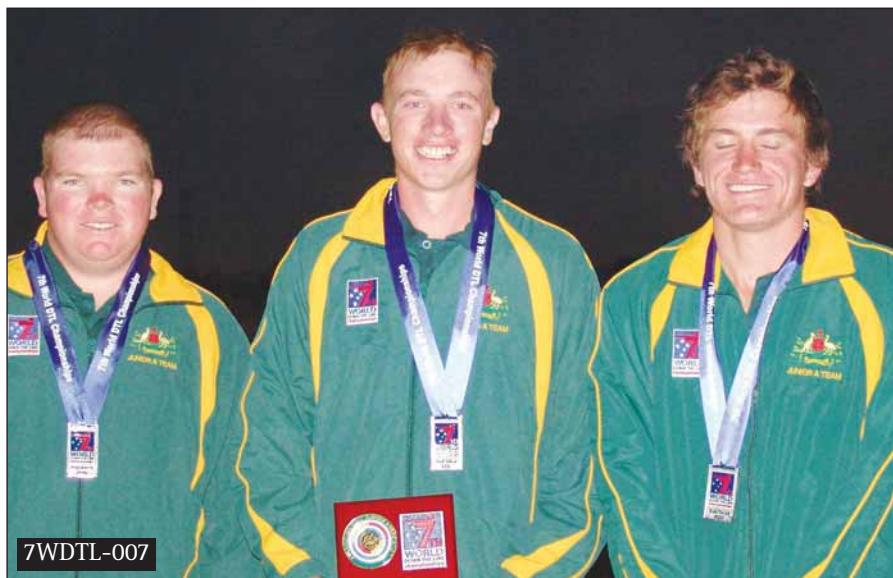

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 2006 were conducted at the ACTA National Shooting ground in Wagga Wagga NSW with the championships running from Friday March 31 to Thursday April 6. With the region still in the grips of drought the grounds were looking a little worse for wear. Much work had been carried out on the grounds in preparation for the Nationals and World DTL Championships.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, all state and territory teams competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

New South Wales successfully won the Open team event, being represented by Tony O'Leary, Arty Del-Ben, Tony Barton, Arthur Turner and Robert Thompson with a score of 125/373. One target behind in second place was the team from Victoria with a score of 124/368. Third place went to the team from Western Australia on a score of 124/361. Fourth place went to Tasmania 123/368, fifth place went to South Australia 123/363, sixth place went to Queensland 121/355 and seventh place went to Northern Territory 116/344.

Kerry then attempted to get the event under way proper by firing the first shot. On the second attempt he managed to break the target which was received with a roar of delight from the crowd.

66th National Champion of Champions

The first event for the 2006 Nationals attracted five hundred and thirty eight competitors and at the end of qualifying four shooters had shot the score of 124/125. (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

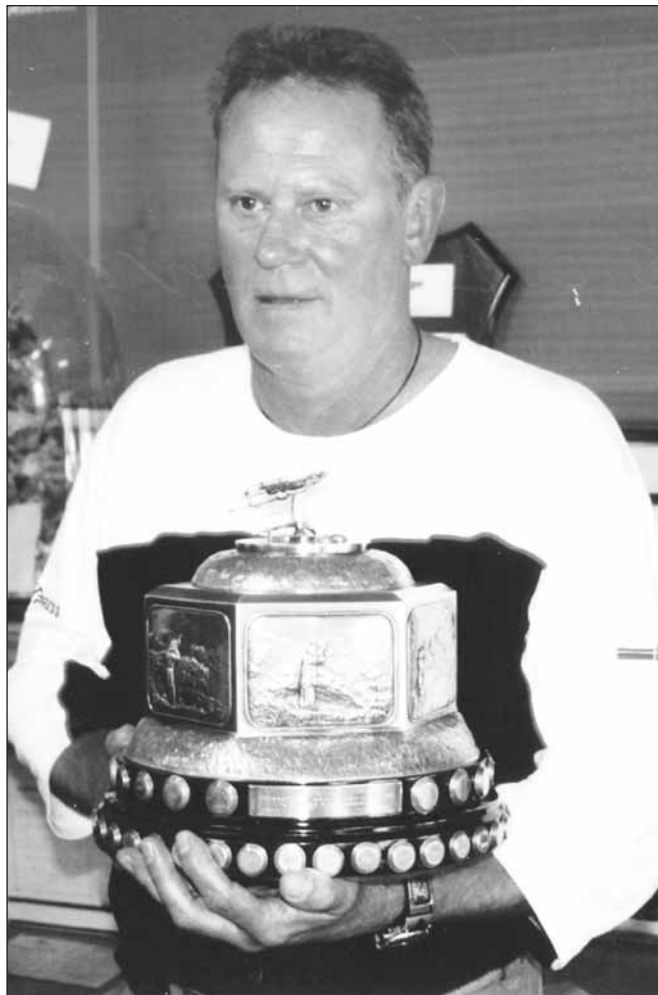

"THE YORKSHIRE TROPHY"

The Tradition Continues

The Yorkshire Trophy, the most prestigious of the four novelty sporting events held each year by The NSW Gun Club, was held on Saturday, 26th Nov 2005.

The Yorkshire Trophy is an open event and has an international pedigree. All shooters are encouraged to compete however to be eligible competitors must have taken part in at least 2 of the 3 previous novelty sporting events conducted by The NSW Gun Club during the year leading up to the Trophy. The only exceptions to this rule are previous winners of the Trophy.

The morning of the 26th began with drizzle but fortunately quickly cleared to become a perfect day affording in excess of 60 qualifiers every chance of shooting well. Before long it was obvious that a real contest was under way and that the committee had set both a fair and interesting course. The overall winner being Steve Newcombe from Andrew Garvie by the closest possible margin.

Our congratulations go not only to Steve our winner, but also to all the competitors that made the event such a resounding success.

The Yorkshire Trophy, itself a magnificent example of the British Silversmiths' craftsmanship, has a wonderful pedigree and a history worth preserving.

The Trophy was originally commissioned by a Mr Fred Birkby and presented to the Harrogate Gun Club, Yorkshire, England in 1937 for a competition shoot as a preliminary to the opening of the English game shooting season each year.

The Harrogate Gun Club was sadly disbanded in the 1970's and the magnificent trophy was returned to Mr. Birkby's widow (now Mrs KM Marshall). As luck would have it Mrs-Marshall was the aunt of Bob Ellison (an enthusiastic shooter and member of the NSW Gun Club). Mrs Marshall, knowing of her nephew's keen interest in the sport, gave Bob the trophy to use as he saw fit.

The Trophy, which contains some 2.4Kg of sterling silver and is valued at \$25, 000, has been refurbished by Mr. Ellison. The six events for which the trophy was to originally contest are depicted in bas-relief on the outer panels making The Yorkvhire Trophy an absolute work of art.

Not only has Bob Ellison presented The Yorkshire Trophy to The NSW Gun Club but-he continues to sponsor the annual event for which the Club is extremely grateful. The event was first contested in Australia in 1984 and the name of the winner each year is engraved on the Trophy. The winning shooter is presented with a boxed silver replica.

THE YORKSHIRE TROPHY is an event worth contesting.

The 2006 event is to be held on Saturday 25th November.

Then without another word he jumped into his car and drove off, needless, to say, I just stood there with my mouth open as wide as the Grand Canyon.

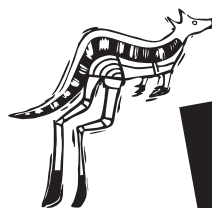

Psychological Skills for Shooting

2006 NATIONALS

I, like many, attended the 2006 Nationals and the 7th World DTL championship. From my point of view as a shooter, I had mixed fortune. I shot personal best scores in two of the National events and shot the rest of the carnival either adequately or dismally. Whilst I was disappointed at the time, I have come to realise what a great time I had regardless of my score.

Talking about the experience, with some friends (who appeared genuinely interested), I thought about issues that often develop for athletes or HSC/VCE students when their results (especially their UAI; University Admission Index) are lower than they expected. Part of the preparation for any event, be it sport or an exam, is the anticipation. By this I mean the nervous tension of what might be expected. This tension however leads to anxiety and will be a factor that produces self-doubt about our ability. This doubt will affect our confidence and as a result we will tense up and therefore will not be fluid in our movements; for the shooter, he will miss, for the student he will have a mental blank. Because of the importance of the competition, we try harder, which leads to greater anxiety and more and more self-doubt.

Regardless of the preparation, training and study you put into a task, you sometimes do not achieve your expected outcome. For athletes or students who are in this position, they need to realise the following points:

Firstly, you are not your score. Whether it is a UAI or your score at the World Championships or the National Double Barrel. The score only represents how you did on that day and on that task. The day before or the day after may yield a significantly different score. Regardless of the number of targets we hit or miss, we are much more than the score and are often more successful in our other pursuits: partner, father, husband, employer or employee, friend, neighbour, etc.

Secondly, the score only means something on the day of the competition and means very little else the next day, next week or next year. The same goes for the UAI, the number is only necessary to determine who is eligible for particular courses. Even if we won a National Championship, our colleagues at work would be suitably impressed for ten minutes or so, and then would get on with their work or their lives.

Finally, you can still win the world championship or get the highest UAI and fail at life. Being the best shot on one particular day won't make everything else in your life successful. The process behind competing and having a go will help you in other areas of your life but the product may not. I love my shooting and want to do it well, but I want the other parts of my life to be successful also: my work, my relationships, my family, etc. Armed with these thoughts, I was able to rationalise (to myself) my disappointing performance, and help others deal with their disappointment as well.

I often talk to shooters about the difference between the process of competing and the product. If we focus on the process (how we shoot) then the product (our score) should look after itself. The biggest problem we all have is that we are human, and our thoughts, beliefs, judgements, prejudices, fears, etc get in our way and help develop more self-doubt.

So, regardless of my performance, what made the carnival a success for me? Meeting people from other countries: New Zealand, Republic of South Africa, Wales, England, Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Botswana, Fiji, and the United States gave these Nationals an atmosphere that was welcoming and friendly. All of the international visitors I spoke to, only had positive things to say about the grounds,

facilities, targets, the organisation and running of the event, and the warm welcome they had received. From a psychological point of view this was not a surprise because we all belong to a similar reference group being trap shooters. Having a sense of belonging, is a basic human need, and is necessary if we wish to remain healthy and well adjusted. Another important human need is to have fun, and the Nationals provide a venue for fun in other ways than just shooting; meeting old friends, making new ones, looking at the new products, maybe even a new gun. How you meet your needs (achievement, belonging, freedom, fun) is up to you.



At the Perth Nationals, Jim Shepherd, Bryan Rafferty and I shared a bottle of Scotch Whisky and it was decided (without any objection) that this would become a tradition! So after points score championship had completed it was time to sit and relax with a bottle of Bowmore single malt. Joining our group was Allan Kenny from Tasmania and Bernie Scanlon from Victoria.

So what else made the National's successful? I enjoyed the opportunity to meet with and talk to many of the readers of these articles. The positive comments and the interest shown in psychology is very much appreciated. The Corsivia targets were thrown well and for those that stayed for the double barrel shoot off or the Beretta Grand Championship they looked spectacular under lights. The additional promotional competitions set up by Perazzi and Beretta gave shooters the opportunity to be involved in additional competitions. For me, the only disappointment at the 2006 Nationals was the low number of B and C grade shooters. The Nationals are not just for the AA grade shooters, and if you want to improve your shooting then going to these big, high pressure events will help you achieve this. I have said before that coming to these events helps your performance at your regular monthly shoot because you are able to deal with pressure better.

Regardless of my performance this year, there are positive things I can take away from the nationals because it's about more than just shooting. I am now getting ready to attend next years Nationals and maybe even the World Championships in Ireland in 2008.

The shooting venue consisted of two trap and skeet ranges superimposed and a separate third skeet only range. All the equipment was new Mattarelli machinery, but the biggest problem was always going to be the lack of a third trap layout to provide training opportunities.

Between March the 10th and 15th a series of non medal badge matches were held to give competitors and officials the opportunity to test the range and equipment before the main medal events commenced.

The Games opening ceremony was a spectacular affair culminating

in a fireworks display second to none but more importantly the passing of this event brought us to the reason we were there to compete.

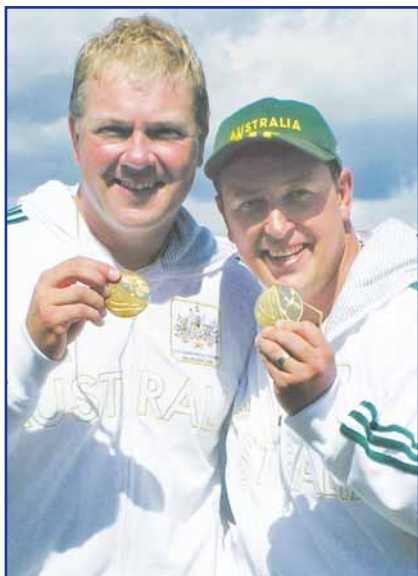

One of the most important rules in Clay Target Shooting is the Refusal Rule GRTS17. However, it seems that there is a lot of misunderstanding, and (regrettably) instances of misuse or "overuse" by some shooters,

The intention of the rule is to put the onus of acceptance of a target squarely on the shoulders of the shooter. It eliminates shooters direct claims to the referee of fast or slow released targets and enables the shooter to judge for himself a target is acceptable as regards to "legality" and "release time". It is not there to cater for personal taste of shooters as to target "flight preference" or to cover up "freezing or other shooter indiscretions".

Lets look at the simplest and most frequent situation.

You are the referee and a shooter calls for a target which he subsequently refuses to shoot at. What is your call?

Well the answer is not as simple as No Target, nor is it as simple as Lost Target It can be quite a dilemma.

As the referee on the spot it is up to your discretion entirely as to whether you give the shooter a "No Target" even on the first refusal. You are entitled to ask the shooter why the target was refused if you had any doubts as to whether it was legal. He may well have a justifiable excuse. You must make a judgement there and then and proceed with the event.

We are all aware that GRTS 17 states that there is no limitation as to the number of targets that can be refused, provided that the referee agrees. Realistically though experience teaches that there are not many occasions where more than one refusal by a shooter in an event may be justifiable, For instance, where illegal target flight is evident you as the referee are required to have the trap adjusted immediately. Secondly, whether button or audio release is concerned you are still the sole judge of any time release incidents whether too fast or too slow.

Now, if you receive, say for instance, 2 refusals for targets which you judge to be legal, or there is some other reason the shooter does not fire, you have the absolute right to rule lost target. However, GRTS17 tells us to seek assistance from officials, scorers or other persons where you have doubts, To that end you should not be afraid to seek assistance.

The Refusal Rule is very clear in its instructions regarding target refusal. Used properly and honestly it is one of our most important and effective rules. It is a rule for "Sportsmen" and should be used in a "sporting manner". Don't be afraid to administer the rule correctly as there are others in you club who are aware of the "professional" users of the rule. Fortunately, these shooters are in the extreme minority so we must show equity and balance to our interpretations of the instructions so that our majority of shooters are not prejudiced by the indiscretions of a few.

It is clearly a matter which has to be judged on its merits at the time so that there is a sensible, logical and equitable outcome for both the shooter in particular and his contemporaries in general.

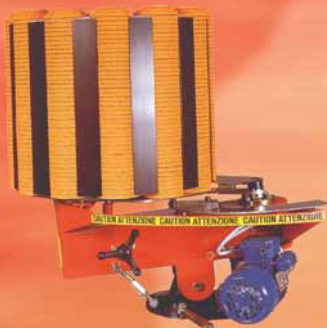
