The Australian Olympic Youth Festival is held every two years and comprises some 17 Olympic Sports with the age restriction being under 19 years as at Jan 2007.

The team assembled at the Sydney International Shooting Centre having flown or driven to Sydney on the 16th. Firearms were checked in to the range armoury and the team transported to the tournament village, the Southern Cross College in Chester Hills.

The village was shared between the cycling competitors and the shooters with the accommodation typical college configuration with rooms twin share and common bathrooms – separated into men and women of course.

After a very quick check in we were whisked away to a compulsory drug seminar and dinner which completed a very hectic first day.

Temperatures over the tournament were consistently in the high 30's and with no air-conditioning a quick trip to the local shops to buy desk fans was a priority on day two. This was a training day and all three disciplines took advantage although having just completed the ISSF Nationals a few days before most just need a couple of rounds to get the feel of the range.

Day two was also opening ceremony night. This was a gala affair that took place at the

Sydney Entertainment Centre, Darling Harbour. Some 8000 people packed the venue and witnessed some very spectacular entertainment but the highlight of the night for the team was seeing Nick Kirley receive the honour of reading the athletes oath with pint sized diver Melissa Wu. To be chosen from the whole Aussie team was indeed a huge honour for Nick and shooting.

1. Nick Kirley AUS 47 41 36 = 124 + 34 = 158
2. Myles Browne -Cole NZL 34 38 39 = 111 + 33 = 144
3. Rodney Mitchell AUS 35 37 37 = 109 + 32 = 141

Nick started off at a blistering pace with a 47, then held on to win very convincingly in the end. Rodney shot consistently in his first major competition to take out the bronze.

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2006

I bring to you the Annual Report for 2006 my fourth year as President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

National Championships were held in all disciplines with the standard of shooting continuing to improve. The Olympic Discipline Nationals were held at Cecil Park Gun Club and my thanks once again to the club for their support of this event. The Sporting Clays Nationals, Skeet Nationals and the Trap Nationals were held at our own National ground with the Trap Nationals attracting in excess of 700 competitors.

This year Australia was the host country for the 7th World DTL Championships. Planning for this event started in early 2004 and a considerable amount of blood, sweat and tears went into what you would call a resounding success for our association. Many favorable comments were received from our International visitors in respect to our National Ground and the competition in general. Full support from the Wagga Wagga City Council and the Wagga community in large has placed us in high esteem at International level. It would be remiss of me not to mention our major sponsors for without their support this event may not have been the success that it was.

Last year I mentioned in my report that we had overspent on the National Ground development in preparation for the major International event, but expected to recoup this expenditure. I have pleasure in reporting that this has been achieved and is reflected in the financial report.

The National ground continues to be



transformed into a world class facility. Nine skeet layouts have now been completed and were used at the Skeet Nationals in November. Positive feedback was received from most competitors during that carnival.

Continued planning of the National ground has seen a comprehensive submission for financial assistance being lodged with NSW Sport and Recreation for the construction of a safety fence, walkways and seating for the entire shooting ground. My thanks to National Executive member Mr. John Mack for his work on this submission. I expect to announce the outcome of this submission at our AGM in March.

In the mean time I urge you all to support your National ground and in doing so ensure the continued development of our sport.

This year we had a staff change with Mandy Manglesdorf moving on after four years with the association. Mandy has been replaced by Sue Vesperman. Sue is the first point of call for the association and will assist you with your inquiries. The National office continues to be the backbone of our Association and I would like to, on your behalf, wish Andy and his staff thanks for another outstanding year.

During the year National Executive member representing South Australia Mr. John Holder was forced to resign due to ongoing family medical problems. John on behalf of all members thank you for your contribution and we wish you and your family well for the future. Mr. Allan Vilcins has been appointed as John's replacement, we welcome Allan aboard. Mr. Mark Bulluss representing the Northern Territory did not seek

re-election due to his ever expanding business empire and has been replaced by Mr. Vincent Mollica, welcome Vince.

Progress has been achieved between ourselves and the Australian International Shooting Limited. A number of meetings have taken place in an effort to create a more open and transparent relationship between both parties. Some achievement has been made in this area, however more needs to be done.

2006 membership of the association increased by 3% and this steady increase is very pleasing. Junior registrations is now approaching 1000 and this is a great effort. With an aging shooting population juniors form the lifeline of our association and without them we are a lost cause. I urge all clubs to support Juniors and actively seek new members. To quote a great man "Ask not what my association is doing for me - Ask what can I do for my association".

Once again our hall of Fame continues to grow. Inductees in 2006 were Jim Ellis, Alf James and Ken Lowery. George Biggs and Horrie Donley were also posthumously inducted. The Hall of Fame induction evening recognises the achievements of our registered shooters and I would urge members that have not previously attended one of these functions to come along and share in the memories of some of the outstanding competitors from within our sport. I congratulate all members of the Hall of Fame on their achievements.

The Junior Development Squad continues to produce talented shooters with many going on to represent Australia at a higher level. In fact the current World DTL Junior Champion is a graduate of this squad. Applications are called in October of each year and I encourage all Juniors to apply. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Russell Mark for his efforts in coaching at these camps. Russell manages to fit these camps into his busy schedule and gives his time freely. Many other people are involved with the camps and I thank you for your continued assistance.

I thank you all for your support during 2006 and I look forward to your continued effort in 2007.

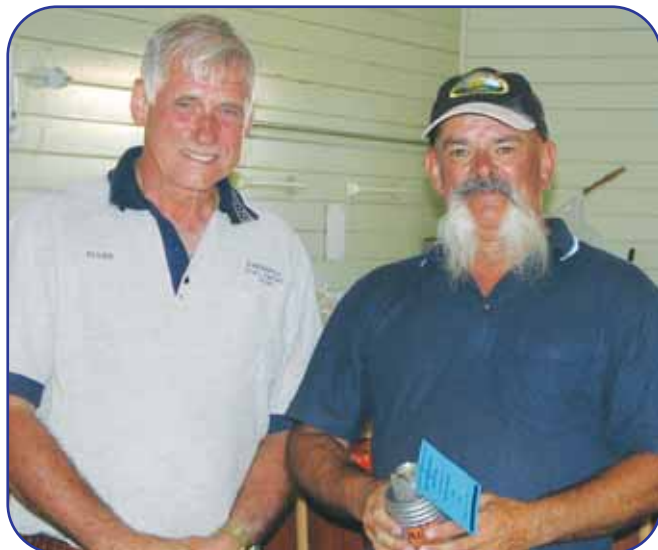

The shooters called it a day and retired to the club house for some fluid replacement therapy. A Calcutta was drawn with some spirited bidding during the auction phase. The complimentary meal was laid on for the shooters. Blade roast done in camp ovens was presented. Now I must admit I always shudder when given plastic knives and forks to eat roast – as it turned out, you could throw the knife out as the meat was so tender, none was required. A big thanks to Col for overseeing the camp ovens and the women in the kitchen for turning out such a great meal. Many of the shooters decided their fluid levels were not quite correct so continued to top up. A local musician was employed to entertain and had everyone in a very festive mood. All I can say is that I'm glad some of these people can shoot straight as they are bloody terrible singers at 12.30 am.

Sunday started with a very overcast sky which was just as well for one of the previous nights revellers who was out on the lawn in front of the club house on his hands and knees ridding the body of some of the toxins taken in the previous 12 hours. Now I don't claim to be an entomologist, but I still don't believe you were studying ants.

The first event of the day was shot amidst some light rain which cleared quickly but a fairly gusty wind remained for the day. This was the 25 Target Double Barrel Championship. Of the ninety-seven shooters present on Sunday, twenty shot clear rounds. This was quite an achievement considering changing light conditions, rain and wind which this event was shot in. Mick Rankin won C Grade with 29/32 with Frank Thomas taking out B Grade with 30/31. Greg Mathews dropped out of the shoot off on the 76th target to take out A Grade. Next was the 25 Target Points Score Championship. Four shot the possible 75 points with Darryl Stevens once again winning the Overall with 105/105. Neil Berry took out AA with 104/105 and Bill Wiedon won A grade with 78/81. B Grade was won by Trevor Cecil with 72/75 and Dwayne Ellem won C Grade with 71/75.

30 Target Double Rise was our final event. Numerous shooters were in the running for their various High Gun awards so there was plenty of pressure on. Michael Swale took AA with 45/50 after going down to James McIntyre in a shoot off which allowed James to take out the overall with a credible 48/50. Malcolm Rankin showed he still has what it takes with 36/40 to account for A Grade. Max Behm shot 24/30 winning B Grade and Mick Rankin (Malcolm believes it is all in the genes) won C Grade with 25/30.

High Guns went as follows – Overall James McIntyre 253/260, AA Darryl Stevens 251/260, A Mark Kapernick 240/260, B Frank Thomas 232/260, C Mick Rankin 228/260, Ladies Beth Zillman 236/260, Veterans Neil Berry 245/260, Juniors Robert Kelly 223/260

It ended up being a great weekend with some excellent scores shot. The weather was relatively kind to us, the camaraderie was great and the beer was cold and plentiful. The final word of thanks though must go to our great sponsors, because without their financial assistance, this event would not be possible in its current form.

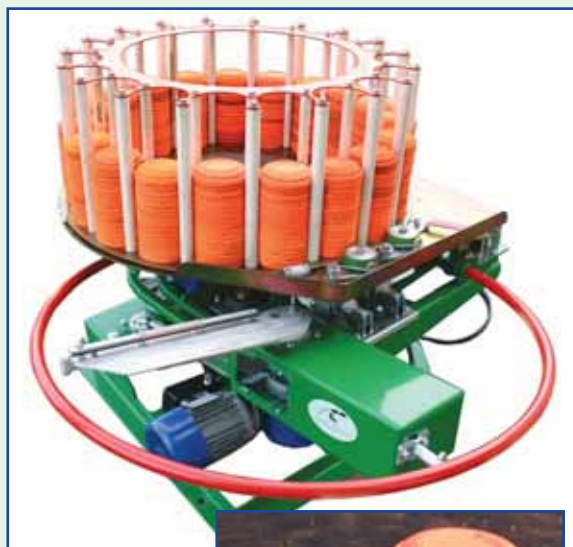

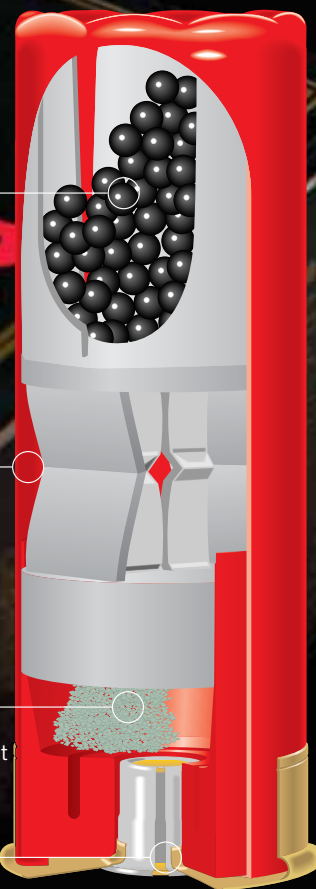

Psychological Skills for Shooting

EMOTIONAL CONTROL

To be a consistent performer, athletes need to be able to maintain emotional control throughout each match, remain focused and not let anger or frustration cost them the game or the match. For individual sports such as shooting or golf the cost of losing emotional control may mean losing the match or being unable to make the cut for the final. In team sports such as football, netball, hockey, etc the cost may be the same but the consequences of one player losing it, may mean that the whole team loses.

What do I mean by emotional control? Patrick Cohn from Peak Sports Network in the United States defines Emotional control as; when you stay even-tempered, level headed, or poised even when you are challenged by mishaps or adversity. For most of us, it is being able to cope with the things that go wrong when we are competing and our ability to bounce back. How many times have you seen a shooter miss a target only to go on and miss another and maybe even another?

Emotional control is an interesting construct because when we are competing well we go into a type of cocoon or "the zone" where even our own thoughts have difficulty penetrating. Whilst in the zone we focus on the present and enjoy the process of competing; we ignore judgements about past performances and avoid thinking about the future or the product.

According to Cohn, many talented athletes who do not know how to control their negative emotions fail to reach their potential because they get hot-headed, angry, or just crawl into their negative mental shell. These athletes are usually perfectionists in their outlook and are prone to emotional outbursts and making negative judgements about themselves as well as their performance.

Your ability to bounce back, resilience, is an important skill for any athlete, especially the shooter who wants to get into a state team or the McIntosh team. The ability to remain composed after missing a target or a point and focusing on the process so that no other targets are missed is vital for team selection. To lose 'it' (emotional control) will only mean that you are likely to miss more and more targets.

Cohn believes that to maintain emotional control, you must do two

tasks. Firstly you must have an accepting mindset before competing. This means having a positive pre-game mindset. By this Cohn means you need to identify the strict expectations that will cause you to become upset when you do not achieve to your own expectations. Some expectations that can lead to feelings of frustration, according to Cohn, include:

*I must play perfectly to be successful today.

*I expect to perform perfectly today and if I don't, I am failing.

*I cannot make any mistakes if I want to win.

*To play my best, I must have an error-free performance.

If you carry these expectations into competition, you set yourself up for feeling like you are failing, but in reality, you leave yourself no room for success. These expectations are irrational beliefs about yourself and the world you are competing in.

Secondly, you must arm yourself with mental strategies to cope with errors or mishaps. You must develop strategies that help you let go of the emotions before the situation gets worse. Visualisation strategies, such as the Black Box technique or breathing strategies that allow you to centre yourself are some techniques that will help.

One of the most important strategies is to practice emotional control next time you are in a local competition. This strategy should form part of your goal setting for the future. At your local club you should be setting goals to shoot this target; the one that will be released as you address the trap. If you miss your goal should then change to maintaining emotional control and focusing on hitting the remaining targets (one at a time). If you practice this skill at your local club level then it will become easier at zone, state or national championship level.

The place to practice maintaining emotional control is at shoots and the bigger and more important the shoot the better.

The Nationals provides an ideal vehicle for practicing emotional control. It must be remembered that everyone at the Nationals is striving to win a national title or be placed in a grade. To win you need to maintain emotional control, therefore if you go to the National or the state carnivals with the goal in mind that you will improve your emotional control then you might just maintain what you need to do and come out a winner. And even if you don't win, what you gain from practicing emotional control skills will make you closer next time and will make you a better competitor at your next club shoot.

It's Your Call

As Referees we are almost certain to come across a situation where there is difficulty in deciding whether a target is hit or missed. It is probably more related to what is dust and what isn't and the interpretation some shooters have of what constitutes a broken target and what doesn't.

As the Referee in a squad you have observed a target that has had a significant amount of dust come from it after being shot at. You rule "Lost Target" (Rule 1.10 (g)). However, three other shooters in the squad put up their hands and claim that there was indeed a lot of dust from the target and it should be called as "One". They had argued that it was obvious that the target had been hit by the shot from the competitor's gun.

IT'S YOUR CALL:

If you stick with your original ruling you would be quite correct. There is absolutely no provision in our rules to allow for a dusted target (irrespective of whether it was a lot of dust or

a little dust that came from it) to be given as "One". In simple terms, a target must have a visible "chip" come from it. Dust is not considered to be a chip.

Rule 1.10 (g) states very clearly that a "Dusted Target" is a Lost Target.

Rule 1.05 clearly defines a broken target and Rule 1.06 clearly defines a "Dusted Target"

However, there are occasions where some of the shooters may claim that there was a chip that came off either their target or the target of one of the other competitors in the same squad. You as the Referee have not seen a chip and have ruled "Lost Target".

This is sometimes a dilemma for most of us. Consultation with the scorer and other shooters in the squad is very necessary. To deny a shooter a target that he may have hit is one thing, but to give a target to a shooter on unclear evidence is another. In the latter case you have effectively taken a target off each shooter in that person's Grade. Equity and fairness are always at stake in these situations. Therefore your decision must not, be taken lightly.

Under Rule 4.20(b) the ruling made by a Referee as to whether a target has been missed or is legal is final and can't be appealed against in a Jury. Moreover, under Rule 4.21 (c) the Referee's decision in all cases coming under his jurisdiction is final.

It is incumbent upon us all to make our decisions equitably, sensibly and wisely within the scope of the many rules which apply to the situation encountered, but do not be afraid to rule "Lost Target" If you feel absolutely sure that the target fired at was not broken in the terms laid down in our rules.

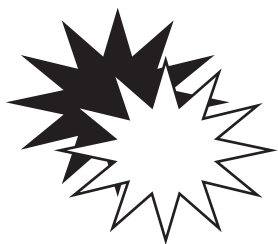

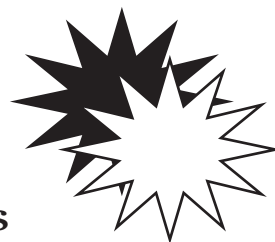

Dear Your Say

It is becoming more and more apparent to me that Shooters are intimidating/browbeating those members who act as Referees, on a volunteer basis I might add. The majority of these referees are not fully qualified in that area but referee by virtue of Club Administrations requiring and/or directing shooters to fulfill these duties. The intimidation usually revolves around the result of a target thrown.

Club administrations should, if directing or requiring shooters (especially our younger members) to act as Referees, stand behind them and support their decision making.

Rule 4.26(d) requires Shooters to check their scores before leaving the ground - this arises when shooters take issue with scores recorded on the board and again has resulted in attacks upon those who referee.

Rule 4.1 8(c) enables shooters to appeal a decision upon lodgment of \$20.00 with the Club Administration or Jury. Again if it is a "he said, I said" the Club/Jury should be prepared to support the Referee's decision

Rule 1.01(1) "Ungentlemanly Conduct" - this gives the Club Administration the option to suspend the membership of shooters behaving in such ways which would include unacceptable behaviour towards referees. This may be somewhat draconian but all Shooters should consider the ramifications which suspension of Club membership could have on the ability to hold a Firearms License.

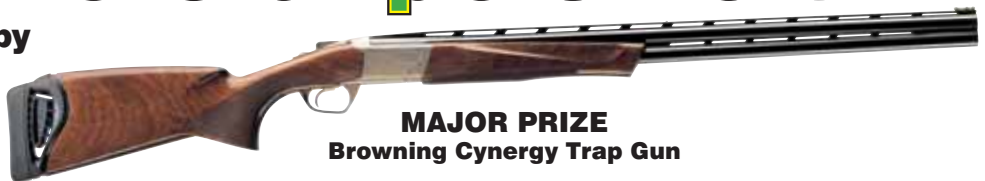

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

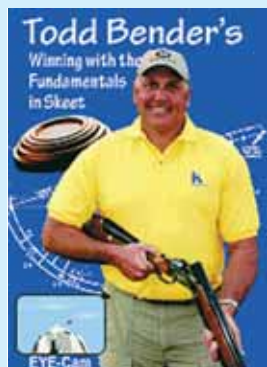
out 75/75 also and Geoff and Wanga 73/75.

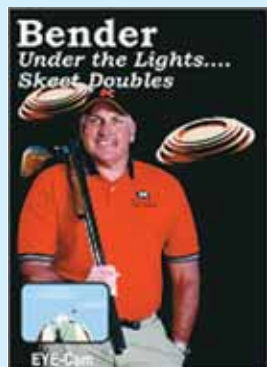

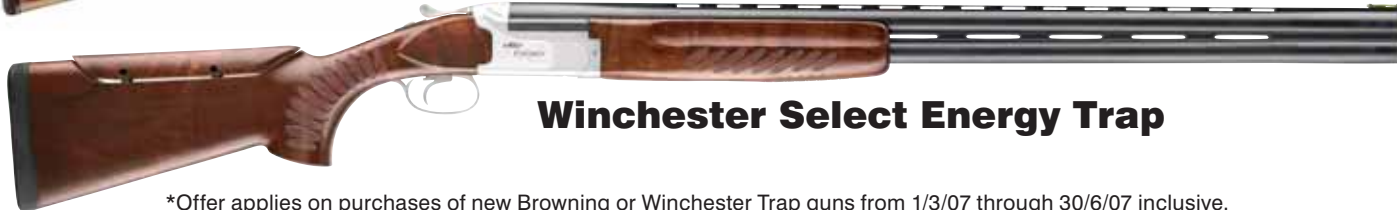
