FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

It has been a very interesting month since my last column and I am pleased to advise the following update.

At the time of writing we are one week away from the annual meeting of the National Executive and with the change of Executive Officer it has taken a fair effort by all in the Office to prepare.

This note is written in advance and will go to print before the National Executive Meetings, however I took the decision to hold the CTSN back by a few days so that we can include a last minute addition of a couple of pages of information to brief you all on any key or interesting decisions taken at those meetings.

I also now advise that the letter published in "Your Say" of the June CTSN was not approved by the National Executive and contains sections which are not factually correct.

Following publication of Mr. Sanders' letter I report:

- I am advised and assured that the decision of the National Executive on this matter was unanimous.
- I am further advised that the previous Executive Officer had been formally spoken to and/or counseled by members of the National Executive on previous occasions with regard to aspects of his position and the discussions on April 11th were a culmination of those actions.

For your information we reprint here a copy of the Press Release that was issued by our Association soon after Mr. Sanders' resignation:

Following discussions by the ACTA Executive Committee, the ACTA Executive Officer, Mr Andrew Sanders, tendered his resignation on the 11 April 2007 to take effect immediately. This was accepted by the Committee.

Mr Geoff Kidd, well known to most shooters, offered to undertake the position on an interim basis pending permanent recruitment action. Mr Kidd has a wide background in national and international shooting as well as extensive corporate management experience. The Committee has gratefully accepted Mr Kidd's offer and he will take up the position as soon as possible. Mr Alan Vilcins, Executive Member from South Australia, will provide support and assistance to Mr Kidd on as needed basis. Mr Vilcins

an experienced shooter is professionally qualified in Tourism Management and Event Management as well as having relevant experience in managing the recent Police, Fire and emergency Services Games in Adelaide. (For those who may not be aware these are the third largest sporting events in the world.) President Bill Jones stated that the ACTA is very fortunate having available at such short notice the services of these two eminently qualified people.

Recruitment action for the permanent replacement of the Executive Officer will be undertaken following the outcomes of the ACTA strategic planning initiative currently in progress. This process will be finalised at the next Executive Meeting.

I am also pleased to report that the National Sporting Clays Championship was run at the National Grounds over the weekend of May 19/20. It was a very enjoyable weekend and it is a credit to John Younger of Bacchus Marsh who shot a fantastic 99/100 on Saturday and followed that up with a 92/100 to win the National Title with 191/200. A full report on this Event will be in the August CTSN, but I would like to record the ACTA's appreciation to Wagga Gun Club who ran this Event on our behalf, to David Coleman who was responsible for the creation of the various targets and to all of the workers from Wagga Gun Club who made this terrific event possible.

At that Event we undertook an initial attempt to include "live" reports (well, almost live) on our Website and a brief write-up was added to the website 3 or 4 times during each day, with photos and results being posted within hours or minutes of being taken. It is our intention to build on this so that members will be able to check out £t monitor all National Championships as they are running. You will also see that we have added a "Recent News" section to keep members advised on relevant matters, and we are hopeful of having a State based and National Shoot calendar on the website some time soon.

You will also see in this issue an article relating to a problem that has arisen recently due to members being coached on the DTL tracks during competitions. I commend that article to all members.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT OF SOME KEY DECISIONS TAKEN AT THE RECENT MEETING OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE MAY 30TH – JUNE 3RD

I have pleasure in providing the following Report on some key issues on which the National Executive met over the past 4 days.

This is not exhaustive or complete and more will be advised in the next issue of CTSN or progressively thereafter, as this is being typed with the closing date for this print run just hours away.

I have been a member of the ACTA for around 30 years and had no idea of the quantity of work required by the National Executive over these 4 days, which commenced last Wednesday evening (May 30th) with a 4 - 5 hour review of the 2007 Trap Nationals and initial consideration of key issues to make the 2008 Trap Nationals a fresh, enjoyable and prestigious Event. The aim of that meeting was to review what happened in 2007 and to put in place the necessary changes to again make the Nationals the highlight of the Trapshooter's year. More on that below.

Thursday May 31st was spent in an all-day review of the structure of the ACTA under the guidance of a very experienced facilitator and expert in sports administration. That meeting identified many of the strengths and weaknesses of the present organisation and the National Executive made changes to address those issues during its full meeting on June 2nd & 3rd, as further outlined in this Report.

The day before the full National Executive Meeting is spent with meetings of all Subcommittees, of which there are 9:

- Finance
- Coaching
- Shooting
- National Championships
- Membership Growth & Services
- National Ground Complex
- Rules
- Hall of Fame
- Management

Most of these meet for 2-3 hours on that day to examine all key issues of their aspect of the Sport & to formulate recommendations for presentation at the National Executive Meeting, held the next day.

The National Executive Meeting spanned the 2 days of June 2nd & 3rd, involving what I estimate to be approx. 15 hours of detailed discussion, resolution & decision making on key items, and what follows are some of the issues, however before progressing further I need to report that Bill Jones has stood down as our President due to personal matters and that is reported in John Mack's section on the 1st page. Bill's dedication to the ACTA was greatly appreciated by all members of the Executive and his service to the sport through various positions on the National Executive deserves praise and appreciation by all members.

As a result of Bill's standing down, John Mack from Queensland was elected to the position of President and John presided over all further sections of this meeting of the National Executive.

I am pleased to report that the ACTA has received a grant of \$35,000 that will be used to develop and foster our Junior Development Program as part of the AISL ISSF Talent Development Pathway. This will result in a policy being developed by the ACTA for the National Junior Development Squad and the National Youth Development Squad.

The ACTA is developing a coaching system for the development of a state based coaching program. Individual coaches for a state based program are to be sourced and all states will have the opportunity to run a level one coaches course.

For future Skeet development, the ACTA is developing a Skeet coaching program for the benefit of all interested members.

As limited funding is now available, the ACTA is providing support and logistics to establish state based ISSF programs.

We will also investigate developing a competition between Australia and New Zealand for ISSF shooters along the lines of the Glenn Cup guidelines, and to be contested at the ISSF National Championships.

The 2008 Trap Nationals will be conducted March 31st – April 6th 2008 at the national grounds.

Complete details of the program will be included in next months CTSN, however I am pleased to advise members that March 31st will involve a new & rejuvenated Opening Ceremony followed by the 50 target Grand Australian Handicap. April 1st – 5th inclusive will then each be 100 target events to be shot in 2 visits, with April 6th to include the usual Teams Shooting and the resolution of High Guns etc.

Entries for the 2008 Trap Nationals will be limited to 500 competitors in each Event to ensure that time constraints can be met and Pre-Nomination and Pre-Squadding will be necessary to make this a more manageable & better experience for competitors and all of the workers at the Nationals.

The Executive is well aware of the need to contain costs for our members for all of these Events and costs will be advised further as soon as detailed budgeting is completed for the Carnival.

In addition to these changes, we will soon provide you with details of a complete social calendar for the 2008 Trap Nationals, including entertainment or functions at the Grounds on most evenings.

The Executive are presently working on the National Ground facilities and are upgrading those to ensure the ground is current with all health and safety issues and are of a high competition standard. National ground upgrades that are being explored include: Seating and shade for competitors, a dedicated trade display area, a drainage upgrade, the lighting of layouts and improved weed control. As with all facility upgrades there is a cost involved and the Executive are attempting to facilitate those upgrades as economically as possible.

Members of the association have been consulted as to the improvement of the grounds and championships and the recommendations of those members have been included in forward planning for the association.

The 2008 and 2009 National Championships have been forward planned to assist members to plan their attendance and the next CTSN will include those dates once all have been endorsed at all levels. These dates will also appear on our website immediately they are fully approved and locked in.

A website upgrade has been implemented and the Executive is looking at ways of minimising office tasks & costs. One initiative is to electronically update the website by member clubs with their shoot information along with upgrading the communication strategies of the ACTA with all of its members.

The Sporting Clays National Championship and the Skeet National Championship will run successively in 2008, and it is hoped that this will allow additional members to compete in each and add to the overall enjoyment through that week. More details on this will be included in upcoming issues of the CTSN and on our website.

As a result of the deliberations of the National Executive, and in order to provide improved governance of our operations, the Executive has moved to implement a structure that is being followed successfully by many other sports. That involves the formation of a Board to provide closer supervision of our day to day operations and to meet more often to review, identify or action any improvements that can be made or to provide policy direction for the advancement of the sport.

That has been voted on and the structure of the ACTA has been progressed to now include a formalised structure of a Board of Management. This Board includes the President and 5 members of the National Executive, and is charged with the responsibility to take the Association forward. It is anticipated that the Board will meet 6 times per year in person or by phone or video conferencing and this meeting schedule will also allow all key sub-committee initiatives to be actioned more rapidly.

A number of rules clarifications and simplifications were adopted at the National Executive meeting. These Rule alterations have passed through a rigorous process of review in each of the States and should go a long way to address anomalies or points of argument in several areas. Again, details will be explained further in future issues of CTSN.

The National Executive has also adopted a policy of much tighter budgeting and expenditure approval in all areas and I am presently concentrating on the preparation of detailed budgets for all of the 2008 National Championships. I am pleased to report that this tight budgeting process was undertaken for the recent Sporting Clays Nationals and we were able to complete that Nationals and the budget was met. A great result for a successful and enjoyable Nationals.

The National Executive, through the Board will also be concentrating on improving membership retention and servicing over future months via several initiatives that should benefit all Clubs and States

The recruiting of a new Executive Officer is now under way and following these meetings of the National Executive, a detailed review of all areas of our operations will be commenced. This will start by tendering many areas which are key costs, with the new Executive Officer to complete this review once on board.

I hope that the above is of interest to all members and as advised, more details will be provided as soon as possible.



CABOOLTURE SKEET

Location 45 minutes north of Brisbane's CBD

A warm and gusty Easter Sunday greeted the 30 shooters as they arrived at Caboolture Clay Target club for the second ever John Reynolds Skeet Carnival .

Six squads lined up for the first event, the 25 target cash divide and the gusty conditions made it all too easy to misread the targets and several shaking heads and muttered curses bore testament to just how easy it was to miss under these conditions and while most shooters were waking up to the reality that this was going to be no walk in the park it was Dave Dundon who knuckled down immediately and worked hard for each and every target to shoot the first 25 of the day and the only one of the event.

The second event was the 50 target championship and with lessons learnt from the first round it was a very careful and respectful group of shooters who got down to some serious shooting but again it was Dave Dundon who continued his recent excellent form to shoot the only possible in the event. He didn't have it easy with a hungry pack of A, B and C graders snapping at his heels throughout meant he couldn't relax for a moment but concentration and confidence paid off and enabled him to walk away with the winners prize.

Lunchtime came around and it was a credit to the spirit of the club that they were able to muster such competent, helpful (and unpaid) assistance with the catering and running of the days events.

The afternoon saw the squads drop down from 6 down to 5 with the departure of the clubs veterans who, having shot their two rounds called it a day and opted out of the final two events, the first of which was the popular 25 target handicap event which with so many C graders participating meant that it would have been a brave or foolish gambler who could have predicted the winner.

With the wind still gusting around the ground every shooter was forced to look really hard for each and every target. The end of the first round saw a much reduced group of shooters assembling for the shoot off but with a good mixture of grades and experience it was a nervous and uncertain squad of 8 who lined up on stand one for the shoot-off.

A combination of nerves and unpredictable targets left just 4 shooters fetching another box of shells for the next round. Into the third round now and experience under pressure helped Craig O'Neill to be the last man standing with a 61/61 closely followed by a very pleased Steve Dykstra who had pushed all the way to the finish line with a cleanly shot 55/60.

The final event of the day was the 25 target doubles and with the light beginning to fail and some rain threatening it was sure to make for an interesting finish, even the local Kangaroo population appeared out of the tree-line to sit watch the outcome.

It all conspired to be too much with nobody shooting the possible leaving Craig O'Neill and Dave Dundon vying for first place but in the end it was Craig who took it with 23/25 beating Dave by just one target.

Overall High Gun for the day was won by Dave Dundon with 121/125 who took away a sash, a trophy, some shells and a big grin and the day was deemed a success by all.

"This is the second year that this event has been held and it is very encouraging to have such a large number of shooters turning up especially considering it is Easter Sunday.

"Everyone seems to have had a good day ad there have been plenty of laughs, some great prizes and even some good shooting - perhaps next year we will make this a two day event and firmly establish it as one of skeet's major shoots," said Skeet Captain Nigel Hughes.

Location: Right on the crossroads of the Newell and Mid Western Highways, close to the centre of NSW

A very successful day was the only conclusion that could be reached following West Wyalong Clay target Club's Central Zone Continental Championship shoot held recently.

Despite very windy conditions there was a good roll up of shooters who were keen to get their hands on one of the handsome blue and gold championship sashes.

The first Central Zone Continental Championship to be contested was the 50 target Double Barrel event. Local shooter, Clive Foster, shooting the only possible on the day was the overall winner with 50/50.

Mick Mitton from Grenfell won AA grade 56/58, Dozer Collins 48/50 was the A grade winner and Mitch Ridley, newly promoted to B grade won with 38/50. Mitchell Brown 41/50 was the C grade winner. Jeff Nash from Orange was the Veteran Champion with 46/50.

Although there were no possibles in the Central Zone Single Barrel Continental Championship the Grenfell shooters were making their trip worthwhile when Warren Schaffer with a score of 47/50 walked off with the overall championship sash.

Again there were no perfect scores in the Central Zone Continental Points Score Championship but Geoff Nash continued his good form to take out the overall winners sash with a score of 143/150.Mick Mitton was the AA grade winner 141/150. THE ETIQUETTE AND RULES THAT APPLY TO COACHING ON THE LANES DURING DTL COMPETITION

We are in receipt of a letter from a shooter who expressed deep concern at the practice of allowing a coach to stand on the lanes with his protégé during a Championship event. The dispute has been taken very seriously by the Rules Committee and clarification of the action required by Management and Referees is of paramount importance.

The shooter concerned observed that the shooter on the lane next to him had a coach in attendance. He (the shooter) was disturbed by the presence of the coach and sought to have him removed by the Referee. Subsequent events created what perhaps can be termed as an unfortunate incident as nobody knew the correct ruling.

While no specific and direct rule exists on this subject, the situation is covered in a variety of ways in a variety of rules which cover etiquette, equity and commonsense. It applies to any formal programmed event in a normal shoot.

Firstly the presence of a coach most certainly can disturb the squad. If we look at rule 1.02(l) "Only those people directly associated with the competition will be on the tracks whilst the shoot is in progress". While the coach may well argue that he was directly associated with the shoot, he does not qualify as a competitor, Referee or Scorer. He is not to be there.

Secondly Rule 1.02(m) precludes a shooter discussing bets while on the tracks. Here again, talking on the tracks is poor etiquette and disruptive. Similarly, we require shooter to remain at the track until the last competitor has shot. This also is to prevent distraction and disruption. Also we can look at Rule 1.02(k) which allows a shooter to shoot at pieces of his own target provided the equity of the competition is not disturbed.

Thirdly there is little doubt that some shooters can and will claim a baulk under Rule 1.11. This sort of incident does in most cases constitute a baulk and he Referee should be aware of his obligations in this regard. In any case, the mere claiming of a number of baulks is further disruption to the squad. Equity is of paramount importance, and while it may not affect some shooters it can and does affect others.

If we look at GRTS 12 it requires the Referee to speak to a shooter immediately if safety has been breached. It also gives him the right to speak to a shooter where etiquette is involved after the squad has finished. However, it says also that it depends on the circumstances. We believe that in the type of circumstances portrayed, the Referee should take action and speak to the shooter concerned immediately if he considers that disruptions are occurring. Here again, we see evidence that Referees (and Scorers) have to be mindful of distractions of a squad.

GRTS15 states that the Referee should be mindful of the "Rule" regarding squad members disturbing the competitor shooting. Yes! "Guidelines for Referees, Trap & Skeet" are in fact formal rules and are to be treated as such. The opening paragraph of GRTS says: Any reference to these "rules" etc. They are in fact "Procedural Rules" for Referees and carry the authority of our Association.

So there we have it! We certainly understand that in some cases some shooters would like to have a coach with them, but the reason for not having a coach with them, but the reason for not having a coach on the lanes are very cogent ones. Equity of competition, sportsmanship and plain commonsense must prevail. Our sport requires a very high degree of concentration and competitors are to be given every courtesy and assistance in this regard.



Gladstone Clay Target Club hosted its Annual 2 Day Trap Carnival on the 7th and 8th April 2007.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

MENTAL SKILLS PROGRAM

Psychological skills for sport include such things as goal setting, motivation, attention, concentration, visualisation, behavioural rehearsal, arousal control and relaxation. These have all been topics of these articles over the past few years and whilst are interesting topics in their own right, they need to be incorporated into a program so that individual athletes can get the most out of each component and improve their performance. It is important to remember that a mental skills training program is a not a "one size fits all". Because of individual differences in people, our approach to sport, the motivation behind why we do things and the latent skills that some athletes possess without knowing, we need to look at mental skills training from an individual point of view and develop an individualised program that will best suit your own needs.

So what are the basic characteristics of a mental skills training program?

The first requirement is to do a quick skills audit. For any sport there are three areas that need to be addressed if we are to perform well. These areas include; physical skills, technical skills and mental skills. Physical skills include those areas such as strength, stamina, hydration, fatigue, muscle movement, etc, and for our sport such things as gun hold and stance. Technical skills include things such as gun fit, knowing how to see the sight picture, lead, follow through, etc. A skills audit involves looking at what you are already doing; listing the things that are being done well and then examining what need to be improved upon.

The second requirement is to set some goals. These will come directly from the skills audit: These goals are not performance goals such as improving your percentage or grade but what you need to do to improve your mental skills, and in particular which mental skills you require more help with.

Once having identified the skills you need support with, it is now a matter of developing goals to improve those skills. For the purpose of this article I will take each skill in turn and using an example, look at a strategy that might help. It is important to remember that the following is an example and not a definitive program.

If goal setting is a problem, then it may be necessary to do the goal setting exercise and write down what you want to achieve over your lifetime and then five years, then yearly. It will be then necessary to look at what you are doing each month to determine if you are actually working towards your goals. Remember it is also important to evaluate your performance and modify your goals if necessary.

For motivation, it may be necessary to distinguish the process of what you are doing from the product. If you are goal-orientated then you may run the risk of always focusing on the future and because shooting is a here and now sport you may tend to perform poorly. If you can be task-orientated then you are able to remain focused in the present and you will more likely succeed.

If you focus on the process (of shooting the targets) the product (shooting the possible) will look after itself.

Remaining focused in the present takes some practise, especially for those shooters who have busy lives and who may find themselves thing about work, family, etc. The best way to stay focused in the present is to pay attention to your breathing. Breathing is the one thing that humans have to do in the present; thinking on the other hand can jump from the past, present and future. One of the best ways to focus on your breathing is to practise the strategy when you are not in competition; those annoying times when you have to wait in a queue at the post office or bank. Rather than get angry, these places are perfect to practice your breathing so it will become more natural out on the tracks.

Concentration is a more difficult concept to practise, but there are ways. Sit quietly and try to focus on a single thought. You will be surprised how quickly your thoughts drift off to other things. What most people do not understand is that what you need to practise is not how to actually concentrate on a single thought, but how to get your thoughts back to that thought once your mind has drifted. It is the same for shooting, if you miss what is important is being able to get your mind back on track so that you do not miss again.

Relaxation is the easiest strategy to practise. Just sit in a comfortable chair or lay down, focus on your breathing and let go. Don't worry about your thoughts, just breathe and relax.

Using Visualisation to deal with distractions that may come into your head whilst shooting; the Black Box technique is a simple to learn and an effective strategy. But visualisation can be very helpful in reducing anxiety because you can use the image to tell your brain that you have shot the target and thereby reduce the need to give yourself self-talk that will cause you to tense up and become anxious.

The above are just a sample of the strategies and components that should be included in a mental skills training program. The goal of the program is to help you, as the athlete, become more focused, confident and composed whilst you are competing.



MAGAZINE GUNS POSITION FOR SAFETY FOR TRAP You are the Referee of a squad wherein a shooter is using a "magazine gun" ie a Semi Auto Pump, or a Bolt Action. You have your attention directed to the manner in which the shooter is handling his firearm, especially in relation to the manner in which he unloads and carries the gun.

Some squad members have pointed out to you some of their concerns and a little are uncertain of the correct procedure. Much advice is forthcoming from all and sundry. You are asked to adjudicate on a number of issues regarding the use of this type of firearm.

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you stopped the event temporarily and satisfied the concerns of other shooters you would be quite correct. You have done this in the interest of both equity and safety.

You explain that in all cases, we should firstly understand that Rule 1.01(b) requires that "All guns carried on or about the shooting grounds must be held in a position of safety, with the breech open at all times". In addition Rule 1.01(f) tells us when it is permissible to load any firearm. That Rule also says that the cartridges must be removed from any magazine gun when moving between lanes 1 to 5.

The problem arises in TRAP shooting when a shooter with a magazine gun finishes his shot on lane 5 and is required to unload and proceed back to lane 1.

Clearly, it is difficult for a Referee to determine the safety condition of a magazine gun. Hence it is important that special provisions for the use and carriage are adhered to:

Therefore: After completing his shot/shots on lane 5, a shooter with a magazine qun is to:

1.Ensure he removes his cartridge or cartridges from his gun before turning from the firing point.

2 It is preferred that his gun muzzle be pointed vertically while moving from lane 5 to 1 irrespective of whether he has permission to pass either in front or behind the officiating referee. The gun must not tilt in the direction of the officiating Referee, scorer or other shooters and be held securely with the mechanism fully open. His finger or finger must not be close to or on the trigger mechanism. He must not load or attempt to load his gun until standing on his firing mark at lane 1.

Although this matter has not specifically catered for in our

formal rules, recent Government rules for firearms safety indicate a very strong preference for the carriage of a firearm of this category in this manner,

The matter of shells being ejected from the firearm in question is just one of those things that occur in our sport. The shooter is entitled to use his firearm and should not be penalized for it. He may as a courtesy pick up his spent cartridges after the event and put them in the receptacle provided.

I am grateful for the assistance and advice given to me by the Chairman of Rules and his committee in these matters.

Dear Bill

Bill, I have been a member, excepting for an enforced break, for thirty seven years and, like most, really do find your column welcome and useful. Please keep it up.

In the May issue of 'CTSN' you expressed concern that as "the referee has contracted outside the written rule" has he created a "precedent" and by going along with his decision, the management committee has done likewise.

With respect this would not be my view.

A very good and safe definition of precedent would be "a case which serves as an authority for legal principle embodied in its decision". (Osborne)

The material which is drawn on must itself be part of the law. A precedent cannot flow from an illegal act or a decision which was itself legally flawed.

I refer to the letter from Jim Robertson regarding our choice of words to demonstrate a scenario in "It's Your Call May 2007". Thank you Jim for taking the time to write and for your general and pleasing comments.

Your legal opinion is quite correct and doubtless would be very useful in a court of law. However, the every day use of precedent as defined in the Collins Dictionary says, among other things, that: a precedent is "an example or instance used to justify later similar occurrences." That is precisely the reason for its use in a simple rules situation. Obviously, we do not want it argued that if "that shooter can do it and get away with it, then so can I."

I bow to your legal knowledge. However, I believe it important we stick to the purpose of this column and discuss rules rather than semantics. We do not want to set a "precedent" in this regard.



2007 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

Brisbane Gun Club - February, 2007

For the 13th year since it's inception in 1995, The Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition was held during February at Brisbane Gun Club. This was the second major Olympic Discipline competition held at the club in little over a month, the OD Nationals having been held in Brisbane in mid-January. The management and members deserve a very special mention in regards to the conducting of two competitions of this magnitude in such a short time. To hold a nationals competition is a great effort for a club, but to line up again just a few weeks later and do it again deserves special praise for all involved.

Retaining it's original objective of being a truly international competition where Australian shooters can compete at home against shooters from other countries, the event once again lived up to this objective by allowing both local and interstate competitors that opportunity. This year we again welcomed the members of the Winchester sponsored Japan Top Gun Club together with shooters from throughout Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria and a special guest who came from Scotland for the competition.

This year, a total of over 80 competitors gathered for the revised competition program which this year was held over four days. The first two days of competition saw the re-introduction of the 200 target Kemen sponsored Australian Open with the preliminary Australian 'Skins' competition held in conjunction. The 150 target Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet were then conducted over two days on Saturday and Sunday.

Thursday, the first day of competition, saw the local and interstate shooters get a head start on their Japanese rivals who arrived mid way through the day when the first 100 targets of the Australian Open competition was being conducted. In typical fashion, the Japanese contingent of around 40 competitors, were straight off the bus and into the practice. Before long they were lined up for the re-introduction to warm weather and the Australian targets and the two spare Olympic Trap ranges were really running hot.

The first 100 targets of the Australian Open competitions saw quite a few good performances being recorded in both the Olympic Trap and Skeet events. Day 1 in the trap concluded with two times Olympic Gold medallist Michael Diamond showing his class by leading the field with a very handy score of 97/100. In the skeet event, local shooters dominated the small field with Kel Madsen leading the way after 100 targets of that competition.

Day 2 of the competition saw the opportunity for all shooters to recoup some of their nominations in the skins event, while those who were competing in the Australian Open events were also looking to record a good result on day 2 of the event. The number of shooters in the field was doubled on Friday when the Japanese visitors and a few others entered for the 'Skins' Badge Match over 100 targets. The Badge Match was held in conjunction with the 200 target Kemen Australian Open making it a two-in-one event.

As always, the spoils available in the Skins competition saw for some very closely contested rivalry. In both the AA/A group and the B/C group, the skins payable of each round was around \$200 per round (more than twice the nomination fee for the event). Everybody was watching the scoreboard closely during each of the four rounds.

At the end of the day, the spoils were spread around reasonably well. In the AA/A group, skins wins were recorded by Frank Minici, Kevin Perkins (2), Michael Diamond (3), Akihiro Aoyama, Dan Johnson and Reno Cangiano. The B/C group also saw a good sharing of the prize money with Scott Dobeli, Masamichi Komatsu (2) and Fernando Cilli (2) all receiving a few dollars to make the weekend more enjoyable.

The 100 target Badge match event held in conjunction with the 'Skins' competition also saw the spoils shared around - AA Grade 1st Michael Diamond (Camel Hill), 2nd Akihiro Aoyama (Japan), 3rd Jiro Nakayama (Japan); A Grade 1st Frank Minici (Cecil Park), 2nd Kevin Perkins (Illawarra), 3rd Greg Newey & Dan Johnson (Warwick); B Grade 1st

Fernando Cilli (Brisbane), 2nd Scott Dobeli (Brisbane), 3rd Masamichi Komatsu (Japan); C Grade 1st Rod Millar (Cairns), 2nd Takashi Kato (Japan), 3rd Shinobu Nakamura (Japan).

At the conclusion of the 200 targets, the six finalists for the Australian Open Olympic Trap competition were determined. They were Michael Diamond (190/200), Frank Minici (173/200), Greg Newey (173/200), Dan Johnson (173/200), Kevin Perkins (171/200) and Fernando Cilli (165/200).

In the 200 target Kemen Australian Open ISSF Skeet Championship, the results were - O/A 1st Kel Madsen, B Grade Justin Ehrenreich and C Grade Mark Kempnich.

Skins in the skeet competition went to Michio Imaizumi (Japan), Hiroshi Ishimaki (Japan), Justin Ehrenreich (Brisbane) and Mark Kempnich (Brisbane).

Saturday morning and a few more weekend shooters arrived. In all, 12 squads of Olympic Trap shooters made up the field in the "Grand Prix" competition with shooters coming from as far away as Melbourne, Cairns, Sydney, Illawarra, Glen Innes and Newcastle plus the many local shooters and regulars from neighbouring clubs including Redcliffe, Warwick, Gold Coast and others. At the other end of the shooting range, a lesser field of 2 squads faced the starter in the ISSF Skeet event. The large contingent of Japanese shooters made up about half the overall field which made it very enjoyable for all in attendance.

As Brisbane had been subject to quite a few showery days during the week it appeared that the weekend's conditions would not be much different. While the early squads got away to a good start, even though the normal early light conditions made it a little tricky to catch a few of the left hand targets, it soon became obvious that everyone in the field would be affected at some time by the rain showers. The luxury, however, of having 3 Olympic Trap ranges always allows for a brief stoppage to be enjoyed while any heavy showers are around.

After the completion of the first day's proceedings in the Olympic Trap "Grand Prix", Michael Diamond was again leading the field on 93/100 followed by Cairns shooter Jar Smaniotto and former "Grand Prix" Champion Kevin Perkins of Illawarra, both on 89/100. With only 50 targets to be completed on day 2 of the competition, many shooters were still in contention for a position in the final. 2006 "Grand Prix" Champion, Frank Minici, was up amongst the contenders on 88/100 as were Dan Johnson from Warwick on 87/100 and Japanese shooter Akihiro Aoyama on 86/100.

Day 2 of the "Grand Prix" and again it appeared as though we would be experiencing showery conditions during the course of the day. The day's scores were up–and–down as expected with Michael Diamond continuing to lead the field towards the final, registering 24/25 and 22/25 to be first in on 139/150. Jar Smaniotto (135) was next into the final followed by Kevin Perkins (134), Frank Minici (133) and then a 3 way tie between Dan Johnson, Shawn Ryan and Akihiro Aoyama all on 128/150, necessitating a 3 way shoot–off to determine the last 2 positions. Aoyama was the unlucky one leaving Dan Johnson and Shawn Ryan to fill the 5th and 6th positions.

The final was of course a single barrel affair with the 10 second 'delay' light being used on station one. Again Michael Diamond demonstrated his class and experience by taking the overall spoils and winning his first Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" title for a number of years.

Top qualifier on 122/150 was Michio Imizumi, followed by Cherie Ryan on 115/150, Kazuki Kono 114/150, Kel Madsen 107/150, Isamu Sato 99/150 and Hiroshi Ishimaki 95/150.

Following a good final which saw the lead challenged, the first placed finalist Michio Imazumi held on to his lead to take the championship spoils for the 2007 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix".

It is anticipated that the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition may be held a few weeks later in 2008 to allow shooters to recover from the O.D. Nationals competition which is rumoured to be scheduled to be held in Perth, Western Australia, in early January, 2008.

Again, the Organising Committee of the Brisbane Gun Club would like to thank Wayne Pilkington and Greg Mitchell of Winchester for their



NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5.500.

- Providing level 1 coaching course for women who have expressed interest in taking on coaching or assisting coaching roles
- Media education course for women

The Program provides successful applicants with a one-off grant of up to \$5,000 for individuals and up to \$10,000 for incorporated organisations.

AISL High Performance Program

What is the AISL High Performance Program and what does it mean for shooting?

Much has been said about the High Performance Program and indeed the question is oft asked, "how does it benefit the sport overall?" In the first instance it is necessary to understand the Program is geared toward the elite level of the sport, which is the top ten or fifteen athletes, across the Olympic disciplines, we have who are capable of being among the best in the world. As a sport we all benefit from the results achieved internationally and, in particular, those of our Olympians and Commonwealth Games athletes.

Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) is the body charged with the task of winning medals and is funded by the Australian Sports Commission. In turn AISL works with its member bodies to develop the High Performance Program through the High Performance Program Management Committee which is made up of representatives from the member bodies, the national coaches, the high performance manager and a representative from the Sports Commission.

The current focus is on achieving medals in Beijing 2008, New Delhi in 2010 and London 2012; to this end those top athletes will be supported via a new program to be announced following the end of the 49th ISSF World Championships in Zagreb.

The program is, unashamedly, not about promoting the top scoring Australians but rather those Australians who are able to achieve medal results internationally. To date qualifying scores have been set at an achievable standard, that required just a little stretch to reach, in order to attract more shooters to the squad level; however the funds available cannot hope to provide adequate support for the numbers able to achieve these scores and so those who are truly seeking "elite status" will need to be capable of higher scores. The program is about success at the highest level and not about just featuring on a ranking list.

Our program employs four full time coaches and a full time sports scientist to assist the athletes in achieving their goals. On the sports science front our athletes also have access to sports psychologists, sports nutrition, masseur and physiotherapists along with medical support. The program also assists with travel, training, daily allowances whilst overseas, ammunition and target costs.

The flow down effect from these program areas is that the knowledge gained can be disseminated to all coaches, with the result that clubs, state and national federations need not fund research on such items enabling them to fund more on coaching and athlete development.

The funding also provides the opportunity for AISL to develop programs such as:

- the Level One generic courses in both coaching and officiating,
- policies which have been drawn up by legal resources and approved by the member bodies and,
- also conduct major competitions.

This reduces the need for member bodies and clubs to spend money and time in such areas, allowing them to allocate their funds and resources to development of the next generation of shooters.

Some athletes may also be eligible for a direct support grant (which is a means-tested grant) as a contribution towards sporting and living costs. This money is not unencumbered though; recipients will need to agree to a plan for their own development in the run up to Beijing, the demands of which are rigorous unlike previous similar grants. This funding is to assist the athletes to have more quality training time; it is not simply additional income. Whilst the recent Commonwealth Games saw Medal performances it should be noted that we failed to improve on 2002 when we gathered 30 medals. In 2006 we managed only 23.

A medal at the Olympics means our sport will be in the public eye and the more successful we are, the more likely we are to grow the sport. Recently there has been criticism of the program, those running the program, the score levels required to achieve a berth on an Australian Team, etc and I am sure this criticism is likely to continue. However, like in any endeavour the criticism is generated by some who fail to reach the scores. To this end I would encourage all, not to concentrate on the qualifying score but rather look at the score that is required to win a medal overseas and then put a plan in place to win that medal and work at the technique required. "Let your scores do the talking."

A 'tool' that has been developed to assist in making decisions at selection meetings is a graph of those shooters seeking selection which shows their form achieved overseas dating back to 1996, including Oceania, and provides an output showing the likelihood of a competitor achieving a 'finals' placing at a major event; this provides valuable assistance to the selection panel in making impartial and informed decisions.

This is invaluable in determining whether a competitor who may consistently shoot the qualifying score in Australia but is unable to achieve under pressure at the major events should be sent, bearing in mind our stated goal is to medal. Conversely, the same tool serves to highlight problems such as just described and may enable us to assist an athlete in overcoming those areas of concern.

Interestingly the top male and female clay target shooters have a 70% (male) and a 42% (female) chance of making the finals whilst in the pistol program there are two in the 70% region (female). In the rifle program steps have been taken to re-establish the positioning gained in the lead up to 2000. Of course all of this is irrelevant if a competitor does not first achieve a qualifying score. Interestingly in some other sports (non professional and less supported than ours) you need to be capable of world record performances to qualify and, yes, some of those who don't make the mark complain about the system being unfair.

It should also be pointed out that the role of the National High Performance Coach is not that of an individual coach, rather someone who develops and coordinates a program. Each competitor should be working with a coach either at the club or state level to 'hone' their skills. Here again clubs and states should be spending monies to support a coach; this need not be large sums but at least cover the incidentals such as petrol, phone etc. Those coaches would then work in with the National HP Coach to ensure the success of their athletes, whether that is at national or international level. This is not to say that the National HP Coach does not or will not provide individual attention, but it is impossible to be everywhere; many sports are centric to a training centre and athletes need to weigh up the pros and cons of moving to that centre.

Details of the new plan will be made available on the web site www.ausshooting.org in August.

With less than 740 days to go to the Olympic Games and just over 760 to the Paralympics, preparation is already well under way; have you set your goals?
