A Grade: D. Pasfield, G. Brown, H. MacInnes, K. Ellison, K. McWhirter, J. Gemmill 25/25.


B Grade: D. Pearson, 25/25.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Well this should be the last EO's report from me as at the time of writing we are preparing for the inaugural meeting of the Board on July 31st and as you will have seen from John Mack's President's column, a new National Executive Officer has been selected, will be attending that Board Meeting, and will be in place for the next edition of this Magazine.

I commend the new National Executive Officer to you all and I am confident that her experience, drive & charm will ensure that the ACTA is run more efficiently, that our major Events are better coordinated and are more "fun" for all, that our sponsors and supporters are better handled and acknowledged, that the ACTA is well positioned with every level of Government to better handle the myriad of issues that impact on our Sports, and that all of our members needs are better and more efficiently addressed.

As you are all aware, we have been in somewhat of a holding pattern while a new National Executive Officer is appointed and I came in on an interim basis, however some issues just could not be left unaddressed. I hope that what has been done over the last couple of months will be a reasonable base from which the new appointee can grow the ACTA.

In particular I would like to thank our President, John Mack, for his tireless efforts on behalf of the Association and I say to all members that if John can maintain his activities and enthusiasm at the present levels, then the ACTA will be well served.

I have recently written to all Clubs who have not provided proof of Incorporation and for those that are unincorporated or that have not responded this is now a critical issue. WE appreciate that there are a couple of Clubs with circumstances that do not allow incorporation and those are being looked at further at the present time, however our Constitution requires that member Clubs be Incorporated bodies and great latitude has been given to date. All members of all Clubs that are not Incorporated should be aware that your Club is likely to be uninsured by the time you read this, and such a position puts all executives and members of those Clubs at risk. The ACTA has now contacted those Clubs on numerous occasions and has perhaps allowed more time for you to comply than is prudent, so if your Club does not comply I suggest that members take the matter up with your executive as a matter of urgency.

Those who know me would be aware that the last thing I want to be known as is Geoff "the compliance freak", but in these days of litigation, any Club that is not protected by Incorporation or by our insurance umbrella is taking what I would suggest to you all is an unacceptable risk . . . and for what?

Now please let me raise 2 other compliance issues that good management demands Clubs and their members to address.

The First is GST and you will see a separate article in this edition on how this is interpreted by the Tax Office and how it should be handled for our competitions. If your Club is registered for GST, then we believe it is crystal clear on how the matter should be handled. More details of the relevant ruling is on our website.

The Second is OH&S. Now I know that many of you might see this as an unreasonable imposition on your sporting pursuits and some of you have contacted me along those lines (some even using stronger language) and what I say to all Clubs and all ACTA members is that I understand that position BUT you ignore this matter at your peril. The hard fact of life is that if your Club experiences an accident that breaches the OH&S regulations in your State, you will

be charged and it will most likely cost the Club and the management a massive amount of money. Make no bones about it, this issue has potential to wipe out some Clubs and it is no excuse, nor is it reasonable management, to pretend that OH&S is not applicable to our operations at all levels.

Many of you have experience with OH&S management in your workplace. Be aware that exactly the same regulations apply at your Club.

While the legislation varies in all States, they are all similar in that they hinge on the requirement to undertake a formal identification of hazards, to examine and establish the manner in which those hazards can be mitigated and controlled, and to put in place a plan to correct all areas where hazards are identified.

You will find that if you have been managing your operations well, you will have most of these issues partly or fully in hand, however this is a specialist business and we have recently employed an expert in this field to look at the National Grounds and Office. Now it is not hard to identify that being struck by a target or arm has been one of the hazards of our sport and I remember getting into trap houses last century and squinting with crossed fingers while hoping that the trap didn't go off. That type of procedure is no longer allowable and you need all trappers to be inducted and to have signed off on a procedure to access the traps in a manner where they CANNOT be injured. As an example, if the trap cannot be discharged and deenergised so that there is no chance of an accident, then you need to make the necessary changes to allow that to occur readily and you need a written procedure on how your trappers and trap mechanics will handle that, plus you probably need that procedure on a sign on the trap house near the access point.

We are further advised that in NSW all members or staff that undertake any maintenance on your traps or grounds must have a Workcover approved "White Card". I understand that similar requirements apply in other states.

Other areas to be kept in mind are trip & slip hazards, safe access down into trap houses or up into skeet houses, earth leakage protection on all electrical connections (including portable generators in your camping area), the control of hazardous materials, safe fittings on all mowers and workshop equipment, the use of safety glasses and clothing etc, etc ad infinitum.

You ignore this OH&S issue at your financial peril as in NSW, fines of tens and hundreds of thousands of dollars are issued for breaches and your Workcover department always investigates after an accident with the benefit of 20/20 hindsight, so in the event of an accident it will almost always be the Club's & Management's fault.

The Consultant who has completed the work for the ACTA has offered a very attractive concessional rate for any Clubs that want his advice and an effective way to progress this might be for several Clubs to band together and have our Consultant or another of your choice attend your location to address all Clubs on what you need to

do . . . BUT PLEASE BE CLEAR THAT DOING NOTHING IS NOT AN OPTION if you want to protect your Club's ongoing operations and your bank balance.

Best regards to all members and thanks to all those that offered their support during my time in the chair. See you at the Nationals.

Condamine Gun Club

The two days brought in excess of 70 shooters, with 15 clay target clubs represented. Shooters travelled from clubs as close as Surat and Chinchilla to as far away as Cunnamulla, the Sunshine Coast and Tyagarah in NSW. Unfortunately for the shooters from Glen Innes, the Friday night before the shoot, brought over a foot of snow and they had to make a quick departure to return home to feed cattle.

The weather on Saturday provided for a challenging day of shooting, with light drizzle at the start of the day, then wind and cloud, and eventually fining-up to a cold and relatively calm afternoon. Three events were shot on the first day, with a few possibles shot. The 30 Target Medley

Event, which was sponsored by Queensland Gas Company, was taken out by Benn Durkin 72/75 (Texas). The main event for the first day, the 50T Double Barrel "Condamine Bell" Championship was fiercely contested, with Scott Trafford 50/50 (Sunshine Coast) taking the overall prize, consisting of the much coveted Condamine Bell.

Sunday, brought totally different weather conditions, with a cold but calm day and blue skies. Shooters however, did not respond as well to the favourable weather conditions, with only one possible being

shot for the day. Two events on the second day, stand out, the first being the 30 Target Points 15M "Chair Event" in which first prize is a Squatter's Chair. This event is sponsored by Condamine Kitchens, which is owned and operated by Club President Brett Pile, who also makes the chairs. This year, as always shooters came with the intention of taking home a chair; however only five ever manage to leave with one. Overall in this event was Wes Humphreys 98/99 (Sunshine Coast). Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

DISTRACTIONS

Recently at a shoot I was asked if I had any strategies that would improve concentration. There is a range of skills and techniques that can be learnt and practised both in and out of competition, to improve concentration. The main technique is to be able to stay focused in the here and now and deal with the process of shooting and not with the outcome. So when I gave this question some thought on the drive home I realised that concentration is a component of a wider set of skills and not just a single entity.

The important aspects of concentration are; staying focused in the present, attending to details and enjoying the process rather than dwelling on the outcome. Concentration needs to be specific (eg focusing on the target) rather than broad (eg focusing on the whole event). The problem with concentration is that we need to be able to recognise the internal and external distractions that limit our ability to focus, so that we can attend to the job at hand or the target about to be thrown.

Internal distractions that limit our ability to stay focused are;

- Thinking too much about either the past or the future outcomes.
 Shooting is a sport where you have to remain focused in the here and now. Thinking about a missed target or previous performance means that you are focusing on the past. Thinking about the result, the prize, etc means that you are focusing on the future. Both these trains of thought take you away from the here and now.
- Self-doubt or negative judgements about your performance. Judgements lead to self-doubt. Self-doubt produces anxiety, and this leads to our muscles tensing up and we lose the ability to move and perform in a fluid way.

- Worrying about missing a target or having a fear of failing.
- Having a fear of the competition level or being intimidated by the enormity of the competition. This distraction is evident at big competitions such as state carnivals and the Nationals.
- Getting frustrated with your performance or your opponents. If you get frustrated or angry with your own performance, then you begin to focus on the past and because you're not dealing with the present, you will often miss the target.
- Worrying about statistics, such as your next break badge. This
 means that you are focusing on the future and again you are not
 staying in the present.
- Trying to break records and focusing on achieving personal bests.
 Again this distraction is future focusing.
- Wanting to impress others such as parents, friends, or peers. This
 distraction means that you are focusing on the outcome and not
 the process of the sport or the competition.
- Dwelling on past errors. This means that you are focusing on the past again and not staying in the present.
- Thinking too much about what others are thinking about you. If you worry about other people's judgements you will not be focusing on the process, because the outcome at the end will be more important.
- A past injury affecting your performance.
- Over-analysing your skills or techniques. Yet again this is a way of focusing on the past and avoiding dealing with the present.

External distractions that limit our ability to stay focused are;

- Noises such as loud speakers, cars, people yelling, etc.
- Visual distractions such as rubbish being blown over the grounds or birds, etc.
- Bad weather
- Cameras or television crews
- Thinking about your family or work
- Poor refereeing
- Poor or faulty equipment
- Less than ideal conditions
- · Being heckled or intimidated by a regular opponent
- Being purposefully psyched-out by other competitors
- Being confused by listening to too many people


Most of the external factors are something that can be put out of your head or dealt with by using visualisation strategies such as the Black Box Technique. The final three listed are external distractions that also have an internal component, in that, we think about them and because we think they are bad, or we judge our performance as bad, this will get in the way of performing well.

Concentration during competition can be improved by remaining in the here and now. Stay focused in the present. This can be best done by focusing on your breathing and focus on the process and not on the outcome. Out of competition, practise needs to include, breathing and practising bringing the focus of attention back when the focus is lost.

As the Referee in a shoot off, you are confronted with a situation regarding malfunctions. Simple enough! We are all aware of the procedures to be adopted.

After the shoot off has been in progress for a while, you notice that a shooter has had three malfunctions since the start of the shoot off. You are about to warn him that his next malfunction will be a lost target and that (because it is a shoot off) he has ten minutes to get a replacement gun or cartridges.

However, you remember that you have just refereed him in the qualifying event where he has had a previous malfunction. You inform the shooter that the event and the shoot off are as one. Therefore the target is lost and the shooter is to retire from the event.

IT'S YOUR CALL.

Technically the Referee is correct but he has erred fundamentally in the application of the rule fairly and equitably. This is an occasion when the referee could have thought more about the incident and exercised a degree of judgement. Let us look at why.

Had the Referee not been the referee in the original qualifying event he would have been unaware of the Shooters previous malfunction. Moreover, it is extremely unlikely that the original qualifying event sheet would have accompanied the "shoot off" sheet to the tracks. Normally there would be no reference to the previous malfunction. Hence, any referee would not be aware of any previous occurrences. Indeed, there may have been others in the shoot off squad who had had malfunctions of which it was virtually impossible for the referee to know about and who could have had their malfunction started again in the shoot off event. Therefore, there was a question of equity which the referee could have considered in his ruling.

If the referee was to strictly apply the rule (which he was entitled to do), he should have warned the shooter after his second malfunction in the shoot off as it was in fact his third malfunction in the event. In that case the shooter may have elected to replace or repair his gun. The shoot off rules allow him ten minutes to do so.

Now there is no criticism of this very competent referee. He is one of the best we have. The report of the incident here is to merely remind us that sometimes we must think outside the square. However, it does not give us a licence to disregard or misinterpret rules. This is an exceptional and unusual case and should be treated as such.

The procedures for malfunctions in qualifying rounds and in shoot offs are somewhat different in that

(a) after three malfunction in a normal qualifying round the shooter is given five minutes to repair or replace his gun (or cartridges) or be re squadded.

(b) after three malfunctions in a shoot off the shooter is given ten minutes to replace his gun (or cartridges). There is no provision to re-squad. Incidentally, this incident highlights a need for all shooters to know as much about the rules as possible.

On a lighter note I am happy to report that the shooter accepted the decision in very good grace and exhibited great sportsmanship and understanding.

That shooting was for fun I wandered further round the club To seek some more instruction The advice was coming thick and fast From those experts in deduction Just shorten up the stock a bit And push the comb down low Don't listen to those other Blokes They only think they know The pitch is what your problem is Your barrels' full of lift Wouldn't have that gun of yours If I got it as a gift I was told it was my ammo Wouldn't use the stuff they said Isn't quite just fast enough It makes you lift your head Nar, his timing is his problem Said an expert from his car

I often saw a glimpse of him While I was at the bar Your elbows are the problem Your feet too far apart I saw you on the second lane I'd watched you from the start From frustration and unhappiness My confidence was just soaring I'll take instructions to the next event I'll get the crown "a roaring" So out I went at a jaunty pace Competing with shot for shot Yes you may already have guessed at it I missed the bloody lot There's a moral to this story And I won't tell you what Because you must already know Why I missed that shot.

The annual inter club challenge between the lads from the NSW Gun





This camp brought together some of the top youth (U25) ISSF shooters in Australia. Some had never been exposed to a structured training camp that not only gave them practical shooting, but also an introduction to a whole range of sports science personnel who were able to provide possible means of

finding that one extra target that we all look for. That one target that may mean making a final or not, winning a medal or not, winning gold or silver.

Participation in sport is a wonderful thing and everyone should be encouraged to play sport of some kind. However, the reality is that not everyone can reach the top, not everyone can excel. These young men and women have by their performances shown that they have the potential to do just that. Attending camps such as this would perhaps give them the motivation, desire and pathway to achieve that goal.

Saturday commenced with an overview of the weekend's program, distribution of the training diary, followed by measuring and patterning of each gun. Each pattern was assessed and advice given as to the implications of the results. This subject raised so much interest that a full session was devoted to the implications of patterns and how it affects one's shooting.

The sports scientists were kept busy all day with sessions by Sean on psychology, including individual consultations with each athlete, Nick with fitness, warm ups and exercise, Lisa on nutrition and general healthy lifestyle and Bianca and Pete videoing the athletes on the range.

Adam, Greg, Valeriy and Gleniss were kept busy with the practical coaching and video reviews while back in the kitchen Mandy and Anne were cooking up a storm to feed the masses breakfast, lunch and dinner. Mandy's morning and afternoon snacks were also worthy of 5 star rating.

Saturday evening after dinner a group session was held with Greg outlining the pathway for the group to embark upon. The message that came from it was that AISL is prepared to assist the athletes in any way it can, but the athletes themselves must have the desire, motivation and most of all the commitment to want to succeed. So many want to have the results without putting in the effort. That is never going to work, and the aim of these camps is to show the kids that it can happen if they are prepared to make sacrifices and put in.

Sunday was competition day. Each discipline shot a 75 target plus final. This was held to see if they could put into practice anything they may have learnt. Results of this competition is inconsequential, it is more about seeing if the athlete is at least trying some of the suggestions made to improve their technique, including their mental game.

Results of the hydration testing was made known with some of the athletes receiving a surprise to find out how dehydrated they actually were and the consequences of their condition.

Travel strategies were discussed to assist those travelling to overseas competitions and giving them an insight as how to

Entry

Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2007 registered shooter record book before nominating.

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on November 18, 2007 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on November 18, 2007 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors – are those who, on November 18, 2007 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and may be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20gauge Championship and National Champion of Champions, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20gauge Championship and Champion of Champions Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is

correctly classified - and indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to skeet grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the sponsorship received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets or tokens may be purchased at the event office.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub Juniors. Reduced Nominations shall also apply to partners, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as the member paying full nomination fees.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NSWCTA TRAP CARNIVAL

In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the Carnival. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 1. Squads of 5 or 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Handicap event qualifying will be shot 5 targets per lane. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 2. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 3. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 4. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 5. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee, check referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 6. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
 - All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 7. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 8. When team selection is involved, Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior men are eligible for selection in Mens, but can only compete in Mens team or Section team not both. Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior Women are eligible for selection in Womens, but can only compete in Womens team or Section team not both.
- 9. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 10. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am, or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 11. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the NSWCTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 12. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 13. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors & Sub Juniors only.
- 14. All High Gun Shoot Offs will be conducted Points Score from 18m squad rotating, Miss and Out.
- 15. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence. LICENCES/PER-MITS (DUPLICATES NOT ALLOWED) MUST BE SHOWN AT TIME OF NOMINATING TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOOT.
- 16. Club Teams Event 5 competitors affiliated through same club entry fee \$15 per team all monies returned to prize pool split if tied.






Both loaded cartridges and the components are produced at Nanclares de la Oca, the cases starting life as sacks of raw polyethelene and brass plated steel strip. Extruding machines stretching into the distance turn

plastic chips into tubing, while stamping machines form flat steel into the heads. This is a progressive operation, six stages being required for the deepest. Heads, base wads, primers and tubes are then combined, ready either for the loading machines or for sale to other companies.

Our next stop was something of a let down. A line of ancient loading machines, of the type you find anywhere, cranked out smallgauge loads at a pace best described as sedate. This was not the high-tech marvel I was expecting. "This is just the short run production for specialist lines", said production manager Antonio Fernandez. "My 12-gauge lines are wonderful but I can't show you those." It would appear that in the ever present search for speed and efficiency - vital in a market where profit margins are paper thin -UEE has come up with some very clever tweaks that their competitors haven't thought of yet.

Were they about to let a big mouth journalist with a camera anywhere near – no they were not!

They were happy however to show me the QC and testing facility, where production is constantly monitored and new ideas are tried out. It comprises a indoor range equipped with three test barrels and a sophisticated array of chronographs, piezoelectric pressure sensors and associated computer hardware. When each new production run is started, a sample of ten shells is tested against the standard specifications. Only when they are confirmed as within the specification can the line start running. The same checks are made at shift changes and the target range of variation from the nominal is impressively small. In any cartridge it is consistency that is most important. Chamber pressure is obviously one of the key measurements for any loader, primarily from a safety point of

view. When a new load is developed the pressure is controlled principally with the powder type and dose and also wad design. The center section of a modern wad has a vital role to play because the rate and extent to which it collapses will have a direct bearing on the maximum pressure generated. The QC checking picks up production related problems that can also impact on pressure, notably crimps that are too deep or closed too firmly. Velocities are measured at one and ten yards (meters), the European standard figures. A photo cell also measures 'barrel time' - the elapsed time from the firing pin striking the primer to the ejecta leaving the barrel.

The range also provides the facility for pattern testing at any given range, with paper rolls allowing a number of shots to be fired in quick succession for later analysis. It was reassuring in amongst all this technology however to see the familiar 30 inch circle grid and manual counting. "The most boring job in the world", said Antonio, "I've done thousands!"

Prime movers

The Galdacano facility also makes the UEE-G primers for both UEE's production and outside customers and this small component is the result of some clever chemistry and impressive quality control procedures, all under the watchful eye of production manager Jose Luis Uriarte.

Each primer is formed from three separate brass parts – the outer case, the cap which holds the explosive material and an internal part called the anvil. These are all made in the same department of the cartridge loading factory that produces the brass heads for cases. The detonating mixture is very sensitive and both the temperature at which it burns and the shape of the flame are crucial elements in cartridge performance. Because of the dangers of handling it in bulk, the mixture is kept wet throughout the production process in a solution of PVA glue, drying of the finished product being the final step. All the processes that involve handling the mixture also take place over a water bath to keep the humidity levels high.

After filling the caps, they are covered with paper – and paper is also used to cover the flame hole in the outer case. The anvil (which transmits the force of the firing pin to create detonation) is dropped into the case and the case and cap are pressed together.

Although the production process is relatively lowtech, the QC checks are anything but. For example, the depth of the anvil within the outer case is crucial to proper performance and the tolerances are very small. An optical device scans every single case. Any that are outside of these tolerances are marked with a blob of dye and replaced.

Each batch is tested for pressure and also for ignition sensitivity with a weight dropped from varying heights. "Everyone knows when a primer does not work", said Uriarte "It either goes bang or it doesn't! And even when the gun is at fault, the primer gets the blame. We have to set the tolerances so that we get 100% 'go' from a normal primer strike without compromising safety in any way. Cartridges have to be safe to handle and carry in your pocket."

Rio brand type 209 primers have recently been introduced to the American market in new packs of 100 for home loaders.



We had an interesting discussion about shot hardness and antimony levels and the current 'more must be better' trend. Antonio's view is firmly that 3% antimony is the most cost effective level. "Our tests show that the results from using 5% antimony are only marginally better and beyond that it is a waste of time. The antimony does not mix properly and density suffers, sacrificing down range energy. What many people don't realize is that the way the shot is made is also important; shot made by the 'long drop' tower method is, in our experience, harder and more consistently spherical, so a 3% antimony shot made in this way could be superior to another with 5%."

The latest product from Rio is the new Star Shot Silver, a one ounce load with highly polished shot that has been developed especially for sporting clays and particularly the new FITASC 28 gram (10z) rule.

UEE's long term commitment to the US market is clear. They may have been late arriving but they intend to stay around a long time. Rio Ammunition Inc. has been established with a base in Houston since 2002 to handle the Rio brand and of course UEE are also the producers of the Kemen range of target loads. Despite the difficult dollar-euro exchange rate, the Rio division is on track to sell over 30 million shells in the US this year. In addition to the target loads they are extending the hunting and law enforcement ranges, as well as making those fine components available to reloaders. As one of so few totally integrated manufacturers they have both the know-how and the resources to get it right.

GST RULING AS IT EFFECTS SPORTING EVENTS

For those Clubs who are registered for GST or for those of you who are just interested, we are aware of a Goods & Services Tax (GST) Ruling regarding the payment of Cash Prizes that we believe to be relevant to our sport.

We hope that you find the following to be relevant and of interest.

The Goods and Services Tax Ruling - GSTR2002/3 - states the following:

Income deemed as Taxable Supply:

- * By accepting an entry into an event, the event holder is supplying the right to participate in the event.
- Participants may be required to formally enter by completing an entry form and paying an entry fee.
- * The supply of a right to participate may contain a contingent right to a prize.
- To claim the prize a participant must provide something additional to the entry fee, that is, participation or performance in the event.
- * An entry fee is the taxable supply of the right to participate and is therefore subject to GST.
 - eg: If an entrant pays \$60 entry fee to participate, the price of the supply is \$60, and therefore \$5.45 GST is payable.

Prizes deemed as Non-Taxable Supply:

A Cash prize is classed as GST free (therefore an input tax credit cannot be claimed) because or if:

The winner is unregistered, and/or the participation has no market value i.e. The winner is not participating in the course or furtherance of an enterprise they carry on.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

With all our facilities available we were able to start close to the nominated time with Five Stand, Skeet and DTL all running simultaneously with shooters from the previous squad backing up as referees and scorers. 
Finally we would like to recognise those who helped make this shoot a success.




