NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S NOTES John Mack



Over the last five years, our member clubs have signed up more than 8,700 new members to our association a tremendous effort on their behalf with every year showing a steadily increasing number. Currently our total membership stands at just over 12,200, with this information you may be lead to believe that our membership is growing at a rapid rate! However our membership retention is very low over the same period our membership has grown by little more than 1,000, there would be varied reasons for members wishing not to re-join our association, times have changed and your association needs to change and adapt with the times.

With over 1,200 members failing to re-join every year your national executive must attend to this issue, currently your national membership fees are collected for the association by the clubs and we rely on voluntary officials to be pro-active in chasing late membership fees. At this year's, National Executive Meeting a decision was made to write to 25 of our clubs inviting them to forward a copy of their club membership fees to which the national office would personally write to members of each of these clubs who had not renewed their membership. The outcome of this sample would then determine how the national executive would proceed, surprisingly only 50% of those clubs responded to this offer!

The association four years ago to entice new members to our association introduced club level membership. This has proven successful with nearly 400 members joining at this level last year. My thoughts are that this level of membership should be made available to our existing members who for whatever reason wish to stay as members but would prefer this level of membership to continue enjoying their chosen sport, this I believe would be a positive step to retain existing members.

In next months, issue of CTSN our chairperson of Membership Growth and Services Mr. Allan Kenny will outline his committee's future policies including Club Only memberships.

On a more positive note you will see in this month's issue an open day being held at Melbourne Gun Club on October 14th this is available to "Ladies Only" the organiser of this event which is being widely promoted is Beretta Australia. Representatives of the National Executive will be in attendance to answer questions and put interested persons in touch with their nearest club, I commend Berreta Australia for their vision, which will benefit the sport of clay target shooting as a whole.

Australian Clay Target Shooting News

FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

At time of preparing this report it is mid August and I am pleased to advise that the inaugural ACTA Board Meeting occurred on July 31st in a meeting room at Melbourne Airport, which was the lowest cost location at which the President, the 5 Board Members, I and the new National Executive Officer, Carrie Elton could assemble.

That was an all-day meeting which examined and actioned all of the key issues of the Association. As a result of that meeting I remain of the view that the increased governance that will result from 2 month-ly meetings of the Board will be of great benefit to us all, and all aspects of our operations will be enhanced and tightened up.

That meeting also gave Carrie the chance to meet all Board Members and to contribute on all issues so that she will start with the Association on September 3rd with a greater awareness of our key issues.

Over the past month we have undertaken a major review of our 2007 Accounts and the Budget to the end of 2007, together with the preparation of an exhaustive budget for the 2008 Trap Nationals. Both of those budgets are being worked through by the Finance Committee at time of writing.

During the past 2 months we have also undertaken a complete review of the set-up of all of the Skeet and Trap layouts on the National Grounds. This has involved greater diligence in the set-up and tuning of all of the traps and I am pleased to report that I believe that we are now throwing greatly improved and more consistent targets than has been the case in the past. In my view our Mattarelli Traps are throwing excellent singles and doubles in both Skeet and Trap and I predict that scores will now greatly improve during all future competitions. I would like to thank John Mack, Ron Traill, Dave Jocelyn and Fred Rapley for their time, assistance, guidance and input to this process. The 1st to benefit will be the Wagga and Downside clubs which both shoot monthly on the National Ground and almost immediately thereafter will be the NSW Clay Target Association who will hire the National Ground for the NSW Skeet Championship mid August and then the NSW Trap Championship at end September.

I can't wait to see what the improvement will be to the scores and the competitor satisfaction levels at the 2007 National Skeet Titles in November and then at the 2008 National Trap Carnival next March/April.

No matter what discipline of the Clay Target Sports is your passion, and no matter what your grade or experience level, I urge all members to consider attending your National Championships. All of the Nationals are graded competitions, so they are not just events for the elite shooters. You shoot in your grade and have the chance to also win overall and meet + mingle with some of the best in the Country. It is therefore a great learning experience as well as a heap of fun and you can guarantee that your shooting or approach to the sport will improve in some way as a result.

For the 2008 Trap Nationals you will see a separate call in this issue of CTSN for "Expressions of Interest" with regard to possible attendance, and coaching being available from, Leo Harrison III.

I couldn't leave this position without acknowledging and addressing the hornet's nest that I kicked with a few of you with regard to my column about OH&S obligations.

My previous column came from a desire by the ACTA to adopt "best practice" on OHRS issues and it is certainly true that we have employees where the spotlight possibly shines brighter than it does for many of our Clubs which are staffed by unpaid volunteers.

However there is also a community expectation that good practices and a reasonable level of training will be given to all volunteers and staff. It is overstating the present position, but to make a point I say to you all that it is obviously no longer acceptable to use club members below "shooting-age" children to sit in the trap house all day and manually load the old non-hoper fed traps like many of us used to do on a regular basis not so long ago.

Similarly, I contend that it is no longer acceptable to have club members undertake activities that may carry any possible level of risk unless they are given reasonable training and unless a reasonable attempt is made by clubs to identify hazards and take steps to mitigate against them.

A couple of you have called Work Cover in NSW and advised us that Work Cover have no interest in volunteer organizations, so I have taken this up again with the ACTA's advisor who provided the following summarized response:

The intention of the management system and advice provided to, and adopted by, the ACTA was to offer our employees, visitors and competitors a safe and healthy environment in which to work and compete, as required by NSW legislation. As stated in the ACTA's Policy Statement, we want to move beyond minimum compliance with the legislation and develop a culture which actively promotes safety in the workplace and on our grounds for all visitors and competitors.

It is strictly correct, as a couple of our members have advised, that the OH&S Act 2000 does not apply to workplaces staffed by volunteer labour. Work Cover would probably attend in the event of an accident, but would probably not take court action. However, an injured person or an Insurer still has the right to seek redress through other means in the event of an accident and the NSW OHS Regulation 2000 (and similar instruments in the other states) is the only specific compendium of safety rules that is available for governance of safety in the workplace (or at our Clubs). In the event of an injury, the distinction between an action brought by Work Cover in the Industrial Court or by some other entity in the civil court is possibly irrelevant when considering a Club's financial and ongoing position.

With the above point in mind, it would appear to be unwise for our affiliated clubs to disregard any reference to the OH&S Act. The approach of the NSW OH&S legislation (and that of the other states as well) is to manage workplace safety by a process of hazard identification, risk assessment and risk control, overlaid by a comprehensive process of consultation and record keeping. It seems to me to be wise to promote this process to our affiliates, rather than to ignore it.

A couple of our members have also made the point that minor maintenance of a trap might not be "construction work" under the Act, however many other activities such as the use of a range of power tools and equipment to, say, remove or undertake substantial disassembly of a trap, to construct a new fence or other item on your range, or carry out maintenance work on their buildings would be regarded as "construction work".

The NSW "White Card", while perhaps not strictly technically required in these circumstances, is still the only entry level training for such activities that is available. Again, it seems wise and conservative to suggest that affiliated clubs consider this basic entry level induction training for any members who are undertaking what may be considered as "Construction" on your grounds, if for no other reason that it provides evidence of the club's duty of care towards its members.

In closing on this issue, the ACTA are not being prescriptive on this matter and each Club can make their own judgements on how they want to treat this subject. If the recent feedback is accurate some of you may choose to ignore advice of this nature. That is your call, however good management demands that you also consider the possible downside in the event of an accident on your grounds and I make no apology for bringing this to your attention.



AISL HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM STRUCTURE



Member State Level Talent Identification Programs

Member State Level Development Squads

(top 2 or 3 in each discipline/event within State)

Qualification: achieving or close (with improving trend) to MQS levels

Benefits: 4 weekend training camps, partially funded, run by Member coaches

Responsibilities: Maintain training records, attend majority of organised training events and own state and national championships

Member National Development Squads

(top 5 or 6 in each discipline/event from state squads)

Qualification: achieving Performance Qualification Score (PQS) in fair conditions

Benefits: 1 or 2 broad focus training camps, up to 4 days, partially funded with AISL high performance coach(s) in attendance. May attend International events either as MQS only or development

Responsibilities: Maintain training records, attend major selection events. Develop training plan. Adherence to the anti-doping policy.

AISL Elite Squad

(1 or 2 for each discipline/event)

Qualification: consistently exceed PQS under all conditions

Benefits: Open access to AISL high performance coaches etc, substantially funded team membership to selected overseas events, discretionary funding where athlete wishes to attend other overseas events for experience.

Responsibilities: Maintain performance levels; demonstrate necessary commitment to training etc.

OVERVIEW

The structure adopts a bottom down view of sports development; that is rather than a pyramid supporting the elite few, it is a filtering or distillation process to identify, develop and support the most skilled athletes. Each of AISL Members will have very differing membership bases but in this model that is not a significant factor other than increasing competition to select the best available in each discipline. In other words, the size of Member membership will not greatly impact allocation of funds.

In an ideal world funding should extend as far as possible to the 'grass roots' but there is an obvious dilution effect in applying this principle. Accordingly, focus may/should be on developing coaching expertise at state/club level rather than funding athletes below state development squad level. In general state coaches should be funded to travel to regional venues to identify potential for the state development squads rather than funding athlete travel to a central venue. Talent identification should be a duty for the Member bodies who should also pursue the numerous other channels for funding at State level.

State development squads should be the breeding ground for athletes aspiring to representative honours and a prerequisite for moving on to the AISL squad.

Any athlete showing the potential or performance necessary to reach AISL level should then be prepared to in a sense 'part company' with their parent body and regard themselves as a member of an AISL squad with the accompanying responsibilities.

At this level, athletes may well experience conflicts with career, family and other lifestyle issues and AISL must be prepared to discuss these on a case by case basis and demonstrate some flexibility without compromising unduly, the commitment required of an individual who wishes to excel in any field of endeavour.

The highest level is envisaged to be those athletes who are demonstrably (by score) at the peak of achievement within Australia AND are clearly competitive in a world sense. It is unlikely more than 10-12 would achieve this status. Such athletes would be virtually automatic selection for any Australian team.

Funding allocation concepts


Overseas teams are heavy consumers of funds but costs are such that it is unrealistic to expect athletes to carry all costs. The JMC-HPPMC should set policy (see governance below) but athletes should expect

part of the costs to be met by AISL. Members may also provide support to their particular disciplines but care should be taken to avoid 'them and us' situations within the team through differential funding. Possibly AISL should be empowered to levy each Member a 'per capita' team contribution based on the number of team members for the relevant discipline. (An example might be, AISL funding \$3,000: Member funding \$1,200: Athlete contribution \$800).

Currently, we are all riding on the remains of the OAP programme and the athlete performances developed by that programme. The

The attached budget (pictorial) overview entitled Finding London has been agreed as the model, with a boost this year approved for the Olympic Discipline Member bodies to \$35k each.

Membership of the AISL squad does not automatically mean attendance at events. Actual team selection will be dependent on events, not all disciplines may compete or there may be other factors. AISL has a selection panel which includes representation by the HPM.

Joint Management Committee and the HPerformance Program Management Committee

The JMC has a role to play in setting policy covering the AISL squads, resolves high level issues that may arise, approves attendance by AISL teams subject to advice from the HPPMC, provide the HPPMC with Member views etc and contribute the in depth information required to support funding requests. The JMC is also charged with monitoring the effectiveness of Member level development programmes and key performance indicators relevant to the AISL squad.

Structure

A separate specific purpose committee is justified because of the importance of athlete development as part of AISL's duties compared to other administrative issues.

Adam Vella Shoots to Number 1 on World Rankings

Adam's consistent form on the international World Cup circuit this year has seen his ranking jump to number one in ISSF Trap.

He started the season by winning silver in the Dominican Republic with a great 121 + 23, 14th in Korea on 116, silver in Lonato Italy with 121 + 21 and finally 12th in Slovenia on 119.



Apart from his bronze medal in trap at the Athens Olympics this is Adam's best season since 2003 in which he became the only clay target shooter ever to hold the number one world ranking in two disciplines (ISSF trap and double trap) at the same time.

As a member of the AISL's High Performance Squad no one is working harder than Adam to continually improve his physical and mental fitness and leaving no stone unturned in striving to find that one extra target that can mean everything.

As this goes to print Adam will be competing at the World Championships in Cyprus, followed by the World Cup Final in Belgrade in October then the all important Beijing Olympic selection trials back here in Australia.

If form is any indication, Adam is on track to improve on his Athens bronze medal.







Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

DON'T BE DISTRACTED BY YOUR SCORE

In last month's article I explored the internal and external distractions that prevent us from staying focused and performing well. This month I want to explore this concept further, especially with respect to your score.

There was a very interesting article in the May 2007 issue of the UK magazine Clay Shooting, by Mark Brownlee called "The Ultimate Question". For Mark the ultimate question relates to our score: "How did you do?" or "What did you shoot?" Brownlee sees this question or one of its many forms as a significant internal distraction because it forces us to make judgements about our performance and focuses our attention away from the present and back to past performances that may not have been as good.

So when we are asked "How did we do?" how does our mind respond?

Firstly, as a response to the question, a thought forms in the conscious mind; the number, that is your score. What happens then is we focus on the number and not some of the many variables that may have gone to make up that number. For example, we may have been ill before the event. We may have had a near miss in the traffic on the way to the competition there may have been foul weather, etc. Given some of the external distractions and variables, this score may have been quite good.

Secondly, the thought is analysed and comparisons are made with other numbers or score provided by past experiences, present conversations or by the scoreboard.

Thirdly, the number is perceived to be good or bad.

Next, the mental perception stimulates glands to secrete hormones that change your mental and physical state, and finally, as I have stated in many previous articles, these thoughts create self-doubt, anxiety, fear and stress and as a result our muscles tense up and we shoot poorly.

Brownlee also states that the "How did you do" question, has another side in that it you invariably find out how someone else did. Hearing how others performed may lead you to make further judgements about your own score, your performance or even your self worth. This preoccupation with numbers can set in motion negative and performance-killing thinking. These thoughts take you away from thinking about the here and now and being able to focus all your attention on the target you are shooting. To be in the zone you need

Pre Nomination Forms for the Skeet National Championships are available from the website or the National Office to focus on the present. Responding to the "How did you go question" either focuses your attention on the past or takes your attention to the future; either way you are no longer in the present. By avoiding the "number", according to Brownlee, you keep yourself in the present and are more likely to enter the zone.

Knowing that this "How did you do" question has hidden dangers that will keep you from staying focused, what can be done to prevent it from affecting your performance?

Firstly, you need to know what the question is actually asking. Whilst the normal response to the question is a number, what does the number really mean? According to Brownlee, it is supposed to be a result: but a result of what. A possible, eg 25/25 is more than just a number. It is an indication that you were able to stay focused on what you had to do. It also means that you were more focused on the present and were not distracted by the past or the future. It may also mean that you were able to stay focused on the process of shooting and finally it is a good measure of how well you were able to follow your mental skills plan. A score of 19/25 may not mean that you didn't shoot well (because the 19 you hit may have been shot very well) it may mean that you were not able to remain focused, or control your breathing, anxiety or level of arousal. How many times have you heard someone say; "I only shot 23 but the one I shot I was hitting well." The flipside to this comment could be something like; "I wasn't able to stay focused for the whole round" or I just thought of the wrong thing" or "I was doing well and then I remembered I always shoot bad at this ground".

So what is the question, "how did you go" really asking? Is it asking "how well did you do the following?"

- a. use your vision skills,
- b. control your breathing,
- c. control your muscle tension,
- d. refocus your attention after a distraction,
- e. quieten your mind,
- f. control your emotions, and
- g. maintain an unwavering belief in your own abilities.

So, if this is what is really being asked, why reply with a number. By replying in a way that doesn't focus on the number, will keep you in the here and now and will avoid letting you make poor judgements about your ability, performance or self worth. By not caring about your score you are likely to be more confident, composed and focused. What you score this round will have no bearing on what you will score next round, next week, next month or next year.

By not focusing on the number what will happen? Firstly, you will let go of the good versus bad judgements about your performance. Secondly you will stay in the here and now. Next, you will stay focused on the process of what you are actually doing, feeling and thinking. Finally, you will be getting rid on the internal distractions that prevent you from being in the zone.

Dear Your Say

ACTA Handicap Shooting - a Proposal for Improvement

Introduction

I believe that the existing ACTA Handicap System does not work, and needs to be replaced. Rather than just criticise, this letter will provide suggestions on creating a system that does work.

Firstly, let us address the reason for a handicap. Put simply, it is to "equalise the competitors". This is not achieved by handicapping a shooter beyond his ability.

Definitions of Handicap

The following dictionary definitions of handicap are given, sourced from the web.

1) "A race or contest in which advantages or compensations are given to different contestants to equalise the chances of winning". Source: The American Heritage [®] Dictionary of the English Language, Fourth Edition copyright [©]2000.

2) "Advantage given to a competitor to equalise chances of winning".

Source WordNet ® 2.0, © 2003 Princeton University

3) "Put at a disadvantage". Source WordNet © 2.0, © 2003 Princeton University

The following Encyclopaedia definitions also assist:- Handicapping (http://www.reference.com/browse//wiki/Handicapping)

"Handicapping, in sport or games, is the practice of assigning advantage through scoring compensation or other advantage given to different contestants to equalise the chances of winning."

"In principle, a more experienced player is disadvantaged in order to make it possible for a less experienced player to participate in the game or sport whilst maintaining fairness".

My own analogy is that if all horses in a race are correctly handicapped, and all perform to their abilities, every horse would cross the finishing line at the one time. It is the extra performance that creates the winner, and it is failure to perform that gives the stragglers.

Discussion

The system to be used for handicapping shooters should therefore be based on equalising the chances of winning. It must therefore be based only on performance from the handicap mark.

The failed ACTA system is based on performance of shooters at the 15 metre Common Mark. It has no relevance to shooting from Handicap marks. It takes no account of the ability of a shooter at another, more distant mark.

When the ACTA made the decision to impose a two metre difference between each grade, two errors were made.

a) this created a large metreage spread, and

b) this minimum was made mandatory, with no provision for inability to perform at that mark. While one can be re-handicapped

backward for outstanding performance, there is no provision for forward movement based on inability to perform at the minimum metreage mark assigned to your grade.

Each of us wants to be competitive, and that is not the case with the present system. There is resentment at a perceived waste of nomination money, and wasted ammunition.

Proposed Solution

I want to address the solution in two parts, firstly to describe a better system, and secondly on how to deal with the transition from the existing system.

New System

1) If we were introducing Handicap for the first time, and no competitor had an existing Handicap mark, I would suggest initially (and once only) assign shooters to the following metreage marks, based on their Common Mark performance:-

11 m "C" Grade

16 m "B" Grade (or has shot 50/50 from 15 metres Common Mark) 17 m "A" Grade

18 m "AA" Grade (or has shot 25/25 from 18 metres)

No minimum metreage should apply after this initial Handicap assignment, with forward and backward movement being defined solely by performance at the Handicap mark.

2) Re-handicap shooters after 100 targets (qualifying event minimum of 25 targets).

3) Forward movement

After two consecutive groups of 100 targets, where the shooter has not shot 25/25 or 49/50 in any qualifying event,

Handicap percentage is less than 90% 1.0 metre forward

Maximum forward movement in one calendar year of 1.0 metre.

4) Backward Movement

No backward movement will be applied where the shooter has not shot 25/25 or 49/50 from his Handicap mark, other than:-

a) Where a shooter shoots 50/50 from 15 metres, his handicap is to be a minimum of 16 metres

b) Where a shooter shoots 25/25 from 18 metres, his handicap is to be a minimum of 18 metres.

Backward movement will apply: where the shooter has shot 25/25 or 49/50 1/2 metre and also (irrespective of score) where

i) Prize Money won exceeds \$100 to: 1/2 metre
ii) Prize Money won exceeds \$200 to: 1.0 metres
iii) Prize Money won exceeds \$500 to: 1.5 metres
iv) Prize Money won exceeds \$1,000 to: 2.0 metres

Prize money is defined as 100% for cash, and 85% of Recommended Retail for goods.

The shooter's card is to be ruled off at any handicap change, and the 200 targets will then restart.

5) Minimum Metreage Mark 11 metres


6) Maximum Metreage Mark 25 metres

Transition from Existing ACTA Handicap System

As each shooter has an existing ACTA Handicap Mark, there would need to be a transition to the new system.

Any earned metreage above the minimum applied under the existing handicapping formula will remain (ie A grade shooter, with earned metreage of 20, would remain at 20 metres).

Each shooter must apply to be re-handicapped by the Club Secretary / Handicapper. Any shooter not applying for re-handicap accepts his current Handicap mark.



You are the referee of a squad in a double barrel event in which a shooter has had three malfunctions. You have warned him that any further malfunctions will result in the loss of targets in each instance. You also correctly advise him that he has 5 minutes to get a new gun or cartridges or that he may be resquadded. If it was a shoot off you would have advised him that he had 10 minutes to replace the gun or cartridges.

The shooter must be able to justify his claim based on his Handicap card(s).

Based on the shooter's ACTA Handicap card(s), the Handicapper would:-

a) Reassign the shooter to the mark in 1) above, where the shooter has not shot 25/25 or 49/50 from any metreage mark.

b) Where the shooter has shot 25/25 or 49/50 from a handicap mark, apply the formula in 4) above to that mark.

c) Any new Handicap would then be reported to the ACTA on the standard Handicap Return.

Conclusion

A shooter's metreage mark should be defined by performance at that metreage mark and not, after initial handicap assignment, by their ACTA Common Mark Grade.

I estimate that within two years ACTA shooters will find their true metreage marks, based on performance at the mark.

Shooters who perform well, who are able to shoot 25/25 or 49/50 in qualifying and more in any shoot off, have proven their ability, will be re-handicapped accordingly. Conversely, shooters who are unable to perform to a minimum of 90% over 200 targets will be re-handicapped forward one metre per calendar year, allowing them to shoot from a more forgiving handicap mark. This is both fair and equitable, which is the objective of a true handicap system.

Shooters who are able to perform at 25 metres are to be admired and praised, and it should be the aim of all of us to reach that mark. These shooters are true champions, and the rest of us have lesser handicap marks to compensate!


The shooter decides that he will remain and take his chances and after a while he fires at a target and breaks it with his first barrel. He then tries to fire at a target piece and has a malfunction, his fourth. After some difficulty he manages to get his gun working again and the squad has been held up for a couple of minutes. What do you rule?

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you rule "one" you would be correct.

Clearly, the shooter has broken the target. The malfunction (his fourth) although annoying, happened after he had broken the target and he is entitle to claim that target. Naturally, had he missed the target with this first barrel and had the malfunction on his second barrel then the target would have been lost.

Although Rule 1.10(f) is specific it does not operate to include a malfunction where a target has been broken. For instance, if a shooter hits say 10 targets straight with his first barrel and each time he fires at a piece and has a malfunction on the second barrel, none of those malfunctions are counted. It is only meant to operate where his malfunction precludes him from breaking the target and of course only after he has had three malfunctions.

RULE CHANGES

APPLICABLE 1st JANUARY 2008

- 1) Rule 2.01(a) amended by deleting the words "Mackintosh events" from the note.
- Rule 2.01(h) amended by deleting the words "one (1)" from the third sentence.
- 3) Change the current grading system by the implementation of a running percentage, calculated after each 200 targets.

Add to end of Rules 2.01(h).

Process of percentage calculation

(i) Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded, the percentage shall be calculated

This shall be known as the 200 target percentage. (example 215 / 225 = 95.6%)

- (ii) This 200 target percentage figure shall be recorded in the percentage column above the ruled off line.
- (iii) This 200 target percentage shall be added to the previously recorded grading percentage and halved

This shall determine and be known as the grading percentage. This is the percentage that shall be used for determining the shooters grade. (example previous grading % 97.2 - 200 target % 96.5 - (97.2 + 95.6) divided by 2 = new grading % 96.4).

- (iv) This grading percentage shall be recorded in the percentage column below the ruled off line.
- 4) ACTA will adopt the NSSA rules (Procedures and Field/Trap Settings) in their entirety to conform to other skeet shooting nations.

This requires the deletion of the last two sentences of Rule 1.25(g) starting "However" and ending with "house.".

- 5) Recommendation to implement from now to change the wording in first sentense of Rule 1.02(j) to read: All competitors shall change lanes as per event conditions (eg Single or multiple targets per lane)
- 6) That Rule 4.11 is amended immediately to read: Automatic traps are strongly recommended for all disciplines.


