During the 2007 full executive meeting held at our national office, Mr. Mark McInnes was officially appointed as the A.C.T.A.'s historian. Mark has been active at all levels in our sport and for several years served NSW on the National Executive. Marks passion other than for rules is the history of our association. Behind the scenes, Mark has formulated and implemented the points system for induction into the A.C.T.A. Hall of Fame for all of our disciplines, this in itself was a huge effort. His research is extensive and I believe Mark has operatives involved in all our states and Territory's forwarding information onto him. Since it's inception in 2004 the Hall of Fame night held during our National Trap Championships has become a popular occasion, I personally have not missed one yet so book your tickets early for this years event.

In February of 2007 the A.C.T.A. was given the role of administering the Mackintosh International Teams Match, to make a Mackintosh team is seen by many as the pinnacle of their years shooting calendar.

The Mackintosh International Trophy was presented by the late Donald Mackintosh of Melbourne and is the prize in the annual trap shooting competition between England, Scotland, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Wales, New Zealand, Canada, South Africa and Australia. This match has been contested for each year excepting the war years between 1940 – 1947.

Since being given the role of administering this event Mark has researched through the A.C.T.A. archives to present the history of this event, as previously stated this event is prized within Australia and New Zealand but over the years has diminished in its importance by some of the competing countries. With Marks enthusiasm this will soon change, during his research we now have the documentation of all those people that have made Mackintosh teams and the years that they have represented Australia in those teams. Mr Doug Smith from Queensland leads the way representing Australia a staggering 29 times!

In closing, our association is blessed with volunteers such as the like of Mark McInnes that give countless hours for the benefit of our chosen sport, make sure as a member you take the time to thank those who serve us well.

2007 Skeet Nationals

Driving and flying, Skeet shooters from every state and territory, and New Zealand, descended on the National Shooting Grounds for the 2007 Skeet Nationals.

Conditions in Wagga Wagga ranged from oppressive 40+ temperatures, to rain and thunderstorms, with the only consistent element throughout being the flies. But even they couldn't dampen the enthusiasm and shooting. There was overwhelming endorsement of the change of date for the event to the cooler (and hopefully flyless) May in 2008.

Shoot Marshall, Sue Pim, did a sterling job of keeping the event running smoothly, and the office staff offered friendly smiles and service throughout the shoot.

Major sponsor Beretta provided valuable sponsorship for the event, which is greatly appreciated, as is the support given by Casella Wines, Rio Oceania and Winchester.

Generally the mood was positive, with a good atmosphere building as the event progressed. This year a fun bush dance with local group the Tin Shed Rattlers was held alongside the shooters BBQ. Mayor Kerry Pascoe, Deputy Mayor Jan Hay and Councillor Kevin Wales formed the official party for the Opening Ceremony, showing Wagga Council's continuing support our sport. Extensive local media coverage was achieved with nightly reports on Television, a package on ABC radio and a range of newspaper reports including a two page spread in the widely read Saturday edition of the Daily Advertiser.

The introduction of the new Canterbury Voice Release systems was somewhat controversial on day one (Pre Nationals), but by the end of the carnival over 85% of shooters rated the system as excellent, and only 8% giving the thumbs down.

82% of attendees rated the overall quality of the event very high to extremely high, 10% were satisfied with the quality of the event with 8% rating it as poor to average.

Positive feedback resulted from the evaluation survey, along with some constructive criticism that the ACTA will be able to take on board to further improve next year's Nationals. You can see more

Survey of Attendees at the ACTA 2007 Skeet Nationals

During the 2007 Skeet Nationals held at the National Grounds in Wagga Wagga from 17th to 24th November, attendees were asked to fill in an evaluation survey of 10 questions to rate the event from a shooting and visitor experience perspective, and provide comments and feedback on what they liked, and what can be improved. Sixty five surveys were returned, giving a sample of half the shooters.

Comments on the carnival, and suggestions for improvement are reflected in the charts and commentaries that follow:

Q1: When asked to rate the **QUALITY OF** THE **OVERALL EVENT**

82% rated the quality of the event very high to extremely high

10% were satisfied with the quality of the event

8% rated the event quality as poor to average.



Q2: When asked to RATE THE TARGETS THROWN AT THE CARNIVAL

28% rated the targets thrown at the carnival as excellent giving a 10 out of 10 score. In total 75% of shooters rated them at 7 out of 10 or better saying

"Too much variance"

"Rate them at 4.5, but the best released ever" "Machines were good. Targets were poor. Service was excellent"

Q3: The rating of IMPORTANCE OF TROPHY value was fairly evenly distributed between those for whom it is important to very important (39%) and those who did not consider it important (35%)

Comments included:

"Need to cover costs" "Its medals and sashes that count" "Glad to see a High Gun Trophy after all this time"



Q4: 62% of attendees rated the PROGRAM OF EVENTS as very good to excellent, with 26% from good to very good. 10% were reasonably happy with the program, and 2% rated it as 3/10.

Suggestions for improvement focused on the length of the carnival and the need for all events shot to carry a National Title.

"Too long a program" "One or two days too long" "On its way to being good. Should be 4 National Titles + Overall" "Need to encourage sub gauge events (National Titles)"

Q5: 53% of attendees gave the CONDUCT OF EVENT AND STAFF A 10/10, with 87% of shooters rating between very good to excellent.

"Maybe somewhat inexperienced, but sure to improve"

Survey of Attendees at the ACTA 2007 Skeet Nationals

Q6: When asked to RATE THE FACILITIES PROVIDED AT THE NATIONAL GROUNDS 57% rated them as very good to excellent, and a further 34% between good to very good.

There were a number of suggestions for improvement including the need for more shade and seating, canteen facilities and an extension to fences to allow for resetting of targets without stopping adjoining layouts.

Other comments included:

"Clean, well set out"

"Need side fences and gun rack at each field" "More powered/water camp sites and clothes washing & drying facilities"

"Facilities are fabulous - clean, never run out of hot water"

"More showers and toilets on other end of grounds"



Q7: Attendees were divided regarding THE EVENT CATERING with 48% rating catering from a 6/10 to 10/10 and 52% rating it from 1/10 to 5/10.

Some comments and suggestions included:

"Quality good, but expensive" "Some foods were running out early"

"10/10 for barbeque

"Drinks warm. Outdoor eating = flies"

"Should be in the club house" "A bit on the high priced side, need more choice"

Q8: The introduction of the new VOICE RELEASE SYSTEM appeared to be controversial, but 44% gave it top marks (10/10) and another 16% marked it at 9/10. In all 85% rated the Voice Release System as very good to excellent. 8% Disliked the system giving a score of 1/10 and a further 7% rated it from 3 to 5/10

Comments ranged from

"Excellent!"

"Best targets I've ever shot"

"It is the future"

"I think the voice release was great. It just needs fine tuning on some stations", to

"Few hiccups, but nothing that can't be fixed"

"Good in theory - needs improvement should not be introduced at Nationals" "One of the worst developments in skeet shooting"



Q9: 90% of attendees indicated they are very likely to, or definitely will, ENCOURAGE OTHERS TO ATTEND NEXT YEAR'S CARNIVAL, with 5% stating they are most unlikely to.

Reasons range from:

students attending on that day, and yet the coaches were up to the task, being able to give every boy or girl individual coaching at shot gunning. After the initial tuition, the task applied to the students was to shoot five Skeet low house targets, then move to the Trap layout, to shoot another five, set up as straight away targets, all in single barrel mode. And with the more than usual visit time allocated, numerous students lined up to shoot at another ten targets, having raised their enthusiasm by scoring well initially. Most of the teachers in attendance also tried their hand at the sport, with results favouring the good side.

Surprisingly, with year seven students being younger and of smaller stature than their elders, the coaches were worried that they would have so much trouble holding up the heavy shotguns, that they would have trouble hitting any targets at all, and yet it was almost an 100% result, as far as some targets being shot by all students. In some part the purchase by the club of special low velocity, low recoil cartridges, solely for these coaching clinics, most probably aided the result.

Without writing up all scores, the top scorers for each school are as follows, Kyabram Secondary College, Best Girl, Olivia Comelli 6/10 and 8/10, equal Best Boys, Jack Hepburn 8/10, and Kurt Northausen 8/10. Saint Augustines P10 School, Best Boy, Stephen Drake 8/10 and 6/10. Echuca College, Best Girl, Amanda Carrington 7/10, Best Boy, William Irish-Moysey an excellent full score of 10/10, well shot William, the only possible score, also shooting an 8/10 score, on his additional ten targets.

A thank you must go to the club members, who donate their time and effort to make these clinics a success, and also to the schools and school teachers, for taking an interest in the sport of Clav Target Shooting, and lastly to the students, for not only participating, but for obviously paying attention to the coaches, to help themselves achieve such good results.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

CONFIDENCE

Several articles last year examined the idea of mental toughness, which is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. I outlined seven characteristics of mental toughness; being competitive, confident, in control, committed, composed, courageous and consistent.

I have already examined what is necessary for composure and this month I want to explore confidence. So what is self-confidence? Patrick Cohn from Peaksports defines self-confidence as how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task. Confidence, according to Cohn, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training, and preparation. As your competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training and quality practice.

The following is a list of sources of self confidence. Rank the following from 1 to 10 (adding others if I have missed an important aspect of your own)

- Past successes in your sport
- An effective training program
- Immediate performance
- Positive comments from others
- Supportive people in your life
- Training or quality practice
- Quality coaching
- Optimistic coaching
- Belief in your physical talent
- Your own method or technique
- The quality of your equipment
- Level of your competition
- Warm up routine
- Comfort with the environment
- Mental preparation
- Performance review
- Mental game coaching
- Coping well under pressure
- Good teamwork
- Positive rapport with teammates
- Positive rapport with coach
- Trust in teammates
- Sports diet, hydration, etc
- Fitness level or conditioning
- Other sports you have played
- Weather
- Game plan or strategies

On a separate piece of paper, write down the top 5 sources of confidence that are under your control. Focus on what you can control to boost your confidence. Remember that what people say about your performance is not under your control.

Now that you are able to recognize the sources of confidence then it is also important to be able to recognize when confidence is dwindling. The biggest factor limiting confidence is self-doubt. I have written several articles over the years on self-doubt, and if readers need to revise, then go back over old issues or read "The Inner Game of Golf" by Tim Gallwey, which puts the whole idea of self doubt into perspective. Self-doubt is the opposite of self-confidence and it kills momentum, and stops athletes performing well because they are scared they will fail.

Self-doubt can be developed by a set of unhealthy and irrational beliefs about yourself and life in general. These beliefs include the following:

1. Strict expectations: "I can't make any mistakes if I want to win."

What happens here is, is that you try to hard and tense up. You become less fluid and your unable to move and swing the way you should.

- 2. Negative self labels: "I'm a poor finisher." This focuses you mind on negative judgements about past performances and takes you away from the here and now.
- 3. Over-generalisations: "I don't do well on this course." Agaian you are focusing on the past and ignoring what you should be focusing on, which is the present.
- 4. Perfectionism: I need to be perfect. This is impossible and will lead to the following behaviours that will further undermine your self-confidence:
 - Setting unrealistic goals and strict expectations
 - Dwelling on shortcomings and failures
 - Worrying about past mistakes
 - Being too self-critical
 - Comparing yourself to others
 - Overanalyzing your performance
 - Viewing your performance as either good or bad
 - Measuring your self worth against your sporting success
 - Focusing on future gains instead of playing in the present.

Now that you can recognize the sources of self-confidence and you can identify those irrational beliefs that get in the way and produce self-doubt.

Muhammad Ali once said "Champions aren't made in the gym. Champions are made from something they have deep inside them: A desire, a dream, and a vision. They have to have last minute stamina: they have to be a little faster: and they have to have the skill and the will. But the will must be stronger than the skill."

There are five steps to seeing yourself as a winner:

Firstly, write down three positive self-labels that positively describe you in your sport, which you can truly believe.

Secondly, post these descriptions on your mirror, fridge, desktop, etc where you can see them every day.

Thirdly, Strive to identify and discard any negative labels that others have given you or that you have made up yourself. Write them on a piece of paper, crumple the paper, and throw it away with authority.

Next, when speaking to others about yourself or your abilities, use the positive self labels you have formulated with confidence. (Avoid deliberate outward displays of cockiness because people who lack confidence will view it as arrogance.)

Finally Goal: feel cocky on the inside while appearing humble on the inside.

By using the previous five steps, identifying the sources of your confidence and recognizing the negatives that get in the way, you will be on the way to being more self-confident which is an important aspect of mental toughness.

No doubt the prizes on offer were a sound inducement \$1000.00 cash and a genuine 1879 gold sovereign for overall; \$600.00 + sash for first; \$400.00 for second and \$200.00 for third in each grade. As tempting as the prizes were, the great majority of the competitors were there simply because they enjoy shooting old (and new) Side by Side shotguns.

A glance at the nomination forms indicated that shooters came from Newcastle/Lake Macquarie, Hermidale, Upper Hunter, Cooma, Dubbo, Cecil Park, Sydney C.T.C., West Wyalong and Cessnock. It was obvious from the pride in ownership of most of the guns that many were heirlooms and had seen several generations in the one family. Quite a few of the guns had been found in poor to average condition and had been meticulously restored to pristine appearance. The replacement value of some of the more outstanding guns is staggering.

After an early breakfast cooked expertly by Club President Theo Stamoulis, the clubhouse was given over to a display of 36 rare and unique side x side shotguns. These came from the collections of our club members and from other avid collectors. Amongst the treasures on display were a cased pair of Purdeys (consecutive serial numbers); a Guinard (Paris); The William Powell side lock owned and shot by Donald Macintosh, our first Olympic shooting medalist and undoubtedly one of the greatest trap shooters ever seen in Australia; Boss; William Leech side lock; Royal Grade William Greener; made to order William Ford and many more outstanding examples of the very best gunmakers' craft. The value of the guns on display, both monetary and sentimental, would be difficult to estimate.

Prior to commencement of the competition all guns were checked by the Club Armourer, Terry Dawson, to ensure that all safety regulations were met. Some of the older guns, although not nitro proofed, had been sleeved at fair expense. At 10.00 o'clock two shots fired from a 1876 Charles Boswell 10 gauge signalled that competition was about to commence. 50 targets sporting followed by 25 tgts D.T.L and then 25 tgts continental point score made up the program (all shot as one event - 150 points) Thanks to our shoot marshal, Dave Morgan, and Col Harris for setting up an interesting lay–out.

The oldest gun used in competition was 111 years old and the youngest was 3 years old. As in the inaugural shoot the committee members were interested to see how the older guns with fixed field chokes, double triggers and extractors competed against the more modem side x sides with variable chokes, single triggers and ejectors. Last year the older guns came out in front - this year the newer guns moved ahead. Four of the top 10 scores were shot with guns over 50 years old. Perhaps the most visible shooter was our lady entrant, Tere Alexeeff, Dressed immaculately in period costume Tere shot the program with her customary great smile and determination.

As the competitors went out to participate Terry Dawson had the unenviable task of selecting the 'Best Presented Gun'. DAVID HALLAM – A GENTLEMAN



The Bendigo Clay Target Club and the Loddon District Police Trap Club are mourning the loss of one of their favourite members – David Hallam. To say David was a Gentleman is a gross understatement.

David left a positive impression with everyone he came into contact with, and none more so than the members and visitors to Bendigo shooting grounds.

David was an active shooter all his life, commencing his love of the sport on the family farm, "Pinelea" at Hopetoun. This life long involvement in shooting was a legacy of his father and grandfather who

conducted "unofficial" trap competitions for many years on "Pinelea", raising funds for the local church. The opening of the Hopetoun Gun Club saw the end of the shoots on the farm, and with David attending Dookie Agriculture College, shooting was put on hold for some years. On returning from college, David's first priorities were to improve the farm and to establish his family. However he continued to hone his shooting skills on vermin and regular duck shoots, along with Bronzewing shooting at Patchewollock (yes – it was legal when David was a young man!)

Right throughout his life on "Pinelea", David saw a number of clay target traps starting with a very early hand released spring trap through to the "electric sonar triggered rig" (as described by his son, Bernie).

In the late 1980's, David became very involved in the Hopetoun Gun Club and this was where he began to establish his reputation for an insistence on safety at all times. He also enthusiastically began to coach juniors and to support the school shooting programme. He had a simple piece of advice he gave all aspiring champions, "Don't look at the trophies before you shoot, just worry about the target." He was also known for his policy of making the parents very welcome at the club as this would ensure "that they'll bring the kids back."

On retiring, David moved to Bendigo and immediately sought out the local clay target club and to his surprise found there were two clubs he could devote his time to. The Bendigo Clay Target Club and the Loddon District Police Trap Club. He immediately became actively involved in both as a committee man and as a coach. It was at Bendigo he was to finally gain his coaching accreditation. It was here he also began to shoot skeet regularly, and this was to become his preferred discipline. He set a goal to improve his scores and grade and was overjoyed when he finally reached A Grade in both trap and skeet. If only all shooters aspired to reaching their highest potential!

He also continued his involvement in the school shooting

programme and readily took over the running of "Dad's Army". Each Tuesday, David put aside everything else to oversee "Dad's Army" and he continued in this role until such time as his illness prevented him from doing so.

David's passion for making juniors and their parents welcome at Bendigo resulted in many joining the ACTA and a number were to go on to achieve State and National honours. Such was the influence of David.

ERIC VINCENT 19/02/1933-15/11/2007

It is with deep regret that we inform the shooters who knew Eric or had shot with him that he passed away Thursday morning 15th November after a long illness.

I first met Eric in the early 1970's through Skeet shooting at Griffith competing in the Robb & Keenan shield and the Riverina Zone skeet teams. He was always helpful and quick witted, always coming up with a quirky saying to help ease the pressure in these events. He always beat me!!!

He was, at the time of his passing a life member and past President of the Wagga Wagga



Gun Club and had been a member of the Tumut Gun Club also. He was a regular competitor through out the Riverina district & Victoria, and his last shot was fired at a skeet shoot at Albury in January 07, where he took home a couple of B grade trophies.

Reloading was Eric's passion and he had no less than 8 shotshell reloaders set up for all gauges and loads as well as rifle reloaders. He was a "reloader extraordinaire". He was also a very good cook (from his army days) and loved cooking game as a speciality and his sauce making is legendary.

He was a constant companion of Barney Rooke (before his passing) and they would regularly compete at skeet and other forms of clay target shooting in the Riverina.

Eric leaves behind his wife Joan, 3 daughters and 7 grandchildren.

You have just finished refereeing a squad and instructed the shooters to "Unload your guns and check your score". Quite a normal and everyday procedure.

One of the shooters challenges his score. E.g. "I shot a 24 not a 23 as is recorded on the sheet".

IT'S YOUR CALL.

Well if you are looking for a short answer you will be disappointed. Every incident of this nature brings to mind a number of safeguards which you as a referee should have put in place.

Firstly if you have complied with GRTS4 you will have no problem in adjudicating on this challenge. GRTS4 requires you as a referee to have a scorer stand close to you so that you can observe what is recorded on the score sheet. The same rule requires that the scorer observe the targets as a check referee, In the absent then, of a previous challenge at the time the target should or could have been disputed, the score will stand as recorded.

In, addition if a target has been incorrectly called as lost during the event, other squad members would normally indicate if it had been a hit. Here again is evidence that the shooter is not on very safe ground in regards to his claim. Another aspect of the rules which we should bear in mind is that the Referee's decision as to whether a target is hit or missed is absolute and can not be challenged in a jury. Rule 4.20(h).

On the other hand, even though you have not abided by GRTS4 and observe what the scorer has recorded, there are other considerations which you should take into account especially if you had called the result of each shot clearly and loudly as is required of all Referees under Rule 4.22(a). By calling the result of each shot in this manner there would have been opportunities for the shooter to hear the result of each shot. If he hasn't heard the result he is entitled to ask you for the ruling at that time. Those of you who whisper or fail to call at all may well place yourselves in an invidious position should a challenge be forthcoming after the event is concluded.

So there we have it.

1. Have the scorer sit or stand close to you so that you can observe what is recorded.

2. Clearly and loudly announce the result of each shot as it is completed.

You may well save yourself and a shooter some embarrassment and confusion. You should always remember that if you capriciously of unfairly alter the score you could be effectively taking a target from the shooter's contemporaries in the same grade.
