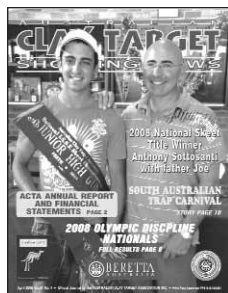

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2007

As the President of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) I am pleased to present my first Annual Report to be tabled at the Annual General Meeting of the Association.

The membership of the ACTA continues to grow and at the end of December 2007 was 12,537 members. This is the highest membership that the ACTA has realised since 1998 and can be attributed to several new initiatives within the organisation and the sport. One of these, the "Beretta Girl Action Day" which was held in October at the Melbourne Gun Club, saw many prospective shooters attend a well organised and coordinated event. Days or events like this will help develop members for the future of our sport.

Another initiative that the ACTA has undertaken is to apply for funding assistance from the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL), to establish an ISSF talent development pathway for promising junior shooters in our sport. Executive Member, Mr Robert Fox is thanked by all members of the ACTA for his work to develop this assistance pathway, as is the CEO of AISL, Mr Nick Sullivan who is supporting the sport by providing the funding. Nick Sullivan, together with AISL Board Member Mr Glen O'Brien have shown how both associations can work together to further develop our sport. Guidelines have been forwarded to all State and Territory Associations and I ask that all associations closely look at the funding guidelines and develop a program that will assist junior shooters in that state or territory.



During 2007, the National Executive commissioned an independent review of the association to develop the National Strategic Plan to take the ACTA forward. From this we now have a clear and defined path in which to progress the association and the sport within Australia. During the National Executive meeting in 2007 the full executive endorsed the proposal to formulate a "Board of Directors" model, a move away from the previous management structure. This has provided more direction in the governance of the association by the Board and Executive.

The 2007 ISSF National Championships were successfully held at the Brisbane Gun Club and the association and members thank the committee of the club for the preparation of the grounds and for their support during the event.

Further in the ISSF sport, Michael Diamond again proved he is the 'one to beat' with outstanding success at the World ISSF Championships that were held in Cyprus. Michael became the 'World Champion' after setting a world record 25/25 in the final.

The disciplines of skeet, sporting clays and trap were all held at the National Grounds at Wagga with numbers being down for the skeet and trap events. The National Executive is currently looking at several initiatives after consulting with members, to ensure that in future years both competitors and traders are catered for, looking forward to returning each year.

The Junior Development Squad is now in its ninth year and continues to produce talented shooters. Thanks must go

to Mr Bill Jones, Mr Graeme Boyd and the junior development staff for their continued support in the delivery of this program.

The ACTA office has had several staff changes over the last year. In the lead up to the placement of a full time Executive Officer, Mr Geoff Kidd fulfilled the role and the thanks of the National Executive are extended to Geoff for his time.

In September Ms Carrie Elton took up the position of Chief Executive Officer and brings with her a wealth of experience in management. Carrie immediately established a working rapport with the local council repairing several urgent issues that had arisen. Due to this, the local council now appreciate the number of visitors that the sport brings to the Wagga area each year.

Further executive changes during the year included the retirement of Mr Bill Jones as the National President and Executive member. Bill was the President for the last four years and I and the membership thank Bill for his leadership and commitment to the association.

The year also saw Mr Peter Haley replace Mr David Coleman as the New South Wales delegate and I would like to thank David for his work on the executive, particularly in the area of coaching. I also welcome to the National Executive Mr Robert Nugent as a Queensland delegate.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Executive Members for the support, time and effort they each contribute to the running of the association during the year. I personally thank the two Vice-Presidents, Ms Elaine Forward and Mr Ron Traill for making my position as President easier by sharing the workload and between them co-ordinating the ACTA at the National Championships.

Finally, to those that have personally supported and assisted me during my first term as President I say thank you and look forward to a promising 2008.

(c) Notes to reconciliations

(i) Under the Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements, income and expense items are recognised in the income statement on the basis of a direct association between the costs incurred and the earning of specific items of income. This process, commonly referred to as the matching of costs with revenues, involves the simultaneous or combined recognition of revenues and expenses that result directly and jointly from the same transactions or other events. The expenses incurred by the association for competitions that were being held were being netted off against income for each event. Income and expense of \$227,227 was not being recognised at 31 December 2006.

(ii) Under the Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements and AASB 116 Property, Plant and Equipment, any loss on sale of Property, Plant or equipment must be recognised in the income statement. A \$195,266 debit reserve was being carried forward from prior years. This entry has been reversed and recognised in opening retained earnings.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Scope

The financial report and the committee's responsibility

This concise financial report comprises the committee report, income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity, cash flow statement, notes to the financial statements and the statement by the committee for Australian Clay Target Association Inc. (the association), for the year ended 31 December 2007.

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Incorporated Associations Act 1981 (Victoria). This includes the responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

I conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the association. My audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgment, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

I performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the Incorporated Associations Act 1981 (Victoria), including compliance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the association's financial position, and of their performance as represented by the results of their operations and cash flows.

I formed my audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report; and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors.

While I considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of my procedures, my audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

Independence

In conducting my audit, I followed the applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Qualification

We were not the appointed auditors for the year ended 31 December 2006. We were unable to satisfy ourselves as to material 31 December 2006 balances by other audit procedures.

Qualified Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for of the matter discussed in the qualification paragraph, the concise financial report of Australian Clay Target Association Inc. is in accordance with:

All shooters are reminded that under NSW law they must show a current shooters licence at the Events Office before they shoot at the National Ground.

Practice – Practice will open at 12 Noon on Friday 28th March. Traps 7 and 8 will be used for practice throughout the tournament (except during the double barrel event) and will be coin operated \$1 coin only for 5 Targets (2x\$1 for 5 pairs) Change will be available from the Events Office. The shoot marshal may commandeer the practice traps at any time for competition use (in case of breakdowns or make-up squads)

Nominations – Nominations will be accepted at the Events Office from 2pm on Friday 28th March and will be open daily thereafter at the Events Office.

Squadding – Squadding for the Pre Nationals will open on Friday 28th March at 2pm and will be open each day from 8am at the Events Office. Squadding will open for the next days events at approx 1pm each day. Priority will be given to those who have pre-nominated and to traders.

Events – Pre National, Handicap, Champion of Champions and Double Rise Events will all be shot in one visit to the traps.

Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Aust-NZ Trap Championship will each be shot in TWO VISITS. The second round after all competitors have completed the first 50 moving up by one Trap. As time will be critical during these events shooters are asked to be on time for their squad – no PA announcements will be made, and squads will not wait. Missed rounds will need to be made up at a later time.

Shooters are reminded of their responsibilities of refereeing and scoring – generally shooter 1 & 2 for the first round and 3 & 4 for the second round. Shooter 3 & 4 of the last round each day are responsible to ref and score the first round the following day – a penalty of one target may apply!!! A prize draw will be conducted each day, the prizes going to one referee and one scorer of the first round.

Double Barrel Shoot off – the field of possibles will be split into two waves. The first wave will go to the traps and shoot a bracket of targets, followed by the second wave. While the second wave are shooting the first wave will be re-squadded ready to shoot their second round. This process will continue until the field can be condensed to one wave or darkness intervenes, the shoot off will then continue under lights.

Prizes and Trophies for each event will be as follows:

- Pre-National S/B and P/S – Overall for each event will receive a Sash and prize money.
- Pre-National Handicap - \$50 of each nomination will go into Prize Pool for 1st to 5th. Overall will also receive a Sash.
- Grand Australian Handicap – Overall receives the Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Beretta Australia
- National Champion of Champions - Overall receives the Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Winchester Australia
- National Double Rise Championship - Overall receives the Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Federal Ammunition
- National Double Barrel - Overall receives the Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Beretta Australia
- National Single Barrel - Overall receives the Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Rio Ammunition
- Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship - Overall receives the Southern Cross Badge, Royal Blue Sash, Prize Money of \$1700 and prize sponsored by Renegade Motor International

It's Your Call

No. 28

In this scenario your judgement and commonsense are put to the test.

You are the Referee of a squad where a shooter has had a broken target or a "No Target" where a target has not appeared on his call. He puts his gun down and calls for a target to look at without reference to you. What do you rule?

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you rule "Lost Target" you would be quite correct. However, you may share some of the blame.

Obviously, there is significantly more to the situation than it first appears and we should look closely at both our actions and the actions of the shooter.

Firstly, GRTS 5 (b) (vi) gives the shooter an entitlement to "see a target" after he has received two broken targets in a row. Not just one target as is the case under discussion.

Ok: We have a situation where a shooter has erred; but what about the Referee? Could this situation have been avoided by an alert Referee. The simple answer is Yes!

Had the Referee held the "On Off" button in his hand, he could

have switched off the microphone in time to prevent the shooter making an error. While our rules do not provide for the Referee to hold the button in his hand during an event (it is merely recommended), it is very good practice for Referees to do so. There are many occasions and instances in a day's shooting where Referee may be able to better maintain equity for all participants if they are able to stop rule transgressions and indiscretions by shooters. Some examples of these are foot violations, shooting out of turn, shooting from the wrong lane, loading two cartridges in a single target event, failing to load, safety violations and of course simply calling for a target after just one broken target. Having said that, it does NOT make the referee responsible if he misses any of these actions. Clearly, the shooter is the master of his own destiny in these cases.

There is a whole list of circumstances in GRTS 5 which generate a right and a need for a shooter to be shown a target, however in every case it really should be in conjunction with an offer from, or agreement with the officiating referee as a matter of common courtesy and commonsense. Nevertheless, where an entitlement exists in GRTS 5, the lack of communication with the Referee does not empower the Referee to rule Lost Target.

We are all aware that a shooter can't refuse a target if the Referee does not agree with the reason for the refusal given by the shooter. Moreover, the refusal of a target where the shooter does not even mount the gun to his shoulder should always attract a call of "Lost Target", but many of these occasions can be avoided by the simple expedient of Referees being alert and holding that all important "Button" in his or her hand.

If you consider you need to "see a target" ask the Referee. There are occasions when your request will be granted. On the other hand the reverse may apply and if you are not entitled you may not get one. Then, instead of losing a target on a technicality, you will have a chance of shooting at the target and scoring from it.

Qualifying

If there is still a tie at this stage a sudden death shoot off will decide ranking positions.

The Semi Finals will consist of 5 targets Point Score with the Number 1 ranked semi finalist competing against number 4 and 2 competing against 3. Ties will be broken by sudden death. No handicaps.

Grand Final

The winner from the first Semi Final will shoot off against the winner of the second Semi. The Grand Final is 5 targets Point Score, sudden death to decide ties.

Conditions of Entry

Only users of Beretta / Franchi Shotguns are eligible to enter. There is no nomination fee. Competitors must register their intention to enter by signifying on the prescribed form available at the point of nomination BEFORE the commencement of the National Double Barrel Championship.

Any fraudulent entries will be immediately disqualified.

International Shooting Grounds, Western Australian Gun Club, Whiteman Park, Perth
12 – 20 January 2008

Perth turned on a fantastic display for the 2008 Olympic Discipline National Championships, held at the Western Australian Gun Club. With facilities second to none in the country, all that was needed was for the Club's new Laporte traps and targets to perform. And that they did...with a range of weather conditions experienced, from extreme heat to strong winds, the state of the art machinery (and its operators) came up trumps.

The shoot was important in an Olympic year as one of the four Olympic selection events, putting additional pressure on Olympic hopefuls to perform, with the results of the National Championships weighing heavily on selection for Australia's quota spots in Men's and Women's Olympic Trap, Men's Double Trap, and Men's and Women's ISSF Skeet. And, with the Laporte traps and targets being used at the Olympics, the shoot also gave the athletes a foretaste of what they might expect in Beijing.

It's not only the shooting facilities that make a good event, it's the clubhouse, catering, and atmosphere that add to the overall experience. The main clubhouse amenities provided plenty of options for the non shooters, families and young visitors to experience. This year saw competitors from all states and territories, along with international representation from Fiji, China, UK, USA, Lebanon, Scotland and Canada.

With Elaine Forward acting as Tournament Director, and Murray Alexander the Shoot Marshall, the event ran smoothly. The WAGC volunteers made sure that everything behind the scenes ran like a well oiled machine. A special mention of volunteers Dave Carroll

(WAGC ISSF Captain), Peter Boylson (Assistant to WAGC ISSF Captain), and Christine Alexander (WAGC President) - pictured receiving flowers from an impressed Eddie Elder - who each carried much of the preparation load and whose committed time and involvement was greatly appreciated. ACTA President John Mack was able to attend, along with Executive Members Rob Fox, Vince Mollica and Geoff Faulkes.

During the championships the ACTA hosted a shooters' BBQ and an informal meeting giving Olympic Discipline members an opportunity to provide feedback on a range of issues. 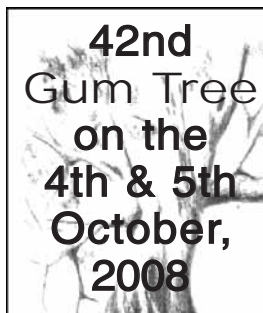

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

PERFORMANCE ENHANCEMENT THROUGH IMAGERY

Last month's article explored the use of mental rehearsal as a strategy for general training, goal setting, pre-competition preparation, problem solving and post-performance review. This month I want to explore the concept of imagery as part of mental rehearsal and how it can help us perform better.

During the last month I also had the opportunity to travel to Olympic Velodrome in Sydney with the cycling squad from the Southern Sports Academy and provide mental skills training as they prepared for the State Championships. Some of the squad had never ridden on a wooden track like this before so the whole experience was new and challenging. This provided an opportunity to integrate technical skills and mental skills. We broke the coaching up into several components: firstly we taught the squad to relax and gave them positive and affirming statements regarding being confident, composed and fearless. Secondly, we had one of the coaches demonstrate the skill we wanted the squad to learn. Thirdly, on the track we got them to focus on their breathing, close their eyes and see in their head what they had just watched; only we asked them to watch themselves doing the riding this time. Once they could see themselves doing the skill, and doing it well, they got on their bikes and practised.

Unfortunately, we have no way of knowing if this method was any more effective than just putting them on their bikes and letting them go. However, this is the process that is written about in countless sport psychology textbooks so it was worth a try, even if the only outcome was to make the squad feel OK about integrating mental skills into their training regime.

Last month I also listened to a commentary CD between Lanny Basham (author of *With Winning in Mind*) and Todd Bender. Bender talked about his use of imagery and mental rehearsal when shooting; he explained that before he walked onto the station, he relived the shot that he has done thousands of times before. When he steps onto the pad and settles himself, he then shoots the target(s) in his mind. Using visualization he hits the targets and therefore his mind is already believing that he has done it. Leaving no time to develop self-doubt, he calls pull and shoots the target just as he did in his mind's eye seconds before.

Now the above is a good example of using mental rehearsal in shooting but Bender didn't stop there. He then explained that before he walks off the pad, he sees himself shoot the target again (just as he did in real life) to reinforce what he needs to do next time. This evaluation of his performance reinforces success and best practise and primes him up for further success.

So for the shooter, golfer, surfer, athlete, diver, etc imagery can be a powerful tool. Mental rehearsal is a means of using imagery to control the images you have about your performance. Just like Bender, it can be used to rehearse a good performance, rehearse an upcoming performance or competition, or to enhance a new skill (just like the cyclists).

Imagery can also be used in problem solving. Remember 'the Black Box Technique', this is a powerful tool that can help you deal with distractions, so they don't get in your way during the competition. Imagery can also be used to reduce anxiety and physical tension. Combined with relaxation, imagery can be used to soothe and calm your mind. Imagery can also be used to influence attitudes and thoughts which affect performance. Mohammed Ali used his jingle "dance like a butterfly and sting like a bee" to create an image that would make him feel agile and sharp in attack.

HOW CAN I LEARN IMAGERY?

The clearer your images are the more effect they will be. Syer &

Connolly (1984) outline several important steps to achieve clear images:

1. Begin with 5-10 minutes of relaxation.
2. Describe your image. Do this in the present tense, alone or with someone asking you questions.
3. Use all your senses. Use your eyes, ears and touch senses by creating or recalling your image. Be aware which is your strongest sense.
4. Practise regularly and consistently. 5-10 minutes for 5-6 days a week.

Exercises in developing clear images.

Sit as comfortably as possible, take a few deep breathes then imagine the following images.

- a. A sunset.... Your gun..... a target leaving the trap..... Which sense are you using here?
- b. Sound of a thunderstorm..... report of your gun..... voice of your coach... Which sense are you using here?
- c. The sun on your skin..... your gun in your hand... Which sense are you using here?

Which of the three senses evoked the clearest images for you?

In conclusion, Winter & Martin claim that the use of imagery techniques is only limited by your imagination. Imagery is widely used in relaxation, mental rehearsal and problem solving but it is up to you to use the techniques in your training and competition. The benefits will be there if you are prepared to put in the time.

TCTA Annual Trap Carnival

Location: At the convergence of the Macquarie and the South Esk Rivers, 27 kms from Launceston and 12kms off the Midlands Highway

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association Inc. held its annual TRAP carnival at Tasmanian Gun Club at Nile Road Evandale over the period 25th - 28th January 2008. Conditions were excellent however it was quite windy, making the competition reasonably difficult.

The four days were nice sunny days but with moderate north westerly wind. Again, this carnival was very successful although not the biggest held, another excellent turn up saw 162 shooters compete over the period, exactly the same number as for 2007.

Shooters were suitably impressed with the new trap stands very capably constructed by Mr George Pinner, the repositioned scoreboard and the new entrance road located to the rear of the club house which now diverts traffic behind rather than in front of the clubhouse building. This is a big improvement enhancing the spectators experience and greatly improving the safety of shooters and spectators alike.

The carnival was shot over 6 Canterbury automatic traps. There were 63 shooters from the mainland in attendance to keep the locals honest and again all indications are that they would all like to be back next year if possible. The mainland shooters again came from as far a field as Queensland and Western Australia. Again prize monies were in line with other top carnivals around Australia, this is achieved by shooter participation.

Again it is obvious that this carnival is now a truly national event and still attracting more and more shooters annually from the northern states. With the airport and accommodation less than 10

minutes away from the Tasmanian Gun Club it is one of the better shooting destinations in Australia

Some very good competition was seen, although the wind made conditions testing again this year, 26 people shot the 50/50 in the State Double Barrel Championship culminating in a tight shoot off between Geoff Faulkes and Arty Del-Ben with the final score of 193/193 being required to win.

The State Single Barrel Championship saw only 2 shooters shoot the 50/50 and a quick win to Steve Atkins on 56/56, however the State Points Score Championship saw 6 shooters shoot 150/150, with a win to Arty Del-Ben on 213/213

Three shooters managed 50/50 in the Handicap event, with Isaac Tasker of Burnie the eventual winner on 71/71, a great win for Isaac who is now proving a good competitor in both Trap and Skeet. The prize purse moved Isaac backwards a meter and half.

The wind played a bit of a nuisance in the double rise event which was won by Tim Atkins of Tasmania with a 57/60 after a shoot off with Gary Kelly of West Australia.

This was also not to be the weekend for many new break badges, only two shooters achieved new heights, with Brent Young of Victoria clocking up a 75 straight and Gian Vassalini his first 50/50 in the handicap

Garry Kelly of West Australia went on to take the Overall High Gun for the three days of carnival with 342/350, dropping three in the double rise, three in the handicap, one in single barrel, none in the double barrel and one point in the points score event, a pretty good effort all round.

State team eliminations were also reasonably tight in the conditions with 10 points down in 250 needed to get into the shoot off for the 15 man squad.

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association Inc. again held a HIGH ROLLER EVENT which consisted of 100 targets points score with a 25 target points score final - The High Roller event was again very well received and has now been a feature for three years - the winner of this event was Mr Geoff Faulkes of West Australia shooting a 550/555 to win from Arthur Turner of New South Wales with a 549/555.

Geoff Faulkes again donated a prestigious Belt Buckle this year to the winner and the TCTA provided a sash. Geoff has already provided next years buckle and I am sure he will be back to defend his title. This year's event drew a field of 20 shooters and it is expected that this field will grow annually making it a very worthwhile purse for the winner. The targets for the event were again sponsored by Olimpyc clay targets and the TCTA and shooters are very appreciative of their contribution to the event in this regard.

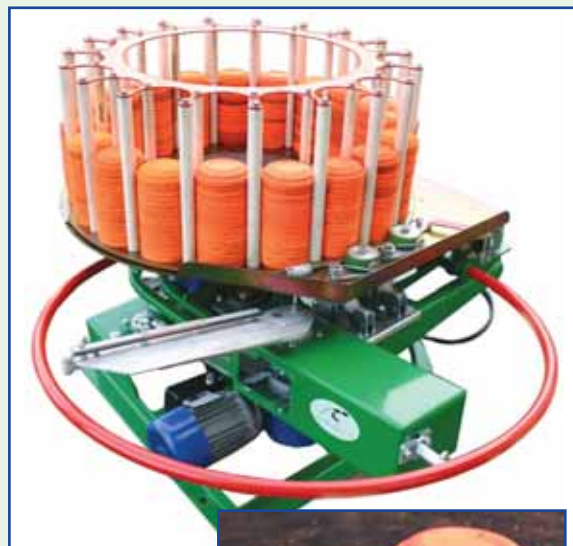

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
15. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
20. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***

SKEET

21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
22. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
23. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

SPORTING

24. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
25. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rocket, rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.

STATE TITLE AT MATHOURA

Mathoura Gun Club included a Victorian State Night Deauville Doubles Championship in its four program shoot for February 2008. 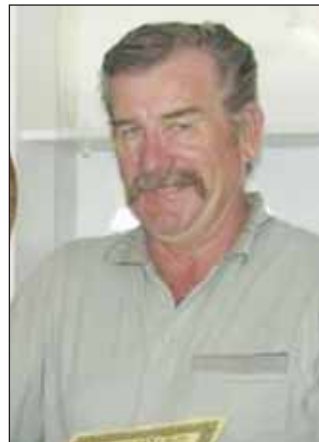

The first of four (4) 2 Day Skeet Carnivals was conducted at the West Australian Gun Club (Inc) over the weekend of 23rd & 24th February 2008, incorporating the State Skeet Handicap and selection for the 2008 State Representative Team to shoot at the 2008 Skeet Nationals being held in Wagga along with the ACTA 5 Stand Sporting Nationals in May 2008.

The State Team selection was held on Saturday over two 50t Skeet "Cash" events, which were supported very well with 10 squads in attendance, made up of 3 Ladies, 4 Juniors and 5 Veterans. Weather conditions were perfect over the weekend with some wind on Saturday, but calm and warm on Sunday. The Skeet Captain, Clem Bertini, decided that the Club use full fluoro orange Corsivia targets instead of the black that is usually present at the Club. There were some comments re the change in colour, but after seeing the results, I think that the fluoro orange targets worked a treat. The Club's Gemini machinery performed excellently throwing the targets on a good flight path for all the competitors to hit.

Competition commenced with Saturdays "Cash" events, sponsored by Max Pedri, Clem Bertini, Marco Ponta and Chris Alexander, stalwarts of Skeet at the West Australian Gun Club.

Ladies Team consisted of A House (High
