Generous sponsorship from Hanson Concrete, Nepean Communications, Security Assessment Services and Associates and Kathy and Barry McLeod provided prize money for the women equal to any other state or national championship.

The 50tgt Double barrel – 50tgt Points event contested by all, saw Lawrie Mirabella shoot a creditable 199/200 to take out A Grade and Overall. Lawrie was reminded that the double barrel target he missed cost him the \$775.00 Jackpot that has been building over the past twenty months. Second in A grade was David Lauritzen with a score of 193/200. 1st in AA went to Bernie Scanlon 217/220 after a shoot off with Herman Finken and Dexter Barnes. With Dexter securing second with a score of 236/240. B grade saw Emma Brache out shoot Dianne McGrath with scores of 187 and 184 respectively. A very pleased Laure Bullmore secured her first grade sash shooting 169/200 in C grade, leaving 2nd place to Jim Maffett 157/200. Jim deserves his placing especially after tirelessly working all day and with keeping the grounds a picture with help from his wife Kathy. Many thanks to both.

In conjunction with event one the women's targets were also scored double barrel and so after shooting 98/100 Latisha Scanlon was a clear winner and very happy to receive a pink sash and \$500.00 cash. After beginning her shooting career at Wonthaggi, Latisha triumphed over last year's winner Michelle Parks also of Wonthaggi. Michelle shot a 95/100 together with fellow club member Iona McJames. After a further 17 targets, Iona finished third overall but was still very pleased with her \$200 prize money.

The \$1000 prize money was double that of last year thanks to our very generous sponsors'. Next year we hope to increase the bounty and provide an event unique in Australia for our women competitors.

The long flowing purple hair of Col, (Colleen Widows), provided some light entertainment for the masses. "You almost had us fooled Col, but for your hairy legs!!!".



While refereeing a squad you become aware that there is considerable background noise coming from behind the "fence" due to loud talking and laughter etc. In addition, you notice some of the squad members' actions indicate that they may be distracted by this noise.

You stop the squad from shooting and ask the offending group to be aware of the distraction they are causing. One of the offenders asks you to indicate the shooting rule under which you act in this instance.

Are your actions in this case correct?

IT'S YOUR CALL

Yes! You are correct. While there is no specific rule in our Shooting rules, you, as the Referee have a clear responsibility to ensure the equity of the competition. In this case you would also be acting under the authority of the management in relation to conduct and responsibilities. To suggest that the Referee in this situation would not be compelled to take action would be ludicrous. In fact, the situation could arise where the competitors in the squad may well be entitled to claim a baulk.

Our sport requires a significant degree of concentration and our participants are fully entitled to enjoy that entitlement and it would be sorry day if other participants or spectators thought otherwise. Indeed one would doubt if anyone would object to the Referee taking action in this matter.

However, occurrences of this nature would almost certainly be unintentional by the offenders. Most would be both apologetic and somewhat embarrassed by their being unaware that they were affecting the squad.



The 14th annual Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition was held during February at Brisbane Gun Club.

Retaining it's original objective of being a truly international competition where Australian Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet shooters can compete at home against shooters from other countries, the event once again lived up to this objective by allowing both local and interstate competitors that opportunity. This year we again welcomed the members of the Winchester sponsored Japan Top Gun Club together with shooters from throughout Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria.

This year, a total of over 80 competitors gathered during the four day competition program which was held on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday 14th to 17th February. The first two days of competition saw the conducting of the 200 target Australian Open event for the prestigious Kemen Trophy. The very popular Australian 'Skins' Badge Match competition was held in conjunction with the first event. The 150 target Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet were then conducted over two days on Saturday and Sunday.

As is the normal procedure, Thursday, the first day of competition, saw the local and interstate shooters get a head start on their Japanese rivals who arrived mid way through the day when the first 100 targets of the Australian Open competition was being conducted. In typical fashion, the Japanese contingent of 45 competitors, were straight off the bus and into the practice. Before long they were lined up for the re-introduction to warm weather and the Australian targets and the spare Olympic Trap range was really running hot.

The first 100 targets of the Australian Open competitions saw quite a few good performances being recorded in both the Olympic Trap and Skeet events. Day 1 in the trap concluded with improving shooter Marcello Casella of Griffith showing the way by leading the field by one target with a score of 90/100. He was closely followed by a large group of shooters including Nidal Asmar, Scott Dobeli, Frank Minici, Kevin Perkins, Greg Newey and more. In the skeet event, local shooters dominated the small field with Keith Ferguson leading the way after 100 targets of that competition.

Day 2 of the competition saw the opportunity for all shooters to recoup some of their nominations in the skins event, while those who were competing in the Australian Open events were also looking to record a good result on day 2 of the event. The number of shooters in the field was doubled on Friday when the Japanese visitors and a

The skins payable of each round this year was \$220 per round for the AA/A group and \$280 per round for the B/C group. These 'skins' again represented more than twice the total nomination fee for the entire four days of competition. Everybody was again watching the scoreboard closely during each of the four rounds.

At the end of the day, the spoils were spread around reasonably well. In the AA/A group, skins ISSF Skeet Champion wins were recorded by Tong Shang, Tony Candali, Nidal Asmar, Kevin Perkins and Nino Pedulla. The B/C group also saw a

Saturday morning and a few more weekend shooters arrived. In all, 13 squads of Olympic Trap shooters made up the field in the "Grand Prix" competition with shooters coming from as far away as Melbourne, Cairns, Sydney, Illawarra, Guyra and Newcastle plus the many local shooters and regulars from neighbouring clubs including Redcliffe, Warwick, Gold Coast and others. At the other end of the shooting range, a lesser field of 2 squads faced the starter in the ISSF Skeet event. The large contingent of Japanese shooters made up about half the overall field which made it very enjoyable for all in attendance.

As Brisbane had again been subject to quite a few showery days during the week it appeared that the weekend's conditions would not be much different. While the early squads got away to a good start, even though the normal early light conditions made it a little tricky to catch a few of the left hand targets, it soon became obvious that everyone in the field would be affected at some time by the rain showers. The luxury, however, of having 3 Olympic Trap ranges always allows for a brief stoppage to be enjoyed while any heavy showers are around.

After the completion of the first day's proceedings in the Olympic Trap "Grand Prix", Daniel Di Pietro had a good break on the rest of the field being 4 targets ahead of Nidal Asmar with Australian Open winner Marcello Casella and Athens Olympic Games Champion Suzy Balogh both equal on 90/100 along with former "Grand Prix" Champion Greg Newey of Warwick, also on 90/100. With only 2 rounds of 25 targets each to be completed on day 2 of the competition, many shooters including Nino Pedulla and another former "Grand Prix" winner, Kevin Perkins, were still in contention for a position in the final.

Day 2 of the "Grand Prix" and again it appeared as though we would be experiencing showery conditions during the course of the day. The day's scores were up–and–down as expected, however, Nidal Asmar showed his class by carding two clean 25s (50/50) to lead the field towards the final. His final score of 141/150 reversed the overnight standing giving him a 1 target lead with Daniel Di Pietro (140/150) next into the final followed by Marcello Casella (137/150), Nino Pedulla (135/150), Suzy Balogh (135/150) and Kevin Perkins (132/150) who had to survive a three way shoot-of with Greg Newey and Travis Gull for the final spot in the final.

The final was of course a single barrel affair with the 10 second 'delay' light again being used on station one. Again the final indicated how important this part of the event can be when determining the overall winner. The best score in the final was Marcello Casella's 22/25 - a good score on the day but still not quite good enough to catch Nidal Asmar who held on to take the winner's spoils by one target.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

KEEPING THE MIND QUIET

One of the most pleasurable aspects of writing these articles, for me, has been the number of telephone calls, letters and personal contact that shooters have made. As a result I have made friends and acquaintances from all over Australia and this is one of the real bonuses for attending the nationals and larger shoots. The other unintended outcomes have been an improvement in my own shooting and the opportunity to "study" performance psychology and seeing research being put into practice.

A couple of months ago I received a phone call at home, and after identifying himself as a shooter, the caller said he and his mates want to know how they can keep their mind quiet whilst they are shooting.

What did they mean by keeping the mind quiet?

Basically, it means not letting your thinking get in the road of you shooting the target. But how does thinking cause so much damage?

To answer this it is important to look at how the brain is made up. For the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis, etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it required is that the muscles need to be fluid and relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgemental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly. Because the right side of the brain doesn't understand language it tenses up because of all the instructions, the muscles are no longer fluid or relaxed and you can't perform the task properly. When this happens, we give ourselves negative self-talk and this leads to self-doubt.

Most adults are capable of abstract thought: that it we are able to conceptualise and understand concepts such as liberty, democracy, justice, hatred, etc. This also gives us the ability to relive the past and dream or worry about the future.

Because of this ability we are not confined to staying in the present. When we perform any task such as shooting or hitting a golf ball we are able to hold onto past judgements and worry about future outcomes. When we leave the 'present' and dwell in the past or get worried about the future, we are again letting doubt rule our thinking, and again our muscles will tense up and we will be incapable of performing well.

So, how can we keep the mind quiet?

It would be easier if we weren't human: that is, didn't have a mind. We could be like robots and we would be able to keep shooting well forever. However, we are human and we can't get rid of our minds.

The easiest way to keep it quiet is to keep it busy doing something else. One of the easiest things to do is to hum. By humming to yourself you are keeping your mind busy so that you can't have an internal dialogue that leads to self-doubt. Humming keeps you busy; you just think about the words and the music and deny yourself the ability to worry about the next shot. I like to hum Queen's Another One Bites the Dust, because it is the quintessential clay target shooting song.

Another way to keep the mind quiet is to focus on your breathing. Breathing is the one human task that can only be done in the present. Therefore by concentrating on your breathing you keep yourself focused on the here and now and reduce the possibility of moving back to the past or forward to the future.

Athletes often using a breathing technique called "Centreing" devised by Nideffer. The attraction of this technique, according to Morris & Summers, 1995, is that it is specifically designed to be used at the sporting site. This makes it useful our on the tracks between shots. While also a relaxation techniques, centering doubles as a form of attentional shifting and refocusing.

Next you can stay focused in the present by using visualization. The Black Box Technique is useful for dealing with distractions and if you are able to visualize yourself shooting the target in your mind before you call, then you are able to convince your mind that you have already shot that target and there is no need for negative self-talk. No self-talk = no self-doubt.

Using a mantra such as "another one bites the dust" or "trust and let go" puts a positive message in your head and again limits self talk. You can also focus on something that going on for you at that very moment to stay focused in the present. It may be feeling the weight on the balls of your feet, or feeling the gun against your shoulder or cheek.

Finally, to remain focused in the present requires you to focus on the process and not the product, Focusing on what you are doing to shoot the targets and how they are breaking will keep you in the present. Thinking about your score, the trophy or the high gun will focus your thoughts and attention on the future. Thinking about the poor score you shot at this club last month will focus your attention in the past. Either way by not staying in the present; you will leave your mind open to give you some negative self talk, and the outcome will most definitely be a missed target.

DUDLEY JAMES 5/2/22- 16/11/07

The Wandoan Gun Club wishes to inform of the passing of life member, Dudley James, on the 16th November 2007. Dudley was born at Kingaroy on 5th February 1922, the elder of two sons of Herb and Florence James. His father, an engineer, was an excellent range shooter. Dudley showed early signs of his sporting competitiveness with success on the athletics track.

Dudley joined the air force on leaving

school, but a primus exploded in a laundry and left him badly burnt and hospitalised for 9 months. Deemed unfit for overseas service, he left the air force and formed James Brothers Earthmoving with his brother Harold who was a capable shooter also. They came to the Taroom/Wandoan district in 1949 clearing scrub and on the 18th April 1952 they started the first dam in their contract with the government, building dams and clearing scrub for Soldier Settler blocks. They were camped in caravans for three years before moving to "Teregram" on the 10th May 1955, the first family property. They started clearing oil exploration lines under contract in 1960 anTrade Pracd it was then they found the green scrub block of "Silverleigh" which they acquired and Dell, Dudley and their eight children moved to in 1963.

Dudley started his shooting career at Wandoan in 1960, when on his way home from clearing an oil exploration line he called in at the old Wandoan showgrounds. Jack Sands lent Dudley his gun for the competition. Dudley won overall for the day and collected the first of his many trophies. He became one of the founding members of the Wandoan Gun Club which later moved to its present position on the southern end of Wandoan in 1964. Dudley walked his dozer in the 14 miles (22km) from "Teregram" to clear the scrub for the present site in 1963 and won the first championship at the new grounds in 1964. Dudley had his first stroke in 1991 and though he tried to start shooting again it was too severe to allow a return to the sport.

Dudley's first gun was an A5 Browning, costing 80 pounds and our local police sergeant stated that it was in immaculate order when surrendered for the gun buyback.

Dudley's achievements were many and they included membership of Zone, State and Australian teams. Some of note were:

His single barrel performance in Kingaroy in 1976 at the State carnival was recalled by Peter McDonald, past president of Kingaroy Gun club. "His 93/93 at the old 45 degree angles was a performance that I shall not forget, as I was the referee."

His move to 27 yards is unknown but it was not long after yardage came in. Dudley was once asked if he had ever shot the possible off 27 yards and he replied "heaps of times". "I even won a gun off

27 yards and donated it back. The next bloke wasn't so generous" he said

A guard of honour was provided at both the church and cemetery with firearms in the broken state. A six shot salute of live rounds was fired at the cemetery by Peter Mundell (Wandoan), Lionel Kearney (Wandoan), Doug Smith (Dalby), Robert Rosenberger (Roma), Wayne Sattler (Wandoan) and Greg Kocho (Condamine) as the casket was lowered







CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the Nationa Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has
 accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score
 recorded.
- 7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed iury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.

SKEET

- 21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 22. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 23. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

SPORTING

- 24. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 25. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rocket, rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.



with Tamworth's John Cassin successful in B Grade.


