

FROM THE CEO

As I'm writing this our shooters are only a couple of weeks away from heading off to Beijing for the Olympics and Ireland for the DTL World Championships, and by the time you are reading this magazine hopefully we will be celebrating with our international athletes back at home!

The importance of developing pathways for our members to reach their potential in each shooting discipline is increasingly important.

I'm pleased that the ISSF Pathway Program, which is jointly funded by the Australian Sports Commission through Australian International Shooting (AISL), is now underway with the first distribution of funds made to all the States who submitted proposals for Round 1 funding. These funds have allowed the first steps to be taken in establishing the program nationwide, including coaching clinics and talent identification.

For those shooters who will be attending the Olympic Discipline Nationals at Cecil Park in January, there is an important notice in this CTSN regarding the change of dates and program. The date change is due to a conflicting event – The Youth Olympics – being held at Cecil Park on the dates ACTA had scheduled. The Nationals will now be held in conjunction with the Oceania Championships from 20th to 25th January 2009.

The Oceania Championships had been scheduled to be held in New Zealand in early 2009, but unfortunately the NZCTA does not have a venue to host this event in 2009 and Australia has been asked to assist.

The program has been amended for the 2009 OD Nationals with the ACTA Championship for each discipline being dropped due to the shorter time available. It should also guarantee a larger competitor base.

Another item of interest to the ACTA's ISSF Shooters is the establishment of an Athletes' Committee for the ISSF disciplines. At a meeting convened during the 2008 OD Nationals in Perth the shooters overwhelmingly voted to have a Committee established. Subsequent to the meeting a survey was mailed to participants seeking feedback both on the OD Nationals and the concept of an Athletes Committee, including how it should be constituted and elected.

The National Executive has now endorsed the establishment of an ISSF Athletes Committee at its meeting on 14th and 15th June. ISSF Shooters will find a notice regarding the establishment of a Committee of five to be elected from shooters present in person or by proxy at the ACTA OD National Championships (ISSF Nationals). Nominations will close on 30 November 2008 with voting to take place at the 2009 OD Nationals. More detailed information is available on the ACTA's website – www.claytarget.com.au, and a full list of nominees will be posted after nominations have closed.

I've been very slack in getting this article into the CTSN, however, the event and the shooters that went along deserve reporting on.

Having been away on quite a few trips I often wonder why do team coaches and managers actually give up their time mostly unpaid to provide support to shooters. In August last year I definitely asked myself why did I do it? I definitely questioned why when I couldn't have a shot myself, when I was lugging huge boxes of athlete lunches around Bangkok, when I had to get up at 5:00am in the morning (I am not a morning person), when I shared a very mouldy shower with several barking geckos, when the hierarchy decided that all Australian team officials needed to have a meeting every evening at 11pm, when some of the food was very dodgy, when I had to keep getting managers and coaches kicked off the overcrowded buses out

to the range so that athletes could at least get to the range on time to compete. All this in over 40+ degrees heat. However, as soon as the 5 athletes (Amanda Holt & Stefanie Tigani - Women's trap, Daniel Allam & Matt Rocco - Men's Trap and Double Trap and pistol shooter Gary Mullens (Men's 10m Air Pistol and 50m Pistol) started shooting I knew all the sweating & lack of sleep absolutely worthwhile and I knew why I said 'yes' – because it was fabulous to see these five athletes take hold of the very best opportunity they would have to prepare for life at a Commonwealth or Olympic Games.

The 24th Universiade (The World University Games) as a multi-national multi-sports event is only preceded by an Olympic Games. The Universiade is actually larger than a Commonwealth Games. There were more than 6000 athletes and 4000 officials from 200 countries, covering 18 sports. The Australian team was 180 athletes strong.

2007 was the first time shooting had ever been included. The Thais had it as their invitational sport. The 25th Universiade will be held in Belgrade, Serbia & Montenegro in 2009 and at this stage it appears shooting will be included.

In Bangkok shooting had 39 countries participate and shotgun alone had shooters from 20 countries participating. Athletes had to be enrolled at University and were allowed to be up to 28 years of age hence world class shooters were present. All athletes and team officials stayed at the Thammasat University.

The Apartments Buildings at the Uni were about 10 storeys high – thankfully they had elevators but were pretty basic apartments otherwise. Stefanie and Amanda definitely got a good taste of 'Olympic' living when they realised they were sharing an apartment with two golf girls and the waterpolo boys were just down the hallway. The venue had all that an Olympic or Commonwealth village has but had the delightful Thai additions of a Thai marketplace and massage parlour, infact about 40 Thai masseurs and masseuse each charging about \$5 AUD for an hour's massage. Sometimes you walked away feeling fabulous, other times you were lucky to walk away at all.

The day of Gary's official practice for his 10 m air pistol event we found out that the bus to the range could take over 2 hours in the morning. He managed to make it just in time as did about 100 other competitors. I learnt a lot about pistol from Gary and also Peter Anderson the Australian Official who was on the Jury of Appeal. Whilst all I could offer to Gary was positive support and helping him find his focus, I also could ensure he arrived on time, had all his equipment, had his start times and numbers and that he was well fed and watered. It was really good to see the shotgun girls and guys turning up and watching each of Gary's matches and likewise Gary turning up out at the shotgun range. Unfortunately the only path between the indoor range and the shotgun range was a dingy alley with small land subsidences, a lot of trash and way too many discarded used condoms. I ensured that when the Australian Chef de Mission turned up I made him stroll through the alley with me instead of being driven around.

The shotgun range at Huamark had two superimposed skeet and trap

layouts, set out in a beautiful tree filled urban park. The park had to be closed to the public each morning as the locals tended to wander a little too close to the shooting action. The discarded items in the alley were not the only hazard at the range. Matt Rocco was the first on the range to meet the real Bangkok hazard to shotgun shooting – dogs! Stray dogs were everywhere and much to Matt's surprise would even run straight over the top of the trap house roof . . mid shot!

Women's Trap

All of the shotgun shooters practiced very, very well. Stefanie particularly shot smoothly and confidently in practice finishing with a personal best - but unfortunately wasn't able to emulate that on comp day - suffering quite badly from heat stress. 20 women competed from 12 countries. Amanda Holt was brilliant on comp day, she was calm and focussed, for a shooter who had only ever made a final at a club shoot, her performance of a 69/75 to enter into the final was a great result. Unfortunately after such solid work in qualifying for the final Amanda's lack of finals experience really did show with quite a low single barrel score. The winner of this event was Zuzanna Stefecekova from Slovakia with a 72/75 + 23/25 = 95, 2nd Marina Sauzet from France 71 + 19, 3rd Wei Sa Yang (China) 70+19, 4th Supawan Karjaejuntasak (Thailand) 67 + 19, 5th Amanda Holt (Australia) 69+11 and 6th Jana Mezeiova (Slovakia) 68+10. Stefanie finished equal 12th with 63/75. Both girls gained a world of experience from this shoot, and soon after they returned to Australia Amanda shot her first National final at the AISL Grand Prix in Sydney and finished 3rd with a very credible 18/25 single barrel.

MEN'S TRAP

Again the level of competition was strong, with 15 countries represented. Daniel shot solidly for the two days to finish with a 114/125and went into his first international final out of the junior ranks. He shot a strong 20/25 to finish 5th. 1st Prosperi (Italy) 117+21+10, 2nd Nikandrov (Ukraine) 115 + 23 + 9, 3rd Hupka (Slovakia) 116 + 21, 4th Tsai (Chinese Taipei) 114 + 21, 5th Daniel Allam (Australia) 114 + 20, 6th Hlavzcek (Czech republic) 114 + 17. Matt Rocco finished equal 15th with a 111/125.

DOUBLE TRAP

The men's double trap scores ranged from a credible 136/150 to 49/150, again 28 competitors from 11 countries. Daniel had had so much fun with the trap that he was keen to give double trap a try. The Gold was won by Furasyev (Russia) 136+45, Silver Khamgasem (Thailand) 133 + 47 and bronze Leybo (Russia) 135 + 31. Matt finished mid field with 115 and Daniel 102.

The standard of the referees was brilliant. I have only ever experienced such a flawlessly refereed competition once, which was at the Athen's Olympics. The officials even yellow carded the Italian coach for some very, very obvious coaching from the sidelines.

Gary Mullens finished 39th out of 47 competitors in the Men's 10m Air Pistol and 31st in the Men's 50m Pistol. He started off each off his matches quite shakily but improved as he went along with some very fine bullseye '10s' shot.

Competition was over. We had one more night in Bangkok before we left. In the wisdom of the Australian Team Organisers we were to travel home before the closing ceremony. This was in an attempt to curb general team misbehaviour. I would have liked the shooting team to have stayed for the closing ceremony as it would have rounded off their whole experience. I had had no trouble with the shooting team, probably because unlike other coaches and managers at this event I actually went along to the markets, temples and night clubs with them ... just to check they all got home safe.

2008 WORLD UNIVERSITY SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year in October after the Olympics and Paralympics are over the 2nd World University Shooting Championships will be held in Beijing at the Olympic Shooting venue. I am proud to be able to take the Australian University Shooting team over to this event. This is a self funded trip and again the shooters see the valuable opportunity to further their international experience by participating. The team at the time of writing this article is Stefanie Tigani and Amanda Holt (Women's Trap) Matt Rocco, Daniel Allam, Tim Bourke (Men's Trap & Double Trap) and the pistol shooters Allana Slater and Gary Mullens.



ACTA SKEET NATIONALS REPORT CARD 2008


During the 2007 Skeet Nationals held at the National Grounds in Wagga Wagga in November, attendees were asked to fill in an evaluation survey of 10 questions to rate the event from a shooting and visitor experience perspective, and provide comments and feedback on what they liked, and what could be improved. Sixty five surveys were returned, giving a sample of half the shooters.

In 2008, we continued to build on this feedback, by again asking shooters to complete a questionnaire. This year, the Championships were held from the 19th to 24th May, and 79 surveys were returned for analysis. A number of the questions relating to the event itself and the facilities provided at the grounds were repeated, allowing us to measure progress and slippages. By building on this knowledge each year we can be sure that the needs of the majority of participating members are being met.

There were only six months between the 2007 and 2008 events, so it is pleasing to see that some improvements have been recorded, including an increase in the rating of the quality of the overall event and catering, with a small increase in the approval rating of the event and office staff. Some problems with the voice release system resulted in a downturn in its approval this year.

The feedback on targets thrown and the facilities are the national grounds remained the same.

More detailed charts follow providing a breakdown of responses, together with a selection of comments and suggestions for improvement.



In 2008, 72% of shooters rated the overall conduct of the event between 8/10 and 10/10 compared with 56% in 2007, and increase of 16%. This year 20% gave a mark of 6/10 or 7/10 against 36% last year. Those giving lower scores between 3/10 and 5/10 totalled

8% in both years. This means 16% of the shooters migrated into the top approval category, with disapproval remaining static. Feedback from shooters included:

"The best for atmosphere for many years" "First time here, but very well run" "The event was a lot better than last year" "Well run, good targets, visibility. Points off for voice release problems" "Need more days shooting" "No ammo for sale" "Slow results for shoot offs"

This year 21% of shooters gave a top score for targets thrown compared to 28% in 2007. However, 30% of shooters rated them a 9/10 against only 15% last year. Overall, this year there was a 4% percentage increase in those who rated targets thrown as very good to excellent (8/10 to 10/10) from 64% to 68%. The lower scores from 1 to 5 remained fairly constant – with 18% in 2008 as against 17% in 2007. Comments ranged accordingly:

"Real good"

"Started OK, but progressed downhill" "Good. Better than last year" "Average - tended to vary left to right"

The change of timing of the Skeet Nationals from hot and dusty November, to a much cooler May was appreciated by a majority of the shooters with 60% giving an 8 to 10, and a further 21% reasonably happy with the change. 12% gave the thumbs down, with the cold and earlier darkness cited as the main objections.

"Cooler weather is nicer than hot weather" "Enjoyed the cooler conditions and no flies, but the mud needs to be looked at"


"If rain and hail stays away – excellent" "Too cold and wet"

A majority of shooters (61%) were in favour of holding the Skeet and Sporting Nationals back to back, citing the increase in shooters numbers as a positive. In contrast 20% were against the back to back format and many of those supporting it did so on the proviso that the Skeet titles be held prior to the Sporting.



There was a keenness among some respondents to reintroduce the small gauges during the pre nationals, and for a day or two rest in between the two disciplines. They said:


"Any increase in shooter numbers is a plus" "Good idea - but reverse the order"

The total of shooters rating the staff performance as very good to excellent (from 8 to 10) rose from 87% last year to 91% in 2008. 56% of attendees gave a 10 out of 10 score to the office and event staff (53% in 2007), 21% gave them 9 out of 10 (24% in 2007), and the percentage of those giving an 8 out of 10 rose to 14% from 10% last year. In is also noted that this year there was no score below a 6/10.





The Voice Release system continued to be controversial in 2008, with fewer people giving it a 10/10 rating this year (12% against 44% last year) and more giving a low rating (13% against 8% last year). Comments indicate that the greater spread in the rankings appears to have been the result more inconsistency experienced in 2008 versus 2007. Many of those who gave lower ratings commented that they like the system, but that it needs further refining to achieve a top score.







"A lot of thought put in and I hope it gets built"


"Great"

Psychological Skills for Shooting

HYPNOSIS FOR SPORT

Throughout this year the dominant subject for these articles has been mental rehearsal and visualization. The main reason for this has been the work I have been doing with the Southern Sports Academy, and helping these talented athletes, lift their potential and performance by using mental rehearsal skills, as well as the technical and physical skills they had been used to using.

Recently, whilst walking through town, I noticed a flyer for a hypnotist who is coming to perform at the local RSL club. Visions sprang to mind of people running about doing silly and dangerous things as part of post-hypnotic suggestions. Now I don't want to criticise the 'hypnotist' and what he is doing: which is nothing more than an act to make money, but I do want to put hypnosis as a tool for developing mental skills into perspective.

I need to point out that I have completed a "Diploma in Clinical Hypnotherapy", and as result I see hypnotherapy as a valuable technique in either general therapy or specifically for sport.

Hypnosis has quite a long past and was originally used as an anaesthesia for surgical operations prior to chloroform and other chemicals. The original process was called mesmerism and was developed by Franz Mesmer in the 1700's. Hypnosis took another blow when it was rejected by Freud for psychoanalysis and then hypnosis became commonplace in theatres and with entertainers. Following the Second World War, hypnosis had a revival because of the move away from the lengthy process of psychoanalysis and the need for effective, short term therapeutic interventions.

There is a general lack of understanding of what hypnosis is in the general community. Stage shows, television and the movies have portrayed a distorted view of this valuable technique. It is necessary to deal with some of the misunderstandings before I deal with the subject in general.

According to Winter & Martin, hypnosis is not sleep. Sleep is a state of reduced consciousness whilst hypnosis is a state of heightened consciousness. Hypnosis is a natural state of mind that we all feel from time to time. Those times when you are so engrossed in a book you do not hear someone at the door or you are driving and you can't recall going past a particular landmark or over a bridge. This is how you can expect to feel as you are hypnotized and it is likened to that feeling just before you go to sleep.

Hypnosis is not a state of being out to it or being in a trance. Actually you are just relaxed. Sometimes, this relaxation can be very deep, but for performance hypnosis there is no need. So as a result you will remember everything that happens to you whilst you are hypnotized.

Because of showman hypnotists, as seen on television, people often

This is not really possible and will not happen with a psychologist because they are bound by a code of ethical practice. It must also be remembered that hypnosis in sport is used to improve concentration and confidence, reduce anxiety, or to help clients change behaviours such as quitting smoking or losing weight.

Hypnosis in sport had been widely used for sometime in the Eastern Bloc countries. The first scientific report of it's use in the Western world was in 1943 when Professor Dorothy Yates used hypnosis to assist a squad of university boxers. In the 1940's-1950's there was widespread use for sports such as basketball, baseball and icehockey. In the early 1960's hypnosis was used to assist a Red Sox baseball player, Jackie Jensen, of anxiety due to flying. He was about to give up baseball because he could play away games because of his fear of flying. In Australia, Dr Guy Grant, helped the North Melbourne football team win their first-ever grand final.

Athletes, in general have been reluctant to confess that they have been using hypnosis for performance enhancement. This is possibly due to a misguided belief that "tampering with their psyche" is a reflection of a basic weakness, unnatural or unethical. These beliefs cannot be further from the truth. Firstly, there is nothing weak about striving to improve or to enhance your performance. Secondly, it is entirely natural. There are no performance enhancing drugs involved, because in the main it is relaxation with carefully placed positive suggestions and affirmations. Finally, if practiced by a psychologist, under a rigid code of conduct, and if it is available to all athletes then it can't be considered unethical.

What does it feel like when hypnotized. Most people are surprised when they experience their first session because they realize that they weren't asleep and that they could hear everything around them or that they could have opened their eyes. This helps the client better understand that they are in control of their behaviour and environment. It is possible to go into deeper states of hypnosis but still clients are aware of the noises and things around them. Actually, under hypnosis clients are three times more aware of the noises and things around them.

According to Winter & Martin, our normal alert state of consciousness acts something like a watchdog to incoming ideas; it screens what it will let through. This watchdog my often stop positive thoughts from getting through and allows you to dwell on negative judgements about yourself or your performance from the past. Hypnosis helps get the watchdog out of the way so that you can get your message through to the part of the mind where images, attitudes and memories are stored. Hypnosis helps you do this through a combination of physical relaxation and mental concentration.

Over the next few months I will focus further on hypnosis and will include some self-hypnosis strategies for readers to try.





I.e. 200 competition targets at a higher percentage to be upgraded and 600 competition targets at a lower grade percentage to be downgraded, simple, effective, nothing else required.

I agree with the last paragraph in the Editors Note that yes, when shootings doubles at station seven, fragments from the low can break the high and some of these pieces may come in the direction of the shooter, but let's be serious, how often would this happen? The statement could be misinterpreted that someone other than the shooter is ducking for cover.



Location: Situated right in the heart of the Mid North Coast of NSW



Southern Zone ISSF Carnival CANBERRA INTERNATIONAL



The Southern Zone ISSF Carnival was held at the Canberra international Clay Target Club on May 17th and 18th, and of course the Saturday was wet weather gear and beanie weather but the Sunday saw shooters languishing in the sun between rounds. There were the regular campers and vans taking in the beautiful views and the wildlife.

Five squads of ISSF Trap shooters attended the weekend, unfortunately with the clash with the American Skeet and Sporting Clays Nationals ISSF Skeet numbers were well down on previous years.

The first day of the Southern Zone ISSF Carnival was a 100 Target Handicap plus a final shot single barrel with Handicap added on. The system that was used utilised the grading system of AA, A, B and C and the percentages that dictate the grading. Hence AA (>93%) was given an additional 7 targets on top of their score out of 100, A (>82%) had 18 targets added onto their score out of 100, B (>70%) had 30 added on and C grade which is less than 70 % had 44 targets added on. The beauty of Handicap shooting in ISSF is that it will not always be the usual AA and A grade shooters that will make the final, thus giving a chance to C and B grade shooters to experience a single barrel final and have the chance of winning overall. Clay target shooting is a sport for all ages, abilities and levels of skill and handicapping is the best way of levelling the playing field and keeping less skilled shooters interested. However the downfall with Handicap shooting is if people are not really shooting in the grade that they should be in or with this particular shoot with shooters that are very new to ISSF and are not yet in a grade which best represents their skill level. However the outcome of the ISSF Trap Handicap on this day was guite impressive and the six shooters in the final represented a good mix of ages, skill levels and gender. Frank Minici (CPCTC), Andy Vaccaro (Majura Park) and Samantha Peck (CPCTC) underwent a five target miss and out shoot off to decide who would be the last shooter into the final round they had all finished on a score of 105/100 when handicap was added onto their original score. Samantha was the winner of this little contest and was to shoot in her first ISSF Trap final.

The results from the final round were:

1st Alex Vassilimis (Illawarra B Grade Junior) 2nd Willow Cameron (Majura Park B Grade) 3rd Samantha Peck (Cecil Park B Grade Lady and only her 2nd ISSF shoot) 4th John Coaker (Warren B Grade) 5th Elio Zadro (Cecil Park C Grade Veteran) 6th Ben Duncan (Majura Park C Grade and only his 3rd ISSF shoot). The scores from the final which ranged from 19 to 8 out of 25 show that being able to shoot single barrel finals (particularly as well as Michael Diamond and Adam Vella do is very hard to achieve) and is a totally different skill and concentration level than the previous double barrel rounds of the day.

The actual Southern Zone Championship and Team selection was held on the Sunday. Mark Corbett from Cooma/Berridale Gun Club
