The main aim is to ensure a profitable outcome for the Association. The increase in fees has no bearing on whether the championship is being conducted on the National Grounds at Wagga Wagga or elsewhere.

Pre-nomination forms for Trap and Skeet are available on both our website and in the CTSN. Persons nominating prior to the advertised closing dates will be entitled to a reduced nomination fee.

To date we have received 215 pre-nominations and 190 bookings for camping sites for this year's Trap Nationals which indicates we will have a successful championship. The Roma Clay Target Club is busy finishing extensions to their existing clubhouse, which will have dining facilities to seat 250 people. Incorporated in this new facility will be the Queensland Hall of Fame building where memorabilia will be on permanent display. During the National Championships the Queensland Hall of Fame building will be officially opened on Saturday March 28, and Queensland's first nominees will be inducted into the Queensland Hall of Fame, this will be a night to remember, so be quick and order your ticket with State administrator Debbie Young.

Likewise the ACTA Hall of Fame dinner will be held on the following Tuesday night March 31, 2009. This prestigious annual event is always sold out so be sure to make your bookings through our National office.

I look forward to meeting you all in Roma, until then, good shooting.

The Bendigo Clay Target Club's Australia Day shoot commenced in 1975, the year colour television was introduced.

Bruce Santon was of the belief the "coloured tele's" would be a drawcard to shooters, and if he was proven right, the recently relocated club would receive much needed funds. When 229 shooters turned up to compete for the 5 TV's on offer, Bruce's idea had well and truly paid off.

To purchase the TV's, Bruce had prevailed on the generosity of 5 club members to loan the club the necessary funds. With a clear profit of \$3,500, they were paid back immediately and the Bendigo Club now had a substantial bank balance. Bruce had gambled on 100 shooters as the break even mark.

Bendigo only had 2 traps, and to ensure that there would be no holdups on the day, the Maryborough Club sent 1 of their "Damo" traps on standby. The day ran without a hitch, and the foundation was laid well and truly for the "Bendigo Australia Day Shoot".

The following year, Bendigo joined with Cohuna and Echuca Gun Clubs and established the "Northern & Central Victoria Circuit Shoot". Cohuna shot Saturday, Echuca, Sunday and Bendigo on the Monday. The circuit shoot ran for a number of years before being disbanded

ANYONE CAN TARGET SYDNEY 2009 WORLD MASTERS GAMES

Registrations are open for the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games, October's seventh edition of the world's largest multi-sport event at which everyday people have extraordinary experiences.

Running 10-18 October, the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games are open to everyone rather than just elite competitors. To enter the Games people need only meet their favourite sport's minimum age, which in the case of shooting is just 30 years. All about being fit, fun and forever young, this year's Games are set to attract more than double the number of competitors of the Olympics.

Of the 28 Sydney 2009 World Masters Games sports competitions, 12 of them will take place at Sydney 2000 Olympic Games venues. Shooting is one of the designated dozen, with the superb Sydney International Shooting Centre in Cecil Park staging the small bore and air rifle, pistol and, of course, clay target disciplines.

After two official practice days (10-11 October) to help the local, national and international competitors become accustomed to the Cecil Park facility, the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games clay target shooting competition will run 12-18 October and comprise seven events - 100 targets single barrel, 100 targets double barrel, 100 targets points double barrel, 100 targets American skeet, 125 targets ISSF skeet and final, 125 targets ISSF skeet and final, 75 pair ISSF double trap and final and 125 targets ISSF trap and final.

At the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games, competitors will go for gold against their peers. In the clay target shooting competition, there will be five age categories (30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69 and 70+) for men and women in the single barrel, double barrel, points double barrel and American skeet events, with two age groups (30-49 and 50+) for both genders in the three ISSF events. The competitor's age on 31 December will determine their category.

To register online for the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games or simply to find out more information, visit the Games website at www.2009worldmasters.com. Competitor registrations are open until 31 July, with the clay target competitor registration fee of \$275 also including, among other things, free Games-time public transport on the city's extensive network of trains, buses and ferries and a seat at the Games Opening Ceremony.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

THE NEED TO ACHIEVE

One of the most complex issues with sports psychology and performance in general is: how do we create and sustain motivation? Over the years there has been a change in the way psychology has viewed human motivation. The following is a brief and sketchy history of the area of motivation taken from *The Sports Psych Handbook*.

Motivation was first examined by Norman Triplett, a psychologist at Indiana University in 1887, when he noticed that cyclists rode faster in pairs than when they were alone. Triplett's motivation discovery was referred to as social facilitation, but this was not utilized for over half a century. In the early 1900s psychologists took a deterministic view of motivation. Psychoanalysis argued that motivation was a product of subconscious instincts of sex and aggression. Freud, especially argued that our behaviour was shaped by our instincts. Next, Hull believed that motivation was a function of our basic physiological needs, such as hunger, thirst and fatigue. Finally, Skinner, put forth a stimulus-response theory, known as behaviourism, claiming that all behaviour is controlled by external reinforcements. All of these theories: instinct, drive and reinforcement argue that motivation is not up to the individual but rather is to either the products of genetics or the environment.

In the 1960s there was a change of thinking about what motivated athletes. Cognitive sports psychology argued that motivation was based on conscious and controllable thoughts: motivation was therefore a decision that each athlete can make.

So, armed with this brief history of motivation, what can we make of it. Whilst we all have traits that will affect our behaviour, and we all have primitive instincts that subconsciously direct the way we act, and we all respond to punishment and reinforcement, we still have to make some decisions for ourselves.

There are several characteristics that influence potential. Firstly, the motivation to engage in physical tasks can be regulated by "locus of causality". Eliot (2005) writes, when participation in sport is inherent-ly pleasurable, when effort is based on the enjoyment of competition, excitement, or the desire to learn and improve are said to have *intrinsic* motivation. On the other hand when, sport involvement is steered by trophies, ribbons, salaries or scholarships, or the approval of others, athletes are extrinsically motivated. Internal and external rewards can improve motivation; they can also affect one another." There needs to be a mixture of both internal and external needs. We all need to have a sense of purpose and be personally satisfied with our performance over time. Having this meaningful sense of purpose will get us through when we are having a bad run.

The second characteristic is self-efficacy. Eliot argues the reasons athletes want to compete depend on the contrast between internal and external rewards as well as the athlete's preperformance assessment. That is, if an athlete believes can be successful, he or she is more likely to participate. This construct is usually referred to as self confidence or self-efficacy. Eliot continues by stating that high selfefficacy is a judgement about one's capacity to perform a particular task at an elevated level, with certainty and repeatedly over time. It is these three factors that distinguish achievers from non-achievers, because from a motivational point of view, those athletes with higher self-efficacy tend to try harder, persist longer, choose greater challengers, experience effort more positively, and feel less anxious. Self-efficacy should not be confused with self-esteem. Self-esteem pertains to a person's generalized feeling of worth, whereas self efficacy concerns specific skills, abilities or opportunities.

The next characteristic is goal orientation. Achievement goal theory

suggests that two major goal perspec-tives operate in an achievement context such as sport: a task ori-entation and an ego orientation. Put simply, a task orientation implies that one participates in an activity for its own intrinsic properties. The enjoyment of the game, the way we feel when we smoke the target, or catch a great wave, or sink a tricky putt. There is a great inner sense of satis-faction when we do well or when we have achieved a personal best. Ego orientation (or outcome goal orientation) on the other hand has participants striving to demonstrate superior ability com-pared to everyone else or avoiding the demonstration of incompe-tence. Both these orientations are within all of us. The good way to deal with goal orientation during the competition is to focus on the process and let the product look after itself.

The fourth characteristic involves performance feedback and interpretation. Attributions address the causes of expectancy beliefs and successes and failures affect continuing motivation. Eliot how outlines that three characteristics underlie attributions. The first characteristic is the locus of causality (perceiving an outcome to have resulted from either an internal or external factor). An internal factor would involve effort or injury whilst an external factor might be equipment such as your gun or ammunition, or a particular gun club or layout. The second characteristic is stability (perceiving the likelihood of the same outcome recurring). A stable factor would be your technical skills, abilities, physical skills and mental skills. An example of an unstable factor would be the weather or luck. The final characteristic of attributions is locus of control (the perception of whether an outcome can be manipulated.) Controllable factors might include your game plan, your pre game meal, whilst an uncontrollable factor might include the referee's calls or opponent's mistakes.

The final characteristic involves high performance consciousness, flow or what is commonly referred to as being in "the zone". Being in the zone involves effortless movement, transformation of time, clarity of vision, distortion of objects, loss of sense of self, etc. Eliot argues that flow or being in the zone should be goal because it will enhance and sustain motivation. He outlines the following to maximize the chances of achieving flow:

- 1. Balance challenges with skills.
- 2. Perform in the present (leave past judgement and future fears alone).
- 3. Concentrate of a small, specific target.
- 4. Concentrate of what is controllable.
- 5. Eliminate in-game evaluation and self-judgement.
- 6. Enjoy the rhythm and feel of the performance.
- 7. Have fun.

Now that we have a basic understanding of the psychological conceptualization of motivation, next month we will look at how to put these principles to work.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2009 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2009 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2009 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade or section prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. A \$5 re-squad fee shall apply. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions. Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

Where necessary, shootoffs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as family member paying full nomination fees.

Authority

This program shall control the 2009 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2009 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking:

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times - Please co-operate.

Souvenirs:

In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2009 National Championships badge.

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

For those shooters who attended the team dinner at the last World DTL Championship which was held in Banagher, Ireland, you may recall the comments I made regarding the next event, scheduled for March 2010 in Cape Town, South Africa.

For the benefit of those National Team shooters who did not attend the team dinner and naturally also for the hundreds of shooters who were not even in Ireland for that Championship event, I would like to pass on some exciting information about the World DTL Trap Championship to be held in South Africa.

At the tip of the African continent, Cape Town has become recognized as being one of the top tourist cities in the world, ranked alongside Rio de Janeiro, Sydney, Singapore, San Francisco and many other similar cities which enjoy glorious beaches close to beautiful mountains. Cape Town has become a cosmopolitan city, since large numbers of European and British based people have invested in property overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, for, what to them, has been small money.

The Valley Gun Club is situated a scant 30 km from the city of Cape Town, close to the towns of Paarl and Stellenbosch, which lie in the heart of the South African winelands and are surrounded by world class beauty. The club is arguably the Country's premier Clay Target Club with over 200 members, who enjoy all disciplines of Clay busting, including the Olympic disciplines.

Whilst I am passionate about the Cape, the winelands, and the Mountains and Valleys, as the President of the Clay Target Shooting Association of South Africa I should be better qualified to promote the shoot rather than the tourist attractions, so let me say that the Valley Gun Club management, main committee and all of the subcommittees which have been formed have been hard at work for over a year already, to ensure that they present a shoot by which all future shoots will be judged. A more dedicated team of professional people will be hard to find anywhere on the globe. At least three of their senior management team attended both of the last two DTL World Championships - in Wagga Wagga 2006 and Banagher 2008 - in order to observe what to do, or not to do.

All the ranges will be in place; a total of 12 for the shoot, plus two as permanent practice ranges which will be open during shooting for those who wish to simply calm nerves with a quick 10 shots before their event. All traphouses are equipped with new traps and the supplier will be on hand with replacement machines in the unlikely event of any breakdown.

Ammunition will be on sale at the range, both from the club, which is a licenced "dealer" and from normal traders who will have their facilities in a "tent town" for vendors. A secure facility for gun storage will be available at the range for peace of mind for all shooters when they leave the range at the end of each day's shooting.

The shoot program is in the final stages of completion and should be on the website during March 2009. Please visit www.ctsasa.co.za which will provide you with a link to the Valley Gun Club and the World DTL Championships. The shoot program will include the South African Trap Championships in both ATA single barrel, and DTL, providing good practice for the World DTL Championship. There will also be a number of side "fun" events to keep all shooters happy.

Perhaps the most compelling reason for you to very seriously consider pressing the "entry" button on the website, is the cost factor. At the time of writing, the Australian dollar and the New Zealand dollar are each worth around 6 to 7 of our South African Rands. Simply stated, this equates, for example, to a beer costing, in a good restaurant, about R12, or in your terms, about A\$ 1,80. A really good meal in a great, world class restaurant, at about R200 a head, equates to about A\$25 – A\$30. The value for money proposition for our foreign visitors is absolutely awesome.

Accommodation in high standard Bed and Breakfast type establishments should cost around R300 per person per night, or \$42. Naturally, for the well heeled, Superior International level 5 Star hotels are also available in Cape Town at (to us!) staggering prices! The Cape Town Waterfront known as the "V & A" Waterfront after Victoria and Albert - is the model from which all International Waterfront developments have been based. It contains dozens of good restaurants, shopping malls and hotels and is a great place from which to chill out in an internationally recognized tourist haven.

Most importantly for families, the levels of crime are nowhere near what some grossly overstated bad press has given South Africa. We do have crime here, as does every major city in the world. Wherever I have travelled, I have had friends or work colleagues warn me to stay away from certain areas. Cape Town and environs is no different, as is the rest of South Africa. We offer the opportunity for a fantastic holiday for shooters and their families and would urge those shooters who are considering the trip, to bring your wives, partners and children. You will have a holiday of a lifetime at remarkably affordable costs.

Remarkable Man – JOE WRIGHT

For the past 2 years I have travelled frequently to St Arnaud to visit my 95 year old father in Coates Hostel, a Nursing Home. Unfortunately Dad had a fall on our farm near St Arnaud and put a small crack in his hip bone and has not been able to get around easily. My mother moved to a small unit in St Arnaud so that she could be near Dad.

During my visits to the Nursing Home I have got to know many of the residents as they spend the greater part of their day in the large lounge/activities room. One of the residents is Joe Wright. Joe is a very happy person with a passion for crosswords, and on meeting him you cannot but notice he has no left arm.

On a recent visit, my mother said to me, "Bet you didn't know Joe was a Champion shot in his day?" Mum then produced the local newspaper which carried a column entitled "50 Years Ago." This particular article referred to Joe and his inclusion in the 1958 Mackintosh Team.

I was aware that a photograph of this particular team was included in George Biggs's book, "The History of the Australian Clay Target Association."

On my next visit, I took a copy of the book with me and showed Joe the picture. He was thrilled. He then informed me that he had originally had the photograph, but he had lost it in a house fire, along with all his trophies and shooting memorabilia. With the help of Jim Shepherd I was able to organise a copy of the photograph, frame it and give it to Joe along with a copy of the book. The photograph now hangs in pride of place in his room.

As I have a copy of each Clay Target Shooting News from the original, I was able to find the results of the 1958 National Championships and the report on each event. The following entry from the May Edition of 1958 is well worth repeating and is testimony to Joe's effort –

"A remarkable performance during the recent Association shoot at East Burwood was put up by the St. Arnaud (Victoria) shooter, Joe Wright. Wright is a brilliant all round marksman. Just prior to shooting in the Association fixture, Wright had spent a week shooting in the Victorian Oueen's Prize rifle shooting meeting at Williamstown (V). He came straight from .303 to the 12 gauge at East Burwood, and went within 1 point of tieing with Newton Thomas and Andy Tie in the National Doublebarrel Championship. In this event Wright had only to stop his final target with the

first barrel to be in the tie shoot, but after being slightly baulked he broke it with his second and thus dropped one below the tieists. Wrights effort with the .303 and the 12 gauge is all the more remarkable when it is noted that his left hand has been smashed (a result of being caught between the buffers of two railway trucks) and he merely rests the gun on the end of his left wrist."

When you read the results report of the event and note the shooters who finished in front of Joe, you also realise what a great effort it was. The winner of the event was Newton Thomas on 239/240, second was Andy Tie on 238/240, third Sperry Marshall on 193/195 and then Joe on 207/210. Also of note is that this particular Mackintosh team went on to win with a score of 2876/3000.

Joe was born in 1920 at St Arnaud and grew up on the family farm at St Arnaud East. Along with his 2 brothers and 4 sisters he attended school at St Arnaud East before leaving to work on the farm.

In 1938 Joe joined the local Militia putting his age up so that his younger brothers could also enlist. The local group was the 17th Machine Gun Regiment and Joe quickly adapted to "army life" and thus began his love for shooting. Joe found his "eye" was pretty good and he shot whenever ammunition was available.



Joe laughs when he recalls being sent to camp at Broadmeadows, Melbourne to continue his training and being asleep one night when the Artillery Unit began live firing in the middle of the night. At this time the Army still had a large number of mounted units and as the live firing commenced the horses broke their tethers and took off in all directions causing a huge problem for their handlers. Joe added that as his unit was then mechanised he was not required for the resultant lengthy roundup, all he had to do was roll over and go back to sleep.

Joe was transferred to the 26th Machine Gun Regiment located in

St Arnaud with their Headquarters in Warracknabeal. Joe began training in earnest with Enfield .303's and the Vickers Machine Gun. He enjoyed shooting the .303 very much and subsequently joined the St Arnaud Rifle Club and began to shoot competitively.

When the Second World War broke out in 1939, Joe was immediately called to camp at Warracknabeal in October of that year. It was during the particular camp that he had his left hand and forearm crushed between 2 railway trucks and was immediately taken to Melbourne to have his arm amputated but ended up losing his hand.

As Joe's injury healed he commenced to shoot again, resting the forend of the rifle across his left forearm. His injury prevented him from active service; however, he remained in the Army where he met his wife, Estelle.

Joe continued to shoot with the St Arnaud Rifle Club and began to compete successfully in the Queens Prize Rifle Match at Williamstown.

He and Estelle purchased their own farm at Traynors Lagoon and Joe transferred to the Trayors Lagoon Rifle Club. This rifle club had a particularly strong group of members and they won many team competitions throughout Victoria, including the then prestigious Bendigo Association team event.

In 1957 Joe broadened his shooting disciplines taking up clay target shooting, with the then newly reformed St Arnaud Gun Club. The original St Arnaud Gun Club had gone into recess in 1955 after live bird shooting had become illegal. Joe purchased a Browning over/under from Evans & Balfour in Melbourne for 120 pounds (\$240.00) after finding his A5 Browning to be unreliable on the trap. It was only some 12 months later that he competed at the 1958 Nationals and very nearly took out the "Blue Ribbon Event."

Unfortunately in 1959 Joe and Estelle lost everything when fire destroyed their home. Among the items destroyed were all Joe's shooting trophies and his shooting memorabilia. After this devastating loss, Joe found it hard to continue all his shooting, but he did recommence rifle shooting. He states that the fact ex military rifles were only 2 pound helped in this decision.

Joe was club champion on many occasions and his ability as a coach was known through rifle shooting in Victoria. He thoroughly enjoyed his shooting, no matter what the discipline. Making many great friends throughout shooting and on trips to Melbourne, Joe never missed the opportunity to drop in on Donald Mackintosh for a yarn and a few tips. Joe says he is a little sorry that shooting has not continued in his family, but has no regrets. Joe has 2 sons, a daughter, 5 grandchildren and a great-grandson.

Not a bad effort for a guy that only ever attended the "Nationals" once!!!!!!!!!

Michael Diamond 2008 – A Review



Even though Michael Diamond started 2008 as World Champion after his world record breaking 148/150 at Nicosia Cyprus late in 2007, it was a relatively slow start to the year for him. He started 2008 with two second placings and a third at the ISSF Nationals in the heat and wind of Perth.

The next event for Michael should have been the pre Olympic World Cup in Beijing; however he unfortunately missed the only two available flights to the Chinese capital (one due to a protest at the Chinese Embassy and one due to a

road accident on the Newcastle Freeway).

When asked about the new green flash targets used during qualifying at the pre Olympic World Cup, Michael said, "I always say if it is round and it flies I will shoot it. It is not going to be a problem, we have seen every kind of target over the years, and as long as they break it is OK for me. We are all going to shoot at the same targets at the Olympics aren't we?"

The next stop on the calendar for Michael, was the second World Cup of the year in May at Kerrville Texas USA. This time Michael arrived several days earlier and went on to easily win this event as the competition succumbed to the pressure in the final, where Michael equaled his own world record score of 148/150 again demonstrating the formidable combination of Diamond, Perazzi (Italy) and Fiocchi (Italy). (Some of you may recall that Michael shot a 149/150 to win the Olympic Gold Medal at Atlanta in 1996 – this does not count as a world record as the Olympic Games are not an Open event). Michael prefers to arrive at each event just in time to acclimatize and practice, then compete and head home as soon as possible. He rarely goes sightseeing or anything like that, preferring to focus solely on the event.

In July Michael headed to Suhl in Germany for a final shoot out before a short break in preparation for the Olympic Games. He once again won this event with a brilliant score of 147/150, but showing that he is his own task master commented, "If only I had shot one more target in qualifying I could have equaled the world record". No wonder he has collected 17 World Cup Titles as well as 4 World Championships and two Olympic Gold Medals.

With August came the Beijing Olympics and all the hype about the weather and air quality. Michael put these distractions behind him and made the final of this hotly contested event, unfortunately the thrilling final was not broadcast in Australia and most of us resorted to scanning radios and the internet to find out what was happening during the final, Unfortunately Michael missed his last target. "I knew where it was going and just jumped over it" he said later. He was then forced into a shoot off for the Bronze which he missed out on to Athens Gold Medalist Alexi Alipov.

Final event for Michael for 2008 was the World Cup Final, the invitation only finale to the World Cup Season, which was held in September, Minsk, Belaruse. In freezing conditions and wearing every stitch of clothing that he had with him Michael hung on in the final until the last target, taking the silver Medal behind lifelong foe Giovanni Pellielo.

While many of us would dream of achieving two World Cup Gold Medals, a World Cup Final Silver Medal, fourth place at the Olympic Games, two silver and a bronze medals at the Nationals in one year, for Michael it is was less than perfection and he is determined to do better in 2009.

Junior Olympic Trap Champion

At 12 years of age most boys are kicking footballs or riding bikes but one Sydneysider was already on the local rifle range honing his skills as a top marksman.

Fast forward five years and 17-year-old Michael McNabb is now the Junior Olympic Trap Champion shooter after representing Australia in clay target at the Australian Youth Olympic Festival (AYOF) in January 2009.

His winning results: Trap - Men (Round 2 - 50

Targets) 1st (113) and Trap - Men (Final) 1st (113+19 = 132).

Michael was introduced to shooting by his father who regularly trained at the Silverdale Rifle Range.

"Dad was a really keen rifle shooter," he said. "I went along with him to Silverdale Rifle Range and saw the clay target shooting. I was excited by the moving target aspect."

Michael immediately began training and competing in the sport.

"Holding a gun as a 12-year-old didn't scare me," he said. "I was used to being around guns because my Dad was involved in the sport. I was also drilled about the safety requirements."

"My first competition was at the Silverdale Rifle Range where I competed in the Five Standard Shooting Competition.

"Using a borrowed gun, shooting jacket and ammunition with a tea towel taped to my shoulder to lessen the recoil (kick), I won the junior competition," Michael said.

Michael has since been selected for state and national teams and prior to the AYOF won a bronze medal at Commonwealth Youth Games in India. "I went to the Commonwealth Youth Games in Pune and was over the moon to win a bronze medal."

Michael was one of ten young Aussie shooters selected to wear the green and gold in the sport of shooting at the AYOF.

AYOF athletes get to compete at the Sydney Olympic venues where their role models won 58 medals in 2000 and finished fourth on the overall medal tally.

Speaking prior to the event he said "I am really happy to be selected for the AYOF, this is one of my goals and I can now tick this off the list. The goal there is to win a medal."

He identified other Australian shooters and New Zealand as his main rivals. For Michael though, it's not just about the sport, but about the Festival experience as a whole.

"It's great," he said. "I went to India for the Commonwealth Youth

games in October (last year) as well. You meet a lot of new people, it's great fun".

"Long term I hope to make the Commonwealth Games team and then the Olympics."

1550 athletes from 23 countries contested 17 sports at the AYOF. Some of these athletes will go on to the first ever Youth Olympic Games staged by the IOC in Singapore in 2010, others will take the next step to the London Olympics in 2012, others will experience the thrill of a lifetime.

HISTORY OF THE AYOF

The Australian Youth Olympic Festival (AYOF) was initiated by the Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) following the success of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. The Festival was first held in Sydney in January 2001, and has been held bi-annually ever since.

Every Festival has grown from the previous in terms of athletes, sports and competing nations. Where possible the Olympic venues from 2000 are utilised.

Like the Olympic Games athletes live in villages, undergo drug testing and there is an Opening Ceremony which features an athletes' parade, raising of the Olympic flag and lighting of the Festival flame.

The AOC is contributed \$4.6 million in funding the 2009 AYOF, up from \$3.3 million in 2007.

The AYOF's mission is to discover future Olympic Champions, provide them with an environment reminiscent of an Olympic Games and promote the Olympic ideals of fair play, honesty and pride in your country.

A staggering 76 athletes from the AYOF alumni represented Australia at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. Between them they won 23 medals, 5 gold, 7 silver and 11 bronze and if they were a country, would have finished 15th on the medal tally.

Matthew Mitcham, Anna Meares, Sally McLellan, Jared Tallent, Emma Snowsill, Eamon Sullivan, Cate Campbell, Melissa Wu and Jessicah Schipper have all competed at a past Festival.

It is anticipated many athletes from the 2009 Festival will go on and wear the green and gold at the London 2012 Olympics and beyond. In addition the Australian Youth Olympic Festival provides a great opportunity for spectators to 'See tomorrow's Olympians today.

Trapshooting Champions – Past and Present

The first of the "greats" was Donald Mackintosh, he was born in Rockbank, near Melbourne in 1866 and learnt to shoot at a very young age. By the time that he was six years old he was regularly shooting game with a muzzle loader and black powder.

He wasn't a very big lad and struggled with the gun but he persevered and became an exceptional wing shot by his early teenage years. He commenced trapshooting at 16 years of age at Bacchus Marsh and enjoyed success virtually from the start.

He developed his trapshooting skills and joined the Melbourne gun club at 23 years of age, it only took him six months to reach the maximum 30 yard handicap and from that time on he never shot from a handicap of less.

By 1890 he was dominating trapshooting at Melbourne and travelled extensively throughout Australia to participate in the major shoots of the day. He practiced extensively and generally participated in live bird shoots at least 3 days a week.

Although trapshooting now dominated his life he still loved hunting and spent as much time as possible shooting game, particularly quail, snipe and duck.

In 1896, he decided that he would travel to Europe to participate in the major trap shoots and to test himself against the best shots in the world. He met with a lot of success and ended up staying there for more than a year.

Donald returned home in 1897 and got married. However he had got a taste of the excitement that was in trapshooting in Europe, so he decided to return to Europe in 1900 and then competed and lived there for the next 9 years.

During this period he travelled extensively and competed in all the major trap shoots of the time. The events were held in Paris, London, Monte Carlo, Florence, Milan, Genoa, Rome, Venice, Turin, Naples, Brussels, Ostend, Aix les bains, Spa, Namur, Lyons, Vichy, Bordeaux, Madrid, Vienna, Budapest, Moscow and St Petersburg.

The grandest of all the venues was Monte Carlo, where the shooters were attended by up to 40 staff and prize money would regularly exceed \$1,000 or \$100,000 in today's terms. The betting at these shoots was huge with bets often exceeding \$1000.

Donald was very successful and won many of the major championships of the time. His list of wins includes major championships won in England, France, Italy, Belgium, Monte Carlo and Spain. He attended the 1900 Paris Olympics and won the trapshooting event, he was posthumously awarded an Olympic gold medal.

By 1903, he was the undisputed world champion, a position he maintained until he retired from international competition in 1908.

He was now 42 years old and he wanted to go back to Australia, he left Europe in September 1908 and returned home.

He had been preparing himself for life after shooting for some time and had spent a lot of time learning all the necessary skills to enable him to establish a business importing and dealing in guns.

So when he arrived back in Australia he established a gun shop in Melbourne. He dealt in all types of firearms but had a real passion for guns made by Purdy, Greener, Cashmore and Boswell. His favourite gun was a James Purdy hammer gun.

Although he continued to compete in trapshooting events over the next 40 years, he spent most of his time on his business and promoting the sport.

He was one of the first trap shooters in Australia to recognise the potential of clay targets and is believed to be the first person in

Australia to achieve a 100 break on clays; he did this in an exhibition shoot in Rockbank in 1928 and was awarded a gold medal in recognition.

In the early 1930's in conjunction with "Calrossie" Horrie James and others he founded the ACPTSA which was to become the ACTA. In recognition of his unique contribution to our sport he was appointed patron of the ACTA, he held this position from 1936 to 1951.

He maintained a passion for international competition and was responsible for establishing what we now know as the "Mackintosh" event. He donated a trophy for the event and worked tirelessly to ensure its success.

Throughout his later years he maintained a close association with the sport and advised

the association on many occasions. He was well known and respected by everyone associated with the sport.

Donald Mackintosh died in September 1951 at Essendon; he was 84 years of age.
