PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2008

It is with pleasure that I bring you my 2008 annual report, my second as President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

Solid efforts by our members at the Beijing Olympics failed to bring home medals for the first time since 1996, nevertheless Michael Diamond and Russell Mark both made the finals in their respective events with Michael narrowly missing out on a bronze medal in a shoot off.

Our 2008 ISSF National Championships were conducted in Western Australia, the grounds and facilities were a credit to the WAGC and WACTA. Being an Olympic year and our championships used as part of the team selection numbers were higher than expected with fierce competition in all events.

The National Trap Championships were held at our National Grounds in Wagga and were our most successful championships in recent years bringing large



entries with record breaking scores despite tough conditions.

Our World DTL teams travelled to Ireland and were successful with Lynne Curtis taking third place overall in the open section with our open team taking 3rd place. In the junior section Glen Barton became World Junior Champion with fellow team mate Anthony Rullo taking out third place, and our junior team winning the junior team event. In veterans Geoff Faulkes placed 3rd O/A and the veteran team placing 2nd, our ladies team placed 3rd

During May our National Sporting Championships and National Skeet Championships were conducted consecutively in the new time slot at our National Grounds with mixed reviews received on this format.

During the year we experienced several staff changes with Rowena Spiranac moving to Queensland, and our executive officer Carrie Elton resigning her position. Sue Pim joined our staff as

#### Scope

#### The financial report and the committee's responsibility

## Terry Thompson, Australia's Oldest Shooter



Terry Thompson was born on the 3rd of March 1920 and this year will be 89 years young. He started his Clay Target Shooting career in approximately 1950, at the Stratham Gun Club located 20km from Bunbury, where he shot for several years. Terry then started shooting with the Busselton club in approximately 1990 where he is a current member.

Terry recently competed in a 100 target points score event at Busselton and came 4th overall with an impressive 267/300.

His first round of the event he shot them with his first barrel giving him 75 points on the board to start the event, this also left a lot of other shooters with a worried look on their face.

Terry has shot a lot at the Augusta club as he said that the cool conditions agree with him more these days.

## **Psychological Skills for Shooting**

by Michael Kruger-Davis

#### BUILDING AND MAINTAINING HIGH LEVELS OF MOTIVATION

Last month, in a basic way, I examined the psychological conceptualization of motivation. In this article, I wish to go further and examine how to put the principles to work, effectively and practically.

For most people the idea of motivation involves the last minute, pre-game pep talk, where the coach gets the team aroused and motivated. This idea needs to be discarded. The proper time to work on sustaining motivation is outside the competition.

What are the long-term motivational strategies? John Eliot, writing in *The Sports Psych Handbook*, argues that motivation strategies should foster autonomy, competence and connectedness. It is interesting to note that these qualities are also inherent in mental toughness and resilience.

PUSH THE EDGE: Find your weakness and get excited about where your game will be after you change it. Using mental rehearsal and visualization techniques can speed up the process of changing your weakness into a strength.

EXPERIENCE SUCCESS: Use mastery learning techniques to acquire new skills. By this I mean break-up the process into smaller, easier steps and do not move on until you have mastered the pre-requisite skill.



It is important to keep a journal of your performances so that you know when you are more successful.

CHANGE YOUR THINKING: It is important that only your successes go into your long-term memory. There is no need to remember past failures.

GET INVOLVED: Autonomy directly improves motivation, and the greatest contributor to autonomy is having some control or input into the decisions that affect you. You should feel some ownership of the training rules, competition choices, and strategy decisions.

PRAISE OTHERS: You will not be able to see the positive and exciting aspects of your performance, if you can't see the positives and exciting things of others. Also you will develop a sense of connectedness when you have an awareness of the contributions others make.

PUT YOURSELF FIRST: Human beings are most productive when they are not distracted by conflicting basic drives. By this I mean that you cannot perform well if you are hungry, dehydrated or tired. Make sure you eat properly, stay hydrated and get enough rest.

FIND MOTIVATED PEERS: Both on and off the tracks spend time with people who want to accomplish great things, and aren't afraid to talk about it or get excited about your dreams and vision. Effective support is vital for motivation.

It is also important to avoid those "motivational black holes"; those people who are negative, critical, and focus on the distractions and what cannot be achieved.

THINK POSITIVELY: There is always a conversation going on in your head, it is usually subconscious. If you start paying it conscious attention, then make sure it is positive and focuses on what you can do. Don't get hung up on difficulties, distractions and losses.

REMEMBER YOUR DREAM: Spend time frequently reconnecting with the real reason you are competing.

To sum up several aspects regarding motivation are important. Firstly, motivation starts with a sense of purpose. Remember that intrinsic, process orientated motivation is preferred to extrinsic, goal orientated motivation. Secondly, does the athlete see a difference between just beating his opponents and making personal best performances. Next, with respect to team sports, are the team members focused on what the team can achieve or are they concerned with their individual performances. Finally, work out what values are important for the athlete, and frame feedback to mirror these values.

## **2009 ISSF** NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year's ISSF national championships were held at Cecil Park Clay Target Club over 20 – 25 January 2009. While it was a bit hot for a couple of the days, thankfully we escaped the dreadful heat wave that hit southern parts of Australia shortly afterward. Apart from a bit of rain late on the second day the weather held up reasonably well.

The ranges at Cecil Park had been well serviced by the indefatigable President Vince Gatt and Fred Rapley. There was only one very minor breakdown over the whole week which, when one considers the number of targets thrown, was a great achievement. Also the support from Cecil Park club in topping up and maintaining the traps was excellent thanks Vince and your team! One improvement that could be made at Cecil Park would be the provision of a decent area for presentations as these had to be held out in the wind, dust and, one evening, the rain. Perhaps an extension to the Russel Mark Control Building? Presentations are held throughout the week at the end of the events and are an important part of the competition. I am sure that everybody would prefer to see them done well in good surroundings.

We had a great line up of judges to help, which was great. Combining the ACTA nationals with Oceania provided an opportunity for them to gain useful experience. Tournament Director Elaine Forward insisted that things were run strictly according to ISSF rules and this, combined with the enthusiasm of the judges, lifted the standard of administration of the event. Claire and Paul Watts ran the

and day one saw the commencement of both the men's Commonwealth skeet and trap championships. The women shot their Commonwealth skeet championship out on that day. Zita Dettori was one point behind Lauryn Mark but after the final Lauryn Mark but after the final Lauryn stretched her lead to 86, Zita 84 with the young West Australian shooter Laura Lee Coles in third place with 82.

Next day saw the completion of the men's Commonwealth skeet and trap championships and the second women's skeet event the National Skeet Championship. Again Lauryn Mark was too strong coming in with a creditable 90 after the finals. However Laura Coles also shot well with a final score of 86. It was great to see how well Laura has developed over the last year or so and she appears to have a great future in front of her. Zita Dettori came in third with 78. Lauryn Mark obviously took out the women's skeet high gun with Laura Coles in second place.

In the men's Commonwealth skeet George Barton blitzed the opposition shooting 123 and finishing with a finals score of 145. (Pity it wasn't the PQS event George!) Keith Ferguson was second with 138 and junior shooter Mathew Maloney third overall with 135. In the men's Commonwealth trap Michael Diamond took out the event 123 and 145 after the finals. Russell Mark was second with 143 with junior shooter Michael McNabb right on Russell's heels with a 142. It was very good shooting by all and great to watch.

At the end of day 2 a trial Glenn Cup event was shot. The best 5 Australian and New Zealand shooters shot 25 targets each. As the Kiwis only had 5 shooters competing it wasn't hard to select their team! Initially it was going to be a 50-target event but popular response from shooters (mainly the Aussies!) was let's finish at 25 it's too late and we're all tired! The imminent onset of rain also hastened both the shooters' and officials' decision.

Australia won with a score of 117 to New Zealand 104. The trial was the result of requests from shooters and subsequent agreement from NZCTA to run a Glenn Cup style event in ISSF similar to that run in

DTL. ACTA will now report to NZCTA with the outcome but is likely the event will become a fixture at future ACTA ISSF nationals at least.

Presentations that evening were a little chaotic due to the late finish, wild weather and the necessity to hold them outside. Thanks for the patience of those shooters who attended.

Day 3 saw the commencement of the men's National Skeet and Trap Championships as well as the women's Commonwealth Trap Championship, which was shot out to finality. The National series of championships are those for which PQS scores can be shot thus raising the pressure on shooters. This was the first of the "big" days of the competition and the last of the 27 squads didn't finish shooting until after 6 PM. The cooperation of shooters in squads backing up quickly to ensure that the shoot went through on time was marvellous and a big thank you to you all. The final of the women's trap saw some spirited competition. Stacey Roiall and Deserie Baynes were tied after the final with 84 but Stacey won the shoot-off 1/0. Catherine Skinner and UK visitor Charlotte Kerwood tied for third place with 83 with Catherine winning the shoot-off 2/1. The longest shoot-off was for fourth place between Suzy Balogh and Stephanie Tigani with Suzie edging Stephanie out after 3 targets!

An inaugural meeting of an ISSF athlete's committee had been scheduled for the end of shooting on this day but that proved impossible due to time constraints. The ISSF athlete's committee was approved by the ACTA Executive at its meeting in June 2008 as a consequence of a request from shooters at an informal meeting during the Perth ISSF nationals last year. The AISL athlete representative Suzie Balogh has kindly undertaken to organise a meeting at the Australia cup in Brisbane in March. Thanks Suzie!

Day 4 saw the finalisation of both the men's skeet and trap national

championships as well as the women's national trap championships. It was another big day but cooperation from shooters and Cecil Park Gun club was again excellent. English visitor Charlotte Kerwood won the women's trap championship with 88 after the finals with Anna Shedrina on 85 and Deserie Baynes 82. Suzie Balogh was unlucky in missing shooting a PQS by just one point. Charlotte Kerwood won the women's trap high gun with 136 with Suzie Balogh and Deserie Bavnes in second and third places respectively.

Michael Diamond again won the National Trap Championship but

not without a close challenge from Adam Vella. Michael had shot the first PQS score of 2009 with 123 but slipped a bit in the finals to allow Adam to catch up. Both finished with 142 but Michael won the shoot-off 4/3. Nino Pedulla came third with 138. It was great to see the large number (31) of junior shooters competing in both trap events. Craig Henwood came third with 161 on the Commonwealth Championship and Charlotte Kerwood was third with 164 in the National Championships.

It is still uncertain as to where next year's ISSF nationals will be shot but an announcement will be made in the magazine later this year. After discussions with shooters the International Shooting Committee will be recommending to the ACTA National Executive a revised program for 2010 with double trap being shot first at the same time as the men and women's skeet. It remains to be seen how that will work out. Anyway 2009 was a great event and we look forward to seeing you all next year.

Payment must accompany advertisement. NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

#### GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause i nconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 22. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 23. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

# **Trapshooting Champions – Past and Present**

#### John W Sutherland - "Calrossie"

The second of the "greats" was John W Sutherland, "Calrossie", he was born at Wallan on the 4th April 1878 and like his father and brothers had a great love of shooting. He grew up in an atmosphere of gun powder, his family were all excellent and keen rifle shooters.

John's early life was spent with his older brother George, helping to manage the local general store at Katandra. He was also the local mail man, he commenced his mail run in about 1896 and continued until he left Katandra about 1905.

In 1905 he became manager of the Calrossie butter factory, about six miles from Yarram in Gippsland. Living and working on Calrossie estate were many men called "John" or "Jack" and so to distinguish one from the other, they acquired nicknames like "Long Jack" and "Tall Jack". John Sutherland became known as "Calrossie Jack" and it was from this nickname that his anonymity in the field of shooting came from.

John took up trapshooting in 1895 at 17 years of age and made his first appearance in a pigeon match in Shepparton. Although he was unsuccessful at first he persisted and it wasn't long before his name began appearing on the winner's boards. He won his first championship in 1901 at Kerang and continued to win from then on.

He won his first Commonwealth title in 1906 when he won the Commonwealth Sparrow Championship and from this time on he became the most prolific winner of trapshooting championships in Australia.

As a result of his growing prowess in the sport he was able to gain employment with Kynochs in 1907, his job entailed the practical use of guns and ammunition for field and trap shooting.

John married Isabelle English at Caulfield on October 23, 1912 and they lived at Ormond, they had three sons Leslie, Donald and Keith.

Kynochs was later acquired by ICI and so the "Calrossie" ICI era began. Throughout the 1920's he travelled extensively throughout Australia both working with ICI and competing in the major trap shoots of the time. He won state championships in Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and Tasmania and gained recognition as the best trap shooter in Australia.

In 1928 he went to Europe to compete, whilst in Europe he won championships in England, France, Italy and Monte Carlo. He won the aggregate for the season in Monte Carlo and was subsequently recognised as the best trap shooter in the world.

Whilst he was in Monte Carlo he created a new world pigeon record of 128 birds straight. He was now at his peak and would go on to dominate trapshooting until the outbreak of war in 1939.

In 1932 he set the Australian record of 121 starlings without a miss at Melbourne Gun Club. This record was never broken.

He won the Commonwealth Pigeon championship a record six times, the first time in 1916 and the last time in 1941. He also won the Commonwealth Sparrow and Starling championships multiple times. In all, he won more than 20 National championships.

Calrossie eventually won more than 100 trap shooting championships, the last of which was the Commonwealth Galah Championship at Kerang in 1948 at the age of 70 years. He competed in his last trap shoot in 1958 at 80 years of age, after which live bird trap shooting was discontinued.

Calrossie was the most influential trap shooter of the time, he was the key figure in the transition from live targets to clay targets and in conjunction with Horrie James and Donald Mackintosh he was instrumental in the formation of the ACPTSA.

He has left us a legacy that is firmly entrenched in our sport, his shooting style. He developed his style over 30 years of competition and then passed it on to the great Fred Burns and Newton Thomas who in turn passed it onto the generations that followed.

He died in 1968 at the age of 89 years and was cremated at Springvale in Victoria

Calrossie amazed the world with his ability with the gun for 50 years. He was to shooting what Bradman was to cricket.
