Congratulations to all competitors involved in the recent Skeet Championships which were held at the National Ground in Wagga Wagga. To David and Jo from the Uranquinty Hotel for the food and bar services we thank you for a professional presentation of both. I would like to also thank the staff from the National office for their extra work over and above their normal workload. Frank Auditore ran his office program and the office in general along with Janenne Kidd who volunteered a great deal of time. Adrian Cousins ensured the shoot was run efficiently and with minimal disruption as did Fred Rapley on the traps. Alison Farish took on the role of handicapper again for the second year in a row. This Team allowed the office and the Shoot to be a seamless operation which ran smoothly.

The National Executive was represented by Ron Traill (Tournament Director), Peter Haley (assisted Fred, wrote scores and assisted with handicapping when required) George Pinner who also assisted on the scoreboard and with handicapping) National President John Mack was here for three days along with Allan Vilcins (Chair, member service committee) whilst Dennis Harwood (Chair, Finance committee), Lynne Curtis (Chair, Championships committee) attended Tuesday and Wednesday as well as attending a management meeting on Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning. Once again thank you to the executive for the volunteer time they commit to the Association on behalf of the members. The Championships also allowed Executive members to meet new National Executive Member Terry Marsden from Geraldton WA. Terry shot the Championships and will return next month to attend the National Executive meeting.

The second induction into the skeet hall of fame and the Adrian Cousins Medal evening was a very memorable evening, I will not elaborate too much however we will feature this and the Skeet Nationals in the next CTSN Issue.

We will in the next two months decide on a structure for releasing information in the CTSN from the National Executive committee's. We will implement a series of information pages on programs within the ACTA. Information from the National Ground Committee, Coaching and Sport Development, Member services, Finance etc. These articles will explain the direction of each committee and the implementation process and proposed timeframes for such developments.

As a start we are in the process of purchasing the ground. At this stage we have all of the documentation required and await the surveyors report on the ground. Once this is completed we will meet with the Council to further the process. This should be completed quickly once the survey and development application is approved. Country Energy is drawing up a template and budget for the upgrade of power which is a priority in the further development of the Ground.

These are exciting times as we look to develop the sport throughout Australia, there are many opportunities to promote the sport through those who have achieved at the highest level of the sport through to those who do such great work at Club, Zone, State & National level. If you have shoot results or something special tell the Media about it, they are always looking for good news stories and you as Clubs and members have them all the time. Develop a relationship with your local media, they can give the sport a positive profile in the community.

Four Seasons at West Wyalong

Location right on the crossroads of the Newell and Mid Western Highways, close to the centre of NSW

Shooters could have been excused for thinking they were in Melbourne when they attended the West Wyalong Clay Target Club's April shoot. It was cold, windy, sunny and cloudy, it rained and there was dust all at various times during the day.

Prior to the beginning of the shoot, Graham Duncan called shooters together and a minute's silence was held in memory of Graham Bolte who sadly passed away recently. Graham was a foundation member and past president of West Wyalong Clay Target Club.

The first event of the day was 50 Targets Sporting Clays and after some early teething problems shooters provided fine results in the windy conditions.

Laurie Redfern shot 45/50 to be first in AA and A grade with Bruce Dent second 42/50, in B and C Grade another Forbes visitor, Ron Spedding 33/50 was the winner and Angela Dent 30/50 finished in second place.

The barbecue was fired up and shooters munched on steak sangers and listened to Frank Ashton's fox stories until the Shoot Marshall called the squads for the 10 Target Point Score Eye Opener.

Clive Foster was the only shooter in the five squads to score 30/30 with Allan Schirmer collecting some money with his 29/30.

Conditions did not improve for the 25 Target Double Barrel Cash Divide but Clive Foster again scored the maximum to win AA Grade from Graham Fairman 23/25, Dozer Collins shot the only other possible to win A Grade 25/25 with Laurie Redfern and Len Lord sharing second 24/25, Ron Spedding won B Grade 23/25 and Narelle Ambrose and David Hodges got a share of second prize money 18/25.

Scuds of rain swept across the grounds and conditions were so bad even Clive Foster could only score 144/150 to win the 50 Target Point Score Championship, Graham Duncan shot 140/150 to take out AA Grade, A Grade was won by Laurie (The Night I Saved John Wayne) Redfern 137/150 with the B Grade winner being David Hodges 131/150, David Spedding was the C Grade winner 125/150.

The 25 Target Single Barrel was going to be very difficult but Mark Payne made it even more difficult by deciding to shoot it No Barrel when he forgot to put a cartridge in his gun. The Squire can assure Mark he is not the first shooter to commit such an error.

Clive Foster mastered the conditions to win AA grade 25/25 with Ron Spedding shooting 23/25 to take the A Grade money, Narelle Ambrose and David Hodges shared B Grade 20/25 and Mark Payne made a remarkable recovery to win C Grade 19/25.

The High Gun winner was Clive Foster 202/210 and Narelle and Angela did a great job in the canteen.

2009 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Clay Target Association's National Trap Championships for 2009 were conducted at the Roma Clay Target Club in Queensland, with the championships running from Monday March 30th to Sunday April 5th. During the week of competition, fine warm days greeted the shooters each day with the exception being a late storm on the Thursday night during the Double Barrel shot off.

The Roma Clay Target club had put an enormous amount of work in to have the new clubhouse extension ready for the championships, as well as sixteen competition trap layouts with brand new Canterbury Traps.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from all States and Territory's competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup which is presented to the winning State team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans sections.

Victoria successfully won the Open team event, represented by Jamie Elliot, Craig Fitzgerald, Robert Viney, Marc Crimmins, and Terry



Walls with a score of 125/372. One target behind in second place was the team from South Australia with a score of 124/369. Third place went to the team from Queensland on a score of 124/367. Fourth place went to Western Australia 124/366, fifth place went to Tasmania 123/366, sixth place went to Northern Territory 123/364, and seventh place going to New South Wales 122/362.

The Ladies from South Australia were successful in winning the Women's team event. The team was lead by Deserie Baynes with Tania Evans and Megan Wallis scoring 74/220. In second place was the team from Queensland with a score of 74/218. Third place went to the team from New South Wales on a score of 73/217. Fourth place went to Tasmania 73/212, fifth place went to the Northern Territory 71/214, sixth place went to Victoria 70/206 and seventh place going to Western Australia with 68/203.



In the Junior division the team from Victoria comprising of Jack Collicot, Trent Orval and Joel Lennane were the winners on a score of 74/220. Second place went to the team from Queensland with a score of 74/214. Third place went to the team from South Australia with a score of 73/214, fourth place went to New South Wales 71/207, fifth place went to Western Australia 71/205, and sixth place went to Tasmania 68/202.



Six Veteran teams competed for their shoulder to shoulder badges with the South Australian team of Robert Andrews, Grant Bollen and Kevin Burzacott shooting 73/216 to take the event from Tasmania who shot 73/212. In third place was the team from Western Australia with 72/214, fourth place went to Queensland with 72/210, fifth place went to Victoria 71/208 and sixth place going to New South Wales 68/200.

OPENING CEREMONY

The local Roma school band led all the State teams in the traditional march past the crowd.

National President, Mr. John Mack introduced the dignitaries that were present: New Zealand Vice President Keith Livingstone, the Hon Bruce Scott Member for Maranoa, Hon Howard Hobbs Member for Warrego and Mayor Robert Loughnan, who noted the importance to the town

After a shot off lasting a further forty targets the winner was Grant Castles from New Zealand



with a score of 90/90. Placing for this event were as follows: 2nd Byron Bone Port Augusta SA 89/90, 3rd Rhys Eeles Echuca VIC 83/84, 4th John Maxwell Wagga NSW 81/82, 5th Jason Davis Morwell VIC 76/77, 6th Ethan Brindley Corowa NSW 74/75, 7th Wayne Hawker Jeparit VIC 72/73, 8th Dylan Bone Port Augusta SA 68/69, 9th Jim Hunter Scubby Creek QLD 67/68, and in 10th place Rowan Atkins Mersey TAS 75/76. The section winners went to Veronica Forsythe Roma QLD in the Womens on a score of 53/54,

Byron Bone Port Augusta SA in the Juniors with a score of 89/90, Ethan Brindley Corowa NSW in the Sub-Juniors with a score of 74/75 and the Veterans went to Robert Andrews Bordertown SA with a score of 64/65.

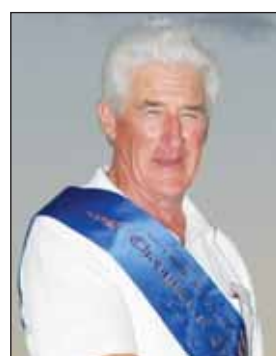

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination or be re-squadded towards the end of the that round.
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next round. Should a following round not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the round concerned.
8. Shooters may be drawn from the first day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. Whilst replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with a trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade or section prize.
13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
14. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
15. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of the Jury, whose decision shall be final.
16. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors. Juniors paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
18. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
19. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
20. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rocket, rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot committee, but shall number five (5) in total.
21. Squads will be rotated daily, shooters will be rotated within their squad every 25 targets.
22. Grading – ACTA members who do not already have a Sporting Grade and Shooters from other organisations will be graded on the first 50 targets shot at. As per Rule 10.01a(iv)
23. Viewing of targets will take place 8.30am on both days.

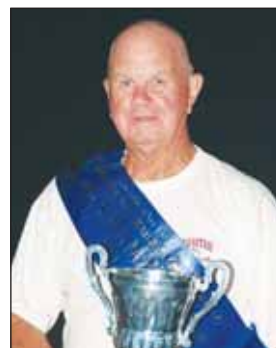

GOLDEN TROUT 2009

Psychological Skills for Shooting

ANGER

Last month's article was about the 'ideal performance state'; what we should all be trying to achieve each time we compete. However, because we are human there are so many things that get in the way of this 'ideal performance state.' Our thoughts, beliefs, judgments, as well as anxieties, fears and self-doubt are just some of the things that get in way of ideal performance. Most of these factors have been dealt with in past articles.

This month, I want to explore anger and aggression. There are a couple of reasons for looking at anger and aggression. Firstly, it is fairly topical at the moment because of the football season. Footballers, provide ample opportunity to examine aggression in sport. Secondly, it is important that we understand what anger and aggression are. As shooters, we have to be more careful in the way we act and react in society. If, for example, a swimmer or a cyclist ends up in a pub brawl or is involved in domestic violence, then they may lose a place in a national team but they are not denied the opportunity to practice or even compete in their sport. If however, a shooter is involved in a fight or domestic violence, the first thing that happens is that his license is suspended and his firearms are confiscated. In some cases it can even mean the loss of a job. In my case being charged with assault or domestic violence, would also lead to me being deregistered. Shooters have no opportunity to compete or practice, their chosen sport whilst the matter is being dealt with before the courts. Whilst, I don't think this is 'fair or just' it is a reality and therefore we have to accept it. What it means, however, is that as shooters we have to be far more careful in the way we act and react.

Let's look at a definition of both anger and aggression. According to Abrams & Hale (2005) anger is an emotion. As a normal emotion, without judgments, anger is neither good nor bad and is as natural and normal as being happy. They continue by stating that anger is not always observable to others; those around you only know you're angry by the way you manifest the emotion, how you behave. Many other emotions, such as hate, fear, frustration and disappointment can lead to anger. Anger and anxiety are very similar emotions and are only distinguished by their associated thoughts. Anger is associated with thoughts of confrontation, whilst anxiety is associated with thoughts of avoidance.

For athletes, two types of anger have been identified: Anger-in or anger out. Psychological literature would describe these as internalizing and externalizing. Anger-in involves directing the anger in towards themselves or trying to suppress it. For shooters an example of this would be swearing when missing a target, throwing shells into the bin or on the ground, or kicking the dirt. Anger-out is typically a physical or verbal affront to others or officials. Fortunately, target sports have few examples of anger-out.

Abrams & Hale define aggression as the use of force to reach a goal. An example of aggression would be when a basketball player swings his arms to prevent other from getting to the ball. This type of aggression is natural and even accepted in the rules of some sports. Violence within sport can be incidental: ie, which may involve physical contact and can be normal part of sports such as rugby, AFL,

waterpolo, hockey basketball and netball. The other type of violence is hostile violence, which involves the intent of harm to an opponent. This can be planned (the coach saying to a player, "make sure you take him out"), or spontaneous (anger related retaliation to an opponent or official). Abrams & Hale argue that aggression without violence may be tolerated and accepted in some sports, but hostile violence is never acceptable.

The study of aggression and anger lead to the frustration-aggression hypothesis in the 1930's. Basically the theory states that we are more likely to become frustrated and aggressive if we are unable to reach our goals. For most of us, as shooters, frustration becomes a fact of life because we are often unable to reach our goals: that is, hit every target.

As I have said earlier, anger doesn't always lead to aggression, but it is a very common factor for people to become aggressive. If you're in a bad mood and someone says something you don't like, you might end up in a fight. Being in a bad mood, may lead to a mind-set referred to by Abrams & Hale as "hostility bias". This means that a person's thoughts lead them to perceive that a neutral stimuli is provocative or threatening. People with this type of mind-set will explode when confronted with a person or a situation that they perceive as threatening. They use anger as a display that gives the other person three options: one is to stand and fight, another is to flee and the final one is to freeze. The person with this mind-set then thinks that responding aggressively again will solve their problems, similar as it did previously.

Outbursts of anger are often reframed as cathartic or venting. Therefore they are given a positive spin, but what is not realized is that whilst it worked in this environment today, it may not work in a different environment tomorrow. Believing that it will be OK and work again, denies people the opportunity to weigh up the consequences of their actions.

This may have dire outcomes.

In conclusion: anger is a normal emotion that can easily lead to aggression or violence. Anger needs to be dealt with and not allowed to develop into aggressive behaviour patterns. Next month I will explore the relationship between anger and optimal performance and strategies for cooling down.

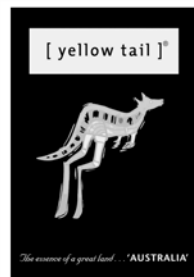

Dear Sir

While recently attending your Association's very successful DTL National Championships in Roma, conversation around the performance of our company's DTL wireless voice release product being used by some clubs, reflected concern to us.

What seems to be in practice at some clubs, is the placement of the trap transceiver part of this system INSIDE the trap house. While in some instances this will work fine, it is our recommendation that this practice can lead to variable performance of the wireless technology.

I have taken the liberty of submitting an article on this matter to explain why placing the trap transceiver on the exterior of the trap house is advisable and a couple of other pointers on getting the optimum performance from this piece of equipment.

As always, if any club is experiencing any problems with equipment purchased from our company, then please do not hesitate to contact us about this – we are more than willing to help you.

DTL WIRELESS VOICE RELEASE SYSTEM

To gain optimum performance from your DTL wireless voice release system there are three critical elements.

- 1) Tuning the system: As explained in our manual, tuning each set of wireless pods takes a fine-tipped screwdriver and 3 minutes of patience. Each of the 7 pods has to be tuned to the same double-digit field number and if you have more than 1 set, then ensure each set is 5 numbers apart. The trap transceiver must then talk to 5 microphones, so the third switch is set to 5. The third switch on each microphone transceiver is then set to a different number, from 1 – 5. This last point is critical – any double-up or different number will mean that that microphone transceiver is not talking to the trap transceiver and hence no response to calls.
- 2) Purchase good quality batteries from a quality supplier – to ensure that they are fully charged. Some batteries have very thin covers and these can be punctured when being inserted, leading to rapid discharge and potential damage. With good batteries you should get around 200 hours of use per set. As a recommendation, the blister packs of 40 AA Alkaline's from Dick Smith's work just fine.
- 3) Position the trap transceiver on the exterior rear wall of the trap house as high as can be allowed by the design of your trap house and the roof. In this position it will be facing the shooters and to prevent damage we have supplied a polycarbonate protective housing, which will withstand a direct shot from 15 mts. This position will ensure optimum line of sight transmission to the microphone transceivers, which should be mounted about half way up the microphone stand. The

aerial inside each transceiver is vertical and aligned between the locating thumbscrews, so when placing the microphones at each stand, ensure that they 'face' towards the trap house and are not turned at 90 degrees.

Finally when a squad takes the line, get each shooter to quickly check that their microphone transceiver is switched on, which is indicated by the bottom light on the pod 'blinking' about every 3 seconds. If the top light is 'blinking' then the batteries are starting to die and if the middle light is 'blinking' then for some reason you do not have full communication from that microphone to the trap transceiver and you need to check why.

We hope that this thumb-nail sketch of setting up your wireless voice release system helps and if you require any more details then either check the manual, our web-site or call us directly – we are only too willing to help you.

As a final comment on performance, 16 fields of wireless voice release worked almost flawlessly for everyone for 9 solid days of shooting at the Nationals in Roma, through heat, wind and rain. There is no reason why your club's set shouldn't do exactly the same.

BOB BARRON

Bob Barron was a much valued life member of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club (Vic.) who sadly passed away on Friday 15 May 2009, aged 83 years.



Bob joined the club in the early 1960's and was initially occupied as a trapper/puller of the old style mechanical traps that were in use at that time. Anyone who is familiar with the operation of these traps would remember the amount of constant effort involved in cocking and then releasing them when the word "pull" was heard. After some time Bob then developed an interest in having a go at shooting these elusive targets that he worked so hard at operating the puller for other shooters at the competitions. Bob was encouraged by his close friends the late Jock Steer and the late Kevin Law to get more involved in the

shooting side and it was not long before he was "hooked" and clay target shooting became a new passion for him which tied in nicely with his other main interests of field shooting and fishing. Bob could be seen at practically all the DTL shoots held in Wangaratta for decades afterwards and was one of the last to leave on shoot days occupying himself with the end of day duties when others may have left to go home.

Bob Barron's dedication to his club was recognised in 1990 when the committee made him a life member and at about the same time he volunteered to become the club curator/groundsman, a huge task which he maintained with enthusiasm until earlier this year when ill health prevented Bob from continuing with this role. It would be impossible to calculate the amount of hours and effort that this dedicated and hardworking club man would have put in at the range situated at North Wangaratta. Bob maintained and cleaned the large clubrooms, mowing and spraying large areas of grass and did many other jobs around the grounds that needed doing. Bob could often be found at the club on his trusty mower covered in dirt and dust accompanied by his faithful black Labrador Max (who died shortly before Bob fell ill), and would never complain about all the hard work that he did. Bob was the sort of man that took on the jobs that some others might avoid, and I am certain that a lot of clubs out there also have someone like Bob, always reliable, respected, dedicated and not expecting any praise.

Bob Barron will be sadly missed by all at the Wangaratta Clay Target Club and the John Deere ride on mower that he spent so much time operating will probably be reluctant to perform as well for anyone else. Our President, Rob Steel, committee and members offer our condolences to Bob's loving family.

ROSS DEANE

28/5/1920 TO 13/5/2009

On 13th May, 2009, clay target shooting lost one of its more colourful characters, when Ross Deane, born on 28/5/1920 passed away at St. Vincents Hospital, Lismore. At the time of his death Ross was a member of the Richmond River Gun Club but shot regularly at all the Northern Rivers venues.

Ross "Dasher" Deane was a friendly somewhat flamboyant bloke who absolutely loved shooting. Referees and other squad members often used to get a tad cross with him because if he could still see a piece of target, he would fire his second barrel at it, sometimes a long time

after the Ref had called "one" and the shooter alongside him was about to call.

Ross served as a tail gunner in the RAAF during the war and on one occasion, while returning from a bombing raid to Borneo or New Guinea, his aircraft was attacked by a flight of Japanese fighter planes. The rear turret in which "Dasher" was ensconced was shot from around him and Ross took a bullet through the foot. "I didn't know I was hit" he used to brag, "I thought it was hydraulic oil leaking into my boot." He used to laugh when he added how he was paraded for using bad language over an open radio channel during that engagement. Ross rarely called "pull" when ready for his target. In his mind he was still in that turret behind the four browning machine guns so you can imagine what his call word was.

While travelling to Grafton's two day shoot last year Ross gleefully told us why he had been known as "Dasher" all his life. "I grew up in South Australia as a kid and Dad used to take me hunting wild peacocks. Dad would shoot the hen bird and I would run down the male. They are a bit slow getting going because of the long tail"

Ross took a couple of hours off from hospital on 26th April to attend the Richmond River Club's monthly shoot to say goodbye to some of his old mates and to donate his three guns to be used as club guns for new comers...a special gesture from a special bloke.

We will miss him but will always remember him.

ZZ's First Open Practice Day/Night

Cecil Park Clay Target Club on 29 April 2009

Weather: Overcast + cool, slight wind, 20°C

The 1st ZZ practice day was set up overlooking the ISSF trap layout. Traps were setup on frames to raise them to ground level, according to the rules, setup has a green shaded cover (shade cloth) representing the ground level behind the traps to aide the vision of the shooter towards the target.

A 100m fence was erected in an ark made up of 600mm High netting with a 3 inch vinyl band across the top and bottom, as you can see by the photograph the bottom vinyl band on the fence is set at the same ground level as where the shooter stands (in future there will be a black netting from the bottom of the fence to the ground).

All the fully automatic ZZ machines (holding approximately 300 ZZ helice targets) being controlled by a computer box sequencer that allows the traps to randomly release a single target at a time, also allowing doubles and triples to be thrown.

Shooting commenced at 11am with our very 1st shooter being a longtime member and local Wednesday shooter of CPCTC, Jake Zadrovec, hitting his first 3 targets scoring 3 out of 3 and quoted by saying "I'll quit while I'm ahead".

To my surprise, not expecting the turnout, shooters were slow to start but promptly started to roll in after 1pm and there was a steady flow from then on.

On dark we turned on the lights and shot right through until we ran out of targets at around 8pm, an hour earlier than planned, after shooting between 550-600 zz helice targets!

Between 30 - 40 shooters turned up on the spur of the moment to help get ZZ started for the 1st time at CPCTC, and hopefully we'll all be ready for the next one! What an exciting sport!

All in all, it is a great start to the first official ZZ continuing in NSW. There are a lot of shooters that have never seen this type of shooting before and it is entirely different to clay target shooting as you have a red wing with a white 'witness' insert made from plastic and clipped together to make the flying bird or as called ZZ helice. As per the rules you have 5 traps and 1 shooting station 25m - 30m away from the traps, with a surrounding fence from 19m up to 21m in an ark from the traps. The targets are revolving at between 4000 - 9000 rpm and on you call a zz helice bird will be released and you must detach the white witness from the red wing with the witness landing inside the fence for it to be classified as a good bird or 'kill'.

These rules are a continuation from the original box birds rules back in the 1960's, which is currently a very large sport in Europe and America. For further rules and information you might like to check out our website www.zzsydneyaustralia.com.au

ISSF Clay Target Shooting in WA

"TAP" PROGRAM LAUNCHED IN THE WA ISSF TARGET SHOOTING COMMUNITY

An initiative looking towards development of Junior's in the ISSF Disciplines within Western Australian was launched on completion of ISSF Flora & Fauna Carnival held over 13th & 14th March 2009.

After a year of discussion, many months of planning to ensure there were correct procedures and guidelines backing up the program, administration documentation for both the identified athlete and acceptance of Directors to the "TAP" Program was announced to the ISSF members of Western Australia present at the ISSF Flora & Fauna Carnival.

The "TAP" program is aimed at identifying talented juniors or persons of interest in the area of ISSF, who with a little support once identified, may achieve greater results over the years from that support. This may be the basis from which we will eventually see the start of ISSF shooters from WA, being in the Australian Team or even as an Olympic representative. WA has had Australian Team representatives over the years, but it has been a long time since any WA ISSF shooter has been either Commonwealth Games or Olympic consideration. The last Olympic consideration was John Harris back in 1956 and Robin Bailey for the Commonwealth Games in Auckland.

Under the "TAP" Program, the opportunity is only open to WA ISSF shooters, with the three (3) appointed Directors stealthily watching all WA ISSF shooters looking for their potential and possible selection into the "TAP" program. Hence the motto "Tapping into the future". Apart from potential talent and skills, the important factors that the directors take into consideration are "ethics & morals", which is not only involving the potential inductee, but will include that of the families or current support base as well.

At the inaugural launch of the "TAP" Program, the ISSF members present heard about the "TAP" Program then saw the identification and acceptance of Mstr Brayden Harris as the first (1st) inductee to the Program. Brayden shoots the ISSF discipline of Trap.

Brayden is a Junior now and will be for another four (4) years. His potential in his chosen ISSF discipline has been watched and mapped over the past two (2) years, culminating with his performances at the 2009 ACTA (inc) ISSF Nationals held in Sydney at Cecil Park during January 2009. Brayden's talent, attitude, composure and ethics displayed themselves completely whilst away with the WA ISSF Team during the National, which was the very first he attended.

The support base that these credential have been built on, come from his immediate family and their history in shooting. Brayden's father,

Elliot, was the first Junior DTL shooter to win the prestigious inaugural Roy Alexander "Junior DTL High Gun" back in 1982 when it was introduced as an incentive to supporting and acknowledging Juniors in the DTL disciplines. This trophy is still presented each year at the 2 day WACTA (Inc) State DTL carnival held in September/October each year. Next is his grandfather, John Harris, who was a phenomenal State ISSF Trap champion many times over, having the WACTA (Inc) State ISSF perpetual trophy named after him and also Australian Team representative. Plus more importantly, John was the reserve for the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne. Ned Harris, Brayden's great grandfather also features heavily in Brayden's shooting genes by being the Founding Member of the CMT Gun Club and his name also proudly etched on a State's Double Rise perpetual trophy.

Currently support that will be provided to Brayden is through provision of gunfitting, targets, ammunition, uniform plus shooting jacket, vision testing, training program & coaching support, identified Mentors on the Eastern seaboard, who will assist him when in attendance at Eastern States identified shoots and media releases where possible. At this point, it should be noted that the Directors (Lindsay Hemley, David Carroll & Christine Alexander) have not restricted the search to just the ISSF Trap, but are also looking at shooters in the other two(2) disciplines ISSF Skeet & ISSF Double Trap plus considering both genders. The first part of support offered to Brayden was his attendance at the Adam Vella Coaching weekend held over 6th & 7th March 2009, prior to the two day Flora & Fauna Carnival.

As the future of our ISSF shooting in WA progresses, we would also be looking at the other programs available through other entries that will offer more scope to increase our identified athletes support need

The Tally Ho Cup grew from a reunion of soldiers after the Second World War and began at Tally Ho on the outskirts of Gunnedah along the Wondabah Road.



The Hunt Road grounds were originally the Winchcombe holding paddocks and were purchased by the club in 1963. A clubhouse was built by the members and many vigorous competitions have been held at the site. Now the club has to sell the grounds in June to relocate to Bulga Range on the Bmoi Valluga Road near Lake Keepit.
