Executive Officer's Report

The first of the National Championship events, the 2010 National ISSF Championships, were conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club from the 18th — 24th of January. A very strong field contested all events with not only the Championships title on the line but also was part of the Commonwealth Games selection process.

Pre nominating was introduced to all National Events for 2010, we had 187 shooters at Brisbane for the Championships, the International shooting committee will be discussing the number of shooters we can cater for as we are now approaching maximum capacity for these championships.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

ACTA Nationals are now Pre Nomination only

The National executive at its annual meeting in July 2009 passed a motion to have all National Championships conducted under the Pre Nomination format.

The decision will allow the National Office to prepare and conduct the Championships in a professional manner with the appropriate staff and catering services as well as on ground amenities.

Completed Nomination forms including Grade & Section are to be received by the advertised date on the Nomination Form. The nominations must be paid for via the options on the form. Failure to fill in all requirements will result in the nomination form being returned.

Those who have pre-nominated and have a valid reason for not competing will be considered for a refund (conditions apply)

No Nominations will be accepted after the advertised closing date.

The advantage of pre nominating is clear, we are able to determine numbers for shooting and the general running of the shoot and office as well as catering. This will also allow us to have prize money allocated and cheques drawn in advance of the Championship, these prizes would then be advertised on the Website. I would like to thank Michael Bopf and the Brisbane Gun Club members and volunteers for hosting the event. The club house staff provided a great array of food and drinks whilst the grounds & trap staff worked tirelessly to ensure the event ran smoothly. Congratulations to all of the competitors and winners of each of the respective events.

The issue of the ACTA insurance cover has been brought to our attention. As we have now provided a brochure on the cover provided it has raised some questions by members which I will explain. This insurance cover has been the same for a number of years, however this is the first time we have actually sent out details.

Public Liability Insurance is provided to clubs.

Personal Accident insurance is provided to members of the Clubs and ACTA. This insurance has Death & Disability, Loss of Income Student Assistance Benefits, Funeral Benefit and home renovation benefit.

The age for the Personal Accident insurance component of the policy is advertised in the brochure as between 3-80 years of age. Following further discussion with the insurer the age is extended to 85 years of age, however the minimum age is still three. Our insurer has tried a number of companies in relation to further extension of the age limits, however has been unsuccessful. Our coverage however is the best available.

The loss of income component is restricted to 16 years -75 years (work years) again the insurers are not prepared to accept any extension of age groups.

These insurance details I hope clears up the questions being asked. As with most people these days I would encourage all of our members to have personal income protection which is readily available in the insurance market.

There are many challenges ahead as we continue to add "Professionalism" to the organisation and the way we do things. Professionalism does not necessarily mean money moreover the way we do "business". There is a need to look at our overall strategic plan now that we have purchased the National ground. We need to look further into the future to determine where we need to be placed in relation to other sports and other shooting sports. As you can see from the sports market there is seven a side rugby, 20/20 cricket. What is the next big thing on the horizon????.

I am not saying drop what we have, however we need to think about how we get more people joining our clubs and shooting our sport. I have provided a request to the Promotions and Development Committee to consider the question as well. This will be discussed by the committee leading into our National Executive meeting in June. If you have any suggestions you could contact Rob Fox, Chair of the committee through the National office.

To be staged at ACTA National Ground, NSW by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2010 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2010 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2010 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence or permit before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly

classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 21. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 23. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

DENYING THAT YOUR PROBLEM IS PSYCHOLOGICAL

Think of a problem you are have when competing? Is it a problem of technique or

is it a psychological problem?

Most of us want to believe that any problems we have: missing right hand swingers from lane five, high 2 in skeet, springing teals or rabbits in sporting, etc, are due to some technical issue and therefore can be corrected with some coaching or diligent practise.

To explore if the problem is psychological we need to revise some information from previous articles. Firstly, our thinking and behaviour can come from either our conscious mind or our subconscious mind, although most of what we do and think comes from our subconscious mind.

Secondly, human beings do not like anxiety. Anxiety, as defined by Wikipeadia is a psychological and psychological state characterized by cognitive, somatic, emotional, and behavioural components. These components combine to create an unpleasant feeling that is typically associated with uneasiness, fear, or worry.

Anxiety is a generalized <u>mood</u> condition that occurs without an identifiable triggering <u>stimulus</u>. As such, it is distinguished from <u>fear</u>, which occurs in the presence of an observed threat. Additionally, fear is related to the specific behaviors of <u>escape</u> and avoidance, whereas anxiety is the result of threats that are perceived to be uncontrollable or unavoidable.

Anxiety can also be considered as "a future-oriented mood state in which one is ready or prepared to attempt to cope with upcoming negative events" suggesting that it is a distinction between future vs. present dangers that divides anxiety and fear.

Anxiety is considered to be a <u>normal</u> reaction to <u>stress</u>. It may help a person to deal with a difficult situation, for example at work or at school, by prompting one to cope with it.

Next, we will go out of our way to keep ourselves calm and contented. To do this sometimes we create mechanisms that will defend our ego from feeling under threat or anxious. Sigmund Freud referred to these processes as "defence mechanisms". Denial and repression are very effective ways by which we can protect ourselves from anxiety but they do have a downside.

Denial is probably one of the best known defense mechanisms, used often to describe those who seem unable to face reality or admit and obvious truth (i.e. "He's in denial."). Denial is an outright refusal to admit or recognize that something has occurred or is currently occurring. Drug addicts or alcoholics often deny that they have a problem, while victims of traumatic events may deny that the event ever occurred. The function of denial is to protect the ego from things that the individual cannot cope with. While this may save us from anxiety or pain, denial also requires a substantial investment of energy. Because of this, other defenses are also used to keep these unacceptable feelings from consciousness.

Repression is another well-known defense mechanism. Repression acts to keep information out of conscious awareness. However, these memories don't just disappear; they continue to influence our behavior.

For example, a person who has repressed memories of abuse suffered as a child may later have difficulty forming relationships.

So with this information in mind, we must remember that self-doubt is the biggest factor in making us miss or fail. Anxiety, fear, denial, not staying in the present, etc are all factors that produce and maintain self-doubt.

According to Nideffer, chances are your problem is psychological if:

- a. you are satisfied with your level of skill when you are playing well,
- b. mistakes tend to occur more frequently under pressure,
- you find yourself having a lot of negative thoughts or feelings during the performance, and
- d. a breakdown in one area leads to other problems as well.

Now, it is easy to fix a technical problem, but denial and repression take over when we think that the problem might be psychological. The other issue is that we think because "it is in our head" then there is nothing we can do about it. This leaves us worse off, because we now know what our problem is, and we know what is causing it, but because we do not know how to deal with it, it will get worse.

So how do we resolve the situation that we now find ourselves in.

Firstly, if it was a technical problem we would develop a plan to fix it. Therefore, we need a mental plan to help us deal with any psychological issues. The initial aspect of the plan should be setting goals that we want to achieve. Once we have decided upon the goals we wish to achieve then we need to learn strategies that will help us achieve these goals. Whilst specific problems might need discrete strategies, eg; concentration techniques, mental rehearsal, other aspects can be helped by generic activities such as relaxation, meditation, visualization.

Secondly, as athletes we have to develop a mind set that will reduce the doubt producing self talk. To do this we need to focus on the present, focus on the process rather than the product and focus on our breathing.

In conclusion, it is easy to think that if we know how to shoot, then when we miss it may be psychological, but it may have been due to a range of factors. However, if we miss, and then miss again and again, it is most likely in our head.





Constitution - What is it, how does it work?

A constitution is a system for governance that establishes the rules, principles, structure, procedures, powers, duties and responsibilities.

It is designed to establish a long-term structure and scope for your club, in other words the instruction book for how things work.

It also governs the club's internal management and has the effect of a contract between the club and each member, the club and each committee member, the club and the secretary and a member and each other member.

WHAT'S THE DEFINITION OF A CONSTITUTION?

The Oxford English Dictionary defines a constitution as "a body of fundamental principles or established precedents according to which a state or organisation is governed".

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Associations and clubs generally incorporate under State or Territory legislation known as the Associations Incorporation Act. The Acts are not identical in each State or Territory. You should refer to the relevant legislation in your State or Territory. Information on the relevant legislation is usually available from departments of fair trading or their equivalents in each State and Territory.

Clubs constitutions are generally guided by the State's Model Rules which are normally available from the Departments of Fair Trading in each State and Territory.

A constitution sets out how all the elements of the club are organised and how power, duties and responsibilities are carved up among different units. It contains rules about what authority is used, who uses it and how it is used in the club.

And, as a kind of deal or contract between those on the committee of management and those who are subjected to certain responsibilities within the club, a constitution defines the rights and duties of members, and the devices that keep those in power in check

WHAT DO YOU USE CONSTITUTIONS FOR?

A constitution is the foundation for building a club. It should contain all the key agreements made by members on how the club will work. In law it is called the "founding document" and it is legally binding on the executive and members of the club. It should tell you the following:

- 1. Why the club exists, its purpose and objectives;
- Who the club's key constituency and stakeholders are, who should benefit from its work; and
- How the club intends to work, its broad principles and the basic structures for decision making and getting the work done as well dealing with the finances and assets of the club.

The constitution or founding documents should be clear and simple so that members understand their rights and responsibilities, leaders understand their mandate and how to be accountable and the members understand why the club exists and how it operates.

The constitution or founding documents will usually have detailed and clear sections on:

- The purpose of the club: why the club exists, who should benefit from the work and how they should benefit.
- **The objectives** of the club: what it intends to achieve.
- The type of it is: for example not-for profit voluntary club.
- The membership of the club: Who may become a member and the duties and rights of members. How members join and how members can resign or be expelled.
- The structures and main procedures of decision-making in the club:
 - annual general meetings and other meetings,

- elections and appointments for the different structures of the club
- their powers and functions,
- who makes what decisions,
- how the club is governed and how decisions are made
- how it is organised to get the work done.
- The roles, rights and responsibilities of members holding specific
 positions and of the different structures: what different individuals
 or structures are responsible for, to whom they account.
- How the finances and assets of the club are controlled so that no money or resources that belong to the club can be abused or misused.
- Financial year and audit process that advises the club when the annual financial account will be finalised and audited and who the report will go to
- Closing down the club: what process must be followed and what will happen to the money and assets of the club.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT CONSTITUTIONS

Constitutions are long-term decisions

Constitutions should be written so that they will not need to be changed throughout the life of a club. They should not need to be changed often, although they can be changed [amended] if members feel the need to make new agreements about the basic principles of the club. It is a major decision to change a constitution and the existing constitution should say when and how it may be done. Any changes should be publicised to members and as the club is registered with the Department of Fair Trading, it is the Public Officer of the club who will need to inform the Department of the change. Check with the Department if not sure.

Constitutions should not be too detailed. They should record only those agreements that will remain true throughout the life of the club or until some major change happens.

Using constitutions

The constitution is the key founding document of a club. It is a record of agreements on the basic principles of the club and is legally binding on all members. Constitutions are not like plans. They should not change regularly. The Constitution records all those agreements that will be important for the whole life of the club. Constitutions play a key role at different times in the club's life and they cover the following:

- Name
- 3. Objects
- 4. Membership and Management
- Meetings
 - General Committee Meetings
 - Annual General Meetings
 - Special General Meetings
- Subscriptions
- 7. Finance
- 8. Dissolution
- 9. Amendments
- 10. Interpretation
- 11. Suspension and Expulsion
- 12. Copies of Constitution
- 13. Custody and Use of Common Seal
- 14. Registered Office

If you require any further information on the club's constitution (rules) refer to the Department of Fair Trading under the Association Incorporations Act or the Model Rules in your State or Territory.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.



SPENCER ANGEL Passed away 28 November 2009 aged 79 years

Spencer Angel was an ambassador of Clay Target Shooting in the South Burnett region & in fact throughout all of Queensland.

Spencer was involved in the establishment of the Queensland Clay Target Association (QCTA) in 1977 and was the first President; his many years as a Councillor on the Murgon Shire Council prepared him for this role as a figurehead & negotiator of all things relating to running a fledgling State shooting association. He proudly supported the first State teams to represent Queensland under the new QCTA banner.

Spencer was the grandson of the "mother of Murgon" - Martha Angel and the Angel surname has been synonymous with Murgon since 1907. Spencer inherited much of her good business sense and he was a butcher and ran a chicken farm as well in the district.

Spencer still found time to be involved in shooting and he held committee positions at Kingaroy Gun Club and was the driving force behind the establishment of the Murgon Gun Club. The land for the club (on Spencer's property) was leased to the club for a "peppercorn rental." They obtained a school building from the district & established a two story clubhouse on site. This is all history today as the club no longer exists but shooting is better off following his involvement.

He travelled widely for the association and the love of shooting and Stow Kentish, Jim Taylor & Jim Haymes all remember the good times had with Spencer. They also recounted his time spent time with Merv Champney the (King from Kingaroy) and Eddie Ransome & they are now all together again in shooters heaven.

Spencer Angel was a gentleman albeit a little "old school", at his retirement from Council in 1996 his personal resume suggested he pre-dated gay rights, computer dating and credit cards – and his speech went on to confirmed: "We got married and then lived together and we thought fast food was what you ate during Lent and foul play meant feeding the chickens."

Spencer is survived by his wife Norma, a son Peter & daughter Tricia and seven grandkids and we as an association wish them all the best.

When our first QCTA president arrived "upstairs" - he probably started organising the establishment of another chapter of the QCTA where past shotgun shooters could meet, have a chat and burn some gunpowder.

For example if they shoot DTL & Sporting they could be using the harder target for DTL& Skeet, so check your facts first before you blame the target manufacture if the target does not break as good as you expect it to.


