

National President's Notes



Association members and clubs throughout the Eastern States, especially Queensland, have faced devastating floods over the last two months. Isolated incidences have also occurred in other states.

Many clubs have been affected, with some almost wiped out. This situation on top of members' own personal, and businesses losses may result in a serious threat to these clubs' future existence. State governments have launched packages of assistance to flood affected sporting bodies and details are available on the net. The ACTA has begun a fundraising initiative to assist these clubs and would

encourage all members and clubs to consider fundraising in whatever way they see fit to contribute to this. More details are available elsewhere in this magazine. Please help if you are able. The other support that I encourage you to show these clubs is by attending their events once they start operating again.

The Board has just met in Brisbane and following interviews, appointed Mr. Chris Gibson to the position of Executive Officer. We welcome Chris to the Association and look forward to working with him to deliver better services to our members. Chris will commence employment prior to the end of February. The administration of the Association has operated well without anyone at the helm for over 3 months and I thank the girls in the office for this.

The Association has formed a new sub-committee "Legal and Governance". This committee will initially comprise two executive members and two other qualified persons co-opted for the purpose. Issues will be referred to the committee for research and advice and these may include our corporate fiduciary responsibilities, suspensions, legal claims etc. We live in a litigious society and need the best advice we can get before making decisions that can have unintended effects. The committee is to be pro-active as well, advising us of possible future problems we may need to plan against to minimise the effect on our Association.

The Association is working with our publisher on an exciting project to digitise all existing copies of the CTSN. The project may take up to 2 years to complete but once finished will store the content offsite, but provide access to all existing CTSN copies via our website. It is expected that this will be achieved at a cost of approx \$24,000 and will protect our history forever. Features will include a search facility allowing research to be conducted quickly and efficiently. Shooters having old CTSN copies are encouraged to contact us and advise us of what they have, and are willing to make available for scanning, as most collections have odd books missing.

We have offered a few suggestions in this column on how the ACTA could better collect its subscription monies. The Board is now recommending to the Executive a new method of collection and this proposal is detailed elsewhere in the magazine. This process allows the ACTA to collect its subscription monies without interferring in the clubs collection of their own subscriptions. New shooters will still have to be vetted by their club when joining for the first time and the club would collect their subs and that of the ACTA as they currently do in this case. If the recommendation is supported by the Executive this will begin for the 2012 shooting Year.

The Board has decided to postpone the Mackintosh reunion until 2012. The decision was not taken lightly and will allow us to better plan such an important event. Anyone interested in assisting with this event please contact Sue at the office.

The Mackintosh blazers purchased by so many of our members were incorrectly embroidered and we ask that all recipients return them as soon as possible for rectification at no cost.

A DIFFERENT WAY OF PAYING YOUR MEMBERSHIP DUES

Your ACTA Board has recently considered the method by which we all pay our membership dues. At present, as we all know, the clubs collect the membership fees for themselves, their state association and also the ACTA. Moneys owning to the ACTA are then passed to the ACTA office for processing. This system not only places an additional work load on the club secretaries but in the Board's opinion does not necessarily maximise membership renewals. If one receives a bill in the mail one generally pays it at the appropriate time. However if one needs to remember to go to the club or send a cheque in the mail without such a prompt one is not necessarily so compliant. How many times have you seen shooters realising half way through the year "Oops I haven't paid my membership yet!"?

ACTA propose that the following system be adopted for 2012: ACTA to invoice every shooter individually for the registration fees owing to ACTA only. Following payment a sticker or handicap card will be sent in batches to the club whereupon further payment by the shooter of the club fee the sticker/handicap card will be stamped by the club. Membership will not become effective until that sticker/card is stamped by the club. The advantages of the system will be that the club secretaries will be relieved of one task and ACTA will retain a greater proportion of our membership from year to year. A disadvantage will be that the shooter will have to make two payments but he or she may decide to stagger the payments so that could be an advantage to some people. SSAA operate very successfully on a similar system and their membership is greater than any other shooting organisation in Australia.

If the Executive agree to this proposal at its meeting in June, accounts will be sent out later this year.

NATIONAL FLOODS – A CALL TO ALL CLUBS AND MEMBERS TO HELP

Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria and also part of Western Australia are presently experiencing one of Australia's largest natural disasters due to the flooding. Many ACTA registered clubs may suffer financially due to loss of infrastructure, equipment and income.

Until the floods in all states are declared over there is no way to estimate the cost to the clay target community by the loss of buildings, traps, equipment and office equipment. Clubs will also suffer due to a loss of income from programmed shoots until they are operational after the floods.

Some clubs will suffer losses that unless helped may possibly terminate their membership – a loss to all members of the ACTA.

The Queensland Clay Target Association (QCTA) have already commenced fundraising to assist these clubs and will run the program until December 31st 2011.

To assist the affected clubs the following proposal will allow **all** ACTA member clubs and members to assist.

It is requested that ACTA clubs **donate the profits from a club shoot to this appeal**. It is also requested and suggested that the fundraising is limited only by a club and members imagination. There are other avenues to assist by, (as example) **raffles**, **auctions**, **charity shoots**, **donations or other self generated initiatives**.

A sub-committee of members that are not on the Executive of the affected states will be formulated to disburse and account for all monies received. This will ensure accountability and transparency of receipted money.

Each state will be responsible for collection of donated funds. Clubs once they have completed their fundraiser, it is asked they forward the amount to their State Treasurer who will receipt the money. The State Treasurer will then forward the total amount raised along with the club names / amounts to the ACTA.

This initiative is purely voluntary, however we all will never know when our own club may be affected and allows for all clubs, members and visitors to donate and assist **directly to the sport** cause. The money is not going to the "general" charity fund – however this does not preclude any person or club from donating further if they wish.

This originally was a fundraiser for Queensland member clubs only, however due to many clubs being affected in several states, this has become a National initiative.

I thank in advance the State Secretaries and Treasurers for their immediate assistance, Zone Secretaries and Club Executives for their assistance in this fundraising initiative.

Results of money raised and grants given will be published in the Clay Target Shooting News. If any person or club wishes to discuss this with me further, please do not hesitate to contact me direct.

ttendance numbers for multigauge events have been steadily on the increase and the Pre-State Multigauge championships in the lead up to the State Skeet Carnival at Blackwater in September were evidence of this. 52 shooters arrived at the beautiful Blackwater grounds contest these championships, beginning with the 50T 20 gauge.

Starting with a bang was Laurie Chelepy from Rockhampton who took overall with a perfect 50/50. Hard on his heels Dave Dundon was 1st in AA shooting 49/50 and Craig O'Neill took 2nd in AA with 48/50. Frank Cooper and Matthew Rhue shot off for 1st & 2nd in A grade shooting 56/57 & 55/57 respectively. Great shooting from the B graders, with Alan Adams 1st with 49/50 closely followed by Brisbane's Paulette Walker on 48/50, and Adam Bozier also shot brilliantly to take 1st in C grade with 48/50, Ray Bourne coming in 2nd in C with 45/50.



The 50T 28 gauge was the second event on the card, Dave Dundon taking overall this time with a perfect 50/50. Craig O'Neill was 1st in AA shooting 53/54 after a shoot off with Mark Fanning 52/54. 1st in A grade was Frank Cooper 50/51 with Matthew Rhue taking 2nd 49/51 and Caboolture's Thomas Rhue finished

1st in B grade with 46/50 followed by Paulette Walker 2nd with 47/52. Local junior Blake Geary shot well in C grade to take 1st place with 38/50, with Adam Bozier taking 2nd

Overall in the 50T 410 event was won by Craig O'Neill shooting 50/52 with Dave Dundon 1st in AA 48/50 and Mark Fanning in 2nd place on 46/50. Ashley Mason from Toowoomba



took the A grade 1st place on 46/50 followed by Eddy Elder 2nd with 45/50. Tassie's George Pinner shot well to take 1st place in B grade with 43/50 with Thomas Rhue in 2nd with 43/52, and C grade was won by Brett Graving 39/50 with Adam Bozier taking 2nd in C grade

Matthew Rhue won the A grade shoot off coming 1st with 57/60 closely followed by Shane Bennett on 56/60. B grade 1st place went to Alan Adams from Pioneer 50/52, with local Jim Storch 2nd with 49/52 and some brilliant shooting from the juniors decided the C grade places Daniel Andrews from Roma took 1st in C grade with an impressive 48/50 with Blake Geary taking 2nd 47/50.

The State Skeet Carnival was underway by lunchtime Friday and opened with the 50T State Handicap event. 54 shooters nominated for this event with 3 shooters coming in with a possible. Matthew Rhue was the last man standing shooting a terrific 157/158 to outlast everyone who made the shoot offs. Blake Geary kept him busy coming in 2nd with 148/159 and Thomas Rhue wasn't letting them off easily finishing 3rd with 151/159. Toowoomba's Len Edwards finished 4th with 133/136 with Debbie Young in 5th place on 112/115. 

To be staged at ACTA National Ground, NSW by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2011 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2011 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2011 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence or permit before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors.

Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridge

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as family member paying full nomination fees.

Authority

This program shall control the 2011 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2011 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking:

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times - Please co-operate.

Souvenirs:

In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2011 National Championships badge.





NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5.500.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

NORTHERN ZONE JUNIOR CAMP

For the past four years I have had the pleasure of attending the Northern Zone Junior development camp at Newcastle Lake Macquarie CTC. I go there primarily I my

role as psychologist: providing information about goal setting, concentration, motivation, relaxation, mental rehearsal, etc. I also get the opportunity to provide some basic coaching and to provide training for the more experienced shooters; how to fit mental skills into their preshot, shooting and post-shot routines. This year's camp in early January was again a great experience. You may have noticed that in the opening sentence I said I have the 'pleasure' of attending. So, why is giving up several days of my holidays, volunteering my time and working with a group of juniors, something I would describe as a pleasure? This is an easy question to answer even though contains many parts.

Firstly, from an organizational perspective everything had been considered. Graham Gosling and Rick Bannerman had invited a good selection of young shooters: ranging from complete novices to very experienced ISSF competitors. Tegan McCloy, Nathan Wilkinson have been part of Hunter Sports Academy squad and provided valuable support to the group as mentors and role models. Over the past thirty years I have worked mainly in schools, so I am well aware of the issues that affect adolescents and of the behaviours and interactions that are likely when adolescents are thrown together. As individuals and as a group they behaved excellently. I never heard or saw anyone display poor sportsmanship, rude or bullying type behaviour. More importantly, everyone was made to feel included and no one was rejected or neglected by the group. The only disappointment was that the media, TV and newspapers were not there to witness responsible teenage behaviour coupled with responsible gun ownership and usage.

I often talk to parents, teachers and clients about what our needs are as human beings. William Glasser, a famous American Psychologist, believed that humans had five main needs that were necessary for our existence and wellbeing. The first of these is a primitive desire to **survive**; find food, shelter and sex. The other four however are not as basic and if we do not meet these needs (or if they are met in a negative fashion) then this will tend to lead to maladaptive behaviours. The first of these needs is belonging. We all as humans want to belong or be part of a group. This group may be a family, social group sporting group, church group or a group of work colleagues. The second need is for approval. We all need to know that those around us, those whose opinions we respect and value approve of us and our behaviour. The third need is for **freedom**. This usually means the freedom to make choices or being empowered to choose those things that will make us a well adapted person. The final need that human beings have is the need for fun. If you enjoy what you're doing you will learn and improve, and life will be more enjoyable. I'm sure Graham and Rick didn't consciously plan to meet Glasser's needs but an unintended outcome of their work was that all these needs should have been met by all who were there.

Secondly, the facilities at Newcastle Lake Macquarie CTC provide an opportunity for these juniors to try a range of disciplines: DTL, skeet, ISSF Skeet, trench and double trap. The grounds were a picture and the catering was good healthy food.

Finally, there was an opportunity to work with the coaches, Graham, Rick, Helen Overton and the Hunter sports academy consultants: Liana Burrows and Anthony Webb both exercise physiologists. Liana's

focus was motivation and this became the theme for the camp, as we were able to take her introduction a step further and look at the difference between process orientation and product orientation. The other important aspect of the camp is that the juniors have a chance to have someone

look at how their gun is fitting them. It was great to see Sophie and Yvette turn up this year with better quality guns and to witness both the improvement and level of enjoyment when they were hitting the target more confidently knowing that their guns were set up right for them. Rick Bannerman was very impressed with the Arrow Laser Shot and used it to help each junior see their gun's point of impact. If a correction was needed, then it could be done, and checked quickly and simply in the clubhouse.

It is easy for me as a teacher to look at the camp and see the positives. The organisers, should feel proud that it was another great success. However, meas-uring the success of such a camp is difficult. If the participants improve over time: personal best scores, improved grades, major wins then these

successes are easy to quantify. But the true success for these youngsters will come with a high level of sportsmanship and personal integrity, lifelong friendships, staying with the sport or returning later in life when opportunities present. These juniors should also be more likely to give something back to the sport: become involved in club, zone or state administration or coaching, encourage their own children to shoot, become advocates for responsible firearm ownership. Hopefully they learnt that good shooting is not necessarily about winning. After witnessing their level of commitment, their striving to improve and achieve, their desire to have fun and learn and their genuine encouragement of each other, I believe that our sport and society will be in good hands when they take the reigns.

For Graham, Rick and the rest of the crew, keep doing what you are doing; you seem to have it right.

And for the squad remember to follow these simple steps:

- 1. Set your goals.
- 2. Stay focused in the present: discard past judgments and ignore fears about the future, they might not happen anyway.
- 3. Focus on the process and let the outcomes look after themselves.
- . Breathe and relax.
- 5. Trust and let go.
- 6. Have fun.

I am looking forward to January 2012 and hearing of the achievements of the squad over the next twelve months.



Club Improvements

The Tasmanian Gun Club had a big 2010. The culmination of several years of forward planning was undertaken and completed during the year:

The power poles from the roadside were replaced at a cost of some \$4000. These were probably the original power poles from some 40 years ago.

The light poles for night shooting were replaced with steel poles and the lights rewired at a cost of some \$4500.

The roof of trap three was converted to a "lift up" style, with a concrete

floor poured at ground level as well, to enable trap filling and maintenance by simply raising the roof and walking in. This at a cost of about \$1800. It was necessary to build a complete new roof to get the weight down to enable gas struts to work efficiently.

Trap four was removed in its entirety and a precast concrete bunker installed to accommodate a new trap house which sits on a scissor lift to enable the house to be raised to DTL height and then lowered as required to Ball Trap height. The club purchased and installed a new Canterbury Crusader Ball Trap.

This project cost about \$26,000. The club received confirmation of a \$10000 grant mid year and along with a very healthy corporate donation was able to commence the construction and installation. However, we were faced with the dilema of commencing the construction mid winter prior to the 30th Police and Services National Carnival or to leave it till summer.

Several of the committee took it on themselves to try to get the installation completed prior to the 30th Police and Services National Championships. However, to make life difficult there was continual heavy rainfall over the weeks leading up to the carnival. As can be seen by the photos we managed to build a good duck hole!

But, all is well that ends well. The construction was completed prior to the due date, unfortunately we were then thwarted by some teething troubles with the new trap, making if unusable during the competition.

All the issues have now been well and truely sorted out and we can thow some mean ball trap targets!

Our aim with installing a ball trap is to enable any shooters, new or old, to shoot at targets which are similar to those shot on a trench layout, this is a facility which has been sadly lacking at the club.

That the old trench layout is so manpower intensive that prospective trench shooters are simply denied an opportunity to enter or compete in an olympic discipline or equivalent on a regular basis.

Now, with the facility available on any normal practice Wednesday, there is no reason a shooter can't prepare for any competition.

To make life easier for our hard working Wednesday practice day volunteers we purchased two Elpipa token operated release controls. These are fitted at the skeet and ball trap layouts, at a combined cost of almost \$3000. Along with a Canterbury covering a DTL as well, we now have three machines, this means that Wednesday practice days are a breeze.

The club also lashed out and acquired kitchen appliances as well, a couple of pie heaters, a wall hotwater heater and a new urn.

The old bar was removed from the club house and the interior is now roomier.

Old wooden seating along the various layouts was replaced as required with macrocarpa pine, this should have a better life span than the previous seating.

The club is now well positioned for the next few years, however, we dont intend to ease up yet, there is still more to be done, the trench layout is due for refurbishment and modernisation, the clubhouse requires further alterations.

A deck area is proposed for the front of the club house to enable viewing of shooting under cover.

Covered walkways to the toilet facilities are proposed.

As usual thoughall these improvements depend on funds and energies.

The past 6 years has seen about \$120,000 spent on the redevelopment of the grounds, a very good testament to the hardworking committee.

We have had an excellent cohesive group of shooters running the club with none who are looking for ribbons for their kite tails, it is a pleasure to work with such a progressive group.


Majura Park Gun Club
