Shooting the Double Barrel off in daylight did not hold up the shoot and the results speak for themselves. enthusiastic and talented younger shooters. To me, one highlight of clay target shooting over other sports, is to see shooters of all ages, shooting alongside each other and being able to compete in different grades, age groups and gender groups at the same time. Very few sports allow such diverse groups to compete against each other simultaneously and I believe this is something we should be using to help promote our sport.

Whilst there were many good and positive comments, there was also some criticism. In most cases this disappeared when an explanation was given as to why things happen in a particular way. As I have been on a steep learning curve myself, I have had to ask many questions to develop an understanding of the sport and its operation and administration.

To assist with this I will be explaining in future editions of the CTSN, some of the issues raised to ensure all members receive the same correct information. In the next edition of our Newsletter I will provide an explanation of the way prize money for the Nationals is calculated and the reasoning behind the method. On any issues, members are reminded that the way to have an input is to raise their concerns, firstly at their club, then have it taken to their Zone and State Meetings, for it to be finally raised with the National Executive by your State representative. On many occasions in the past this has not occurred.

An unpleasant experience I encountered was to hear a number of rumours, which had no truth to them and where members had not made any attempt to check their veracity. Quite often all that is needed is to ask a question to find out the truth.

The general atmosphere during the Championships was extremely friendly, very much like a family getting together on a special occasion and I look forward to meeting many more members in the future.

I now await the Skeet Nationals to see the return of some shooters I have already met and to meet others who were not at the Trap Nationals and to find out all about "skeeties".

Once again the perfect weather allowed the final event, the Mackintosh Team shoots to be completed on the Saturday, before the forecast rain on Saturday evening. A side benefit of the recent rains was the opportunity to see the layouts in perfect condition. Numbers were very good with above average competitors for all events.

The results of the State Teams Shoulder to Shoulder and the Champion of Champions competition highlighted the good shooting to come. A couple of the highlights of the week were the new National Championship record of 900 out of 900 in the Double Barrel won by Tony Arvanitakis, an event in which 4 shooters beat the previous record, and back to back wins for Lisa Hawker as Women's National Champion of Champions.







ISSF SHOOTING

Minimum Qualification Scores (MQS)

As outlined in the last issue of CTSN, your Board directed that a regular column be established in this magazine to, over time, address the various issues that our elite shooters have to contend with. It is hoped that this column will also provide useful information not just to ISSF shooters but to the wider audience of DTL, American skeet and sporting shooters and thus enhance the understanding of the elite portion of this wonderful sport of clay target shooting. Last issue we said we would examine what is an MQS.

QUESTION: What is the MQS and what is its relevance to the High Performance squad?

ANSWER: Since 1988, the Olympic Qualification System of the Shooting Sport is based on two fundamentals: the Olympic Quota Places, and the Minimum Qualification Scores (MQS).

Each shooter, to be eligible to take part in the Olympic Games needs an Olympic Quota Place, and must have obtained a Minimum Qualification Score at least once during his/her shooting career.

The MQS (Minimum Qualification Score) is a minimum score that a shooter must have recorded at least once during his/her shooting career, in order to become eligible to take part in the Olympic Games.

The Minimum Qualification Scores for each shooting event are designated by the ISSF. A look at the scores listed below will clearly show that these scores are very low and unlikely to gain selection in a team. However they are established to ensure those athletes from countries considered unlikely to qualify for the Games have an opportunity to be represented, should they receive a wild card entry; thus ensuring that there is a "minimum standard" to the competition.

MQS for Shotgun are Trap Men - 112, Double Trap Men - 118, Skeet Men - 114, Trap Women - 58, Skeet Women – 60.

The personal MQS scores of each shooter are recorded through ISSF supervised shooting events and each athlete willing to participate in the Olympic Games must record it before heading to the Games.

As an example, the MQS score for the Men's Trap event has been set to 112 points scored in one round of 125 shots. A shooter willing to participate in the Games must have scored

at least 112 points during an ISSF supervised competition at least once in the set time-frame.

Now to Quota places; given the limited number of qualification slots available for shooting sport at Olympic Games the qualification system for our sport is based on Quota Places.

A Quota Place is a qualification ticket to enter the Games, awarded by the ISSF to those shooters who reach the best results during designated ISSF Olympic Qualification competitions such as World Cups, World Championships or Continental Championships.

Quota Places are country-related: the shooter wins a quota place, which is then owned by his/her country. Each country is free to decide how to use the Quota Places won by its shooters. Therefore, the shooter who secures a Quota is not automatically qualified for the Games, as the final decision is to be taken by his/her national team. As an example, the Quota Place won by Shooter X could be used by the country holding the quota to enter Shooter Y in the Games.

Each Olympic cycle, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) assigns a certain number of Quota Places to the ISSF, which then distribute them to nations through designated qualification competitions. This is currently set to 390 Quota Places which were awarded to the ISSF at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, which were then re-distributed to 103 different countries. 390 Quota Places will also be distributed for the 2012 Olympic Games in London.

A Victorian North East Zone, Night, Points Score Championship was the main drawcard on Friday the 25th March for the Mathoura Gun Club, and it certainly did draw the shooters, with five full squads attending. A good night for shooting, with a light breeze, enough to keep all mosquitos away, but not enough to worry the targets,



perhaps a little cool, although a fire outside the clubhouse was a welcome spot for everyone to thaw out.

Deniliquin members Rob & Ned Collicoat were the only two who shot a full score of 30/30 in the 10 target Points Score Cash Divide opener, with Roger Kerslake dropping just one point to collect 2nd place cash with his 29/30 result.

Sponsorship - What does it mean to the shooter, the association and the sponsor?

The Australian Clay Target Association has received many questions regarding sponsorship provided to the association and the cost of those benefits. As President I believe it is timely to give an explain as to how sponsorship packages are tailored to suit particular companies involved and how they vary to suit sponsors needs.

Packages are agreed between the sponsor and the association for terms of up to five years. An example of this is the Beretta sponsorship package signed in 2006 for a five year period. This package provided the association with 15 double rise traps, 16 skeet traps (and associated control boxes), 10 shotguns for prizes at the National Championships and one shotgun for the world DTL Championship that was held in 2006. This package has now expired with the equipment remaining the property of the association. Another example is the recently signed five year package with Perazzi which includes flexibility to be revised annually on parts of the sponsorship package, with an emphasis on junior development. Sponsorship packages may include various benefits to the sponsor, this being normal business practice to make the association more attractive to the sponsor. These may include, (but are not always limited to) the association providing free advertising, nominations, trade sites, and other benefits such as "Hall of Fame dinner" tickets, all of which have a financial cost to the association. Other benefits may include naming rights and the erection of signage as supplied by the sponsor, which is at their cost and does not have a financial cost to the association.

Some sponsorship packages are tailored to suit sponsors that cannot make a long term commitment, with Coopers Tires being an example of this. This sponsorship was a one year package (now extended to two), being a cash payment in exchange for signage benefits, advertising, naming rights, free nominations and "Hall of Fame dinner" tickets.

Coopers Tires being a non-industry sponsor the arrangements were tailored to better suit Coopers Tires to keep them as a sponsor into the future. The association is currently developing a sponsorship package with differing levels of both commitment and benefits and hopes to have these available later this year for interested sponsors.

In relation to the acquittal of sponsorship, the association's current policy is that the sponsor is "sponsoring the association as a whole" and the donated product value is deducted from the amount calculated for prize money - using the formulas that were developed and used in 2008 and 2009 by the ACTA Executive.

This means that the sponsor's donation assists the whole membership - as opposed to a single winner (as would be the case if a shotgun was the prize, with the association having to bear the costs associated with servicing the sponsor package).

This practice exposes the sponsor to the whole of our membership not just the winner of a National Title. The whole association should therefore receive some benefit. Some sponsorship, as example Coopers Tires is also spread over more than one discipline at the sponsor's request.

Some sponsor packages are prepared by our legal firm, Landers and Rogers and include indemnity clauses for both the association and the sponsor and may further include clauses relating to confidentiality. I thank those sponsors who have waived this provision to allow the association to provide the above information to our membership. These arrangements are clearly between the sponsor and the association - not any particular winner of any particular event.

I hope this clarifies the type of arrangements the association enters into on behalf of its members.



2011 Skeet Carnival TAMWORTH CLAY TARGET CLUB

Tamworth Clay Target Club held its Annual Skeet Carnival over three days on 18th to 20th March 2011 at the Loomberah facility.

The Northern Zone Skeet Championship was run in conjunction with the carnival as was the NSWCTA Skeet Championship.

The program was changed a little this year in that what used to be a 50 target 20 gauge cash divide and a 25 pair doubles cash divide have been changed into championships to make the program a bit more attractive.

The Lucky Number Shoot-offs and the Club Teams were run again this year and distributed another \$550 among shooters who may not have been successful in the events.

It was the best equipped shoot the club has ever held with all four skeet layouts now having modern large capacity automatic traps.

They are located in high and low trap houses which have recently been refurbished with external access stairs for much safer access to the

traps for servicing and restocking. Until now, the access to the high houses was via internal ladders which were very dangerous and totally unsuitable for stocking the traps with targets.

The running of the shoot proved to be so much easier and efficient with the new and improved facilities.

Weather conditions were close to perfect throughout the week, with more than 500 shooters from across Australia and New Zealand in attendance. A small band of shooters (approx 15) from the New South Wales Clay Target Association's Central Zone attended and again put in some very strong performances.

This is a squad of 25 shooters who have performed to the highest standard and positions within the team are highly competitive with only the best shooters taking a place. Matt was also a member of the NSW Open Team. This team is comprised of the top 5 shooters from the NSWCTA Trap Championships (held Oct 2010). Matt was also recognised for having achieved trap shooting's 'Grand Slam' - shooting 400 consecutive Double Barrel targets in an event, 50 targets off 25 metre Handicap & 25 pair Double Rise targets.

Fellow West Wyalong club member, Clive Foster, narrowly missed out on a place in the Open Mackintosh Team. Clive's shooting throughout the Double Barrel, Single Barrel & Points Score events saw him in a position to shoot off for the final places in the team. 





NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Still Stressed Out!

I don't know what happened last month, but the article that appeared in the CTSN should have been titled: Stressed out.

This month I want to explore aspects of stress management, such as problem man-

agement and emotion management a little further. These strategies can be employed by athletes or they can be used as part of the coaches repertoire of skills for helping the athlete or the team deal with stress.

What is problem management? Before I answer this question, there is an assumption that it is the problem, or skill deficiency, that is causing the athlete stress. According to Raedeke & Burton, problem management is a proactive approach that reduces stress through competitive engineering, personal engineering, problem solving, and use of mental plans.

The first aspect of problem management is competitive engineering. This involves the athlete experiencing stress because they are uncertain about being successful in important competitions. Competitive engineering means that you can reduce the stress by changing the situation. When I researching this topic I thought: many of us become stressed about shooting at state carnivals or the nationals, but how can we reduce the stress by changing the situation? We cannot change the program or when or where we are shooting, but we can change our thinking. This is the basic principle of cognitive-behavioural therapy: "It is not the things in life that affect us, but how we think of them."

How can uncertainty cause us stress? For the shooter, there can be several factors that cause uncertainty when we are competing. External factors would include concerns regarding ammunition type or speed, choke selection, changing light conditions on cloudy days, wind, background, brand of targets and traps. There is very little you can do about some of these external factors: wind, changing light and backgrounds are variables that may not be able to be changed but you can always choose not to compete. Internal factors that create uncertainty involve us not staying in the present. If we dwell on the past, either past experiences, past performances of ourselves, or others, either good or bad. When we focus on the past we develop judgements: judgements about our performances, our ability, our self worth. These judgements interfere with our ability to focus on the present (the task at hand) and we then develop self-doubt. This self-doubt causes our muscles to tense up and we then fail. Uncertainty can also occur when we focus on the future. Future focus leads to anxiety. Anxiety is a worry or fear about an impending event. The problem with fear is that the things we are afraid of may never happen. What anxiety does is also to again attack our ability and develop self-doubt.

Where possible, it is important that to achieve we need to limit both the internal and external factors that lead to uncertainty.

Removing excessive importance of the event is another effective way to reduce stress. There are two types of rewards for our effort. Intrinsic

and extrinsic: intrinsic rewards relate to the inner gains that motivate us to perform well. Intrinsic rewards relate to feeling good about your performance, achieving personal bests, being satisfied that you played well or played with technical perfection. These rewards are related to process motivation, that is, competing because you enjoy competing. Extrinsic rewards, on the other hand, relate to product motivation, and are focused on prize money, trophies, praise, etc. Product motivation can also be responsible for poor sportsmanship, cheating and bullying behaviour because the athlete believes that "the ends (prize) justify the means (process used to achieve them)".

The factors that allow us to place to too much importance are:

- · parents or coaches offering money or gifts to athletes who win,
- · trying to impress parents, coaches, selectors.
- the need for recognition.
- the need for approval from significant others.
- external recognition such as media,

The way to reduce stress for excessive importance is to focus on the process and let the product look after itself. If you shoot because you like shooting, then with effective coaching, good gun fit, etc, you should be able to perform well and with consistent improvement success will occur.

Personal engineering also involves increasing our personal control by keying goals to the process rather than the product. It is also important that we appraise demanding situations positively, and view them as a challenge. By doing so we will see problems as surmountable because you believe that you have the skills and capabilities to attain your goals. Developing and helping athletes maintain confidence in their capabilities, can be achieved if technical, physical and mental skills are adequate to cope with the demands of the competition. Making sure that athletes are mentally tough: that is they are confident, composed, competent, committed, in control, competitive, courageous and consistent. Personal engineering also involves lifestyle management: making sure you sleep well, eat a nutritious diet, stay hydrated and manage time effectively. Lifestyle management also involves consuming alcohol in moderation and quitting smoking completely.

The final aspects of personal engineering involve developing appropriate problem solving skills and developing effective mental plans. Problem solving skills will assist us to have optimum technical skills and with the support of the coach , problems should be identified and resolved through appropriate remediation. Mental plans are important because the offer a conceptual framework for evaluating our performance and making new goals to either remedy problems or move our game to the next level.

Next month I review the emotional management aspects of dealing with stress.

Last month I mentioned again, the Arrowlasershot. At a shoot last week I was asked by a shooter if I had it with me and in about the same time it took to put it together it became apparent that his gun was shooting too flat and with a slight modification to the pitch, he was shooting much better. Glen Walker, renowned skeet shooter, and supplier of shooting accessory products such as Hidefspecs, contacted me when the CTSN arrived, letting me know that he supplies and sells Laser shots.
