

National President's Notes

The Executive and sub-committees have met recently, and I was re-elected as your President.

I consider this to be a great privilege and I will carry out the duties of President to the best of my ability.

During the meetings many exciting proposals have been decided upon or are now undergoing due diligence. I cannot enlighten members on those proposals that have not yet been finalised but there are some which I can outline to you. Many of the decisions will bring input and expertise to our Association from outside of our normal state based

executive structure. Having this expertise available can only be beneficial to the Association.

The structure of the Board has been reviewed. The Board, formerly composed of the President, five executive members and the power to second one, will now comprise the President and four executive members with the power to second two members with expertise in specific fields which we are lacking. The current situation shows us lacking in Legal and Accounting expertise and it is our intention to advertise in the CTSN for two suitably qualified persons prepared to join the board on a volunteer basis with expenses paid as we do the Executive.

The ACTA has set up an ISSF working group of Chairman Darryl Maguire (Local State Member), Michael McCormack (Local Federal Member), Wayne Geale (Mayor of Wagga Wagga), Kay Hull (ACTA Patron), Russell Mark (ISSF expertise) and Don Johnson (Executive member, Chairman of Grounds, and engineering expertise). The group's task is to suggest design and source funding for a complete ISSF facility on the National Grounds. The Executives' only involvement will be ultimately "ticking off" on the completed proposal and funding arrangements.

The Executive have created a new class of membership with non-voting rights for "Supporting Associations". The ASSA (Australian Skeet Shooters Association) is the first organisation to be accepted as a "Supporting Association". The ASSA is an incorporated body with elected officials and membership of it is dependent on being a member of the ACTA. Their aim is to promote skeet shooting in Australia. The ASSA has offered to help the ACTA with such things as recording Annual Long Breaks, Grand Slams, and other Hall of Fame award scores. They have an excellent website dedicated to the discipline and this will be linked to the Association's. The ACTA see this as a positive move and look forward to future involvement of the ASSA within our sport.

Regarding websites it is interesting to note that the Gold Coast club and the NZCTA (New Zealand Clay Target Association) have both had websites featuring an open forum in the past. Both organisations have removed the forum from their website. SSAA (Sporting Shooters Association of Australia) has also made a decision not to have a forum on their site nor link to any site that has a forum. This would be a condition of sites linked to the ACTA also.

I have previously indicated that following a complaint from a member we have had an ADC (Anti Discrimination Commission) conciliation meeting and subsequent agreement signed under the powers of the ADC. The Executive have finalised the new membership categories as required by this agreement, and they will take affect from the 2012 membership year. A review of subscription fees in light of the changes is under consideration (the first in two years) which takes into consideration the changes we had to make to the categories. Following our legal advice it was obvious we had little choice in much of the outcomes. The agreement signed is confidential and all that can be made public is that the agreement was acceptable to both parties.

The agreement is enforceable in a court and any breach of confidentiality is considered contempt of court.

It has been decided that we will not be hosting the 2012 ICTSF (International Clay Target Shooting Federation) World Skeet Championships. This decision came about after the ICTSF General Assembly decided that it must be shot using the English rules, we became aware that England was not funding their teams to the event, and the feeling at the informal skeet meeting was that there was already another organisation in the World conducting an event that was generally accepted to be the World Skeet Championship. The ICTSF has been advised accordingly. Since our decision NZCTA has advised the ICTSF that that they will not be offering to host either Skeet or Sporting ICTSF World Championships in the foreseeable future, and although committed to funding teams to Australia if we had hosted the event, they will not be funding teams to these events when conducted elsewhere. Both Australia and New Zealand remain totally committed to the ICTSF DTL World Championship, the event the ICTSF was originally founded to administer.

The long awaited Mackintosh reunion is now being planned for the 2012 Trap Nationals, this being the 75th Anniversary. It is proposed there will be a dinner on the Saturday night following the last qualifying event and a breakfast for all past members on Sunday after which time the Teams

match will be shot. A special 75th Anniversary badge will be struck for all who enter the qualifying events. The event is being organised by Mark McInnes on behalf of the ACTA and it is envisaged to include mementos for past team members, entertainment and a large memorabilia display.

The ACTA is extending the right to compete on ACTA grounds for the Sporting Discipline to members of other bodies who shoot a sporting/simulated field discipline. This is not a reciprocal right as it is up to the other Associations to grant that to us but we believe this is a step towards that aim. SSAA, F&GA (Field & Game Australia) and F&GFA (Field and Game Federation of Australia) members can now compete on our grounds at all levels in the Sporting discipline. This has been approved by our insurer and all members of the other associations need to do is sign the visitors book. Only ACTA members are able to qualify for State and National teams. We hope this will lift numbers at Sporting events especially at club level, and address the concerns raised by some members recently in the magazine.

The Rules committee has removed the rolling percentage calculation from the handicapping process. It was believed that any benefit was far outweighed by the extra workload imposed on those doing the cards, and the number of cards with errors was unacceptable. We now revert to the previous calculation simply based on the last 200 targets.

Nationals dates for 2012: Trap 25 Mar-1 Apr. Skeet 20-26 May. ISSF 16-21 Jan. Sporting 25 & 26 Aug

A decision has been made to bring the Trap Nationals scheduled to be held in Perth in 2014 forward to 2013. This decision was made as the NZCTA are conducting the ICTSF World DTL Championships in 2014 and it would be prudent to have our Nationals on the East coast that year, saving members having to travel to Perth and New Zealand in the same period.

The ACTA has agreed to begin a new Trans-Tasman competition starting in 2012 with the NZCTA-ISSF Nationals. The competition, in the spirit of the Glenn Cup, will be conducted in Australia in odd years and New Zealand in even years. There will be 3 person Olympic Trap team funded the same as Glenn Cup teams currently are, selected annually on the ISSF Nationals and the Australia Cup Final. This is only possible thanks to our Team Sponsor Casella Wines and I thank them for their support of this match. We are also looking at other possibilities for ISSF shooters and international travel opportunities outside of the AISL (Australian International Shooting limited) umbrella.

Many other initiatives are being costed and will be finalised at a Board meeting in August prior to executive approval. A busy meeting schedule was completed this year and we are confident the majority will benefit from the decisions made.

Executive Officer's Report



At the ISSF, Trap and Skeet National Championships held this year, one of the extremely positive aspects was the performance of junior shooters, both male and female. Their performance, whilst not only good for the future standard of Clay Target shooting in Australia, is good for the growth of our sport by the encouragement and support it gives to other young shooters. The ACTA has recently completed a Youth Training camp, which covered ISSF and

was held at Cecil Park and will shortly conduct a Junior Training camp at the National Grounds at Wagga Wagga. These camps are for shooters who have shown ability through their performances, and provide them with training on all of the aspects needed to consistently produce good results. Training includes psychological preparation, ideas on fitness as well as shooting techniques. All subjects are designed to produce a better shooter who is able to identify any problems with their own technique and to give them the best chance to shoot well.

In a previous magazine the President mentioned that the ACTA was considering a new method of member registration. This issue received more replies or comments, that I am aware of, than any other issue. None of the responses were positive. Many responses from Clubs indicated that it would cause more problems and work than it would solve. As a result we have gone back to the drawing boards. The aim is to design a more cost effective system which picks up more of the members who are late in renewing or failing to renew because they have lost contact and interest. As we all know, when you have been away from an activity for a few weeks it is easier to not attend and find excuses than to show up. Many Clubs identified that this was an opportunity for the Club to follow up with members which would not occur if the ACTA was the responsible party for renewal of ACTA membership. It would also be simpler for members to make all payments at once. We are more than happy to hear any suggestions to improve the system if you feel there are benefits to be had.



This will provide facilities away from the clubhouse area closer to the people using the layouts from 10 to 18 and those camping down in that area.

rom 15th to the 21st of May, 148 shooters made their way to the National Shooting Ground in Wagga to compete in the 2011 National Skeet Championships. With the exception of some rather cold and foggy mornings, provided Wagga almost perfect skeet conditions for the six national and two prenational events. Of the total number of shooters, there were 14 female competitors, 31 veterans, 14 juniors, 3 subjuniors and an impressive dozen shooters from New Zealand. Each grade also had a good number of participants, with 36 AA Grade, 32 A Grade, 54 B Grade and 26 C Grade shooters.

This year, the carnival borrowed from the American tradition of shooting 100 targets straight. While there was much debate about the pros and cons of such a change, it did result in prompt completion of the daily events. The overall results did not seem to be affected by the different approach, with 24 possibles shot across the six main events and the emergence of some exceptional shooting.

Pre-National Events Event 1: ACTA 28 Gauge

Championship (50 targets) The first event on Sunday morning was the 28 gauge competition. It

was won by Thomas Rhue, a subjunior from Caboolture Clay Target Club with 65/65. Thomas shot off against more experienced shooters in the likes of Mauro Conti and Shane O'Brien to secure the win. Expect to see more great things from this impressive youngster in the years to come.

He was however, a little disappointed when he remembered that the 410 does not count towards the Overall High Gun, again bringing to light the question of whether the smaller gauges should be included as official National events. Apparently once a high enough percentage of shooters participate in the smaller gauge championships, they will be incorporated into the National program.

National Events Event 1: 5th National Skeet Champion of Champions (100 targets)

Three perfect scores were achieved in the Champion of Champions (50 targets in 20 gauge, 50 targets in 12 gauge) - Blake Slater, Steve Vaccaro and John Pope. This event mandates the shooting of doubles at stations 3, 4 & 5 for the shootoff, with all three missing a target in only the second pair. However after two more pairs it was Blake Slater from Melbourne Gun Club who won the event with 107/108. This was a phenomenal effort by Blake who had shot 20 gauge throughout the entire event.

Seven rounds of the shoot-off were completed before failing light caused a postponement until the following morning, leaving only Chris Jenkins and John Pope to sleep on it. Early in the eighth round Chris surrendered his last freebie leaving both shooters on the wood and under the pump, however it was John Pope who finally surrendered on a low 6 leaving Christopher Jenkins, a junior B Grade shooter,

This year, the awards were presented to Paul Johnston from Melbourne Gun Club who shot 213 in the 12 gauge at the 2010 National Titles. In 20 gauge, Shane O'Brien from the Eastern Goldfields Gun Club shot 150 straight at the World Skeet Shooting Championships in San Antonio, Texas. Also at the World Shoot, Peter Vella from Bathurst shot a commendable 103 in the doubles. Congratulations to each of the shooters for these fantastic results.

Grand Slam

The Grand Slam is a formidable challenge for any Skeet shooter. It is awarded when a shooter obtains a 200 break in 12 gauge, 100 break in 20 gauge and 100 break in doubles during the course of his or her career. At the 2010 Skeet Nationals, Leigh Roberts shot 100 straight in doubles to meet his final criteria and was presented with a plaque

at this year's Hall of Fame dinner. Leigh, as a highly skilled and experienced shooter, is only the fifth person to achieve the grand slam.

Adrian Cousens Medal

The Adrian Cousens Medal is awarded annually to the shooter who obtained the most Hall of Fame points from World, National and State Skeet events in the previous calendar year. Nominees for the 2010 medal were Leigh Roberts, Julian Lucchitti, David O'Sullivan, Paul Johnston and Brendan Pearson. While each of these shooters has achieved considerable wins both during 2010 and throughout their careers, it was Leigh Roberts from Bendigo Clay Target Club who was victorious on this occasion. This is the second time Leigh has won the medal in its four year history, indicating the exceptional quality of his shooting.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The 2011 dinner also saw Paul 'Johnno' Johnston receive the highest honour bestowed upon a Skeet shooter – induction into the Skeet Hall of Fame. Paul is the fourth shooter to be inducted and follows in the footsteps of NSW shooting great Reg Clarke and fellow Victorians Ken Lowry and Adrian Cousens.

To be considered for inclusion in the Hall of Fame, a shooter must have a minimum of 200 qualification points and have won at least three National Titles. Paul has had a long and distinguished shooting career, with highlights including four Australian National Titles (including the 1987 High Gun), four National Runners-Up, eight State Titles, and receiving the Grand Slam in 2010.

Paul has played a pivotal role in promoting Skeet throughout Australia. He helped to resurrect the Australian Skeet Shooters Association, of which he is the current President, is on the committee of the Melbourne Gun Club and assists with Victorian State Skeet events. Paul's achievements also transcend our borders, with one of his fondest Skeet memories coming from making the Australian team that travelled to the World Skeet Shooting Championships in the USA in 1990. Catching the international competition bug, Paul has participated at the World Shoot consecutively for nearly the past decade, and frequently travels across the Tasman to compete at the New Zealand Skeet Nationals where he has had great success winning three silver ferns.

Paul gave a heartfelt speech, thanking his wife Leonie and daughter Tayla for their continual support, and reminiscing through his Skeet career. At times, however, Paul's modesty took the better of him and it was left to Glenn Clarke, acting as host for the induction, to intervene. Glenn, much to the amusement of all in attendance,







RFI AXATION **RESPONSE**

Over the past three months the theme for these articles has been stress. We have explored the definition of stress, and emotional and problem management as ways of

understanding how stress affects us.

As humans, all of us experience stress. No-one is immune from it. When our resources are greater than our demands, (picture 1) then we are fine and in control of most things that will confront us.

Demands

As our demands become greater and the resources are stretched then we become strained but we are still able to cope and function. (picture 2)

Resources
Demands

However, when our demands are greater than our resources (picture 3), we become stressed and if the imbalance grows then we will eventually snap.

> Resources Demands

So, how do we deal with the stressors in our life. Ignoring them won't help. Nor will avoiding the cause as this will only put off the inevitable. The best way is to deal with the demands and eliminate the problems, if possible. For athletes, the competition itself may be the greatest cause of stress.

Herbert Benson from Harvard University Medical School developed a process called the "Relaxation Response", which is a physical state of deep rest that changes the physical and emotional responses to stress . . . and the opposite of the fight or flight response."

In past articles I have written about the fight or flight response as a way of dealing with fear and anxiety. Listed below are the differences between the fight/flight response and Benson's Relaxation response.

Qualities of the Fight or Flight Response

Increased heart rate Increased blood pressure Increased respiratory rate Higher pulse rate Increased oxygen consumption Increased blood lactate Increased muscle tension Rapid production of cortisol Production of noradrenaline

The Relaxation Response is a simple practice that once learned takes 10 to 20 minutes a day and can help relieve stress and tension. Learning and putting into practice such techniques can significantly improve your mental, emotional and physical health. This technique was developed by Herbert Benson, M.D. at Harvard Medical School, and is taken from his bestselling book "The Relaxation Response".

To learn this technique, set aside 10 or 20 minutes each day for a week and try it.

- 1. Sit quietly in a comfortable position.
- 2. Allow your eyes to close.
- 3. Think about each muscle, beginning at your feet and progressing up to your face. Deeply relax all your muscles. Keep them relaxed.
- 4. Breathe through your nose .Become aware of your breathing. As you breathe out, say the word, "ONE", silently to yourself. For example, breathe IN ... OUT, ONE "IN. OUT," ONE", etc. Breathe easily and naturally.
- 5. Continue for 10 to 20 minutes. You may open your eyes to check the time, but do not use an alarm.
 - When you finish, sit quietly for several minutes, at first with your eyes closed and later with your eyes opened.

Do not stand up for a few minutes.

Do not worry about whether you are successful in achieving a deep level of relaxation.

Maintain a passive attitude and permit relaxation to occur at its own pace. When distracting thoughts occur, try to ignore them by not dwelling upon them and return to repeating "ONE. "With practice, the response should come with little effort. Practice the technique once or twice daily, but not within two hours of a meal, since the digestive processes seem to interfere with the elicitation of the Relaxation Response.

Chris Patterson of G and G Duncan Fuel Injection Repairs had put up \$600 for a 50 Target Handicap Event and with the strong, blustery winds and occasional scuds of rain it looked like it would be the front markers who were most likely to be amongst the winners.

Young Matt Schiller shooting very well in the conditions was second 44/50 and Mitchell Kneebone after a short shoot off was third 46/53.

To cap a great day Kelvin Maxwell was High Gun 113/125.

Besides shaking his own hand and patting himself on the back Club President, Kelvin Maxwell thanked Patto for his sponsorship and wished all shooters a safe journey home.
