National President's Notes



Your board met in Sydney on the 25th of November and also attended the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) AGM on the same day. Mr. Dennis Harwood had resigned from the Board recently and after a ballot was replaced by Mr. Gary Read, who attended his first board meeting. We extend our thanks to Dennis for his time on the board and the executive and welcome Gary. The Board is pleased to advise that Mr. Neil Haydon, a qualified lawyer, has responded to the call for an independent board member with legal skills. Mr. Haydon met with board members and will now take his place on the board until June 2013. We have not yet received any interest in the position requiring accounting or other financial skills, but again ask

that any person with these qualifications interested in being a board member contact the Executive Officer.

The AISL AGM produced some interesting results. Two new Board members were elected for four year terms, (since changed to two) being Catherine Fettell who is the President of Pistol Australia (now required to relinquish that position) and Olympic Gold Medalist Mr. Russell Mark. Mr. Robert Marshall was elected to fill the casual vacancy created by the resignation of Mr. Glenn O'Brien.

Following the elections, 3 Constitutional changes and 5 Special resolutions were put to the meeting. These were all proposed by Pistol Australia and all supported by your AISL delegate Mrs. Elaine Forward. Some required a 75% majority to be carried and all but one was. The board believes that these changes which provide for the President to be elected by the members as opposed to the board, shorten the term of directors and the President to two years, and generally make the AISL more responsive and accountable to its members is certainly a step in the right direction.

The board is of the opinion that in our sport where the scores are based so objectively and there is no need for any subjective judgment, that AISL needs to look at the selection process, simplify it and make it as transparent as possible. We also believe that the current arrangements with AISL running so many Australia Cups and dragging our ISSF shooters all over the country has placed a huge financial burden on anyone trying to represent their country, and has effectively destroyed a large part of what was a healthy domestic competition in this discipline. I feel we can look forward to changes in these areas.

The Fair Work Australia matter referred to in previous columns is now listed for hearing on the 7th December. The notice not only names the ACTA but also some individual members of the executive. I can assure you it does make you feel a little uncomfortable to be named as a co-respondent in a matter of this nature.

The National Ground has been without a grounds man due to ill health for over a month. We have decided to employ a young trainee through a group scheme, for a two year traineeship, to help overcome this problem and plan some succession. Some Government financial assistance has been found for the position.

Target tenders for National Championships have been received and tests will be carried out in the next week to assess suitability. We test flight, visibility (often affected by strength and shade of colour) and breakability. The tests are done at Wagga and are carried out without the shooters knowing which brand is being shot before them rating the target against the three criteria. This process helps us make an informed choice. The procedure which has been in place for some years now has seen complaints from shooters about targets reduced to almost nil. The ACTA policy is to use the best, not the cheapest target available for your National Titles.

The board has appointed Mr. Adrian Cousens as Acting Historian. Adrian shares the passion of former historian Mark McInnes, and as Acting Historian will carry out most of the duties required of the historian's position except production of the previously regular historian's column. One of his first undertakings will be to re-organise our Hall of Fame website pages, adding extra information and standardising the Trap and Skeet sections.

Although this is January CTSN, Jim Shepherd seems to have all magazines out about 3 weeks into the month prior to the cover date, so I imagine you will all receive this prior to Christmas.

I wish you and your families a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Executive Officer's Report



The sport of Clay Target shooting has had the international events, the Glenn Cup and the Glenn Trophy in which we compete against New Zealand, in DTL and skeet for a number of years now. Recently it was agreed to have a similar competition with New Zealand in the ISSF discipline.

The trophy, which is to be a perpetual trophy sponsored by Casella, will be named

after Jack Sutherland, (Calrossie), and Jim McKenzie a well known New Zealand shooter. The first competition is to be held at the New Zealand nationals in 2012. The trophy will be competed for in New Zealand and Australia in alternate years similar to the Glenn Cup and Glenn Trophy. The team of three shooters will be selected using results taken from the previous National Championships and the final of the Australia Cup. This year, as the competition was initiated after the 2011 Nationals and will be shot at the New Zealand Nationals shortly after the 2012 ACTA Nationals, scores from the 2011 Nationals were used with the Australia Cup final, conducted in October 2011, to select the team. In the year the competition is shot in New Zealand the scores used for selection will be from the previous ACTA Nationals and the previous Australia Cup final.

Recently it has come to my attention that unlicensed drivers are driving vehicles on the National grounds to move to the practice layouts and back and to move vehicles around the grounds. This is illegal and is prohibited on the grounds. Any accident or damage which occurred would not be covered by insurance and would be the responsibility of the vehicle owner. The public liability insurance specifically excludes accidents or damage caused by vehicles driven by unlicensed drivers. A sign will be placed at the front gate reminding vehicle owners of their responsibility.

I recently visited the Newcastle Lake Macquarie grounds, the site of the 2012 ISSF nationals. The grounds are located near Awaba on the western side of Lake Macquarie and are in very good condition. Club members were engaged in a working bee to ensure that, not only will the grounds look good, they will help shooters produce good results and possibly PQS scores as National squad members are preparing for the Olympics. This should also ensure a very competitive National Championships.

I look forward to seeing many shooters in the New Year at our National Championships and some good shooting.



2012 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS 26th March – 1st April 2012 OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at ACTA National Ground, NSW by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2012 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2012 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2012 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence or permit before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 9.00am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly

classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Authority

This program shall control the 2012 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2011 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times - Please co-operate.

Souvenirs:

In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2012 National Championships badge.



The Squire reports from West Wyalong


There were six squads of shooters at the West Wyalong Clay Target Club's Open Shoot held on the last weekend in October.


It was noted after the shoot that although it was James who won the \$200 it was his Mum who had her hands on the dough.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one visit only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 4. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons'designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5)
 TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

STRESS TEST

For most of us when we were at school we learnt to read, write and do sums. We do these skills on a daily basis and we would definitely notice how difficult some aspects of our life would be if we had trouble doing them. Dealing with stress is something that

we need to do on a daily basis as well and yet learning to manage stress is left entirely to chance.

Earlier this year I wrote a selection of articles about dealing with stress. This article is a follow-on article in that series.

From time to time in our lives we become overwhelmed: bills, being bullied, excessive demands on our time and resources, flat tyres, traffic, late bus, quarrelling kids and partners, etc. We can cope using destructive ways: drugs, avoidance, alcohol are common but they do not fix the problem they just hide the symptoms. In the September/October edition of Scientific American: The Mind, there is an article by Robert Epstein, Fight the Frazzled Mind, which claims that research over the past few decades suggests that there are four broad, trainable skill sets or "competencies" that we can use to manage stress non-destructively. The competencies are:

- Source management. This involves reducing or eliminating the sources of stress.
- Relaxation. Practising such techniques as breathing exercises or meditation
- 3. *Thought management*. Correcting irrational thinking and interpreting events in ways that don't hurt you.
- 4. *Prevention.* Planning and conducting your life so that you avoid

The author conducted research involving 3304 (this is a large sample) of ethnically and racially diverse people from all over the world through participation in an online test at http:// MyStressManagementSkills.com using a survey that explore the usefulness of the four competencies listed above.

The author thought that he could predict the outcomes of the study fairly well and supposed that the most used competencies would be relaxation followed by thought management. Both of these are reactive strategies: that is you use them when you are experiencing stress. What he found however was the proactive strategy: Prevention: doing things

such as planning your day and trying to avoid stressors before they affect you, was the most effective competency. This was followed by Source Management, which includes things such as delegating tasks, organising your space scheduling your time, etc. The reactive strategies: relaxation and thought management were the least predictive strategies.

There is an interesting lesson here. Manage your stress proactively. Taking some deep breaths or counting to ten when you are stressed are good strategies but you will be much better off if you can find ways to avoid situations that make you feel stressed in the first place.

Epstein asks, "Can we fight stress more effectively? Fortunately, his study showed that (1) People who had training in stress management are better at it than people who have not and (2) the greater the number of training hours the better the skills. This means that regardless of what our natural reactions to stress are, learning stress-management skills is likely to be helpful in the long term.

Epstein outlines 6 strategies for fighting stress before it starts.

Firstly, **Seek and kill**. Take a few minutes each day to identify your stressors and find ways to reduce or eliminate them.

Secondly, **Commit to the positive**. Replace self-destructive coping strategies such as drinking, drugs or over eating with positive helpful strategies such as exercise, relation, yoga, etc.

Next, **Be your own secretary**. Keep lists of what you need to do, use your diary or smart phone to be better organised and planned for what needs to come next.

Fourthly, **Immunise yourself**. Use exercise, thought management and relaxation strategies to be in a better frame of mind to tackle stressful events.

Next, **Make a little plan**. Spend a few minutes each morning planning your day. You will get more done, waste less time and feel less tressed.

Finally, **Make a big plan**. This will give you greater control over your life. The more control you have the less stressed you will feel.

An inability or unwillingness to deal with stress can have a devastating effect on our lives. The study also showed a high positive correlation between test scores and the levels of happiness people reported. The concept of happiness I will deal with in future articles.

Epstein state the bottom line is: that stress management is both trainable and beneficial and you can reap the greatest benefits by fighting stress before it starts.

Before I conclude this month, I recommend that readers go to www.abc. net.au and look or listen to the Radio National: Background Briefing program of Sunday 14/11/2011 called "Guns are Back". This is a reasonably balanced report but it gives us insight into the thinking of the anti-gun lobby (Coalition for Gun Control) and the input from the media. There is also opportunities to make comments or read other peoples comments. This was far better coverage than the article that appeared on the cover of The Australian on Thursday 27th November, which showed shooters with quarry such as elephants, bears, zebras, etc. These images are harder to justify to those that would like to have our sport shut down.
