National President's Notes



Work on the National Grounds is gaining momentum. I am pleased to say that we now have another 8 powered sites completed at the eastern end of the grounds, and work is currently underway on more powered sites at the western end. This number of new powered sites will cater for every camper currently on the waiting list. Some more seating has also been purchased and the ablutions building at the western end will be completed for the Trap Nationals.

We are in the process of employing a trainee groundsman through a group training scheme to ensure the grounds are kept in great condition at all times. The Traineeship in Land Management is directly suited to our required tasks.

The Chairman of the Grounds Committee Mr. Don Johnson has resigned his position due to workload on other projects he is involved with. Don remains on the executive and on the Grounds committee and I thank him for the effort he has put into the proper planning and development of the grounds.

The Fair Work Australia (FWA) issue we have been dealing with for some months now continues without resolution, following a conciliation hearing on the 7th of December. Since originally advised this meeting was re-scheduled a number of times and the eventual 48 hours of notice we received precluded some from attending.

Disappointingly, this week the Association became aware of an email circulating in regard to this matter. The email is not factual in many instances, and is in direct contravention of the laws governing the FWA process which require complete confidentiality from all parties during the conciliation process. Needless to say we have not breached that law. The email also mentions some individuals and they are now at liberty to pursue their own interests in the matter if they so wish.

Following the target testing process I mentioned last month it has been decided to use the Corsivia target for the next 12 months. Three brands of targets were ranked very closely, and it eventually came down to the number of breakages off the trap to decide the successful brand.

The Executive Officer and the Promotions Chairman Allan Vilcins have begun meeting with our sponsors. Many of the agreements which were in place for advertising etc have run their course and now need re-negotiating. Two of our past major sponsors have indicated they would be interested in an open forum with representatives from all sponsors to assist us in developing a strategy to help increase membership and attendance. This idea will be considered by the Promotions Committee as soon as possible.

It is intended that meetings with all sponsors will be completed by the end of February.

The board still has a vacancy for a member with a background in Finance. We are keen to fill this position with a suitably qualified person. Anyone who is interested should contact the EO.

Notices

INSURANCE: Clubs are reminded that incident report forms are located on the web site. Clubs should submit an incident form following any activity which may result in an insurance claim as soon as possible after the incident, even if it is not known whether a claim is to be made or not.

A number of questions have been raised about insurance coverage for club canteens. These facilities are covered but clubs should be aware that an investigation into an incident will look at Food Safety Handling qualifications as well as hygiene standards and practices.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES: Some clubs and members have queried why the membership category, club only, has been dropped. This membership category was originally instituted to allow senior members, who no longer wished to compete, to continue shooting at a reduced cost. Clubs were only allowed to have a maximum of 10% club only members of the total membership. This was listed in the Secretaries Handbook. It was found that some clubs had up to 25% club only members and the category was not being used for the designed purpose.

Day 2 was slightly over cast, but still with a top temperature of 24 degrees Celsius forecast. The





ACTA Members – what you need to know to acquire

Applying for Import Permission SPORTS SHOOTER

Sports Shooter Test

Under this test, **Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA)** members may import restricted category C articles to take part in clay target events. Category C articles are self-loading shotguns, pump action repeating shotguns and associated parts.

Who can apply?

ACTA members that meet one of the following criteria:

- Requires the firearm because of a physical need due to lack of strength or dexterity; or
- On 15 November 1996, a person was a registered shooter with **ACTA** and possessed a self-loading shotgun or pump action repeating shotgun for use in clay target events.

There are two types of documentation that can be issued:

Import Permit

If the sports shooter is importing the firearm himself/herself, the sports shooter will require an import permit.

Sports Shooter Certificate

When purchasing a firearm through a dealer, a *Certified Sports Shooter Certificate* will be issued in the name of the sports shooter. The dealer will be issued an import permit if the article is not already in stock. Both the certificate and permit are required to be surrendered to Customs before the firearm can be released.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications must be made in writing to the Attorney-General's Department.

Required Supporting Documentation

- ☑ 1. Completed application form.
- ☑ 2. Evidence of citizenship or residency
 - ⇒ Certified copy of current passport; or
 - ⇒ Certified copy of expire passport or birth certificate and Statutory Declaration of continued citizenship; or
 - ⇒ Certificate of evidence of residence status.

If you have changed your name, you will also need to supply:

- ⇒ Certified copy of marriage certificate; or
- ⇒ Certified copy of change of name certificate.

- ☑ 3. Evidence of **ACTA** membership and firearms license
 - ⇒ Certified copy of **ACTA** membership card; **and**
 - ⇒ Certified copy of firearms license.
- ☑ 4. Evidence of use
 - ⇒ Statement by the sports shooter that they intend to use the article **solely** to take part in clay target events.
- ☑ 5. Meeting criteria for the firearm due to a physical need **OR 1996 ACTA** membership and firearm ownership
 - ⇒ Doctor's certificate (on the template that forms a part of the prescribed application form) verifying the sports shooter's condition and the need for the firearm due to this condition; **OR**
 - ⇒ Copy of the sports shooter's **ACTA** membership card, proving membership on 15 November 1996; **and**
 - ⇒ Evidence the sports shooter possessed a self-loading or pump action repeating shotgun, for use in clay target events on 15 November 1996 (must prove ownership on this date).

Psychological Skills for Shooting

HAPPINESS: IS IT POSSIBLE?

It is not unusual during therapy for a client to say: "I just want to be happy!"

It is even less unusual that they look surprised when I ask, "Define happiness."

Given happiness is a goal that most of us try to achieve, it is possible. This article will examine the introductory chapters of *The Happiness Trap: Stop Struggling, Start Living* by Russ Harris. The name Russ Harris may be familiar to viewers of the ABC because he conducted a lifestyle program a year or so ago, which took 6 people from Marrickville in Sydney, and looked at their lives and attempted to improve their happiness score. Russ Harris is a medical practitioner who uses ACT (Acceptance and Commitment Therapy) as a model for behavioural change in his clients. When I read his book and attended a workshop on ACT it was evident how close this philosophy is to what we are trying to achieve in sport psychology.

In Australia we have a fairly high standard of living. We have good medical treatment, clean water, safe food, good housing and sanitation, more money and better access to education and welfare services than a lot of other countries. In fact, today's middle class live better than royalty of a few centuries ago, and yet human suffering and misery is everywhere.

According to Harris, the psychology and personal development book-stores are growing at alarming rates. There are books to help you deal with eating disorders, depression, anxiety, anger management, divorce, relationship problems, sexual problems, drug dependency, alcoholism, gambling, loneliness, low self-esteem, grief and so on. Then there is radio, television, magazines and newspapers, where experts give us never ending loads of advice to help us cope and improve our lives. There are psychiatrists, psychologists, psychotherapists, counsellors, social workers and life skill coaches to help us as well. There is a problem here: with all this self-help advice and wisdom, human misery should be reducing not increasing. Surely, Harris believes, there is something wrong with this picture.

Mental health statistics are scary. In most years 30% of the adult population will suffer a mental illness. According to the World Health Organisation, depression is the fourth biggest, costliest and most debilitating disease in the world and by 2020 it will be number two. One in four adults will suffer from alcohol or drug addiction at some stage in their life. One in two people, will go through a stage in their life when they will seriously consider suicide and one in ten will attempt it. Think of your family and friends and consider what these figures will mean for the people you know and love.

We are living longer, we are wealthier, but are we happier. It appears not. Could it be that happiness is not normal! Let's go back in time. When we climbed down from the trees and we evolved into human beings, our minds evolved to help us survive in a dangerous world. We ended up with four basic needs: food, water, shelter and sex. Because none of these are important if we are dead, primitive man was forever on the lookout for anything that might harm him and where possible he avoided it. Overtime the brain became very good and distinguishing between good and bad, predicting and avoiding danger, and through evolution we have survived and because those good at predicting and

avoiding danger lived longer and had more children and passed their genes on, and on.

Our modern mind doesn't have to worry about dangers lurking in the jungles, but it still has that ability to predict danger, so it does: but now it sees danger in things like losing one's job, getting a speeding ticket, not having enough money to pay the bill, being embarrassed, getting cancer, or one of a million other worries. Because of all these bad things that can happen, we spend a lot of time worrying: more often than not, they never happen.

Another essential for survival is belonging to a group. Early man need to be part of a tribe to survive, whereas today we fear being rejected: am I fitting in, am I as good as the others, how do I compare with? This need to belong also means that we will strive "to keep up with the Jones's or put ourselves down because we feel we don't measure up. Early man only had a few tribesmen to compare himself with, but today we compare ourselves to others every time we open a magazine, watch TV, listen to the radio because there will always be someone who is smarter, taller, richer, slimmer, sexier, stronger, more powerful, more famous, etc.

For the caveman, more was better. The more weapons the likelihood of more food. Dead animals meant more skins to keep out the cold and more food. The more children, the more likely some would survive to adulthood. So it is not unrealistic for modern man to think that more is also better: more money, better car, bigger TV, younger-looking body, younger-looking partner, better job, etc. Mostly, we all want more. Harris maintains that evolution has shaped our minds so that we are almost inevitably destined to suffer psychologically: to compare, evaluate, and criticise ourselves; to focus on what we are lacking; to be dissatisfied with what we have; and to imagine all sorts of frightening scenarios, most of which will never happen.

If most of my clients are trying to be happy and according to the Dalai Lama: "The very purpose of life is to seek happiness," what is it we are looking for and how will we know if we find it? The dictionary defines happiness in two ways. Firstly, it can be a sense of pleasure, gladness or gratification. We all enjoy happy feelings: smoking a target, eating our favourite meal, savouring good wine or single malt whiskey. But these feelings are fleeting and impossible to hold on to, they slip away every time. The harder we try to pursue these feelings the more likely we will suffer depression or anxiety because there will be times that we will fail in our quest or the expectations will fall short.

The other meaning of happiness is a rich, full and meaningful life. When we do something that makes us feel proud, worthy, valued and vital. This is not a feeling that comes and goes, but is a profound feeling of a life well lived. And it must be remembered that in order to have a full life, there will be uncomfortable feelings such as, sadness, fear, anger and grief as well as pleasurable feelings of joy, happiness and contentment.

Next month, I will further into the Happiness Trap, and explore the myths surrounding being happy and what we do and how we think in setting the happiness trap. In the meantime this book is well worth reading. Or visit www.thehappinesstrap.com

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one visit only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
4. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.



As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
