PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2011



It gives me great pleasure on behalf of the Executive, as the President of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) to report on the Association affairs for the 12 month period ending the 31st December 2011.

Membership for the period slightly decreased from 13,040 to 12,848. Full memberships and the junior category saw the greatest reduction with Veterans again increasing in numbers. This is the first year in some time that we have had a decrease in membership, and we believe that the natural disasters so widely felt throughout Australia during the period would be a major contributor to this decline.

The Executive has ensured the Association is insured as comprehensively and economically as possible. Tenders for our Insurance needs were called during the period and the firm Pollards acting as brokers, have sourced our insurances from the Australis Group -Lloyds of London as underwriters.

The Association traded well during the year showing a profit of \$298,767 up from \$281,167 last year. Whilst revenue was slightly down, many expenses were managed below last year's and this helped increase our surplus.

Development continues at the National Ground, funded by these surpluses. Construction of new grandstand type seating, a second ablution block and 24 more powered sites began in the period and will be completed for the 2012 Nationals. Provision of extra water, gas and sewerage mains was part of this development. Much of this work completed is very expensive, but being mostly underground is not very noticeable. The ACTA have now completed an infrastructure program encompassing power, water, sewerage and a gas upgrade in just under 2 years at a cost of over \$240,000.

The purchase of the National Ground freehold from Wagga Wagga Council was finally documented in August and four monthly payments to the council were made during the period.

The Olympic Discipline Nationals were conducted with a good attendance and our thanks goes to the WAGC and WACTA for providing the facilities and running the event.

The National Trap Championships were conducted at the National Ground with a total attendance of 2410 over the 5 main events. This figure was up from 2226 the year prior. Some great scores were shot and the DB winner Tony Arvanitakis set a new record of 900/900 for the Double Barrel Championship. Congratulations Tony.

The National Skeet Championships were held at the National Grounds with 149 Shooters attending, exactly the same as last year. An informal meeting was held at the event allowing the Executive members present the opportunity to gain some interesting and valuable insight into how skeet shooters would like to see their discipline develop into the future. Some decisions have already been made by the Executive in regard to matters raised at this meeting and we are certain these will be seen by Skeet shooters as beneficial and in line with the sentiments expressed at the meeting.

The National Sporting Championships were conducted by the Wagga Gun Club on the Association's behalf at the National Grounds. The attendance of 109 was a great result after only 78 attending the year prior. Our thanks go to the Wagga Gun Club for working so closely with us during this event.

The ACTA funded a team to attend the ICTSF World English Sporting Championships in Paeroa, New Zealand. The team performed well with Renae Birgan being the outstanding performer winning the Ladies section overall. Congratulations Renae. Our teams also placed well with Gold for the "Super Vets" of Bryan Rafferty, Max Kavanagh and Peter Sutherland.

Silver was awarded to our Open team of Anthony Panetta, Craig Macpherson, John Younger, Sox Pilipasidis, and Peter Hall. Silver was also awarded to our Ladies team of Renae Birgan, Gaye Shale, and Trina Adams. Congratulations also go to the ACTA Skeet Team of Leigh Roberts, Shane Bennett, Len Edwards, David O'Sullivan and Steve Vaccaro who attended the NZCTA Skeet Nationals in November and came home with the Glenn Trophy.

Probably the major highlight internationally was the win by Michael Diamond in the ISSF World Cup Final. Michael continues to be competitive wherever he travels and helps keep our sport in the media limelight.

The National office has been very stable over the period. The appointment of Mr. Chris Gibson as Executive Officer on the 21st of February followed the resignation of Mr. Tony Turner in November of 2010, restoring our administration capability. The current office staff of Maureen Ryan, Judy Ferry, Sue Vesperman and Jenny Robinson along with our Groundsman Dave Jocelyn have all contributed greatly to the efficient administration of the Association. We have now employed a trainee, Wayne Sloan to assist Dave on the grounds as the facility continues to grow. The trainee is employed through a group scheme and began work in late 2011.

To all our staff at the office and the grounds, your efforts have been greatly appreciated.

The Executive changes during the year saw Mr Bob Blake replace Mr. Peter Haley from NSW. Peter was a Vice President of the Association and spent a great deal of time at Wagga Wagga, both as Chairman of the Grounds Committee and standing in at the office during the period we had no Executive Officer. Peter resigned due to personal reasons and was sadly missed.

Mr. Brian Bailey Tas. was replaced by a former Executive member Mr. Allan Kenny. Brian had run the ACTA Coaching camps for some time and with his wife Heather, had provided organization, food and support for our young shooters. Brian will be missed in this capacity.

Brian Muirson filled the vacancy made upon the retirement of Mr. John Mack, Qld. I thank John for his time as an executive member and particularly his three years as President. I can assure all that you have no idea what a term as President is like until you have tried it.

Mr. Dennis Harwood Qld, retired and at the end of December had not yet been replaced. (This position was filled by Geoff Moore in Feb 2012) Dennis was a long serving member of the executive and Chairman of Finance for many years. Our thanks to Dennis for his efforts over a long period of time.

The Board, in a new initiative seconded a non-executive person to the board. We welcomed Mr. Neil Haydon in late 2011 and look forward to working with him as part of the Board. Neil has expertise in the legal field and the Board is still looking to fill a position with a person skilled in finance.

The CTSN continues to be a major expense to the membership but is constantly improving. The digitization project is nearing completion and will become a valuable asset of the Association for many years to come. The coaching scene has been very quiet at a National level. We are in the midst of a legal claim involving our past Coaching Director, and lots of initiatives and programs have been on hold whilst this is sorted out. Due to the delicate nature of the proceedings I am not at liberty to elaborate.

The Association also saw a claim from a member against us in the Anti-Discrimination Commission. This resulted in the new categories of membership we introduced from 1st January 2012, with the consent of the commission. Significant flow-on effects to clubs and states are yet to be seen but will be inevitable.

These two issues above have taken a tremendous amount of association time and effort away from what we should be concentrating on. It is extremely disappointing to be now dealing with matters once common to big business but relatively unheard of in sport.

The Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) held their AGM and many changes were made to their constitution, supported by ACTA. It is hoped these changes will signal to AISL that the affiliates are not happy with many of their policies regarding selection, training and funding, and change is required.

Association sponsors have again provided exceptional support, and to all Sponsors we extend our sincere thanks. New sponsorship provided by Casella Wines allowed the ACTA to select an Olympic Trap team during the period to compete overseas for the first time in many years under our own banner. (The team comprising Brett Dunstan, Daniel Di Pietro and Frank Minici travelled to New Zealand early this year and successfully competed for the inaugural Jack Sutherland (Calrossie) - Jim McKenzie Trophy, provided by the Sutherland family and Casella Wines). Our thanks to both Casella Wines and the Sutherland Family, for providing the support to make this annual team event possible.

I take this opportunity to thank my fellow Executive members, Board members and Committee chairs for their support, time and effort they have given so freely over the last twelve months. The Vice Presidents, Mr. Ron Traill and Mr. Rob Fox are tireless workers, and deserve special thanks.

The Associations greatest asset remains its people, at all levels within our organization. From the club member who mows the grass before the shoot to the Club President who spends his Sunday fixing the broken water pipe, and all between, we have really great people at all levels, and a little appreciation of their voluntary effort does not go astray. My thanks to you all.

This year the Association should be able to look forward to a prosperous year ahead knowing we are in a strong and safe financial position, with a growing asset base. We have a reasonably stable membership and are fully insured to protect our members and our assets. A comprehensive budget was completed and it is expected to closely reflect our next annual result.

Executive Officer's Report

The dates for this year's Junior Development Camps are now on the web site as well as

the application forms. The dates coincide with school holidays in some states to allow shooters to attend without impacting on school time. The ACTA provides accommodation as well as meals and coaching. This is an opportunity for young shooters to develop their shooting and also to get an understanding of good training routines. The first course will be located in Wagga Wagga at the National Grounds and will concentrate on DTL, although techniques will be appropriate to other disciplines. Later Camps may use other disciplines, including ISSF to develop skills. The camps will be restricted in the number of people able to attend and attendee's will be selected on current grades and previous experience.

At this year's Trap Nationals Winchester is providing shooters, nominated in the Champion of Champions event, the opportunity to shoot Winchester ammunition. All shooters nominated for the event will receive a coupon from the events office which will entitle them to collect a box of AA shells from the Winchester display. GOULBURN CLAY TARGET CLUB SUNDAY NOVEMBER 13 2011 Alan Cramp & Clem Rowe Memorial Shoot LOCAL SHOOTER SHINES

n Sunday 13th November 2011 the cream of NSW and Australia's Down The Line Trap Shooters descended on Goulburn to pit themselves against the best of the best. Goulburn Clay Target Club's annual Alan Cramp & Clem Rowe memorial shoot has grown in popularity over the last few years and with almost 100 shooters in attendance it appears this event is firmly planted on the calendar of the who's who of Australia's clay target shooters. Shooters traveled from near and far with some coming from as far afield as West Wyalong, Bega and the North Coast.

Sunday's preparation had started months before, and the finishing touches were finalised in the late hours on Saturday night. shots fired. that's a lot of lead!

Local Shooter Fraser Roberts again showed why he is a past national champion taking out the overall High Gun honors by just 1 point, shooting every target presented to him with the need to use his second barrel just once in the points score event. This outcome reflects Fraser's natural ability. when he revealed that there was no practice or preparation for the event and in fact has not fired a shot in almost 2 years. This forced retirement is due to shoulder damage caused from the years of recoil and punishment from the heavy double barrel shot guns used. This constant barrage to the shoulder has resulted in a calcified shoulder joint which causes severe pain for days after shooting. "My shoulder swells up and glows bright red after a day of shooting, I'll be in pain for a week", Fraser said of his shoulder injury.

Also in the spot light was a trio that travelled long hours through the night from Boorowa. Father, son and daughter team Steve, Matt & Katie Schiller are no strangers to the winner's podium and all three featured heavily in the shoot offs at the end of the day.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 2. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 9. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 10. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 11. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 14. Pre-Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 20th April 2012.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one visit to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.

LEIGH WILLIAM KNIGHT 6.11.1957 - 3.12.2011

Clay target shooters throughout Australia were shocked and saddened to learn of the tragic death of Leigh "Wally Gator" Knight on the 3rd December 2011. Leigh was travelling home after an evening shooting ducks on the rice when he was involved in a motor vehicle accident, less than 2 kilometres from his home. Leigh was 53 years old.

It is fair to say Leigh was one of the most credentialed shooters not to have won a National title, this possibly due to the fact he was in a duck swamp during the time the Nationals were being shot. He was known throughout Australia, particularly in western New South Wales, southern Queensland, inland South Australia and the Northern Territory. He was most at home camped on a river bank, fishing or hunting and often with his father, Bert, and mother, Barb.

Leigh began trap shooting at the age of 12 when he was attending the White Hills Technical School in Bendigo. The very first year he attended the North East Zone School shoot at Shepparton he won the Overall. The 2nd year he had to settle for 2nd, but back again the following year he again won. This encouraged him to join the Bendigo Clay Target Club and take up competitive trap shooting. Over the years he competed, the number wins he would achieve would virtually be too numerous to count. At any shoot he attended, his very easy going nature and his readiness to help, would win him many friends and admirers. Testimony to this was the fact in excess of 300 shooters and friends from all over Australia attended his funeral.

PARADIGM SHIFT

Paradigm is an interesting word. It is pronounced "para-dime" and is defined a "the set of assumptions, concepts, values and practices that constitute a way of viewing reality." Interesting word, an even more interesting definition, given that no two people are able

to view the world in the same way. Marriages, friendships, relationships, etc appear to breakdown all the time: what is happening is that we are unable to recognize the other person's point of view or their perception of the issue, problem or solution. Relationships breakdown when paradigms clash. Michael McQueen in his book "*The New Rules* of Engagement" demonstrates this by citing an email, which contained a radio communication transcript between a US Naval ship and Canadian authorities off the coast of Newfoundland in October, 1995.

US Ship: Please divert your course 0.5 degree to the south to avoid collision.

Coastguard: We recommend you divert your course 15 degrees south to avoid a collision.

US Ship: This is the Captain of a US Navy Ship. I say again, divert YOUR course.

Coastguard: No. I say again. You divert YOUR course.

US Ship: THIS IS THE AIRCRAFT CARRIER USS CORAL SEA. WE ARE A LARGE WARSHIP OF THE US NAVY. DIVERT YOUR COURSE NOW!

Coastguard: This is a lighthouse. It's your call.

And with one sentence everything changes: this is a paradigm shift.

However, in relationships or in society in general, it is difficult to get the other person or side to see the other side of the story or other points of view. As shooters we are up against this all the time. Elements of the coalition for gun control are hardly likely to see the other side of the story. The spate of drive by shootings in Sydney, most likely organized crime related, lumps licensed and law abiding gun owners in the same bucket as those committing the crimes. The anti-gun lobby does understand the difference between sporting shooters, target shooters and criminals. They probably even take pride in our shooting athletes that win medals in the Olympics. But like the Captain of the ship, they cannot see the lighthouse, which is in this case, is that most people can behave responsibly with firearms and that problems with firearms are to do criminal behaviour or mental health problems.

For shooters and the anti-gun lobby, Is a paradigm shift possible? I'm not sure I actually know the answer to that question. I do know that it won't come as a "light-bulb" type revelation that occurred for the captain of the ship, but with a carefully thought out plan of what type of change is needed, I'm sure it is possible.

Firstly, we need to understand what happens when we try to change someone's opinion. We all have set ideas, but these can fit into three boxes: area of acceptance, the zone of uncertainty and the area of rejection.

If we understand what the person we are trying to persuade, will freely accept, is uncertain about, and clearly rejects, then we can look at trying to change their mind by starting off by acknowledging what they will

This is exactly what Hitler did before the WWII to get the people off Germany to support him. He did not come straight out and tell his followers about the "Final Solution". This would have been too much for any society to accept and would have been rejected and he would most likely have been overthrown. Instead he adopted a propaganda campaign starting with what people accepted and then moving them from acceptance into the zone uncertainty, step by step until the there was little they would reject.

He did this by asking: Should all Germans have jobs? They answered yes. So the people were not surprised or concerned when he made policies that would exclude immigrants from getting jobs. By asking other questions, for example: Should German banks be run by Jewish businesses? He then made policies to shut down the Jewish banking system. An so on he continued making policies excluding Jews, gypsies, disabled, homosexuals, etc, so that Germans could be better off.

This is a very simplistic account of what happened, but over time he was able to change the way of thinking for most of the society to accept his the policies he shared with the people. Each move was small and calculated to be close to what was already accepted.

Secondly, we need to reframe the negative connotations used by the anti-gun lobby into things that are at least neutral or best positive. When we talk with the media we should refer to guns as firearms not weapons. We need to make listeners or readers realize that for our sport our firearms are necessary: just as you can't play golf without a set of golf clubs, you cannot shoot without a firearm.

Thirdly, we should be willing to acknowledge that society believes we, as shooters, can be trusted: we have a license and we can carry and use a firearm. It is not possible for the members of the anti-gun lobby to so easily prove that they are trusted by society.

I cringe when I hear or read there has been another incident involving firearms. Recently, the Sydney tabloid press, during the debate over criminal gangs and drive-by shootings, made a big story about the fact that Bathurst had the highest proportion of registered guns per head of population in NSW. Why were they doing this? They wanted to highlight the danger of the guns in the community. The story was picked up by the radio networks, but became obvious that they the people of rural NSW understood the story was a beat up because:

- a. the drive by shooting were occurring in western Sydney,
- b. those doing the shooting were criminals and not likely licensed or using registered firearms,
- c. firearm crime statistics for Bathurst did not exist.

We need to be mindful that not everyone believes what we believe, however to protect our sport and our right to participate we need to see a paradigm shift in the non-believers.

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."
