National President's Notes



Most members would be aware of the flooding leading up to our National Titles. Most of the city of Wagga Wagga was lucky to escape with minimal damage, however it was a catastrophe for those outside the levies. Our thoughts are with those who have lost so much. The National Ground was inundated but damage was minimal with no flooding affecting any buildings. Traphouses were flooded at one end of the grounds but all were operational again in less than a week.

The Association naturally considers itself a part of the Wagga Wagga community, being based there, having staff reside there, and

conducting most National titles there. Suggestions on how the Association might be able to show some support to those affected would be welcomed.

These types of occurrences bring out both the best and the worst in people. Due to closing dates I am writing this on the 15th of March, 9 days from the Pre Nationals start date. As late as vesterday I had a telephone call from a member who had been told by at least two people that the nationals were off. No statement was ever made by the ACTA that the Nationals were off. Rumors and gossip abound despite photos showing the grounds ready to operate as normal being displayed on our website since the 8th of March. This is also despite the ACTA advising every state that it is business as usual, and requesting they put the information on their website. Sadly, some people do not know the damage they can do by repeating unconfirmed gossip, or distributing sensationalist emails and photographs without first confirming the facts.

Flood donations received for the appeal conducted for the 2011 floods were recognised in the previous CTSN. Requests have been received from a number of clubs for assistance and we have asked ACTA Patron Mrs. Kay Hull and a member of our Legal and Governance committee Mr. Kelvyn Prescott to consider the requests and allocate the funds. Recipients and amounts will be publicised in the CTSN.

The Board of the ACTA will meet on the 24th of this month to address current issues. We are still keen to have a person with a financial background become a board member. To date, surprisingly no-one has expressed an interest in this position, which runs from appointment until June 2013. Please contact us if you are interested.

I was considering last year's AGM today and the criticisms raised at that time, and questions regarding sundries and Executive expenses. I then looked at the financials for the year, shown besides last year and thought - why is the Executive being criticised? You would think from a financial viewpoint members would be happy with a committee that has delivered over \$570,000 of surpluses in two years. Executive members work hard on your behalf and along with the staff strive to bring in a good financial result. They also make the hard and necessary but sometimes very unpopular decisions to achieve this.

As an example, from time to time the Executive makes changes and adjustments to payouts for events. In 2010 I was told by a shooter in the trade area, that "yous" are thieves considering what we paid out on a particular event. I informed him that the big picture was that at the previous Nationals at Wagga in 2008 we had only just broken even. He agreed we would be stupid if we made a loss. So, if we make a profit we are thieves, if we make a loss we are idiots. I told him that in the interest of all members I would prefer to remain a thief in his eyes, as opposed to an idiot in everybody's. The association has a lot of money invested in the National Ground so that those that wish to compete for the National Titles can do so at a reasonably central, properly equipped and serviced ground. We believe it is only proper that the whole membership gets a return on this investment and thus we budget for a reasonable surplus from the Nationals.

The Trap Nationals will have been conducted by the time this goes to print and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those that helped during the event. The flooding throughout NSW and Vic. has placed an extra strain on our volunteers and their support is appreciated. Hopefully by the time you read this we will have had a great Nationals, a Mackintosh reunion to remember and a Hall of Fame dinner enjoyed by all.

Executive Officer's Report



As the President has indicated, the National Grounds recently experienced an indication of what some clubs went through with the floods last year. Fortunately, things are now back to normal and we were only affected for two days, thanks to the work of Dave Jocelyn and Fred Rapley. We quickly placed information on the website to assist members who had planned to attend the

Nationals and to give them an indication that the grounds are in excellent condition.

Some members have questioned the process used to select the new target contract for the next year. The companies who tendered to supply targets were advised of the process before testing and informed of the result. After submission of tenders the ACTA received samples of 5 different targets at Wagga Wagga. I organised six experienced shooters to test the targets and then prepared a questionnaire based on flight, visibility and breakability of the targets.

The squad was asked to score each batch of targets out of 10 with

only myself being aware of the sequence of batches. After testing I collated the results and placed the test results in order. A recommendation was given to the Board based on the order of the test. This was accepted although one Board member who had been present of the test abstained from voting to avoid any suggestion that he was aware of the order.

Some members have asked why change if the current supplier is satisfactory. In any business you regularly test all options? When buying a car you do not automatically buy the same model and brand as before. You test drive and look at others to see what improvements or changes have been made. If the ACTA was not doing this on a regular basis for all our activities, we would not be doing our job properly. We try to obtain consistency by having arrangements for a fixed period of time and then testing options in a fair and impartial manner. At no stage does this mean other products are not good or satisfactory but, like in shooting, they were beaten on the day.

We look forward to working with all suppliers and sponsors on an ongoing basis and providing them with an opportunity to work with the Association to benefit the shooting sport.

The CTSN will increasingly have reviews of products, not only for the benefit of members, but to provide the sponsors with a chance to make members aware of their products.

Any suggestions for type of products to be reviewed would be welcomed.

As this is the time of the year for membership renewals the office receives a lot of phone calls from members advising that they have not received their handicap cards and wish to shoot. In the initial phase of renewal processing may take a couple of days due to the number of renewals. At the moment memberships are currently being updated on the day of arrival from clubs, however members should be aware that, if they have not received their card, they can prove they are a financial member and able to shoot by showing their receipt from their club.



Australia traps the Glenn Shield Trophy

he Glenn Shield event, for the Jack Sutherland (Calrossie)-Jim McKenzie Trophy held in Waikato, New Zealand this February, was the first ever event of its discipline. created by ACTA and sponsored by Casella Wines. The cup is an original trophy won by Calrossie and was donated by the Sutherland family.

The Australian delegation was a three man team (Frank Minici, Brett Dunstan, Danny Di Pietro) picked from last year's Nationals and the Australia Cup Final held late last

NZ used the North Island Championships as part of their selection criteria to select their top 3 representatives (Gavin Paton, Allan Sinclair, Myles Browne-Cole) to compete against the Australian Team in this historic debut.


Overall results for the North Island Championships by the Australian Team saw Frank miss his last target to finish on 115 missing out on the final by one target. Danny shot 116 and Brett came out all guns blazing posting a world class score of 121/125. Jeff Tonna, not

offici-ally on the team, also posted a great score of 116, christening his new gun.(In practice he shot a score of 99/100).

A special acknowledgement must go to the women's events, held in conjunction as part of the North Island Championships, where the girls were entitled to shoot against the boys in the open event. Upcoming talent, Laetisha Scanlan, in the open, shot a brilliant score finishing on 120. In the finals she equalled with Brett Dunstan requiring a shoot off finally determined by Brett winning all spectators and competitors would not have wanted to be in Brett's shoes considering the bar that Laetisha was setting.

Lucky for the boys that Laetisha had family commitments taking her away from the NZ Nationals which drew a collective sigh the team as Frank was over-heard to have commented that he didn't think he "could handle being beaten by a girl again!"

Day 1 of the National title in conjunction with the Glenn Shield Trophy, had Frank posting a score of 65/75, shooting 23, 19, 23. Second round where the weather became cloudy

and glary with visibility almost impossible as targets could not be seen in the first 3 metres of flight (though professional shooters might have commented that Frank choked), it was lucky for the team, Danny posted the highest score on the day with 71/75. Brett shot 69/75, seeing the boys only 3 behind on their first

While daytime saw hot competition and fierce rivalry between all the boys (Aussie and NZ). night time saw them arm in arm socialising as comrades under the warm and friendly NZ hospitality.

Day 2 atmosphere was next to none, with the New Zealand team giving it all they had against their Australian brothers. Frank posted 23, 24 (47/50), Danny 22, 22 (46/50), Brett 24, 24 (48/50). Such a great group performance positioned the Australian team to win the trophy by 1 target. The shooting highlight was Brett shooting a world class score, winning all events and taking out the New Zealand High Gun and shooting a possible 25/25 in a single barrel final.

Stay tuned for next year's Glenn Shield which

will be held on home ground here in Australia in conjunction with the Australian National Titles in Brisbane, January 2013.

A heartfelt, and special thanks goes to Brant Woodward, Chris Robinson and Ian Hovenden for their exceptional hospitality with the highlight being a visit to the highest point in NZ (Mount Egmont aka Mount Taranaki, 3000 meters above sea level).

A big thank you to ACTA and Casella Wines for covering costs and accessories for the team's wardrobe. Without them, this trip would not have been possible.

On a final note, Frank, Brett and Daniel are privileged to be the first representatives of this inaugural occasion and they would like to express their gratitude to the ACTA for creating this event and for Casella Wines' sponsorship. This initiative of introducing and supporting a new Olympic Trap event demonstrates a deep respect and appreciation for the sport and it's evolution in Australia. It is a legacy which will enrich gun sport in this country for spectators and competitors alike.

Beretta Australian Launch of the Beretta DT TT



In February Australia saw the launch of Beretta's new DT11, which replaces the DT10. Australia was chosen for the first market launch after the gun was launched internationally in December. Australia was chosen by Beretta International because the growth of Beretta sales in Australasia was the largest in any of their markets in 2010-2011.

What is so different about the DT11 to justify this effort. Beretta has spent over \$30 million Euros on new equipment for the manufacture of shotgun barrels using new cold hammer forging and vacuum distension techniques which are designed to enhance the ballistics of the barrel. Whilst this system has been previously used for rifle barrels, this is the first time it has been used, on a commercial scale, in producing the new Steelium pro shotgun barrels. The new design also includes a longer cone in the barrel to improve the shot pattern and a 3mm wider receiver to improve

balance of the gun. All versions of the DT11 will be available with the B-FAST stock adjustment system to assist in customising the gun to suit individual shooters and all include a new adjustable trigger designed for both right and left handed shooters. All barrel design features, gun balance and the Micro-core recoil pad work to reduce recoil, limit rise of the barrel and improve acquisition for the second shot.

Beretta sees this model as a major improvement over previous models however the proof of the pudding is in the eating. Results so far appear to back up the hype with Laetisha Scanlon producing excellent results in the New Zealand ISSF Championships and the DT11 recording its first Australian record with Russell Mark shooting a new record in

the Double Trap, at the Olympic Trials in Melbourne, two weeks after taking delivery of his DT11.

ACTA member, Matt Dwyer, who was present at the launch, was asked to provide some comments from a shooter's perspective of the DT11. His comments are as follows:

"It was a great privilege to be a guest at Beretta's "Discovery Tour 2012" to be a part of the Australian launch of Beretta's new DT11 shotgun. The entire show in itself was magnificent, with the Beretta people putting on a first class event. The formalities aside I was keen to put the new

The variety of shooting conducted at the launch included Trench, Trap and also Sporting Clays and with a seemingly endless supply of RC cartridges on hand the guns got no rest whatsoever. I am pleased to report that the DT11 proved reliable from the perspective the guns were literally "running hot", to the point where they were consuming cartridges at such a rate accidentally touching the barrels rewarded one's fingers with a painful experience. This is a good test of reliability as I have seen guns falter once they became that hot.

I shot the Trap gun first, and knocked out 100 targets in pretty quick time in the drizzling rain. For a gun I was using for the first time the DT11 was very easy to just pick up and get shooting with. I certainly noted the reduced perceived recoil and associated muzzle flip, and the patterns seemed to be sufficient to really break up targets convincingly. I was extremely impressed with the trap gun, not only because it made an average trap shot look more credible, but the ability to keep the gun on target after the first shot was amazing. Shooting chips was as tempting as ever, especially with free cartridges, and anything remotely like a chip was soon engaged with the second barrel for good measure. This bodes well for DTL shooters who might require the second barrel for either a wayward first pattern or during double

DT11 through its paces, and I was asked by the ACTA to provide a brief summary of my initial shooting impressions for inclusion in CTSN. Here's what I thought.

rise events. I found the DT11 trap gun was very controllable and shooter comfort was without question.

I headed straight from the DTL layout and lined up to get a crack at the sporting targets. Again the DT11, this time in sporting guise, was a very easy gun to get used to and it balanced nicely. I felt the gun was very "shootable" gun down straight out of the box, and there was a very slight increase in perceived recoil compared to the trap gun. There was no set order of targets and it eventually ended up being pot luck which targets were thrown and more often than not there were more targets in the air than the gun held cartridges. I can't even recall which chokes were in the gun, but it was testament to the DT11's ease of shooting that most shooters managed respectable scores with the test guns.

I followed up the launch by using a

DT11 sporter at the Victorian State Skeet carnival a few days later. Assisted by some chamber inserts I came away with a grade win in the first event, the state 20ga, with a 48/50 after dropping "Low 2" in the first round, then immediately dropping the repeat! I was not unhappy with my scores over the weekend, in fact I probably shot some of my best skeet along the way, and the DT11 certainly held up its end of the bargain even if I didn't at times. There was significant interest shown in the DT11 by shooters at the carnival. The enthusiasm of some towards the gun leads me to believe the hype is already building, and if the groundswell is anything to go by I believe the sales of the new gun will keep Beretta very busy.

I will cover the Beretta DT11 in a full review in the near future, however to sum up my initial shooting impressions of the new gun, I would rely on just a few words. Comfortable. Shootable. Ouality. An added bonus is the guns are available with a "headed stock" enabling the buyer to be precisely fitted for best results. Even though there are relatively few examples out in the marketplace at this point in time people are already on podiums and setting new records with this gun, so a word of advice here to finish off. If you are thinking about a DT11 then I would strongly suggest you get your order in sooner rather than later. Given the current factory production rate and the frenzy of interest surrounding the gun it will pay to be closer to the top of any potential waiting list as opposed to the bottom."

New development in guns is always of interest to shooters and we look forward to the response from competitors, as the shooter is always the beneficiary.



Finally, event three, a 50 tgt Tony Calandro Double Barrel Championship, and although there were at least three squads of shooters with a clean score it was not long before it was a battle between five, then quite suddenly down to two, Tom Allen a Mansfield member, and Terry Walls a shooter from Yarrawonga, then Terry dropped his 269th target and when Tom shot his it was all over, with Tom Allen putting his hand up for the Overall Winners Sash and the 1st place in AA grade trophy with a magnificent score of 269/269.

Stephen Atkins and Casey Fletcher both with a High Gun score of 247/250 having lost just three points for the day, decided because it was a memorial shoot for Tony Calandro, to not shoot off, but to share the Overall High Gun Sash in honour of Tony.



CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2012 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2012 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2012 registered shooter record book prior to competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will compete. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition.

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20gauge Championship, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20gauge Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

OUESTIONS?

Last month's article called paradigm shift was by way of a foundation for what was to come this month. This month was going to look at the different thinking and responding styles of baby boombers,

Gen X, Y and Z's. There has been a great deal written over the recent years on this subject and sociologists and organisational psychologists see the rules of engagement between the generations as important within the workplace, family and sporting bodies.

Unfortunately, I am unable to go any further with this topic this month as the research documents are still on my desk at home and I am currently unable to get back to my house due to floodwaters. I have been stranded off the farm now for 8 days and it will be at least another week or so before I will be able to return.

Regular readers will be well aware that a chief component of psychological skills for sport is how we view ourselves. Our opinions, beliefs, attitudes and judgements get in the way of keeping us from the task at hand. Our thinking lets our minds wander from the present (where it essentially has to be) to either the past (where we form judgements about ourselves, our performances or our abilities) or to the future (where we can develop fears and worries about things that might never happen).

So, what are the questions we need to ask ourselves to stay on track?

Watch your thinking. What sort of unhelpful thinking is keeping you stuck?

The answer is usually: rigid rules about your life, self-limiting beliefs,

unrealistic expectations, harsh judgements, reason-giving, being right, etc.

Be aware and flexible. How do you see yourself?

Answer: do you see yourself as just your current struggle or is there more to you. Do you see yourself as a score, eg 100/100 and anything less is therefore no good. Do you see your self-worth tied up in your performance at the gun club from week to week or is there more to you? What do other people see when they see you?

What matters to me? How disconnected are you from your true values-what really matters to you and not others.

Answer: Are you driven by rules, Do your internal rules contain words such as 'should', 'must', 'have to', 'good', 'bad', etc. Are you focused on a worthwhile goal or is your motive driven by anger, revenge, hurt, greed, etc.

Be present. How much time do you spend dwelling on /reliving the past/worrying about the future/getting lost in your thoughts?

Answer: To be able to shoot well or to be able to function properly at most things you need to be able to stay focused in the present. Too many of us, let ourselves get distracted by the things around us or worse, by our own thoughts .Sometimes, it is necessary to let things go so that you can complete the job at hand. This was Tim Gallwey's mantra from the Inner Game of Golf: Trust and let go.

Open up. What things (feelings, sensations, etc) are you avoiding, and how?

Answer: What are the costs of avoidance. How much time or energy does this take up in your life?

Avoidance has an opportunity cost. It is costing you hwta you could achieve if you changed your behaviour and thinking. It is about taking a risk. Having a go and not being tied up in self-doubt: You cannot win – if you are not prepared to lose.

Do what it takes. Are your current actions helping you get where you want to be, or be the sort of person you want to be?

Answer: Do you need to learn some skills for change? Do you give up too quickly, when sticking with something might have worked OR persist when such action isn't working. As human beings we are always growing and changing: we are dynamic, never static, and yet when I talk to some shooters the thing that I notice the most is the need to stay with what they know or think feels right even if it is of no use at all. Avoiding change, avoiding the discomfort of having to do something differently, often gets in our way of learning and or improving. In this case, we are our own worst enemy.

Think about the questions raised and how you can answer them.

Hopefully, before next month I will be able to get home and after a long clean-up put together the article on engaging with the different generational sets that I was hoping to look at writing for this month.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - National Skeet Championships

GENERAL

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 9. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 10. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 11. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 14. Pre-Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 20th April 2012.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one visit to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.

Strong performances by Australian shotgun shooters

Australia's shotgun stars have shown preparations are in good stead ahead of the 2012 international season with more strong performances across the weekend at Australia Cup 2 in Lilydale, Victoria.

Following Russell Mark's (VIC) new Australian record in the men's double trap on Friday, fellow Olympians Adam Vella (VIC) and Suzy Balogh (NSW), along with Keith Ferguson (VIC) all shot world-class scores over the weekend.

2004 Athens Olympic Games bronze medalist Adam Vella (VIC) won the final of the men's trap after shooting an imposing 121 in the qualifying rounds.

Vella held a three target lead heading into the 25-target final and closed out the event emphatically with a 23 to win by seven targets.

The result all but ensures Vella will be nominated to the Australian Olympic Committee and have the opportunity to compete at his second Games in London later this year.

Catherine Skinner (VIC) produced a come from behind victory in the women's trap after Balogh fell one target short of equaling the Australian record in the qualifying rounds.

The 2004 Athens Olympic Games gold medalist, who now seems destined to compete at her second Olympics, shot 72 in the three rounds of qualifying but was not able to hold off Skinner in the final

Skinner, who had qualified with a score of 66, was peerless in the final as she shot 24 targets from 25 to finish with an overall score of 90, three clear of Balogh.

In the men's skeet Keith Ferguson (VIC) equaled the Australian record with an outstanding 124 targets.

Ferguson, who dropped one target in his first of five qualifying rounds, then shot four perfect rounds to lead by four moving into the final

A score of 23 for Ferguson in the final was enough to win the event by five targets from Clive Barton (NSW) and Paul Adams (QLD), with Barton winning the shoot-off for second place.

Australian International Shooting Limited CEO Nick Sullivan said the performance of several key members of the Australian shadow squad was welcomed ahead of the first World Cup later this month.

"These scores across the weekend are an important stepping stone ahead of the international events just around the corner," Sullivan said.

"The first World Cup is less than two weeks away in Tuscon and these scores will give our team confidence heading into this event.

"All our athletes are capable of repeating these scores overseas and it would be good to hit the ground running in the first international event of 2012."

The first World Cup is being held in Tuscon, USA from March 23-April 1 with Australia sending a team of 16.

The Australian shotgun team will be nominated to the Australian Olympic Committee following the London World Cup, which also serves as the official 2012 London Olympics test event (April 18-29).

Alcohol & the use of a Firearm

Recently we have had a few enquiries regarding the use of & handling a firearm whilst under the influence of alcohol.

Please see the below section, taken from the Firearms Act 1996 to clarify this question;

64 Restrictions where alcohol or other drugs concerned

(cf 1989 Act s 16)

(1) A person must not handle or use a firearm while the person is under the influence of alcohol or any other drug.

Maximum penalty: imprisonment for 5 years.

- (2) A person must not sell or give possession of a firearm to another person:
 - (a) if the person knows or has reasonable cause to believe that the other person is under the influence of alcohol or any other drug, or
 - (b) if the other person's appearance or behaviour is such that the person intending to sell or give possession of the firearm believes or has reasonable cause to believe that the other person is incapable of exercising responsible control over the firearm.

Maximum penalty: imprisonment for 5 years.


first event. John collected the prize with a score of 13/20 to Dick's 11/20. Yes, it was definitely the same two shooting! Ray Kearns took out







NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the

following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
