National President's Notes

I would like to begin this column by thanking your two Vice Presidents, Rob Fox and Ron Traill for preparing the Presidents Notes whilst I was off motorcycling for a couple of months. Our travels took us to a few gun clubs and one in particular deserves mention. The Geraldton club is certainly something special. They don't have the fanciest layouts, the biggest clubhouse or the greatest car park but they do have the people, and in abundance, which I suppose is what clubs are all about. The toilets always have paper the bins are always empty, the shells always raked up and the hospitality extended by members both at the shoot and before and after is exceptional. Don't think this hospitality is only extended to Donna and I because of my position, it extends to everyone. The Geraldton club certainly sets a standard that many others could try to emulate, and you can see the pride in their faces. Congratulations Geraldton.

The Board met in late November with some difficult issues to address. The timing for the release of the new rules for Olympic Discipline competitions has not been easy for us to deal with. Knowing changes were coming but not knowing what they would be, or when they would be released, resulted in the Association deciding some time ago to shoot our Olympic Discipline Nationals in January 2013 under existing rules. This decision was accepted by the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) and we have been assured that any PQS shot will be recognised. As of the date of the Board meeting the new Rules were not on the website, and the switches and chips required to upgrade equipment for the new rules were not available. The Board reviewed its previous decision but has decided at this stage to shoot the event under the old rules. However things can change quickly and the Board will be monitoring the situation right up to the event.

The Board reviews Association finances at every meeting and it appears that the Association has performed well this year and will again achieve a substantial profit. Improved in-house management of cash surpluses has resulted in more than doubling the interest revenue received this year to date.

The Legal and Governance Committee is currently preparing a submission to the Attorney Generals Department in relation to the proposed changes to import regulations. The proposed changes included limitation on adjustable stocks (with the emphasis on easier concealment) which unintentionally impacts on many of the type of adjustable stocks used in Target Rifle Australia (TRA) events and by members of the ACTA. TRA are also making a submission which we hope, along with ours, will be treated favourably.

The Board is recommending to the Executive that from the next Executive meeting forward, minutes are published on the website. The suggestion to allow more open governance should be welcomed by members if it gets Executive approval.

The Executive officer and Mr Peter Haley have had a fruitful meeting with both the NSW Minister for Sport Mr Graeme Annesley, and a Representative of the NSW Minister for Tourism with a view to securing funding to develop the National Grounds further with the introduction of Olympic Discipline facilities. Local member Daryl Maguire organised and attended the meeting and the Wagga Wagga City council provided assistance with the preparation of the proposal. The meeting resulted in a request for further information, some of which is being correlated by Wagga Wagga City council after which the proposal will be supported by the Ministers to the Treasury Department, for consideration. The construction of these facilities would open up endless possibilities for the ACTA, and provide a venue off the coast for competitors to be more likely to have good conditions for shooting qualifying scores at home in Australia.

The Association has now had a member come forward with experience in Promotion and Marketing, prepared to donate his time to the ACTA. Mr Alex Smith has a lifetime background in mainstream media and is currently the Public Relations manager for a large Multi-National. We welcome Alex to the Board and hope that his input steers us in a better direction. Many will know Alex, so take the time and give him a pat on the back.

The Board has met again with some industry representatives. One important message we gleaned from this meeting is the value of electronic marketing. If we are to grow and retain membership we need to use the best and most efficient tools to deliver our messages. As an example of a changing marketing environment, some multi-national companies have cut their advertising spending in

the print area by 50% last year, with the funds being moved to other electronic marketing initiatives. The electronic marketing area has for the first time, exceeded the print media in promotional dollars spent worldwide. I know that Alex Smith has some great ideas in this area so as much as you all hate change; it is inevitable and hopefully will be coming soon.

The website already has the archived copies of all CTSN and a results area with the club results uploaded as received. Club results show on the website up to two months before you receive the CTSN with them in. In other words, the results section in the CTSN is an expensive duplication showing out of date content due to deadlines for printing and taking up space that could be used for more general interest content and income producing advertising.

The matter of insurance is always a confusing area for members. In a perfect world if all clubs abided by the ACTA constitution and rules all members could rest assured that they have the best and most comprehensive cover available, when shooting at any ACTA affiliated clubs, or acting as a member of a club committee. However it is quite likely that some clubs are jeopardising the cover provided by your Association to all its members by continuing to allow non ACTA members to shoot on a regular basis. A visitor is a visitor not someone who comes numerous times a year. Some clubs feel they have covered this problem by providing their own insurance cover. Some relevant questions that come to mind are is it kept current, is it adequate, as a shooter are you sure it exists, as a committee member of one of these clubs does it extend its cover to your possible legal liabilities? With two companies involved this could be a minefield.

The matter is that serious that your Association is carrying out a full investigation into the implications for you, our member, to ensure you are properly protected. There is one thing that seems certain and that is if a person causing an accident, injuring an ACTA member, is not an ACTA member himself or a Bona Fide visitor, the ACTA insurance will not provide the liability cover to the non-member allowing the ACTA member to be recompensed properly.

As a warning - many people have referred to insurance as "that old furphy" and "that red herring" but these people are not aware of the number of accident and death covers our insurers have paid out or the extent of some payouts made under the liability cover section of our policies. There have been numerous payouts and some well into the six figures so don't fool yourself that this is just being used to boost membership, it is a matter of serious concern, and something your Association needs to address urgently to protect its members, both as shooters and when acting as club officials.

Executive Officer's Report



It has reached the time of the year for membership renewal. The ACTA uses annual renewal based on the calendar year not anniversary dates of joining. This is done for a variety of reasons including simplifying membership for families with only one time to join, ease of dates for financial membership for club shoots, clear dates for insurance coverage of members. Unfortunately the ACTA still receives some renewals in the October/November period. Members should be aware that insurance coverage relates to financial

members of the Association and members are financial once payment is made to your club and a grace period is also allowed for payment until the end of March. Similarly members cannot shoot unless they are financial members. At this time of year renewals are processed in the office within the week of receipt of the renewal information from your club. Labels are sent to the member direct from the ACTA at the time of processing. If you have not received your label after a reasonable time, 3-4 weeks, you should check with your club.

In this magazine we have also advertised for shooters to advise us of information relating to long breaks, Grand Slam and masters award accomplishments. This will allow the ACTA to have the information on the website for members to check the latest information. Similar to the Club results information, the archived CTSN, and Hall of Fame information this will provide members with more information of what is happening in their sport. Clubs and members are also advised that the Club Coach package is available on the web site. If you are a Club Coach or interested in coaching you can access the package to find out what is involved or to update your knowledge.

The ACTA will be advising shooters going to the 2013 DTL Nationals of their squadding by email and will place all squad details on the website. This will be done 10 days before the commencement of the Nationals and will also allow members to check online at any time.

If members have any suggestions as to other information they would like to see on the web site please contact me and I will investigate the feasibility.

The Australian Government is conducting a review of the importation laws relating to firearms, specifically approval for semi-automatic shotguns and adjustable stock length for firearms. The ACTA is providing a submission to this review.

Dear Members,

The proposal to establish a State Clay Target Ground at Echuca incorporating the Echuca Clay Target Club and surrounding land has finally been agreed upon.

The land owner has agreed to sell 60 acres of his land. The land purchased will cover the fall-out area for 12 trap layouts and incorporate a car park of approximately 5 acres. This acquisition will totally secure the future of the site as our State Ground.

The \$10.00 VCTA affiliation fee, paid by all adult members over the past few years has placed our State in a sound position to finance this project, however with surveying of land, transfer fees, land tax, legal costs etc., plus the purchase of the land, we are looking at an approximate shortfall of some \$100,000.

With contracts close to completion, we now need to find this finance. I am personally asking all Zones, Clubs and Members if they can assist with monetary donations toward this exciting project.

With well over 2,000 full members in Victoria, if only 200 members donated \$500 or 500 members donated \$200, or even if 2000 members donated \$50 we would have the amount required.

NSSA WORLD SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Report by Glenn Clarke

It was a true privilege to receive the Australian Shooting Team badge in the mail. I have no doubt that this badge and the opportunity to represent Australia at the world Championships is highly coveted by all skeet shooters who compete and love the sport of Skeet. To actually be selected in the team was a huge milestone for the author and I extend my gratitude to the ACTA for continuing to support Skeet in this country and send international teams to world championships like they do.

I remember back in the 80's watching the big names of our sport performing at such a high level at the nationals and the selection of the teams at the nationals gave most competitors the hunger for success and watching these people receive their team selection was a huge motivator to keep the hard work going into the sport. As this continues in 2012 and beyond and the new format for team selection will only foster more club and State Title attendance and ensure the most consistent people are sent away on these missions.

Thankfully our Skeet Nationals are in May and the world cham-

pionships are not until October which allows enough time for the Myriad of Paperwork to be done. There was much preparation to be done to obtain the necessary paper work from all of the authorities to be able to get the gun across to the USA and back such as Police, Customs and the American ATF, many hours were spent writing letters and following up to obtain the necessary permits.

Monday the 24th September began the journey at Customs in Melbourne and as I was getting my gun inspected I saw another Tuffpack already in the customs area, it turned out the owners were Linda Watson and Max Oakley also heading stateside on the same day, and I must say that on top of the 5 person Skeet team there were nearly 30 other Australians that travelled this year to the world shoot which is a fantastic effort and also demonstrates how strong the skeet fraternity is in Australia.

The long haul flight from Sydney direct to Dallas was a huge effort at 14 hours 30 minutes but the positive side was there were no connections to be made and anyone who has travelled via Los Angeles in the past few years know that this is a big airport to avoid as it is just so overcrowded and inefficient, particularly when travelling with a firearm!

Walking outside the airport doors at Dallas at around 4 pm in the afternoon and the huge whoosh of hot air that greeted me was nearly overwhelming. I waited for fellow team mate David O Sullivan to pick me up (on the wrong side of the road mind you) and we jumped into the car and headed for San Antonio approx. 4 hours drive away. Apart from a very bad hamburger experience in Belton Texas

we made it safely to the hotel and after getting our respective rooms crashed exhausted into bed at approx 11pm.

Tuesday 25th September saw a very late start and IHOP for breakfast with pancake crepes and endless coffee the day started well. Paul Johnston and Shane O'Brien fellow team mates made contact and suggested we have our first shot in America at the Bexar Community range which was approximately 40 minutes drive east of our hotel. Our Sat Nav looked after us well and we were there with no problems, Paul and Shane had already shot a few rounds and soon it was Dave's and my turn, despite these targets being superfast the opening rounds were ok (maybe it was the jetlag!). We just had to make sure we didn't stand on any fire ant mounds (and they were everywhere). A couple of rounds done and it was back for a swim at the hotel as it was scorching hot.

Wednesday 26th September. We started early as we all wanted to go to Cabelas at Buda Texas which was approx. 60 miles away, whilst at Cabelas we met other Aussies there Nick Aird, Wayne Petersen and Kel Madsen also enjoying the big superstore. We had all arranged to go to Bandera gun club that afternoon as they have their weekly competition there every Wednesday afternoon at 4pm. When we got to the grounds there must have been a 100 shooters there competing for the cash prize. The format was one round of singles and one round of doubles and then sudden death shoot off at stations 3, 4 and 5 and there were Kiwis, Americans and British and of course the Aussies. Our very own Mal Briggs was the victor of the day with excellent shooting followed by Billy Williams one of the All American team members and Glenn Clarke third overall so things were looking good for the Australians.

Thursday 27th September. Was the registration day at the National Ground with us all getting our final registration and squadding paperwork completed and the process was handled very well by the NSSA and we were done in 20 minutes. The biggest issue was that as the author was non classified with the NSSA, it took me a while to convince the NSSA that I was AA grade and I showed my ACTA scorebook to verify my grade and to please let me nominate that way but we got there in the end.

Our Team Manager Paul Johnston had arranged to hire a skeet field for the day and for the rest of the day the Aussies were found on field 17 practicing for the big event. That night you could also practice doubles under lights on the top fields and some of the contingent went back to the club to practice shooting under lights which was truly a unique experience as the sight pictures are completely different in the dark!

Friday 28th September, Mini World Doubles. The weather had been fantastic all week but it was getting worse and the day was very windy and the clouds were coming in pretty heavily a big storm front was moving into Texas expected in the afternoon. The wind was gusty and swirling but luckily the white flyer targets were still staying pretty true. The Mini is a great warm up event for the Main world shoot but the doubles are the first event in the USA where we shoot them last in Australia

Saturday 29th September. Today we shot 200 targets and the huge storm that passed the night before had dumped approx. 10 inches of rain overnight so lots of water lying around and the fields were very muddy, a small amount of showers were coming through sporadically but gradually as the day went on the weather was on the improve. In the morning it was the 12 gauge and in the afternoon it was the 28 gauge and two Aussie

team members performed incredibly well with both Paul Johnston and David O Sullivan shooting the 100 in the 12 gauge and then David backing it up in the afternoon with another 100 in the 28 gauge. At the end of day one of the Mini World David had won 14th overall in the 12 gauge and was AAA5 which is 8th overall in the 28 and was equal leading for the High Gun with approx 675 shooters which was a fantastic start for the weekend.

Sunday 30th September. Wind wind and wind, as the front had come through on the Friday the wind was coming through and it was strong making the targets move around unpredictably and most of us got caught at one stage or another. The 20 gauge was first up and Shane O'Brien came in with a 100 and Paul, Glenn Craig and David all had 97's. The wind was blowing even harder for the last event of the mini which was the pop-gun, the lowly 410 and what a battle, shooting in the gale with the little guns, so much so that I will keep the scores out of the article so not to stain the page with tears!

Shane ended up winning AA class after a shoot off in the 20 and

came 13th overall which kept the Aussies in the spotlight. Another big mention here to Matt Fallon, Matt who lives in NZ and travels to some of the Aussie shoots shot the 100 in the 20 gauge and went nearly 2 boxes under lights in the stadium shoot off field and came 3rd overall in the mini 20 gauge what a fantastic effort for Matt.

Monday 1st October, Main Event Doubles. The weather was starting to right itself and the morning was bright and sunny the wind was still there but it was fairly consistent so the targets were flying pretty well. The writer was scheduled to shoot at 11.30 am and in the distance you could see a storm front coming through. As we shot the clouds were getting darker and darker and the clouds were so dark it was like shooting under lights with the orange target against the black background, half the field was in dark cloud and half was in bright sunlight making the tough job of doubles even harder. The wind started to blow as the front got nearer and nearer and just as the last station was shot there were lightning strikes. As we all literally ran back to the

car the heavens opened up and the torrential rain came down. The NSSA had to stop the shoot for nearly 2 hours because of the lightning strikes. An hour or so later the storm front had passed through and the sunshine came out and the shoot was back on. The Aussies performed well with Craig O' Neill with a 97, Dave and Glenn with 96's, Paul with a 95 and Shane with a 90 which was not too bad considering the conditions.

Tuesday 2nd October, Main Event 12 Gauge World Championship. Today was the big one and the event which the team was entered so there was a lot of pressure on all of the Australian team members. Luckily the day was a beauty with beautiful bright sunshine and little or no wind, perfect for skeet and no excuses!!

Well that was until you stepped onto Station One on the 9 am rotation in the morning and looked up to see the target and you looked directly into the sun. My heart sank as I realised that it was just impossible to see anything in the air expect for the sun. After much faffing about with hold points and hat adjustments there was no other choice but to call pull and hope you hit it. Luck was on our sides as somehow (and I don't know how) we managed to get off station one still clean and lots more hard work to be done.

The 12 gauge is actually 3 separate events with 75 targets being shot in the morning called the East then 75 targets shot the afternoon called the West and then the aggregate 150 targets is the actual World Championship event. This format is new as the 12 gauge for many years had been a 250 target event

shot over 2 days of 125 targets a day and the NSSA changed it to a one day event several years ago to shorten the world shoot by a day amongst lots of controversy with the traditionalists.

After the 150 targets were shot our Australian Team had done their best with Dave 150/150, Glenn 147/150, Paul 145/150, Shane 145/150 and Craig 144/150. This aggregate score had been enough to secure World Runner Up (Zone 8) to Team USA (Zone 1) which is a fantastic achievement for the ACTA and Australian Skeet shooting.

Other notable achievements from other Australians at the event were Lorraine Hughes with a 149/150 Glenn Walker with a 150/150, Nigel Hughes, Harry Bader and Mal Briggs with 148/150, after the shoot offs Glenn Walker an amazing 11th overall and David O Sullivan 18th overall in the 12 gauge event. Commiseration to Lorraine who actually did miss her first High One in the sun and ran the next 149 straight which is a gutsy effort!

Once again there were lots of lessons learnt and anyone who has got on a plane and travelled half way around the World will I am sure attest to the fact that it is not easy to compete on a world stage. Coming from winter cold to summer heat and competing when you should be normally sleeping it takes all the experience you can muster to achieve your best performance on the day and this event threw all it could at us to try and make it hard from sweltering heat to mud to rain and wind so I think to all of the Australians who travelled to the World Championships this year a great well done for all of your efforts!

WINCHESTER Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix

On 20th & 21st October Brisbane Gun Club once again conducted the annual Winchester Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix competition in Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet. This year marked the 18th holding of the competition since the inaugural Grand Prix in 1995.

This year although the fields in both the Olympic Trap and Skeet events were small, we once again welcomed many visitors to Brisbane including shooters from Hobart, Sydney, Melbourne, New Caledonia and of course from clubs throughout South East Queensland.

As is always the case at Olympic Discipline clay target shooting competitions in Australia, the great majority of shooters in attendance were trap shooters, however the small number of ISSF Skeet shooters were once again pleased to welcome Eugene Hernu from Bourail in New Caledonia. Eugene was the inaugural

Olympic Discipline Championships which are to be held at Brisbane in mid-January 2013.

Day 1 of the Olympic Trap commenced with competitive scores being recorded by many shooters with former Winchester Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix Champion Kevin Perkins of Maryborough Gun Club in Queensland setting the early pace with a very good 24/25 considering the early morning start. Kevin was followed by a number of shooters including Brett Dunstan (Frankston Australia), Craig Henwood (Melbourne), Nidal Asmar (Werribee), Justin Hitchins (Hobart), and Jennine Gerrard (Warwick) all on 22/25.

As the day progressed, all but a few shooters were keeping a close eye on the scoreboard as the first day's proceeding also included the popular optional 'Skins' event which is traditionally held in conjunction with the first day's rounds at the Winchester Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix. Good rounds were continually posted throughout the remainder of the proceedings on Saturday with Craig Henwood, Rob McNamara (Red-

As the day progressed, Brett Dunstan continued to demonstrate his consistency by carding 24, 21 and a final round 25/25 to finish on 179/200 and taking first position into the single barrel final. Craig Henwood also showed glimpses of good form with 23 and 25 in his middle rounds to make it into equal second spot in the final, along with Fernando Cilli who shot consistently well over the 2 days to record 176/200 along with Craig. Dan Johnson's consistency over the 2 days saw him make it into the final in 4th position, a few targets ahead of Nidal Asmar who got the 5th spot. The final position into the final was decided by a single barrel shoot-off between Greg Newey and Alex Smith, with Alex proving the victor on this occasion.

To be staged at Whiteman Park, W.A by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2013 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2013 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2013 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors - are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is

correctly classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day. With the National Double Barrel event, the qualification and 1st 200 shoot off targets will be shot from 15 metres, then the next 200 shoot off targets from 18 metres and the balance to be shot from 21 metres until finality.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Authority

This program shall control the 2013 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2013 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking:

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times - Please co-operate.

PRODUCT REVIEW

BISTOLI TAKE DOWN GUN CASE

I was going past the ACTA office and called in to see Chris Gibson. During our conversation, he asked 'Can you write?' I replied 'Yes I learnt at High School, [I was a slow learner]'.

'Well look behind you and write me a review on it !!' IT being a magnificent Bistoli Gun case.

I took it home, opened it up in the morning, BIG mistake. At -2°C, it was hard to manipulate key around the solid leather handle and into lock, but I managed. Later in the day when the weather warmed, it was quite easy. I am thinking that it was only the cold weather and newness/stiffness of handle, and old stiff fingers. Once opened I was more than impressed with what lay before me.

This case is made in China, and is of a green covered canvas and wood construction 10mm thick as well as 10mm dividers, with solid leather external end strip and corner protectors. All leather is of generous proportions and hand stitched and rivetted where required. Inside the compartments are covered in green bias felt and padded. All workmanship appears to be of top quality. I was told by the importer that the lid is fitted with a piano type hinge, but could not verify because it is excellently sealed.

The case is fitted with leather straps that are rivetted to the bottom of the case, to hold the barrels and stock in place. The heads of the rivets are covered and fitted with Velcro strips to fasten the barrels and stock in place. Measurement of the case are 865 x 265 x 85mm, which will accommodate most all guns, be they Under and Over or the side x side variety with barrels up to 80cms or 31 inches long. In the barrel section there are

two removable spacers for different length barrels. There is also a good size inlet to house the dolls head or cross bolt lug on the SxS barrels if needed. One thing that did catch my attention was that the solid leather handle is attached to the hinge pieces with a screw instead of a rivet. This would make it easier for replacement or cleaning/dressing.



All leather appears to be oiled as are the straps that go around the entire case at each end. Inside the case there is a generous sized compartment for cleaning gear, etc with a hinged lid, this will stop losing it or dropping/misplacing it. There is also provision for two snap caps. The compartment for the stock should accommodate stocks up to 16" [400mm] L.O.P easily. I can see no reason why this excellent case could not house a 20 or 16 gauge gun for those who need this. A solid, sturdy brass lock keeps the lid secure, with the key kept in its own neat little key fob. Only one key of brass construction, was supplied with review case. Another interesting thing is the Bistoli leather name tag which is attached by a small buckle, it could also be used for an emergency toe rest, when you leave yours at home.

I took this case with me to two different shooting events, one being the local SSAA shotgun event, with a Fabarm Max Luxus, 30" barrel and extended chokes, and also to Barellan Clay Target

club's monthly shoot, with a 30" T1 Perazzi. All shooters were suitably impressed when they seen it and examined it.

As well as this model [SGC 6000CL] case, there is a larger model SGC 5000PU, which is suitable only for Under/Over type shotguns and will accommodate longer barrels. There are also case covers available from the importer/supplier. Case was supplied by TEZNIK Importers of Sydney.

Mr Reay served many years through the 80's into the 90's as a policeman in Mt Isa, and then transferred to the Mt Isa Fire department, in which he is still a serving member.

Having several discussions with him during the Carnival he assured us that he had really enjoyed the shoot, and was pleased that he had made the effort to attend.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one visit only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
4. **Shooters will be Pre- squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/25 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
21. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.

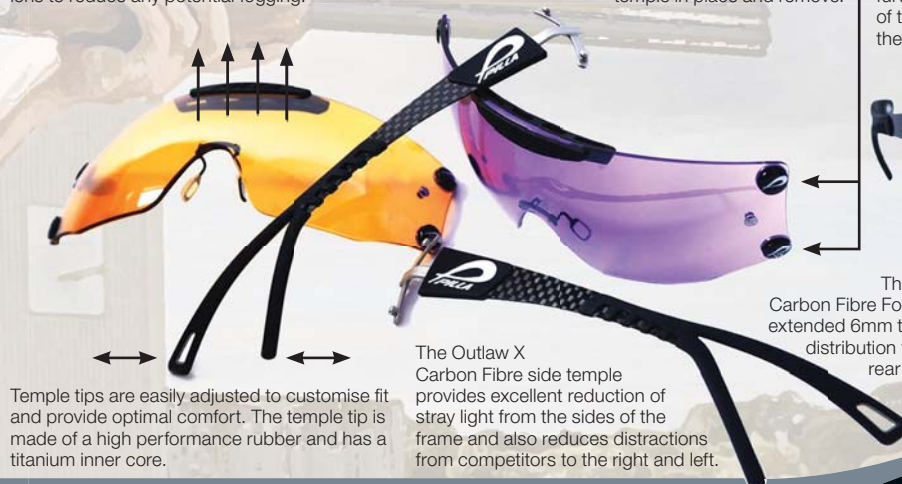

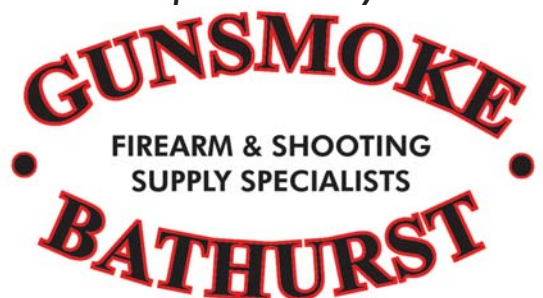

Presidential Medal

Preamble

The NSW Clay Target Association President will be awarding medals for outstanding achievement in coaching, administration, or contribution to, the sport of clay target shooting.

The following is a guideline for the assessment of individual nominations for the award of Presidential Medals outlining both the process and assessment criteria.

Process

- A call will be made to all NSW clubs by advertisement in the *Clay Target Shooting News* January to March of each year.
- The nominations to be forwarded to the NSW State Secretary by the closing date stipulated in the advertisement. The letters shall be marked "CONFIDENTIAL" on the outside of the envelope and shall only be opened by the State Secretary.
- The State Secretary will treat the nominations as confidential and shall only release them to the NSWCTA President.
- The President will request advice from the Executive Committee on a confidential basis and will carefully consider such advice.
- Executive members will keep all details of the nominations and any relevant discussions confidential.
- The President shall make the final decision on the award of the Presidential Medal(s).
- The formal announcement and presentation of the medal(s) will occur during the Annual State Trap or Skeet Championships.

Criteria

- Outstanding contribution to the sport from Club to State level.
- Generally only one medal to be granted per year but the President may, if the situation is warranted, grant a maximum of two medals in a year.

Another test of hand eye co-ordination was between the two teachers involved, Craig Bessell and Bradley Mellington,

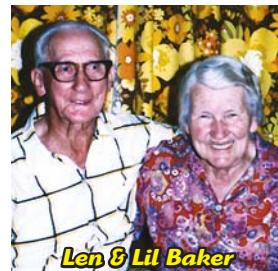

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WHY DO PEOPLE PARTICIPATE IN SPORT?

I wrote the last article in response to all that was happening in the sport of cycling. For weeks the scandal surrounding the cycling world was all we heard and then just before the Melbourne Cup a Jockey was in trouble

for betting. I'm sure there were heaps of other examples but I don't want to dwell on cheating but on motivation in general.

As I wrote last month there are three main theories underlying motivation in sport.

- Need Achievement Theory
- Attribution Theory
- Achievement Goal Theory

Whilst we might identify ourselves if we examine each theory closely, it is unlikely that our motivation can be discretely pigeon holed. These theories exist to explain how individuals within a population behave, and if you look closely at those around you, you will identify these theories in the way others (as well as yourself) behave.

So how do we know that a shooter is motivated? According to Burton & Raedeke motivation is reflected in three behaviours: Choice, effort and persistence.

Motivation shows in the choices we make: choosing to shoot, choosing to set challenging goals, to practice and exercise. Motivation also shows in the amount of effort we put into our sport. How intensely we train, practise, compete and strive to achieve these goals. Motivation also shows in the level of persistence we have to achieve these goals especially in face of adversity and obstacles.

The American psychologist, William Glasser, developed a "Choice Theory" that looks at how people behave. It argues that behaviour is directed by five fundamental needs. The first need, **Survival** (food, clothing, shelter, breathing, personal safety and anything else to keep us alive). This is a physical need and is primitive in that it is a overwhelming and fundamental drive.

The other four fundamental drives are psychological in nature. They are:

- **Belonging/connecting/love**
- **Power/significance/competence**
- **Freedom/autonomy, and**
- **Fun/learning**

I recently took the opportunity to travel with Graham Gosling from Newcastle Lake Macquarie CTC to the Gold Coast in Queensland to compete in the Pan Pacific Masters Games. Masters games are great examples of task orientation of participating in sport. The games, even though they are a competition, are set up primarily for the love of the sport. Yes, there are medals, a bit like the Olympics, but there are no other trophies: no cash, shells, guns, toasters or knife sets.

Motivation to compete in Masters type competitions is likely to be task orientated. That is, it is the love of the sport why we compete. This doesn't mean however that there isn't some ego orientation involved. Firstly, we are still competing, and secondly, there is still a lot of interest in the scoreboard and who shot what.

I am happy to take this opportunity to congratulate Debbie Young, President of the Gold Coast CTC, and her committee and members for the three great days of shooting. So why were the Pan Pacific Masters

games a success? Well, you can't say the weather, but that is out of the control for any organising committee. The shooting competition had the four components that Glasser argues are necessary for mental wellbeing.

The Gold Coast CTC and the Pan Pacific Games provided everyone a sense of belonging. As visitors, the general welcome was heart warming. We were introduced, welcomed and made to feel like we were at our own club. The effort obviously put in by the GCCTC committee and members to have the grounds, clubhouse and traps in great order, demonstrated a pride of their club and commitment to our sport. Shooting as a sport and shooters as a group can be a bit cliquey: we seem to have a preferred discipline and rarely leave our comfort zone or take risks shooting targets that we may not be familiar with. The difference here was that most people referred to themselves as "clay target shooters" rather than skeet, trap or sporting shooters. Trap shooters were welcomed and encouraged by the skeet shooters and vice versa, and everyone was encouraged to give the sporting competition a go.

The second of Glasser's needs is power. This is not the megalomania definition of power. It is not about bullying or pushing your weight around. It's not about winning at all costs. It is more the personal power to make choices about what you do. Choose to shoot skeet or sporting, when all you ever shoot is trap. Power for Glasser also means being competent. Remember that competence is one of the components for mental toughness. Whilst everyone wants to win, these games encouraged shooters to take risks in trying a different disciplines and shooting for enjoyment of the sport not the trophies.

The third need is freedom. This is about freedom to make choices and having autonomy to live and behave as you like, within socially accepted models. Again the freedom in the games involved the freedom to take chances with a new and different discipline.

The final need is the need to have fun. This is essential to life, mental wellbeing and learning. When events are run well and nobody is playing for 'sheep stations' it is possible to have fun. And isn't that why we took up the sport in the first place; to have fun. Whilst everyone was taking it seriously, there was still an opportunity to have a laugh, see the humour in the silly and strange things people do, and have some friendly sledging.

I don't know if the Gold coast CTC saw the Pan Pacific Masters Games as a success. I know if the organising committee were happy with the overall sports carnival because of their media releases. From a competitor and a visitor's point of view it was excellent. I was made to feel I belonged: welcomed by the club, the fellow shooters and most importantly, we were invited back. We had our need for power and freedom met and most of all we had fun and at times shot well. Although on a smaller scale, these games rivalled the World Masters Games held in Sydney a few years ago. For those wishing to enjoy their shooting, and all that the sport has to offer, think about competing in 'Masters' competitions. In 2013 the Australian Masters Games are being held in Geelong.

One of the other great things about this trip to the Gold Coast was the location. The gun club is near the village of Jacob's Wells. We stayed at the tourist park and would thoroughly recommend it as a place to stay. And within walking distance, that is, across the road was the tavern where we ate well, sometimes too well, and the café that served our breakfast of coffee and eggs each morning. Next-time, and I'll be happy to go again, I'll take a fishing rod as well as a gun.

Norman James Paterson 7/2/1929 - 26/12/2011

Norman Paterson or Norm as everyone knew him first got interested in club shooting at the Learmonth Gun Club about 15 km from Ballarat in the 1950's. Previous to this Norm was a keen field hunter and fisherman.

Norm obtained his membership to the ACTA in 1955, and retained this membership all his life.

He also obtained his membership at the Haddon Field and game in 1962 after it was formed as a club, and retained this membership also all his life.

Norm was the president of the Sebastopol Gun Club for 10 years from 1971 until 1981, where his two sons shot and one of them, David developed a lifetime interest in shooting. Norm's wife June was always on hand as well to run the afternoon teas, so it was a real family affair.

Norm was then very proud in 1981 to be awarded a life membership to Sebastopol Gun Club – this was in fact the first life membership ever awarded at Sebastopol Gun Club.

Over his shooting career Norm won more than 500 championships, some as diverse as the septic tank championship and the wingtrap championship. Included in this total he won 45 Deauville Doubles championships with his shooting partner, Keith Fisher. As his son David showed more interest in shooting Norm then shot Deauville Doubles with him and they won 108 championships together.

Norm trained as a coach through the ACTA to help to mentor others to shoot. Over 100 shooters would attend for the novice and coaching event at Sebastopol Gun Club when he was president – it was very popular.

At the 1988 Field and Game world titles held in Geelong Norm won the World Veteran's title. He is the only Australian to have ever done so.

In later years due to ill health Norm was unable to compete, but even late last year he was out at Haddon Field and Game to watch his son David compete at the monthly shoots.

Norm was a devoted family man, baseball player for Ballarat, championship winning softball coach, and extremely keen and successful fisherman as well as shooter. Norm is sadly missed by his family.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
