daylight each day. This was only achieved with the help of the clubs volunteers and the co-operation of the shooters. Thank you all. Congratulations to all the winners, some of whom were a little surprised to be on the podium as a result of the new shoot-off format.

This was the first shoot where the ACTA uploaded footage to Youtube. Checkout the ACTA website to view. It is hoped to regularly upload content from major events. Numerous media releases were also made.

It became obvious from this event that the Association needs to look at how we can encourage officials to get the ISSF qualifications needed to administer these events and support their attendance. This is something we will be considering in the future and raising with the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL)

The Board met prior to the ISSF Nationals and many agenda items were dealt with. Thanks to the Board members who so freely give their valuable time to attend these meetings at least six times a year.

A decision was made to re-advertise the position of Executive Officer of the Association. Details can be found at www.sportspeople.com.au and applications close on the 15th March 2013.

The Board is also preparing a position description for a new position within the office. The part time position is for a Media Officer, responsible for our Social Media content, website and media relations. It may be some time before this task is finished and it is hoped to fill the position locally with a post graduate university student.

The program for the DTL Nats in Perth during April was reviewed following a request from WACTA to increase the number of targets. It was decided the advertised program will remain in place. The program will be shot using White Flyer targets and the Australian Team to attend the World DTL in New Zealand will be selected.

I write this column from a Toowoomba motel room. Our trip home to Roma from the ISSF Nationals has been interrupted by road closures to the west of Toowoomba. I hope all the competitors from that event get home safely.

only able to take a second and third out of all events. This will undoubtedly change as shooters get more experience in the new system.

You may have noticed if you have been looking at the web site that we now have a button for media releases. A link to the latest release will also be on the front page of the web site. The first releases have related to the 2013 ISSF National Championships. We obtained good media coverage in Brisbane with an interview on the ABC Regional radio, results in radio sport reports and comments in the Brisbane Courier Mail. These media releases were distributed nationally to all media outlets. Results from the ISSF Championships were being uploaded to the web site daily but this did not include complete shooter scores as that requires more work at the moment. We will get to that eventually.

Also on the web site is a link, under the media section to You Tube with video reports on the ISSF Nationals. This was footage taken at the Nationals and includes interviews with some shooters. A twitter account has also been registered and at the start of the Championships we had 40 links, half from overseas. As the numbers increase it will allow us to distribute information on Championships and brief results and points of interest in a more timely manner to those linked in. As I have previously indicated Squad lists for the 2013 DTL Nationals will be placed on the web site and entrants will be advised of their squadding information by email. Many shooters may be in transit when the information is being distributed so the traditional method of "snail mail" may not reach everyone.

Some time ago the Association's Historian, Mr Mark McInnes, reached a point where he needed to take a break from his position. To partially offset the vacuum this created, I have been appointed to an interim position to assist the National Office with matters pertaining to the Hall of Fame, Annual

Awards and Records and some measure of a continuation of Mark's historical research. I am extremely hopeful that Mark's absence will prove to be of a sabbatical nature and that in due course his passionate, foresighted and constructive influence will be returned to us. Tasmanian Skeet Carnival

Good venue. Good background. Good program. Good weather. Optional pre-noms. Finished on time every day. All in all a great weekend. The only downside was a lower attendance than expected, possibly due to a large simulated shoot nearby and several other Gun Clubs shooting on the island that weekend. One shot an impor-

tant memorial shoot and a couple even shot skeet. We looked at several possible date changes to try to avoid this but none worked. Maybe the State Association could try to broker a program deal between the clubs.

Anyway those who attended had a great time. Michael Buttigieg won his first State Title which put a big grin on him. I have never won

the Doubles in Tasmania, thanks mainly to the father and son combo of Warren and Raymond Groves, who relegated me to runner-up on a couple of previous occasions. Anyway this year I gave it (to quote Peter Brock) "a red hot go" but my good friend Glenn Clarke gave me a doubles lesson in the shoot-off, along with the need to come back and try again. Glenn had a great weekend also winning the 20 gauge and the High Gun. The president of Tas Gun Club, Johnny Foster, assured me that next year the locals will put up a much better fight. Game on!

Tasmanian Skeet History

Part of my charter as "Acting Historian" is to continue Mark's work in constructing a detailed history of all the winners of the various State Championships in each state that incur Hall of Fame points. During my visit to Tasmania I was able to access old dusty shoot books and perpetual trophies as well as the records and memories of many people. My thanks to everyone who assisted me in this venture, especially Alan Styles, Maurice Crowe, Jimmy Briggs, Ian Rist, Chris Rockliff and Paul and Jan Marshall. The nett result is a full set of winners for the Doubles, 20 gauge and High Gun right back to the inception of each event. As the 12 gauge predates all the other events by a large margin, it is obviously a much bigger challenge. However I have been able to string together an unbroken list back to 1975 and about 60% prior to that. At the end of this article I shall publish the known results from 1978 back in the hope that some of you may be able to fill in a few of the gaps for me.

Ancient Skeet History

Some time ago Mark rang me and said that he had found some very early State Skeet results for Victoria but was puzzled by the scores which were in rounds of 20 rather than 25. I was unable to cast any light on this but filed it away in my "Interesting Homework Basket". Well lo and behold, the very early Tasmanian results threw up the same quandary. As you will see in the list, the 1949 event was won by Rex Powell with 14/20. My best educated guess was to throw away the repeat and the doubles on two and six.

However, in an extraordinary stroke of good luck I was approached by one of the elder statesmen of Tasmanian clay target shooting, Mr David Hallam, who said he had heard of the historical research I was doing and wondered if I might be interested in borrowing his 1936 ACPTSA Rule Book. Would I? Does a wild bear defecate in the forest? That little book proved to be an absolute treasure trove of information. So much so that I got permission to photocopy before returning it and sought first refusal if he would ever part with it.

So how do you shoot 20 skeet? First you shoot singles on stations one through seven. Forget station eight. That's fourteen. For the other six you go back and shoot three pairs on stations two, four and six. While I was contemplating the pair on four I found that you always shoot the high target first in the pairs, which provides an interesting scenario on six. However things then got a bit easier when I found that no electric power was used. The trap-boys, who remained in the traphouses in those days, cocked, loaded and released the machines, all by hand. As they would have trouble hearing shooters calling from distant stations, they actually responded to a whistle blown by the referee, upon being advised by the shooter that he was ready.

And the pairs? Not as bad as first thought. The high-house trap-boy responded to the whistle, but the low-house boy responded to the gunshot, thereby giving following pairs rather than simultaneous. The reason for deleting station eight also became clearer upon examining the field layout diagram. In 1936 they were still using a half circle rather than a semi-circle and the target flight-path was still over the top of the opposite house, rather than 36' to the side of it. So if you were attempting to shoot a low eight on field two and someone missed a high target on field one, it would probably smack you in the back of the head.

Tasmanian Records

Here's an example of how time and history can combine to provide a reality check. Back in the mid eighties I was somewhat smug in the knowledge that I had won the Tasmanian Skeet Championship four years running. However a few years later Stuart Browning took some

of the gloss off it by emulating that feat. Ah well, better a shared record than none at all. That was until about ten years later when Chris Rockliff showed Stuart and I how it is really done by winning the event six years running from 2002 through 2007. Then to make it worse, my historic research showed that I wasn't even the first. Sperry Marshall won the event four years running from 1969 to 1972. The moral of the story? When you start to think that you are a legend, watch out. Hindsight will probably show that it was only in your own lunchtime!

And if you want to talk about legends, what about Sperry Marshall? Everyone knows what a great Trapshooter he was. As an example, last year at the Macintosh reunion he was one of only five people in history to get a Gold Macintosh Badge for 20 or more appearances in the Macintosh Team. And I didn't even know that the bloke shot any Skeet. Turns out that after winning his first State Skeet Championship in 1953 he went on to win it 10 times during the next 20 years – That's a 50% kill-ratio! And if you include the 3 times his brother Paul won it during that time it means the trophy spent two thirds of it's life in that era sitting on the Marshall's mantelpiece.





Psychological Skills for Shooting



Michael Kruger-Davis

I have thought about writing an article such as this several times of the past 12 years or so. In writing this article, I wish to express my sincere

sorrow for anyone reading this who may have been affected by mass shootings that have occurred throughout the years around the world. I also wish to point out that I am in no way discounting the grief, sense of loss or distress that readers, families or friends of those involved may feel.

GUN CONTROL

When I awoke and heard the news on 14th December that a mass shooting had occurred at a school in the US, I was sickened and appalled that this could happen and that it did happen. This incident, brought back memories and thoughts of similar events at Dunblane, Port Arthur, Columbine, Norway, Cumbria, etc.

Unfortunately any type of disaster is news and where it involves guns the media are able to milk it for all its worth. Here is a snap shot of three days in one week in January:

There are several interesting facts here.

Firstly, the language that is used. The headlines use firearm related speak to grab the attention of the reader: "under fire", "reload", "on target" and "weapons at 20 paces". In an effort to grab attention and make an emotional connection, the media use words and phrases that will invoke negative thoughts and emotions when talking about firearms and firearm ownership.

As responsible firearm owners it is incumbent upon us to not allow these emotionally charged words to be used. Guns should be referred to as firearms as this is a neutral word:

weapons, on the other hand immediately invokes images of warfare, conflict and crime.

There is a section of our brain called the amygdala and this is the area that regulates emotion. The pre frontal cortex on the other hand, is the area of the brain that makes us aware of the consequences of our behaviour. By using emotionally charged words, phrases, pictures and film clips, the amygdala is stimulated and the response is likely to be emotional. Gun ownership, like any other issue needs to be discussed in a rational manner. For example, every time the NSW press do an article on NSW Shooters and Fishers Party MLC, Robert Borsack they trot out a file photo of him sitting next to an elephant he has just shot. Regardless of the issue he is talking about, the media have by using this picture, created a negative perception of Robert in the reader's minds. They cannot rationally examine what he is saying when they are flooded with emotions.

Next, these articles draw on a range of issues relating to firearm ownership. In these three days the articles, looked at gun crime in Sydney (criminal related), hunting in national parks, the current debate in the US regarding whether assault type rifles should be prohibited, armed guards at US schools, gun amnesties and buy back schemes, gun importation and purchases of new firearms, the difference between legal and illegal firearms, challenges in the US to the law regarding gun ownership and the Second Amendment.

For the Coalition on gun control this is mana from heaven. With so many issues being discussed, they can have an input into any of these topics by just arguing that firearm ownership should be limited if not banned. For responsible firearm owners, there are too many issues here, most of which have no bearing on our our interests or our focus for having a gun in the first place.

The anti-gun lobby is arguing that there are now more guns in Australia than before the buy-back. This may be correct, but what they are not saying is that the guns that were hidden in cupboards have now gone, the assault type rifles have now gone, background checks are needed before purchasing firearms and that all firearms have to be securely stored. Nor are they saying that suicides and homicides in Australia have fallen since the buy-back and firearm restrictions have been put in place. These new firearms are legal and registered. As responsible firearm owners we know the differences between these firearms and the ones used by criminals. The anti gun

lobby does not want this distinction discussed because they do not want to have to admit that some people in society are responsible, safe and can be trusted with registered firearms.

Thirdly, there is a overstating of the importance given to the gunman. People who commit these atrocities clearly have some form of mental health problem or personality disorder. If the media were to ignore the story, or at least report it without giving any credence to the perpetrator, then the perpetrator would not get the attention and approval that he/she is seeking. The media can still run the stories and if they gave the focus to the victims, or the emergency workers or some others who behaved in a positive way then the perpetrator misses out. This would have the effect of limiting others from thinking that they would receive fame and infamy, if effectively they were ignored.

Finally, there is the issue of mental health. To commit acts of mass killings shows a complete disregard for societal norms and rules. Therefore to behave in such a way is not normal or likely for a well-adjusted and mentally healthy adult.

So what can we do to protect our sport and our rite to own firearms?

We must take control of the agenda. We need to get stories and examples of responsible gun ownership into the mainstream media. In 2012 Matt Schiller and became the DTL Junior Champion, Renae Birgan was Women runner-up in the FITASC World Championships and Jason Owen was runner-up on the X Factor. We should have capitalised on the three great achievements by shooters. The general public needs to know what great ambassadors they are for our sport. The Olympics are all well and good, but the coverage is dependent upon winning and the Olympics are soon forgotten. There are world championships happening all the time, that often feature Australian's in the winning positions.

We need to use and get the media to use the language that will place us in a positive light in the eyes of the general public. We must not allow the media to use words like weapons: we need to point out, like a cracked record, that you need golf clubs to play golf and you need a shotgun to shoot clay targets. Our focus should always be that we are involved in a sport (clay target shooting) or a life style choice (hunting) and because we do these pursuits in accordance with the current legislation we are responsible and law abiding citizens. We should point out that because we have a current firearms permit the society deems that we can be trusted.

We need to behave in a way that does not compromise this trust for ourselves or for other shooters. We need to embrace the rules for safe storage and make sure that we behave in an exemplary way at all times.



With just one event on the card, a flat out 100 target double barrel scramble with the inevitable marathon shoot off at the end of the day. With our

club's growing numbers and the success of the last couple of years, 2013 has meant the club has had to go from shooting half a day to now having access to the shooting grounds for the entire day. What was once a 12pm start is now 10am and early access to

The early start was needed, as the ensuing shoot off took quite a few hours. In the past these necessary shoot offs had to be avoided and results were commonly decided by a coin toss because there was never time before dark, a sad way to finalise a sporting competition. With time on our side and plenty of daylight left the competition began. From six starters an early departure was Frazer Roberts just 5 targets in, this was a surprise, normally in the thick of things right till the end. Onwards and upwards with Josh Lambert bowing out with 190 odd straight targets, this was later found out to be Josh's best result after more than 20 years of target shooting (90 targets better).

Neil Privett another veteran shooter also had a personal best day with 236 straight targets but this was not enough to win the event. After Neil missed and left the competition, leaving Matt Patmore, Darryl Reed and Kim Chiavarini all with impressive credentials and the potential to shoot 700 to 800 targets straight, the club committee were forced to change to competition to points score (meaning a miss with the first barrel and you're out). This changed things dramatically and within 7



targets Kim Chiavarini needed a second barrel and exited the competition. Darryl Reed just one target later completely missed handing the victory to a seasoned campaigner Matt Patmore with 258 not out.

Fitness at this level is earned over years of competition, most small clubs don't have the ability to allow these shoot offs to run their natural course and thus the physical and mental fitness is never allowed to build up. With better technology, better equipment, better targets and an increasing number of shooters with the ability and knowhow to shoot 600, 700 and 800 targets straight, it's only a matter of time before a shoot off goes past the magic 1000 target mark.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one visit only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 4. Shooters will be Pre- squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/25 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 21. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.



As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
