National President's Notes

"Believe nothing of what you hear and only half of what you see", is an old saying that was told to me many years ago by a senior colleague which left me in good stead during my career. There has been a rumour circulating – that the ACTA Executive is wishing to spend \$4 million of members monies on a new club facility at the National Ground in Wagga. I can put this to rest as the only discussion regarding a club rooms was a draft concept plan proposed by the immediate past president, produced at the June Executive meeting with no figure mentioned. As far as I am

aware there has been no other discussion by any member of the Executive and none brought to the attention of the Executive Committee since that time. Members of the ACTA would immediately be included on such an enormous issue. There are several reasons that this would not go ahead (at this time), mainly due to the ACTA not having \$4 million and the only way that a project as large as this could go ahead is if government funding was provided for the vast majority of the monies required. I can also advise that there has been no discussion relative to this with government that I am aware of.

A Management Committee meeting was held recently and numerous items were discussed that will be put to the full Executive Committee for their decision on whether they are to occur. As I have previously advised, once minutes are ratified they will be provided to all State Secretaries and placed on the ACTA website. Issues discussed include the employment of a Media Officer, IT requirements for the office and the employment of a National Coaching Director. There are other points that were discussed and I encourage all of the membership to look at these minutes and raise any issues through the appropriate channel if required.

At the time of the Management Committee meeting the National Sporting Clays Championship was held at the National Ground in Wagga. To the time I left on the Sunday the weather was holding out and good scores were being posted. I thank the Wagga Gun Club for conducting the event and ACTA office staff that were involved in any way. Congratulations go to Peter Tobin for the overall High Gun and Victoria for the open teams shoot. Congratulations to everyone that competed and to those that secured a prize during the event.

A recent change to the Associations Incorporation Act in Victoria requires the ACTA to review the constitution and bylaws with a view to the Victorian Office of Consumer and Business Affairs (OCBA) accepting our constitution. The ACTA is incorporated in the State of Victoria, however operates the national ground in New South Wales and conducts events in all States and Territories in Australia. If we do not conduct the review and submit our constitution by November, a generic constitution will be in place for our association – provided by OCBA. To protect member assets the ACTA has had 'Landers and Rogers' (solicitors) review the constitution, bylaws and reporting structure. Although no one likes change, advice provided is that as we are only incorporated in Victoria – this may expose the ACTA to litigation in all other states. Their recommendation is to incorporate the ACTA in "all of Australia" or become a "company limited by guarantee". The only difference between these is the reporting requirement to the Office of Consumer and Business Affairs. The Management Committee has returned the file to Landers and Rogers for further clarification and advice of any decision taken will be provided to members with any constitutional change requiring motion at the Annual General Meeting (or a Special General Meeting called especially for this purpose). However, if further advice is that there is no requirement to change, the status quo will remain. No changes will be undertaken lightly with any changes made to protect member assets.

I am extremely proud of the way National Executive members donate their time, resources, knowledge and commitment. Whether it is advice to the National Office staff, hands on procurement for the national ground or attendance at the numerous meetings around the country, they all are committed 100%. Mr Robert Nugent, immediate past president has now remained on the National Executive and I look forward to working with him over the coming months to progress the association. At this time I would like to thank Mr Geoff Moore who has been required to stand aside for Robert in Queensland. I thank Geoff for his time in the National Executive, for his open, honest discussion, his friendship and the support he has given me. Geoff was and is a great asset to the National Executive and I look forward to him returning in the future to represent Queensland and the Executive. I commend Geoff for his input.

Finally I wish everyone good luck in competition wherever it is. Stay safe!

Executive Officer's Report

Firstly, congratulations to the Australian Sporting Clays team on their recent trip to Canada, a great effort and truly great representation of the Association.

This month, I wish to inform you of the outcome of a meeting I attended with the CEO of AISL, Damien Marangon & their High Performance Manager, Tim Mahon. I am now aware that we are on the same page in many areas important to the growth of the sport. AISL will support the ACTA in strengthening the coaching and development component within the ACTA, whilst the ACTA will highlight and work with AISL to promote ISSF shooting.

Our sport is now in a position where we can have national representatives at many levels across our various disciplines. The Olympic and Commonwealth Games requires a different pathway to our Trap, Skeet and 5 Stand Sporting. We need to be pro-active across all of these disciplines as well as the Olympic disciplines.

To assist AISL and the ACTA, we are working on a partnership that will see the introduction of a National Coaching Director. This appointment will be made in consultation with AISL who will also contribute to the cost of a development pathway that will culminate in our shooters being able to access the AISL pathway. This will also include the education of coaches.

The ACTA Coaching Committee has developed a job description for the National Coaching Director and is currently considering the national pathway for both athletes and coaches. Our sport will not improve without a structured pathway for both athletes and coaches.

You will notice I use the word "athlete" a great deal. To compete at the highest level in the present sporting climate, physical fitness, including strength and mind training are now absolute prerequisites. It goes without saying, if you can't shoot it doesn't matter how good you are as an athlete, but to reach the top in our sport, requires a great deal more than simply being able to shoot.

This area is a passion for me, coaching and the development of junior's is the base on which we can build a bigger and better future for our sport. It is however incumbent on people to accept the challenge in pursuing the levels needed to achieve. The pathway from Club to Zone to State to National is a sequential process that delivers measurable outcomes. That is, understanding certain achievements before moving to the next. I am a former Level 3 Coach, I understand the pathways, commitment and dedication required to make it to the elite levels of sport. The Association is putting together a plan that will assist shooters to reach their full potential. We are at the beginning of a defining partnership with AISL, to work together to achieve our collective goals, for without a solid foundation these goals will never materialise.

AISL will be more successful if the ACTA is strong and develops our talent. Wins for AISL means further assistance and support for the ACTA. This in turn delivers more programs to our members.

Next Month I will highlight some initiatives from the Executive Committee meeting conducted in June this year, including some that have already been put in place.

Notice to all Rules Supervisors, Handicappers and State Secretaries

Rule Amendments and Changes Effective January 1st 2014

The following rule changes to grading and handicapping were approved by the National Executive after proposed changes were sent to the States for comment in August 2012

"Rule 2.01(e) Change % for B Grade from 87% and under 94% to 90% and under 94% and C Grade under 90%".

"Rule 2.02(c) is changed to:

20 – 124 competitors – 1st 1 metre.

125 + competitors – 1st 2 metres, 2nd 1 metre.

"Rule 2.02(d) to be changed to 97% + only will be handicapped 1 metre.

"Rule 2.02(e) – any handicap score of 50/50 will earn 1 metre handicap".

Note: There will be no half metre penalties. From January 1st 2014 those shooters with earned half metres will move forward to the nearest whole metre mark.

The following grade percentage changes were also approved by the Executive for ISSF Trap grading following submissions from ISSF Trap Shooters both State and National:

AA Grade - 91 % and over.

A grade - 86% and under 91%

B grade - 78% and under 86%.

C grade – Under 78%

1. ISSF State Postal Team Matches

Double Trap – The qualifying event shall be conducted over 30 pairs (60 targets). Teams to consist of 6 shooters, with the top 4 scores to count for men, and 4 shooters in both the women's and junior's teams with the top 3 scores to count. (25 pairs previously. Change required under new ISSF event format).

ICTSF World English Sporting Championships – CANADA

The Canadian association began its quest to host this prestigious event by attending the first ICTSF World English Sporting Championships in New Zealand in 2011. Canadian president Mr. Doug Harvey, representing Canada, submitted an application to join the ICTSF at the General Assembly held with the World Championships that year. The application being successful, Doug subsequently came to the ICTSF General Assembly in Wales in 2012 with a power point presentation on the Galt Sportsman Club and the rest is history. The ICTSF granted the event for 2013 to Canada and planning began.

Unfortunately Doug developed a serious health problem and organisation of the event transferred to Rob Miesner, the Galt President and the new Canadian President, Jason Philp. The venue, minutes from the township of Cambridge, set in a lush timbered grounds, was very picturesque. The fields were equipped with 140 new Promatic traps. This equates to around \$500,000 of machinery and the organisation necessary to equip layouts with all new equipment for all the events conducted during the week was immense.

The Australian contingent of John Younger, Peter Hall, Andrew Garvie, Noel Lillis and Paul Lillis had arrived early and some encountered difficulties in getting firearms through customs. The team members were all staying within about 200 metres of each other and the trip to the club was a fairly easy 10 minutes in light traffic. The area around the hotels

was full of shops, eateries and entertainment within walking distance.

With 650 targets on offer in total, approximately two thirds of the total field competed in the supporting events. A Make a Break layout also ran all week adding more interest. John

Younger was successful in the five stand taking out the Overall with an excellent 98/100. The main event saw 271 entries, and ten countries represented. The OA winner was George Digweed with a 185/200 in the event and a 17/25 in what was a really tough final, giving a total of 202/225. The best Aussie, John Younger came in with 179/200 plus 13 for a very respectable 192/225 and equal seventh place. The team fared well taking out the Bronze medal from the Welsh, after the English in first place and the Canadians in second.

Presentations were a long winded affair, with some pre-events not concluded until the Sunday, meaning three whole events were to be presented. The Canadian association awards in HOA, Runner up, Masters, AA, A, B, C, D, E, Ladies, Juniors, Veterans and Super vets classes. A decision has now been made to limit the presentations on the final night to the World Championship event with the grades as recognised by the CPSA rules for English sporting.

The General Assembly hosted on the Friday before the main event approved Australia as the host for the 2015 ICTSF World ESP event. The ACTA now has to finalise an organising committee and venue for the event as soon as possible. This will be a major undertaking.

I am pleased to report that the team members and all other Australians present conducted themselves well, dressed appropriately for the official ceremonies and represented Australia with pride and dignity.

I congratulate them on making the team and representing Australia so well.

Commonwealth Trap Championships

DARWIN – 19-21 August 2013

This year was the first time the Commonwealth Trap Championships were shot in the NT. The Darwin committee decided some time ago to put in a bid and as a consequence also decided to do a major upgrade of the trap facilities to a standard suitable to run such a prestigious event. The four DTL and three skeet layouts were completely rebuilt and properly surveyed. The previous trap layout dated back to 1981 and was definitely showing its age apart from the fact that none of the layouts complied with ACTA rules.

An enormous amount of work was conducted by the committee headed by club President Tony Papandonakis. Victor Ferteklis, although not formally allocated such a title, effectively became the project manager and he and his son Vice-president Nicholas personally put in literally hundreds of volunteer hours. Work was interrupted in February by a major lightning strike which burnt out virtually all our layouts including the two trench layouts. Thankfully one object of the upgrade was for all the underground wiring to be replaced. The four aging Gemini traps were replaced with the latest model Materellis and the walks were completely re-laid and now the standard of DTL and skeet facilities at Darwin are second to none in the country. All we need now is a decent clubhouse!

The event was run on behalf of the ACTA by the NT Clay Target Association executive headed by President Megan Niven ably supported by the Darwin club committee. As it was an ACTA event the ACTA Executive Committee kindly agreed for Judy Ferry of the ACTA office to assist in the office. Judy's travel and other expenses were met by the NTCTA. Many thanks Judy for your able assistance, making the Eftpos machine available and also taking all the photos. Judy worked with Vicki Ferteklis of Darwin in the office and thank you Vicki for your great work not only during the event but prior to and afterwards – we couldn't have done it without you! Adrian Cousens was our shoot marshal and Cuzzo did his usual fantastic performance – thanks Cuzzo for your efforts; you will always be more than welcome back up here. ACTA Victorian Executive Committee member Gary Hayden also attended and thanks Gary for your assistance during the weekend.

The weather was perfect and all the traps threw great targets. Attendance was 58 shooters and while it would have been nice to have had more but given the cost and effort

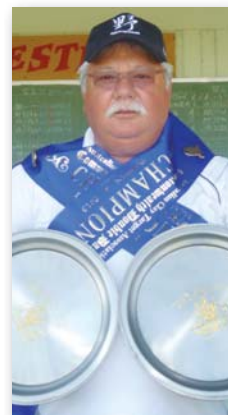
As would be expected the 50 Double Barrel saw a range of shoot-offs, but strangely,

Darwin Trapshooting Carnival

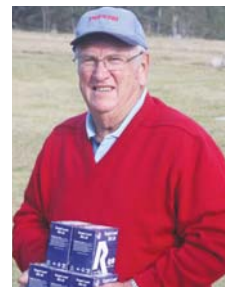

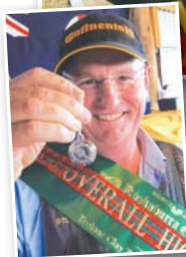

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
3. The tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and, where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of **15 Pair (30 targets)** with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Friday 3rd January 2014. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.**
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.**
11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the Jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only in Double Traps. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. **All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).**

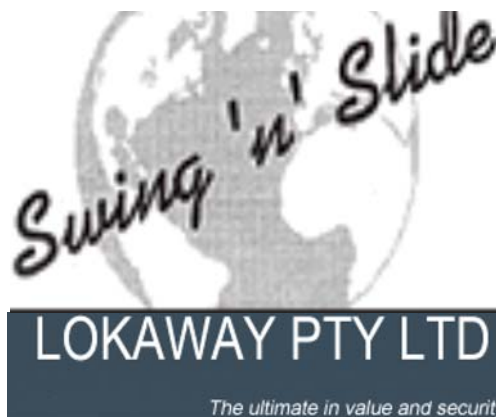

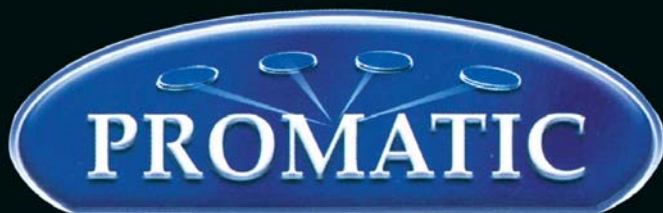

Psychological Skills for Shooting

PILGRIMAGE

Over the years in these articles and in coaching workshops, I have encouraged staying in 'the here and now', being mindful of how and what you are sensing. In this article I want to share an experience and relive a moment in time for me.

Anyone who has ever played Monopoly knows the value and position of Mayfair. Mayfair is a prestigious suburb in Westminster.

In June, whilst visiting England, I went to Mayfair in search of a very special place. We left Piccadilly Road and travelled down Berkeley Street, past Berkeley Square, the showrooms of Jaguar, Bentley and Rolls Royce and into Bruton Street. Bruton Street appears understated at first glance but then you wander down the street you realise the jewelers, tailors and designers all offer a bespoke service of making their clothing and jewelry to measure. In a few moments, Barbara and I arrived at our destination, 33 Bruton Street, home of Holland and Holland. For me this trip was something of a pilgrimage.

Like most readers, I have had an interest in guns for most of my life. This interest culminates in 'the best' London Guns of which the name Holland and Holland is synonymous. Holland and Holland hold two royal warrants for the supply of firearms and clothing to the Duke of Edinburgh and the Prince of Wales. For most Australians the concept of a Royal Warrant is difficult to understand, but essentially it is an endorsement by the Royal family of the quality, workmanship of the products and service offered by the company. Royal warrants are not given lightly and are proudly prized and carefully guarded.



We were welcomed into the showroom and introduced to Pratik Patel, responsible for the clothing and accessories. As a shooter, I expected the gunroom would be the centre of my attention, but it was impossible not to be impressed by the arrangement, quality and range of the clothing and accessories available for sale. In the catalogue it states "Holland and Holland clothing also includes exclusive designs, based on classic elegant styles suitable for town or country, whether shooting or not."

The showroom itself was a sensual experience: the colours, the textures and the smells. The contrasting textures of leather, wool, cashmere, cotton, silk and felt evoke memories forged from the tactile experiences throughout our lives. The journey around the showroom was delightful. There was always something new to look at and to try on. I couldn't decide between leather or tweed shooting vest, but then reality kicked in and I remembered that in the Riverina there would only be two or three days per year where it would be cold enough to wear either of them. I could wear a cap when shooting and I could wear a hand woven silk tie when I need to dress more formally, so a tie and a cap it was.

At the back of the showroom, with an entry flanked by two cannons, was the gunroom. Here was a mind numbing display of new and used H & H shotguns and rifles. Interested mainly in the shotguns, it was hard to not be in awe of the woodwork, the engraving, case colour hardening or silver finish. All of these guns were exquisite: described in the catalogue as being "celebrated around the world as the perfect combination of artistry and craftsmanship."



Standing in the gunroom was like being at the National Gallery. Artwork on the walls, plush leather furniture, leather inlaid desks, mounted game birds and in the cabinets, functional masterpieces; "Royal" side by sides, and 'Royal' Over and Unders, round action sidelocks and 'Royal' double rifles. Holland and Holland guns are bespoke. They are made to your measurements. In the gunroom, there was equipment to measure the bores, wall thicknesses, chokes, etc. You can have absolute confidence in what you would be buying: the quality, the tradition, the reputation and the feeling that you own and shoot one of the 'best' London guns.

My experience at Holland and Holland was a real joy. I'm sure the staff knew that I was only looking, but we were treated with all respect that would have been afforded a customer buying a new pair of guns. I look forward to my next trip to London. I'll definitely call in to the showroom again and I will hopefully get to the Holland and Holland Shooting Ground for some coaching, and who knows maybe fitting for a gun.

A shooter well worthy of a mention was Denmark's Siobhan Blake, who took out Ladies', Juniors' and B Grade High Guns. She was definitely a



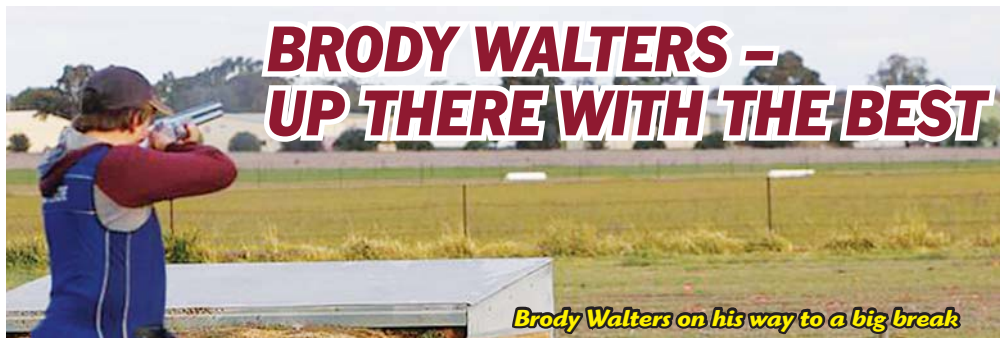

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
