I recently attended the New South Wales DTL Carnival held at the National Ground and must congratulate everyone that was involved in making it a success. From the office to the competition areas it was a pleasure to attend and participate. The grounds are looking sensational although over summer they will dry out considerably.

A newly installed set of lights was trialled for the double barrel shoot off and from the reports of shooters was a success. Congratulations are extended to the ACTA grounds committee (Chaired by Mr Don Johnson — New South Wales) for implementing this initiative. Subsequent layout installation will depend on an analysis of the cost, requirement and ground development priority and will be included in the 2015 budget and subsequent ACTA business plan.

Two new members have commenced on the ACTA Executive Committee, being Mr Kim Hibble from Tasmania (replacing George Pinner) and Mr Bronte Evans from South Australia taking my position whilst I am President of the Association. I thank them both for coming onto the Executive and look forward to working with them for the betterment of the Association. Both are an asset which will be useful to the executive during their time. Welcome.

This takes me to the topic of volunteers! The definition per Dictionary.com is: "a person who performs a service willingly and without pay". Volunteering gives members an opportunity to make a difference and give back to a club, association or organisation. Volunteer members come with many different skills and it is with these skill sets and experience the organisation is enhanced. Volunteering is not only a one way act of giving but is also of great benefit to those members volunteering. Skill sets are used, sometimes increased and can lead to employment opportunities.

Most clubs find themselves in need of volunteers at some point and in fact many cannot operate without volunteer staff and committees. Consider volunteering at a club, zone, State or national level as you may be the person with the ability that can help.

Members must always be reminded that volunteers are there to help. Most will assist whenever and to whoever asks or needs assistance; however they are not there to be abused, ridiculed, insulted or taken advantage of. All States and Territories in Australia now have legislation to protect volunteers from any of these issues and provide legislative guidance as to how to progress infringements.

Volunteers must also remember that they also have a duty of care to the Association or club and must act within their authority. To work outside their designated limitations may expose the club or Association to litigation and themselves to injury or other action. Volunteers however are covered legislatively if acting in good faith to the club or Association.

Recently there has been a spate of minor misconduct issues and personal arguments that have been brought to the attention of the Executive Committee. A reminder that these issues are to be handled at the club, zone or State level before they are referred to the ACTA office. Nearly (if not all) club and State constitutions have a disciplinary section which should be utilised in the first instance. Only major infractions should be brought before the Association. Unfortunately at times, clubs believe it is easier for the national body to take action against somebody which takes away the emotion and responsibility from themselves. All issues referred to the Association will be looked at and unless all previous avenues within the State or Territory have been exhausted, the ACTA "Legal and Governance" committee will not be referring the matter for further action and will return the matter to the originating complainant.

I hope this finds you and your families well and you are successful in competition.

We are also coming up to "that" time of year. Wishing you and your families a safe and enjoyable Christmas celebration and a prosperous New Year. Stay safe!

Executive Officer's Report

As 2013 winds down, the National Office is into its peak work period. 2014 membership renewals open as at the 1st of November with all members required to join before the 1st of January. In January 2014 the ISSF Championships will be conducted by the ACTA in Western Australia at the Western Australian Gun Club. Nomination forms are now available in the CTSN and on the Website. During February the Association's Auditor will be in Wagga Wagga to conduct the Annual Audit, preparation for the audit is underway as is the Annual Report. Then it's off to the World DTL Championships in New Zealand followed by the National Trap Championships in April. Six weeks after this event the National Skeet Championships are conducted followed by the National Executive meeting in June. August then offers the 5 Stand Sporting Championships. This is a very brief overview of how quickly timelines come and go.

The full National Executive will meet in November, the last meeting of 2013. This meeting will continue to address the important issues the Association faces in terms of governance, including the necessary changes to the constitution required under our Incorporation requirements, tender recommendations for targets and insurance services.

The meeting will also look at future provision of services relating to the data base and other essential member services vital to the continued growth of the Association.

One of the initiatives to be introduced will be to achieve membership growth, the target, 14,000 members by 2014. The Promotions Committee and the National office staff have been working on ways to increase our membership, one of those is linked to a new data base that will allow the National office staff to contact previous members and target new members. Our membership has been stable for the past five years, numbers remain the same, however there is a large turnover of members. We will be able to follow up those who have not joined as well as communicate better with our current membership base. In 2013 an initiative was introduced to reward members for introducing new members to Clubs and the ACTA. That initiative will continue in 2014. As part of our new service we will be able to track those who attend and results from State and National carnivals. We will record all individual results of these events and be able to send nominations forms etc directly to participants.

As we move towards 2014 there are a number of tenders currently being decided. One of the most important is the target tender and testing. The testing will be carried out on the National ground with the results and the tender documents provided to the Championships Committee. The Committee will consider all aspect of the testing and tender price prior to making a recommendation to the full National Executive this month.

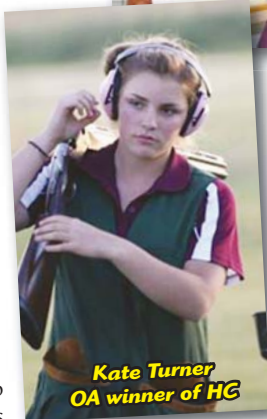
Our Zone Teams receive generous support from West Orange Motors VW & Gunsmoke Bathurst & this support is very much appreciated.

TRAP CARNIVAL

4th-6th OCTOBER, 2013

Some people get all the breaks. And if you were a participant in this year's NSW State Carnival, you were one of them. Even if you didn't win an event or set a Personal Best, you could return home happy to have spent the long weekend in the company of the country's best shooters, in some of the best weather we've seen in a while, at grounds that were as ready as I've ever seen to host this massive event.

Skip ahead if you're only interested in the "Winners are Grinners" sections, because I want to start and end this report by mentioning 2 very important, but very different, groups of people. First volunteers and "behind the scenes" people.

As a first time participant in proceedings, I kept a low profile and did a lot of observing. Most obvious observation: how unbelievably well organised everything was. Think about some of the things that have to be seen to: Nominations, Squadding, Checking of Shooters' Books, Entering Scores (on both the computer and the white board), Getting Boards out to Layouts on Time, Getting Refs and Scorers out to Layouts on Time (!), Organising Shoot-offs, Reviewing Shooters' Books & Possibly Regrading,

Organising Prizes (which included cash, sashes, and trophies), and then getting the Shooters' books back to them at the end of proceedings. I'm sure I've only mentioned about half of what went on in the office, but a few people deserve special mention. Frank Auditore is the Shoot Program & IT King. Just give him another cup of coffee and he is good to keep going all day. Kathleen Dawe, Secretary of NSWCTA, was there nearly every minute, and seemed to know the answer to every question thrown at her. Working right alongside her was Janene Schiller, who kept everyone on their toes providing support to the smooth running of the office. Janene was assisted by Mandy Brook-Barnes and Amy Hewitt. Lyn Blake put on a lovely morning tea and managed the White Board like a professional statistician. Adrian Cousens, our Shoot Marshall, got score sheets out & back in promptly, and kept the facts and figures up to the minute. Aside from that, there were some helpful members of the NSW Executive who put time in when they could, in any way they could. I would like to add that cool, calm, sportsmanlike behaviour prevailed every bit as much behind the scenes as it did on the layouts.

Out in the public arena, we had our fearless leader, Noel Edlington, as Tournament Director. Throughout the weekend, Noel was the man whose hand you wish you shook if you actually did win

First order of business was the parade of Zone Teams, followed by the introduction of our official guests: the Mayor of Wagga Wagga, Rod Kendall, NSWCTA Patron and Member for Wagga, Daryl Maguire, and Kay Hull, patron for the ACTA. This was also the inaugural year for the NSW Presidential Medal, which was awarded to Joy Dwight, for her services to our sport over many years. We must also make special mention to the outstanding work of our Canteen Specialists, Arthur and Leanne Turner, who not only kept the masses fed every day, but also whipped up a delicious

barbeque on Saturday night for the troops. Last but not least we have to thank our lovely Fred Rapley for his devotion with making sure our traps are all operating smoothly, teen him up with our Trappers and you are all set for a nonstop weekend for shooting.

A few statistics: we had 310 shooters in attendance, from NSW, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Northern Territory, and the ACT. 56 were Juniors, 33 were Veterans, and 40 were Ladies.

A few sporting highlights: the Handicap event shoot-off started out with 7 possibles. One of them was 15 year old Kate Turner, a C grader who has only been shooting for a few months. We all held our breath as the young lady with the winningest smile I've ever seen held on for 94 targets... and won! It was lovely to see someone so tickled to have taken 1st prize.

Another sporting highlight of the weekend was achieved by Matt Schiller, who set a new long break record for the NSWCTA State Trap Carnival. Matt shot 862 consecutive targets without a miss. This was across the Single Barrel, Double Barrel, Points Score & the Open Teams event. He still had not missed a target, since the one he dropped in the single barrel at the completion of the program.

One other special moment, for me, anyway, was refereeing a squad which had 2 fathers shooting

Every time she got on top of a target, she would look over at Dad to see if he'd noticed. He always did.

Aiming4Gold – the Pursuit of Excellence with Associated Virtue

Following the London Olympics, the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) undertook a formal review of the nation's high performance system. This included reviewing and evaluating the current processes and athlete projections to win future World Championship, Commonwealth and Olympic medals.

It would be fair to say shooting's performance at the recent Olympics mirrors the misfortunes to that of Australia: our Olympic performance peaked more than a decade ago; our overall relative Olympic position has been trending downwards since the Sydney Games; the London Games provided clear signs there are new and re-emerging competitive countries. As Albert Einstein once said "... the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different result ..."

What resulted was the Australia's Winning Edge (AWE) high performance strategy 2012-2022. Like other sports, AISL was required to present to the ASC how they could contribute to winning medals in events that matter (World Championships, Commonwealth Games, Olympic Games, Paralympic Games). In the end, shooting was one of only 17 sports that the ASC believed could contribute to these AWE outcomes.

The advent of AWE has given opportunity to review and revamp AISL's high performance system, specifically the capability of current and future shooters and the quality of the high performance system. Both of these factors are critical in achieving AWE outcomes.

Aiming4Gold (A4G) is our response, a high performance model committed to implementing **BEST PRACTICE** in all aspects of the development, leadership and management of athletes, teams and coaches. Through a

holistic, systematic approach which fully utilises the capacities and experience of athletes and coaches in decision-making and program development, A4G aims to set world-class standards of management in high performance shooting.

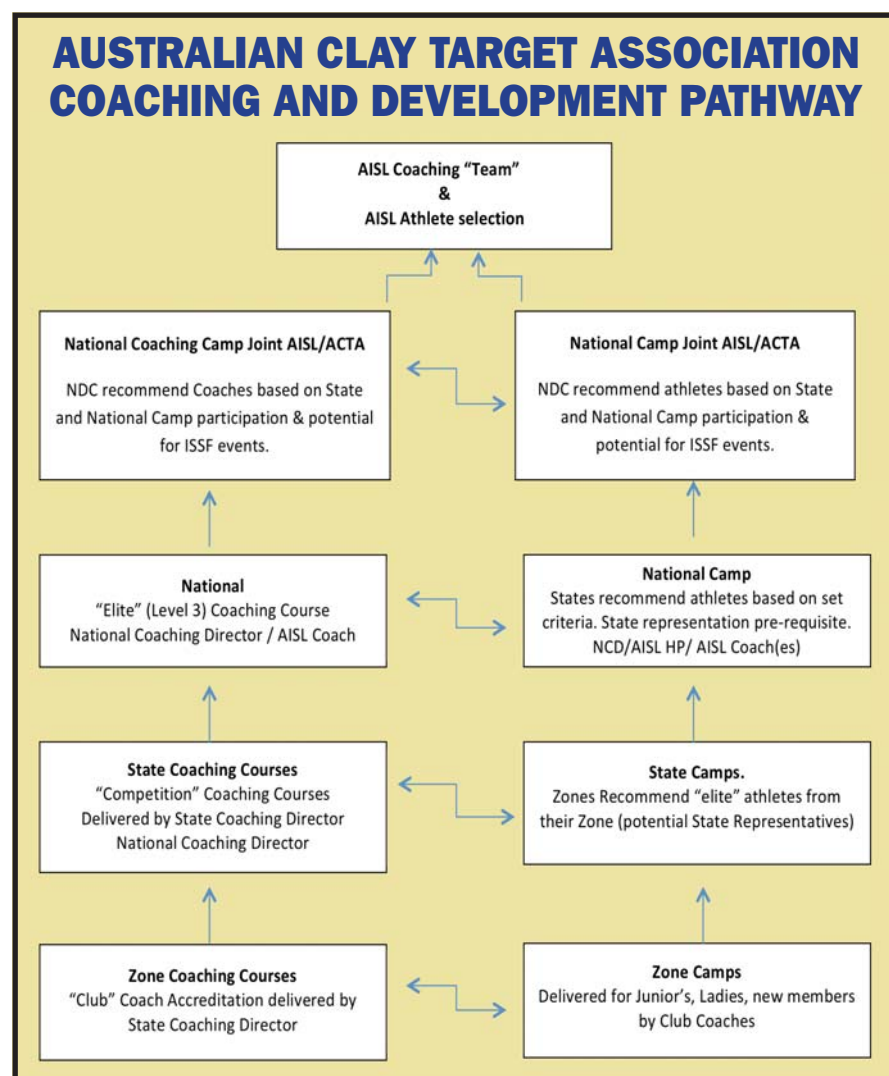
The A4G strategy targets AWE investment to have the greatest impact on performance at the Olympic Games, Paralympic Games, and World Championships; our finite resources will have little significant impact if spread too thinly. Therefore, to be competitive on the world stage, we must maintain a performance focus or we run the risk of investing simply in participation in international competitions.

And achieving AWE results will only occur if we focus upon process related factors rather than concentrating on the outcome; it is understood that, provided the process steps are in place, the outcome will usually follow.

Many initiatives have already occurred since the employment of a dedicated full-time High Performance Manager in April 2013:

- A revised High Performance Plan aligned to the key performance drivers that are critical in achieving success. These key drivers revolve around athletes, coaching, leadership, daily training environment, competition, research & innovation and partnerships.
- The establishment of a new HP squad structure and criteria linked to the AWE nomenclature;
- The confirmation of key performance targets for our benchmark events;
- Realignment of the timing of squads to an November to October timeframe;
- The introduction of an application and selection process for the A4G squad;
- Individualised Athlete Performance Plans addressing athlete needs both on and off the range;
- Realignment of the High Performance Joint Management Committee to a High Performance Committee;
- Re-engaging with the State Institute/Academy network to enrich the daily training environment of our shooters;
- Working with our discipline sport partners to ensure athlete pathways are aligned; and
- A full review of our PQS system to determine if it contributes or inhibits the achievement of AWE outcomes.

There is no guarantee these initiatives will ultimately deliver the success we are striving for. However, best practice shows these initiatives increase the probability of success and that in itself would give us a competitive advantage to our competitors.

2014 ACTA ACADEMY

Training Camps, Criteria Upgrade



Members will be aware the ACTA is advertising for a Coaching Director/National Coach in this edition of the CTSN (see page 8).

As an integral component of the position the ACTA will establish the ACTA Academy. This structure will allow the ACTA to bring athletes into a structured program. Where possible we will be aligning the program with high performance institutes and academies.

The opportunity to foster greater cooperation with existing elite sporting programs, whilst having particular regard for the requirements of our specific sport, should ensure the Association achieves the desired outcome for the athletes and stakeholders involved.

Our target areas encompass all disciplines, obviously working closely with the Australian International Shooting Limited to achieve an agreed set of objectives in the area of key performance indicators for ISSF.

Selection in the Academy squad will be based on a number of factors including grade, recognised potential and commitment. Once selected the athletes will be given the opportunity to enter an agreement with the ACTA Academy that will include

updating details of their training program, goal setting, etc. Through partnerships with other organisations the ACTA Academy will provide training in the areas of sports psychology, nutrition for sport, strength and conditioning, goal setting and evaluation, time management and other relevant ancillary programs such as "Drugs in Sport", "Dealing with the Media", as well as seeking sponsorship opportunities.

Selection in the ACTA Academy will be for one year and based on all of the above. All athletes will need to be AA Grade and have attended State or National camps or achieved at National level.

In the first year the National Coaching Director, Chair of the Coaching Committee and the Executive Officer will have the discretion to exempt athletes where they could not reasonably have achieved some of the criteria, given it is a new program.



The Academy will have the NCD and "Guest" coaches attend camps and where possible the NCD or the AISL coach will have regular contact via email and skype with the athletes.

Athletes need to accept the terms and conditions that will be provided. The agreement will be ready to implement in January of 2014.

NSW Trap Carnival

How about the fact that this win was the last one he needed to complete a full set of Australian Trap High Guns. That's right. He now has a Gold badge from every State (and the NT) of Australia to go with his Gold Australia Badge from 2003. Throw in his Macintosh High Gun that year and his State Team High Gun last year and it's no wonder he has three Doug Smith Medals pinned onto the lapel of his navy blazer.

Also flying low

Let me diverge for a moment. Credit to NSWCTA for allowing me to become creative on Double Barrel day. The time we saved by deferring the Single Barrel shoot-off to the end of the day allowed us to reach 400 in the Double Barrel shoot-off before it got too dark

Then after shooting another 147 targets the next day to also win the Point Score he appeared to fade away. Not so! By shooting all the targets in the State Postal Team, combined with 14 targets he carried in from the Single Barrel, he finished the weekend on 862

Under the radar

The other two shooters involved were a bit of a quandary. Their visible achievements hid what I see as even greater feats. The major prize at any State

straight. But wait, there's more! That was 862 "not out" because he didn't eventually miss, he just ran out of shooting. And the current Annual 15m Long Break is only 904. If only!!

AA Elite Update

As I said last month, AA Elite is still a "work in progress". This is further evidenced by the fact that a separate notice in this magazine advises some changes to both the written criteria and the application form to clarify the seriousness of the commitment that inclusion into this new grading concept brings with it. Some of the most frequently asked questions about AA Elite are in relation to how and why it came into being. It was conceived at the 2011 Skeet Nationals by a group of disgruntled shooters discussing the inequity and National embarrassment caused by a minority of established AA shooters competing in lower grades both here in Australia and overseas.

An innovative solution

As any further attempts to legislate the problem away seemed to be a waste of time it was decided to adopt a completely different approach and try to lead from the front by example. Initially a couple of them sought permission from the National Office to have their handicap cards marked "AA for life" which evolved into a submission to the National President for a new grade to be established called AAA. This would be a voluntary permanent upgrade available to AA shooters who would then no longer be required to fill in a Handicap Card and would shoot in AA with a handicap of 0 for the balance of their career. The concept was viewed in isolation by the proponents as a solution to an existing Skeet shooting problem and no thought was given as to whether or how Trap shooting would be affected.

Approval

The President listed this matter for consideration at the next Full Executive meeting in June. After some discussion the basic concept was approved. Then there was further discussion as to how it could be applied to Trap shooting. And finally it was decided to introduce some ISSF flavour by changing the name from AAA to AA Elite. Unfortunately this change has opened up a whole new can of worms and has given the concept an unintended ego slant that was never originally envisaged.

Unforeseen problems

This has created a few problems, particularly in the Trap shooting fraternity, but hopefully we can navigate our way through that in time. Anyway, the end product was the passing of a motion which stated "Shooters may request to remain in AA grade for life and we would suggest then that their card have written on it AA Elite. And to be able to request this, the shooter must be a AA 0 skeet shooter or a AA 25 metre trap shooter. We would strike a badge with the words AA Elite."

Formalisation

This motion was then passed on to the ACTA

Hall of Fame Committee to put into effect by creating the relevant criteria documents and producing the required application forms. During this process a serious imbalance in the degree of difficulty for inclusion between Trap and Skeet was realized, as all AA Skeet shooters have a 0 handicap but only a minority of AA Trap shooters are on 25 metres and additionally this problem was exacerbated by the unintended inclusion of the "Elite" aura. In an attempt to rectify these anomalies it was decided to add the requirement of 50 Hall of Fame points to the Skeet criteria and

to include the same in Trap on an either/or basis.

Reversal

At the same time and after much "on again off again" deliberation, it was eventually decided to address the issue of potential reversal. It was thought that isolated cases may arise where, due to unforeseen and extreme circumstances, some previous applicants might have a justifiable case for a return to the conventional grading system. Thus a somewhat generic opt-out clause was added and all these various terms and conditions were approved by the National Executive in February 2012.

Clarification

However it is now believed that both the intent of AA Elite grading to be a lifelong commitment and the serious restrictions of the opt-out clause, which were only ever intended to apply on extremely extenuating medical grounds, were not spelt out clearly enough in either the original criteria document or the application form. For these reasons both the

criteria and the wording of the application form were amended as at October 1st, 2013 and all previous applicants have been advised in writing of a temporary unconditional opt-out amnesty to address any potential misunderstandings.

Consequently the Application Forms for both Trap and Skeet have been reworded accordingly and all AA Elite shooters who signed applications prior to 30-09-2013 will be sent a revised application form to sign and return to the National Office. Those shooters who applied after that date are not affected.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WHY SHOULD WE HAVE A PRESHOT ROUTINE?

During the September school holidays, I spent some time with the Junior Development Squad again. We started off the sessions by looking at their pre shot routines. Initially, it was difficult for them to recognise what they do before each shot and then even harder to put into words, what they do and why they do it.

Anyone who plays golf knows the importance of "addressing the ball". It is the moment when you have put the ball on the tee and placed your feet in the correct position and sit the club behind the ball, ready to commence the swing. In shooting the process is pretty much the same. For the skeet shooter it is walking onto the pad and setting your feet in the right position, for the sporting shooter it happens when you walk into the cage and position yourself, and for the trap shooter it happens when you step onto the next mark and position yourself ready to shoot the next target.

But a pre shot routine is just not about putting your feet in the right position although where to stand is an important aspect of the pre shot routine. The pre shot routine is the switch for you to change your level of attention. It is the trigger for you to start to concentrate.

According to Burton and Raedeke (2008) Attention is the process that directs our awareness to information available through our senses. Most of the time our senses are attacked and bombarded with stimuli. For instance you may be reading this article but you might also become aware of external stimuli of something cooking and you may feel hungry. You might smell something burning and you might feel worried. When you notice certain sensory information you make a decision on what action to take and this process requires attention. Thus, according to Raedeke and Burton, attention involves perceiving sensory information and using it to make decisions and choose responses. The sensory information in shooting can involve smell (the smell of the burnt gun-powder), touch (the feel of the gun in your shoulder, the recoil, the weight of the gun, the feeling of the sun on your neck, wind or rain on your face, etc), sight (the target flying through the air, the target smashing or the target not breaking at all) and hearing (the gun closing, the explosion, the call of the referee).

Each sport is unique in the sensory information that needs to be attended to for an Ideal Performance State (IPS). Nideffer (a renowned US sports Psychologist) has developed an applied theory of concentration, which should be considered by all athletes and coaches. To understand this theory it is necessary to realise that for each of us an optimal level of arousal will coincide with efficient use of attentional capacities; this is referred to as our ideal performing state (IPS). At this IPS, we efficiently match the attentional demands of the situation with use of appropriate type of concentration. When we are not at our ideal performing state it is because the types of attentional focus becomes inefficient and mismatched with the situational demands. Nideffer believes that we all have an individual concentration style, which means that we have characteristic ways of using our attentional capabilities. Nideffer describes concentration as being either broad or narrow. An analogy here is like a torch with a variable beam: broad type of concentration is when the beam is broad and wide and narrow type, is when the beam is focused on a small point. Jeffery Bond argues that Nideffer

also sees influences on concentration as either external or internal. We can now measure our concentration style in each of these types of concentration:

1. Broad - External: awareness of everything that is going on around - seeing, hearing, feeling. Necessary for good court/field vision. Probably more critical in team sports than individual
2. Narrow - External: Ability to concentrate in a focused way, to focus on the one thing, to narrow onto the relevant aspects of a task. Very useful in target sports and as a way of blocking distractions.
3. Broad - Internal: Need to analyse, organise and plan. The ability to mix it with what is going on and draw some logical conclusions. Being able to deal with a large number of ideas at the one time.
4. Narrow - Internal: Ability to focus on a single thought or idea and stay with it. Needed to enhance awareness of aspects of body reactions to stress (tight muscles, too high heart rate, etc) usually indicates extreme dedication and capacity to follow instructions, to stick to a performance plan.

Beyond focusing on the task relevant cues (attention) shooters need to be able to block out all internal and external distractions. This ability to sustain focus and effectively block out distractions is called concentration. Effective concentration allows shooters to apply appropriate attention to the internal and external cues. According to Perry, a shooter who can focus, or pay attention, on the task at hand and avoid distractions enjoys the greatest possibility of success.

So, this is the secret. And we need to use the pre shot routine to help us narrow or focus of attention so that we only focus on the target. The difficult part is, we have to do it every time we step onto the tracks or into a cage to address the target. So when we are shooting twenty five targets we have to have our 'one shot' pre shot routine twenty five times. Because our attention broadens (when we are not shooting) and narrows when we are about to shoot, we have to learn how to turn on and off continually.

Therefore, our pre shot routine can have a number of steps.

Walking on to the pad, track or into the cage.

Putting our feet in the correct position.

Taking a breath to centre yourself.

Closing your gun.

Mounting the gun for the gun up disciplines or holding the gun ready for the gun down disciplines.

While this process is being followed the focus of attention will be moving from broad to narrow. When this has occurred, you are ready to call 'pull'. Our pre shot routine is the all-important step required to change our focus from broad to narrow: from the environment to the target. We can make the pre-shot routine more sophisticated and elaborate by adding visualisation. We will deal this in the future.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
3. The tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and, where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of **15 Pair (30 targets)** with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Friday 3rd January 2014. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.**
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.**
11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the Jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only in Double Traps. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. **All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).**

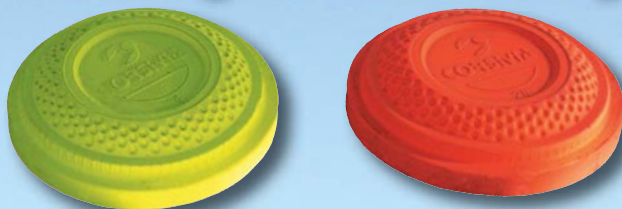

Hay Gun Club in partnership with Murrumbidgee Catchment Authority

The Hay Gun has successfully completed a grant partnership with the Murrumbidgee Catchment Authority Native revegetation and rabbit eradication on the Hay Gun Club Grounds.

The project included the removal of rabbits and rabbit warrens. The Gun Club has been plagued with rabbits over the past few years as the site was once used as a dumping area. The increase of noxious weeds on the grounds had provided the perfect breeding area for the pests.

Through clearing of the block, and the introduction of fresh loam, the Club has improved the health of the soil and improved the water use efficiency. Over 100 native trees have been planted along the boundary fencing and will provide a more stable habitat for local native birds and other wild life.

The removal of the pest rabbits and weeds will reduce the destruction of the lawned areas of the Gun Club, Pigeon Club and the Showground. Turf has been laid along traps 3 and 4.

This Grant has been an enormous help to the Club in gearing up to the 2014 Easter Carnival Shoot. The Club has benefited greatly from workshops and working bees.

Members and visitors are reminded that the Club shoots every 4th Sunday of the month and the club has now introduced practice shoot days.

The Club welcomes new members and spectators to the Grounds and also people are invited to come along and look through the Club house photos dating back to the early 1900's.
