Executive Officer's Report

The National Executive meeting is being conducted under a new format in 2015 to allow for a comprehensive review of the aims, objectives and opportunities of the Association. The review will look at the opportunities and direction of the Association in the medium to long term.

The results of this review will be pivotal in setting the strategic direction of the Association into the future. Whilst not pre-empting the outcomes, I have highlighted some areas that will be addressed at the meeting.

The review will include the structure of the Association, always a controversial issue with any association, however one that needs to be addressed based on the needs of the Association in moving forward. In the current climate it is not sufficient that members holding Executive positions have the right intentions, they must have the right skillset to offer the body they represent. There may be new processes to have elected members on the Executive. There is also the need within the Association to have the right balance of "specialist" business skills on the governing body.

There are examples of many sporting organisations in Australia "seeking" these specialists as "Non-Executive" members, that is they are sought out because of their expertise. If it is available through the membership that would be a bonus.

President Allan Vilcins has highlighted that the Sub Committees' structure is not ideal and is not producing the desired results. This can be addressed simply by modifying the "terms of reference" of these bodies. With numerous sub-committee roles intertwining it is more practical to have

these sub-committee's amalgamated to ensure the "ripple effect" of decisions is addressed. When decisions are made there are ramifications down the line and I give as an example a rule change, any rule change has an effect on Clubs, States and National competition. With Rules, Championships, Coaching and ISSF all working through one committee, any changes would be addressed by those involved at all levels.

Our structure of reporting will be reviewed with consideration given to how the Club, Zone, State, National structure works, is it effective? Do we have the correct communication process that allows National matters to be directed down the most efficient path to allow them to be addressed.

As stated I am not pre-empting any changes, however these are just some of the issues we need to address whilst planning the future direction of the Association. When strategic planning is mentioned many organisations choose to put their head in the sand when it is really an easy process. The questions that needs to be asked: Where did we come from? Where are we now? Where are we going? How do we get there? Answering these questions give us the information required to then make the decisions that allow us to make informed decision on the Association for the future of the Association. Remember, your State Executive elected delegates to the Association are your link to the National Body, talk to them and be prepared to offer constructive suggestions, we are listening.

Rule Interpretation

QUESTION

Hi

I had an occasion at a shoot recently as a referee where I gave a shooter a "no target" for a clay that came out of the trap house on its edge straight up in the air. The shooter hit the target which I called a "no target" which he then repeated with a legal target

Discussion after the completion of the day gave me the impression I may have been incorrect with this decision, as consensus was that the target was unbroken so should not have been given as a "no target". Checking through the latest rule book showed that on the face of it, it was a legal target, but looking at clause 4.04 on page 37 gives a clear indication of what a legal target is, it's not a clay on its side going straight up. This target had no affect on the competition but I would like to have a ruling on this for future reference as I do like to be correct with my referee duties.

ANSWER

This is a very easy question to answer and is covered in the Rule book in 2 instances.

Rule 1.06 clearly specifies that the target MUST NOT be fired at to be called a "no target", or else be a broken target when it leaves the trap.

The other is Guideline no. 17 "Interpretation of refusal rule":

- 17. Interpretation of refusal rule:
- (a) A shooter may refuse to shoot at any target which he considers to be illegal.
- (b) There is no limit to the number of targets the shooter may refuse as long as the Referee agrees with the reasons. Obviously, if too many targets are refused for illegality, the Referee must find the cause, then correct it. If the Referee does not consider that the target refused is illegal, he will ask the shooter why he refused the target. If the Referee is not satisfied with the reason he will tell the shooter. He will also state that any further targets which are refused, and are considered by the Referee to be legal will be scored "Lost Target". If the above situation seems likely to arise, it is preferable that a third party, qualified if possible, adjudicates subsequent refusals. The foregoing procedure in no

way discriminates against the Referee, it is meant to assist in equity of competition. A major point missed by Referees is that although a shooter may refuse to shoot at an illegal target, he is equally entitled to accept an illegal target. However, if he shoots at and misses an illegal target, the only decision open to the Referee is "Lost Target". Similarly, if he hits it "one" or "two" is scored, abide by result.

- (c) A Referee should not call "No Target" for a fast or slow released target, nor if the target seems to him to be too high, too low or too wide. "No Target" should only be called in the case of a broken target, a pair of targets emerging instead of a single (or vice versa), or where a safety hazard exists if a shooter elects to shoot at the target.
- (d) Referees are to ensure that "R" for refusal is entered on scorecards. Every refusal must be called either "No Target" or "Lost Target" by the Referee.

The simple answer to the question is that the Referee made an error of judgement.

If the target was a complete target and was fired at by the shooter then the result of the shot must stand. Abide by result.

FLYING FOX CARNIVAL

TAREE WINGHAM CLAY TARGET CLUB **APRIL 24, 2015**

The Taree Wingham Clay Target Club's Flying Fox Carnival is done and dusted for another year. In the lead up to the weekend the Newcastle and Sydney Metropolitan areas were inundated with the most amount of rainfall in two consecutive days in 168 years and the phone at the club was ringing hot asking if the shoot was still on. Fortunately the rainfall did not reach the Taree-Wingham area and the shoot was full steam ahead. Caravans and campers rolled into the club grounds a week prior to the official carnival in the hopes of securing the prime camping spots

and to escape the rain further south. The club grounds were looking fabulous thanks to the dedicated members who put in a grateful effort to showcase the lovely grounds. The 2015 carnival kicked off on Friday 24th April with official practice and principal sponsors Hunts Shooting Supplies providing a number of Perazzi guns for people to try on the practice trap. Michael Hunt was kept busy with stock adjustments and alterations as shooters





ing the possible, which was surprising considering the class of shooters in attendance and the near perfect shooting conditions. 18 shooters were one target down with 24/25 and after a shoot off places 5th and 4th were decided with Rod Haug & Steve Wallis taking these places respectively. The shoot off to determine 1st-3rd commenced and lasted 4 targets before local Club President and handicap specialist Peter Ryan dropped a target to claim 3rd place. The shoot off continued between Tony Ryder (AA 23) and Peter Larcolmbe (B 17) and lasted until the 16th shoot-off target which Tony let fly free enabling Peter to claim the Handicap title and 5 slabs of GB ammunition.

Conditions remained perfect for the commencement of the second event, a 25t Points Score Championship sponsored by local club member Kerry Bourke, proprietor of Bourkes Transport Industries. As expected with the conditions a number of excellent scores were posted. C grade was taken out by Gary Maytom with an excellent 74/75 with Kevin Aitken taking 2nd



in C grade with 71/75. B grade was taken outright by Dan Thistleton who held his nerve and posted a well shot 73/75 with a shoot off required to find 2nd place in B grade. Colin Crighton and Lionel Finlay wowed the crowd and both shot well above their B grade averages smoking targets on their first barrel up until the 20th target when Col dropped a whole target. Lionel hit his next target and took out 2nd in B grade. A grade was won outright by Karen Berry with a 73/75 and 2nd place was secured by Peter Fiorenza with 72/75. AA Grade shoot off commenced with 5 shooting the possible. After a further 75 points Tony Ryder and John Reid decided to let fate decide the winner. Tony came up with the right call and claimed overall honours with John settling for 1st in AA.

The final event of the day was the Taree Leading Appliances 50t Double Barrel Continental Championship. With the traps switched over to continental the shooting began and the change in height and elevation fooled a number of shooters. C grade was taken out by local club member Allan Mudford with 50/54 after a shoot off with a red hot, in form Gary Maytom 49/54. B grade had an outright winner with Peter Larcolmbe claiming his second trophy of the day with 48/50, ahead of Colin Crighton on 47/50. A grade was a 3 way race for the title between Rob Marko, Terrie Busiko and Rod Haug. Nerves claimed the scalp of Terrie on the first target in the shoot-off quickly followed by Rod on his 4th target who settled for 2nd place and Rob Marko taking 1st in A grade. AA grade was an exciting chase for the title with shooters knowing a score of 50/50 would be required as a golden ticket into the shoot off. 9 shooters across 2 squads were in the shoot off for overall and AA grade. Squad I took to the tracks with Phil Baker the sole survivor of the squad, clean on 75/75. Squad 2 showed no signs of letting the title go with Arty Del-Ben, Glenn Kable, Vito Balliana and Nick Xenos all remaining clean. Shooters were re-squaded with Nick and Phil missing an identical low left hand target on their 81st. With conditions becoming darker it was only a matter of time until light would play a role in the decider. Vito would stumble on his 99th target with Glenn & Arty hitting 100/100. The two club mates decided that with the light fading a coin toss would decide the winner. Arty called heads and the coin landed heads up giving Arty bragging rights in the coin toss department, or as Arty would say in his thank you speech "A few people have called me a tosser and I guess I proved them right". Well shot gents and a great show of sportsmanship.

Overnight it was as if a switch was hit on the weather with a polarising cool and strong westerly wind blowing that had shooters reaching for their winter jackets. The 4th event of the carnival, the 25t Single Barrel Perazzi championship commenced. The strong blustery wind played havoc with the

clays and did not discriminate with shooters of all grades struggling. Charlie Sherry was the only shooter to post a possible and take out the title, a fitting win for a Perazzi user winning the Perazzi Championship. C grade was won by Russell Sainsbury with 21/25, 2nd in C grade was Allan Mudford with 24/32 after a shoot off 4 others including new shooter Adam Wilkinson who impressed in the tough conditions. The main event, the 19th annual Flying Fox sponsored by Hunts Shooting Supplies commenced in similar windy and cold conditions. The annual Flying Fox event consists of 25t Double Barrel and 25t Points Score shot in one walk as one event. A graders Steven Littlefield and Scott Anshaw put the field on notice early with a well shot 99/100 before the final wave of AA grade shooters took to the tracks knowing the door to the title was left open, however no possibles were posted amongst the elite shooters with 8 settling on 99/100. Under shoot off conditions, 5t Double Barrel followed by 5t Points Score with totals added after the 10t were

shot. Steven and Scott would exit the shoot off in respective order and claim A grade honours. After a further 50 points it came down to defending 2014 Flying Fox champion Phil Baker and Joe Camilleri. Another 40 points would be required to determine a winner with Joe missing a double barrel target and Phil holding his nerve to claim his second consecutive Flying Fox title with 159/160. B grade was won by Lionel Finaly and 2nd Peter Larcolmbe, while C grade was won by Gary Maytom and 2nd Kevin Aitken.

The final formal event of the programme, the 30t C&L Paving and Asphalt Champion of Champions Cash shoot, off 18m was underway by 2.00pm. A change in meterage back to 18m did not deter C graders Gary Maytom & Allan Mudford who were the two most consistent C graders all weekend with the pair tussling it out in yet another shoot-off. Gary came up trumps to win with 63/75, over Allan on 57/75. B grade was won outright by Lionel Finlay on 46/50 and Lee Maytom taking 2nd on 43/50, ensuring her husband Gary wasn't the only winner in the family. Steven Littlefield shot well to win A grade outright on 49/50 over Tammy Henshall one point behind on 48/50. Overall Champion of Champions Champion would be between Tony Ryder, Steven Caltabiano and Hank MacInnes. Steven bowed out in the early goings to settle for 2nd in AA grade while Tony & Hank continued shot for shot.

Hank would be the first to stumble on his 58th target and pull a second barrel, however as Hank stumbled, Tony fell and missed his target entirely dropping 3 points in the process which gave Hank the title and cash.

Once scores were calculated and High Guns were determine the inaugural Grand Champion shoot off sponsored by Leichts Tyre & Auto, an event exclusive to Taree Wingham CTC got underway with the overall and graded High Gun winners shooting 5t handicap until a grand champion was crowned. A short shootoff commenced and after 5t it came down to AA grade High Gun Tony Ryder and A grade High Gun Tammy Henshall. Tammy let the 7th



Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix BRISBANE GUN CLUB MARCH 13, 14, 15, 2015

Mid-March, and Brisbane Gun Club once again lived up to its reputation as one of Australia's premier Olympic discipline clay target venues, by conducting the annual Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix for the Olympic disciplines of trap and skeet.

This year, 2015, marked the 21st holding of the Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix which was first conducted in February, 1995. Over the years, the competition has attracted many of the World's best shooters including Olympic Gold Medallists, World Champions, Commonwealth Games medallists and National Champions from throughout the Pacific region, Asia, Europe and the Americas.

As is always the case, this year's Grand Prix was well attended by international, interstate and local shooters alike, and it was with pleasure this year that we welcomed a very enthusiastic group of shooters from Papua-New Guinea. Again, we also welcomed a contingent of some 35 shooters from Japan's Top Gun Club, which has enjoyed our competition and the generous sponsorship of Winchester Australia for many years.

The established program of 250 targets of Olympic Trap and 200 targets of ISSF Skeet was once again well embraced by those in attendance, in particular the trap shooters who this year would

have the opportunity of perhaps sharing in the 10 rounds of 'Skins' which would be on offer during the 3 days of competition.

Friday, the first day of the weekend's competition, saw the conducting of the popular Olym-

of the popular Olympic Trap Skins Badge match which as always gave competitors the opportunity to build towards the weekend's event, and at the same time participate in the 100 target competition which includes 4 rounds of graded Skins.

The established procedures were once again in place and shooters were again divided into two groups AA and A Grades combined and B and C grades combined, with \$10 of each shooter's nomination fee pooled for each of the four rounds of the event. The established rules are that the highest score in the group wins the prize

money for that round, and if two or three shooters have the same score in the round, the prize money is shared. If however, four or more shooters shoot the equal highest score, the prize money is held over and jackpots to the next round.

The first of the seven squads entered for the Olympic Trap Skins event kicked off the morning with a leisurely 10.00am start, and it was obvious as usual that the competition for the Skins prize money throughout the day would be hotly contested. In the AA/A group, Sam Bylsma of Bundaberg, Justin Hitchins and Brisbane member Fernando Cilli. all recorded 23/25 to share



the \$80 skins in the round. The B/C group was shared with 24/25 by local members Franco Di Bartolmeo and Scott Dobeli who both pocketed \$160, the first of a number of cash envelopes they would be receiving over the weekend.

Round two, with good shooting conditions, the AA/A group was shared by local member Michael Cilli with 23/25. The B/C section this time around was won by relative new comer to Olympic Trap shooting, Shaun Ezzy of Brisbane, who carded 23/25 to take the money.

After the half-way point of the day's proceedings,

AA shooter Dan Johnson of Warwick, had the first possible score of 25/25 to take the money in the AA/A group, while Corey Bylsma of Bundaberg won the B/C section with 22/25 to collect \$330 in that group.

The final round of the day again saw Dan Johnson in the money, this time sharing with fellow Warwick member and long term supporter, Greg Newey, recording 23/25 to share the group. The B/C section went to Kurt Goody of Callide Dawson Gun Club, who pocketed the \$330 with 24/25.

100 target Skins Badge Match: AA Grade Dan Johnson (Warwick) 91/100, A Grade Justin Hitchins (Hobart) 87/100, B Grade Filip Markovic (International) 85/100, C Grade Shaun Ezzy (Brisbane) 83/100, Junior Sam Bylsma (Bundaberg) 86/100, Lady Erin Stewart (Kingaroy) 79/100, Veteran Greg Newey (Warwick) 86/100.

The first day of the 150 target Olympic Trap Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix also saw a Skins competition held in conjunction, with the field now expanded to 12 squads with the inclusion of the Japanese visitors. Again, the competition for the spoils was fierce, and it has been said on a number of occasions that during the skins competition you really find out who your friends are.

Skins throughout the day were evenly distributed with Sam Bylsma (2), and Dan Johnson (2)

sharing the money from the AA/A section while Erin Stewart, Franco Di Bartolomeo, Terry Heslin, Phillip Kellar and Col Gurski all shared in the B/C pools.

At the conclusion of the first day of the Olympic Trap event, with only 50 targets and a final to be shot on Sunday, Dan Johnson (95/100) was two targets ahead of promising junior Sam Bylsma (93/100), while a number of others including Kevin Perkins and Kurt Goody were all hovering looking for a position in the finals.

Sam Bylsma started well on Sunday recording

49/50 for his final rounds to finish at the top of the leaders board with 142/150, while Dan Johnson who had also shot consistently over the two days ended on 140/150 to be second qualifier. Next into the new-system 15 target single barrel semi-final were Kevin Perkins, Kurt Goody, Scott Dobeli and Japanese visitor Masahiro Ichimura, who took the last position following a shoot off with Warwick's Greg Newey.

While all this was happening, Skins were also still being won. In the AA/A group, Sam Bylsma picked up two Skins for the morning and in Heslin and Angus Donald (PNG) all shared the spoils. After the 4 rounds in the Badge match and the 6 rounds in the Grand Prix event, the total paid out in Skins money for the weekend was \$5,760.

At the conclusion of the 15 target semi-final. former Champion, Kevin Perkins, was into the Gold/Silver final with 13/15, while Kurt Goody, Masahiro Icimura, Samuel Bylsma and Dan Johnson all scored 11/15 to enter into a sudden death shoot off to determine the 3 shooters

Launch of Parliamentary Friends of Shooting a great success

Olympic and Commonwealth Games gold medallists Michael Diamond and Laetisha Scanlan were the guests of honour at the recent launch of the Parliamentary Friends of Shooting event held at Parliament House in Canberra.

The Nationals Senator for Victoria Bridget McKenzie launched the Parliamentary Friends of Shooting in March, in an effort to raise awareness about sporting and recreational shooting among parliamentarians. Senator McKenzie said sporting and recreational shooters were often demonised in the mainstream media for participating in a pastime that is not only legal but delivers significant social, economic and environmental benefits to Australia.

"Shooting often cops a bad rap in the mainstream media by commentators who are misinformed." Senator McKenzie said.

"Shooting has produced a number of Olympic, Commonwealth and World champions such as Michael Diamond, Laetisha Scanlan and Russell Mark.

"The public is happy to support these champions every four years when they are winning gold for Australia but outside of this the sport can be frowned upon – I am committed to changing this.

"In my home state of Victoria we know recreation hunting contributes around \$440 million per year to the local economy, much of that in regional Victoria.

"Our farmers rely on shooting to humanely cull invasive pests such as rabbits, foxes and deer, while also delivering significant environmental benefits.

"Many thousands of Victorian's also compete at sporting shooting clubs each and every weekend in events such as clay target shooting, with the best of those going on to compete for higher honours.

"Shooting is wonderful activity which I have proudly participated in for many years and I want to see it get the credit it deserves.

"We know our licensed firearms owners are seldom responsible for any of the horrible gun crimes such as the recent Martin Place Siege, yet if you picked-up your newspaper or listened to the constant harping from Greens Senators such as Penny Wright you may think otherwise.

"Through the Parliamentary Friends of Shooting I hope to begin to change these negative perceptions about shooting. I would even strongly encourage the Greens to come along, meet with those who participate in the sport, farmers and recreational hunters to help dispel some of the myths."

Senator McKenzie said following the launch of Parliamentary Friends of Shooting many Members and Senators had expressed interest in joining and had said they would love to learn more about the sport and even have the opportunity to use a firearm.

"Our launch in March was the beginning of what will be an important association," Senator McKenzie said.

"To give Members and Senators the opportunity to hear from Michael Diamond about the thrill he got from winning gold for Australia in front of his home crowd in Sydney, or how Laetisha Scanlan begged her dad to let her try out the sport before going onto to win gold at the Delhi and Glasgow Commonwealth Games was truly a great moment.

"For our next event we plan on holding a clay target shooting day in the very near future, where Members and Senators will have the opportunity to try the sport first hand."

Cazzo's Kamblings

JULY 2015

The fact that a large number of people still contact me and ask questions that illustrate the fact that they do not understand how the Hall of Fame concept works has prompted me to try to offer a detailed explanation of it this month. The basis of the whole thing is a point system. Each calendar year a finite list of specific events are allocated points for results attained at State, National and World Championship level.

Geography Criteria

State wins are acceptable from every State and Territory of Australia. At the moment this encompasses all six States and the Northern Territory, however in times past the ACT has conducted "State" carnivals. Such historic results are eligible and would still be if the ACT decided to resurrect these Carnivals. National results are acceptable from Australia, New Zealand and the United States. World results are acceptable in Trap from both the Grand American Trapshoot and the World DTL Championships conducted by the ICTSF. World results for Skeet are only accepted from the NSSA World Skeet Shoot.

Specified Events

For Trapshooting there are eight events that are eligible each year for point allocation. For simplicity they are the eight major events conducted at the Nationals. They are Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points Score, Double Rise, Handicap, Champion of Champions, Overall High Gun and (Mackintosh) Team High Gun. For Skeet Shooting there are five events that are currently eligible. They are 12gauge, 20gauge, Doubles, Handicap and Overall High Gun. Unlike Trap where the designated events date back a long way, Skeet had fairly slim pickings up until relatively recent times. The National Championship didn't start until 1970 and State Carnivals didn't appear until almost the end of that decade. However recently

the pendulum has swung the other way and in order to achieve a more balanced degree of difficulty between Trap and Skeet, the eligible events list was capped at the above five. For both Trap and Skeet the only other relevant proviso is that specified events must be conducted at the designated Carnival and if "stand-alone" events are held, they are ineligible at this time.

The Arithmetic

World Championship events attract 50 points for a win and 20 points for runner-up. National events attract 20 points for a win and 10 points for runner-up. State events only attract points for a win and at the rate of 10 per each. Induction into the National Hall of Fame requires a minimum of 200 points but has the additional proviso that such totals must include at least three National wins. Induction into State Halls of Fame is obtained by simply accumulating 100 points without any other "fine print".

Rare Exceptions

The only deviations from this strict points requirement relate to "ancient" historic situations before any such point system gained relevance and a small number of truly eminent shooters have been accepted on a "known ability" basis and are already inducted. No further such exceptions are envisaged. Each year I create points charts in order to establish our annual medal winners and to document our major event history for that particular year for posterity. In order to illustrate the above explanation I have included last year's Trapshooting results chart. Enjoy!

The rest of the list still competes regularly and I certainly enjoy seeing them continue to embellish their reputations.

May's Trivia Question

The fact that the young girl (she was 16 at the time) in the photograph standing in front of the dais is Pud Burgess' daughter is purely coincidental. Although all four of Pud's children shot clay targets at various times, Louise (Machul) is certainly the most accomplished of them, although I must admit that Pud and Victor were a very formidable Deauville Doubles team. She won a couple of NSW Ladies Team High Guns as well as the Ladies section in each of the Mackintosh events (DB, SB & PS) at the Nationals at various times. She is a link in the chain of five generations of trapshooters starting with her great grandfather as her son Ben has already started accumulating Open Hall of Fame points. I was surprised by the number of "correct" answers this month (all bar one and that was a good guess) and the first of those drawn was submitted by Robbie Thomson. As he is from Cobar I considered disqualifying on insider trading grounds, but as he is such a nice bloke I couldn't bring myself to do it.

This Month's Trivia Question

The fact that I felt obliged to include the clue that Desiree was not the correct answer to May's

Trivia Question speaks volumes in itself. Desiree had won the Ladies section of the National Double Barrel event for the two years previous to Louise's win in 1977 and went on to win it four more times during the next six years, prior to going into "trapshooting retirement" for almost a decade. She is unquestionably the greatest lady trapshooter in ACTA history, as evidenced by the fact that she has almost three times as many hall of fame points as the next best lady.

Absolute Domination

The Ladies High Gun award at the Nationals commenced in 1974 with Eley donating a very impressive perpetual trophy for this new section. The timing could not have been better for a little blonde 13 year old girl from Mildura who was just starting to hit her straps. She not only put her name on this trophy in it's inaugural year but went on to add it every year bar one for the first eleven years,

before entering the retirement period referred to above. Since reappearing again in the early 90s she has added another six wins, including another three in a row between 1992 and 1994 for a total of sixteen as at 2015.

Psychological Skills for Shooting


WHAT CAN THE SCORE SHEET TELL US?

Every week when we shoot, a part of us ends up on the score sheet. It may not be our DNA but it is a snapshot of our per-


formance in that event, at that time.

Can we use the score sheet to our advantage? Can we interpret the range of Is and 0s to tell us more than just how we performed in that event.


The following table might be a squad of 5 shooters anywhere, shooting any discipline. It may be DTL, single barrel, double barrel or points score, skeet, ball trap, trench, sporting or field and game. The discipline is irrelevant to this exercise, other than the shooter is presented with 25 targets



If we take shooter number I, it is easy to read this score and assume that he is a good shot. We see he/she is able to hit the targets, so his/her gun fit is probably correct, good combination of gun and ammunition, possibly good conditions.




What does his/her performance tell us about his/her mental skills? It is likely that our shooter here is able to maintain his concentration for the complete round. He/she has probably learnt to focus on the process of shooting the targets rather than the product or the score. This shooter is probably confident in his/her own ability and has worked out how to regulate his/her attention to the target. The shooter has the ability to narrow the focus of attention to deal with the target being presented. This assumption is even more likely if we look at the same row of targets but a different score at the end.



This shooter is able to concentrate, attend to the targets and rely on his or her pre-shot routine. This is what we all want to achieve.

If we look at shooter number two. Again it is a good score. It shows that the shooter has the ability to shoot targets and that the gun probably fits well. What is different here is the score.




If we focus on the 24 as a failure then we are doing the shooter an injustice, because he /she can shoot. If we look at it and say there was I lapse of concentration, then we will be closer to the mark. Missing one target means that you let your mind wander and because it was the first target missed it is likely that the shooter just wasn't ready. His mind (read concentration, focus, attention) was not ready to tackle the target. This is where pre-shot routine is important of some ritual that you develop to focus your attention on the task at hand when you start shooting. This might be a physical signal or a verbal instruction to yourself to switch on your focus.

Shooter three has again demonstrated an ability to shoot and shoot well, but this time the lapse of concentration, being the last target, tells us that the shooter had moved away from the present (shooting the target) and started to focus on the future, his score, the trophy, the high gun, etc.



To shoot well and to concentrate continually means you have to remain in the present. Focusing on the future will distract you and lead to a missed target.

Shooter four is also showing good shooting but a real problem with staying focused. For this shooter, we see again a score that represents good shooting. The lapse of concentration on target two might have been due to being not ready, focusing on the future, wind, change in light, etc.



The important target to look at here is target 8, which is also missed. This target could have missed because the shooter had left thinking in the present and had thought about missing the target before. When we think about the past we will miss because we are thinking about our previous mistakes, making judgements about ourselves or our abilities, and not focusing on the task at hand: shooting this target (not the one missed earlier). If the shooter went on to miss targets from the same pad over and over, then there maybe some fear about that target creeping in. Again this means that the shooter is in the future and not the present.

Finally, shooter number five, seems to be shooting well and then because of a lapse of concentration, 'loses it'. What happens here is that the shooter is angry, annoyed, cranky about missing the target so when the next target is thrown he/she is still in the past, thinking about the lost target, and misses again. Whe the next target is thrown he/she has moved his/her thinking to the future (worrying about his score, percentage, losing the prize, etc) that he/she misses again.



Now he/she tenses up and in an effort to try harder and because his/her muscles are not fluid, he/she misses again. The shooter here has decided to take a couple of deep breaths, focus on the process of shooting the target and let the product look after itself. By doing this he/she is back on track.

So just don't walk off the layout next time you shoot. Take a look at the scoresheet and look at how you can use the array of Is and 0s to tell how and where you should be focusing your attention.

Remember to focus on the target by attending to the process and let the product look after itself.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another sporting association to which we grant reciprocal rights.
- 2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 4. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 5. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi, battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot Marshal, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 6. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
- 8. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 10. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 11. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 12. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 13. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 14. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 15. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, ACTA to adjudicate.
- 21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 23. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 24. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.


