Presidents Notes



Elections

During the executive meeting held recently, I was returned as ACTA National President. Thank you to all who have supported me during this process and to those that have sent congratulations since. I will certainly not be perfect but I will try to give you a 100% effort. On behalf of all members I wish to thank my predecessor, Mr. Allan Vilcins for the time and effort he put in during his term. The position, although honorary, comes with a great responsibility to all members. It is rarely easy to please everybody but I am sure Allan believed

he was always acting in the greater interest within the limitations under which we operate. Allan introduced quite a few processes and procedures to the governance of the ACTA and these will help guide us into the future.

Congratulations to Mr. Rob Fox for being re-elected as Vice President and to new Vice President, Mr. Mal Dyson. Other honorary officers include Mr. Alan Styles as Treasurer and Mr. Gary Hayden as Secretary. The executive officers column will explain the structure we have adopted for the next year in more detail, and also where we want to be in the future.

Those of you that know me will understand that I am very outcome driven and sometimes have been accused of skirting process or procedure. Whilst I won't apologise for this I will try to operate completely within the limitations that exist.

CTSN

Welcome all members to the second edition of the Clay Target Shooting News (CTSN) in its new format. The aim is to produce the same size magazine, generally 64 pages, but with better quality paper for photographs and advertising. The limitation has always been the weight restriction imposed on us by the postal category we need to fit into. Thanks to Jim Shepherd for the great work to get us to this stage.

Executive Meetings

Many decisions were made during the meetings but as the minutes are not yet approved I can't really comment on many of the complex matters. However some simple and clear decisions were made that I can report.

- Existing ACTA Uniform policy adopted for all ACTA events across all disciplines.
- The appointment of a second patron is under investigation.
- Adoption of a National Charity on an annual basis is under investigation.
- Proposed rules changes to be considered by a State Rules Supervisors meeting in the near future.
- Formation of a Board of 4 persons with power to co-opt 3 others to meet regularly. Board portfolios are of a management nature, eg finance, legal etc.
- Sub-committees reduced to 2 with portfolios that fit in either the sports conduct (eg: Rules, championships etc) or Sports enhancement spheres (eg: Coaching, promotion etc)
- Nationals in all disciplines to have \$10 added to nomination cost of each event to be used as proportionate grade prizemoney with one optional pool only of \$10 for High score.
- Join two, get one free membership offer abolished. (Only 1 was taken up last year)



In our acknowledgement of sponsors we inadvertently left "Hunts shooting supplies", sponsor of the Single Barrel Championship at the Trap Championships off our list. We apologise for this oversight in acknowledging one of our Major Sponsors

Hall of Fame

Development is continuing on the new website and the Hall of Fame is intended to have a very special area on this site.

Much of the work on researching old records etc was done by individuals and whilst we know who has received awards in the past, we are short of much of the general interest details, eg: when and where the scores were shot that were used to consider these awards. Many shooters will have received letters in an attempt to fill in these gaps. If you have received a letter and you have the information that can be used to add detail to the HoF section of the website please advise Sue in the office.

It is also important for shooters to understand that the office is not advised of many of the great shooting feats that take place annually. If you have shot a large break or qualified for a Grand Slam please let the office know the details so the award can be considered.

Grounds

Grounds and facilities matters which are now part of the Board portfolio has seen some works carried out recently. A detailed survey with heights taken at the base of all infrastructures on the shooting complex has been completed. This is to ensure that any further development has better drainage and flood proofing than currently exists.

Trap

Negotiations with our neighbour has resulted in permission being granted to remove the fence between traps 15 and 16. Another trap will now be installed on the fence line. Traps 15 and 16 were originally spaced to allow this to happen . It is planned that by 2018 we will be able to have 5 banks of 4 traps in operation for the World DTL and one practice trap.

Sporting

The Wagga club has just completed the conduct of the NSW State Sporting Carnival on the grounds. The club also conducts the ACTA Sporting Nationals on our behalf each year. The club has recently purchased another 7 Sporting traps. All the Sporting machines used for these events in the past have either been the property of Wagga club or borrowed from neighbouring clubs. The ACTA do not own any Sporting equipment in their own right. A big thanks to Wagga for continuing to host these major events and for purchasing more equipment to make these events even better. Look forward to the National Sporting at the end of August.

Skeet

Problems experienced with shooting being interrupted on layout one during the Skeet Nationals are under investigation. Arrangements with the adjoining Pistol Club that comprise part of our safety template are under review. I am confident we will have a resolution of this problem before the next Skeet Nationals.

ISSF

Many outstanding performances from our young shooters bodes well for the future. Below is a recent ACTA press release highlighting some of our young shooters performances.

Cyprus Grand Prix (5 – 15 February 2015). youngster Jack Wallace (Yering, VIC) claimed the Junior Men's Trap gold.

Current Junior World Record holder James Willett (Mulwala, NSW) will lead

Australia's junior squad in what will be his debut International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) Junior Cup, in Munich, Germany, from 26 June to 2 July.

Willett has been a stand-out performer in recent competitions, shooting scores that are unmatched in his peer group. Ever since the young farmer took up ISSF Double Trap shooting, he has consistently broken records, with his score of 142/150 targets at the March ISSF World Cup setting a new Junior World Record.

Willett's form continued over the weekend, where he claimed the Men's Double Trap title at the Australia Cup competition, hosted at the Brisbane

Executive Officer's Report

The National Executive meeting was conducted in June with a comprehensive review of the Association including where have we been, where are we going and how are we going to get there?

The results of this review were unanimously in favour of progressing the organisation to a Company Limited by Guarantee. This and other recommendations on the structure and the reasoning behind these decisions will be placed in the magazine and on the website over the coming months.

The Executive decided on installing a Board with two sub-committees with all executive members represented on these committees. This structure allows Executive members and States to have a direct line to the Board through these representatives. The decision allows a more direct Management-Executive reporting process.

The role of the Board and the Sub-Committees has a clear separation of responsibilities. The Board manages the Strategic Direction of the Association whilst the Executive Officer conducts the day to day business of the Association. The Executive Officer reports directly to the Board and the Board reports to the Executive Committee (including sub-committees). This structure will mirror the changes that will be recommended as part of the move to a Company Limited by Guarantee. This also fits within the recommended structure for National Sporting Organisations by the Australian Sports Commission.

The comparison paper provided by solicitors Landers and Rogers of "Association V Company" are on the ACTA website. The differences are clearly stated, however they are not significantly different.

The ACTA would still be governed by a Board elected by the members. The format would change, however it would be the Member "Clubs" who elect the Board. We would develop (in line with best practice) a skill set of professional expectations the nominees would be measured against in consultation with the Sports Commission. Clubs would still have a direct input to the Board through their individual States. This would cater for a mixture of Sport and Business expertise required to conduct the Assoication.

The board would be measured against performance as would the Executive Officer, at any time the Board may replace the Executive Officer if that person is not performing their roles in the prescribed manner as would the Board as individuals or entirely be able to be removed. This does not change by going to the Company Limited by guarantee.

The ACTA would also look at the Structure and reporting process. We acknowledge that individuals, Clubs and States should have access to the National body, Board and Executive officer. The Structure is still being developed to incorporate the National interests, however it is likely to mirror the interim structure.

Rule Decision

Recently I was approached by a member of my local club who had been interstate and had attended a number of shoots.

At a particular shoot, this shooter had suffered a malfunction. He was approached by the "referee" and the "referee" asked the shooter for his gun. The shooter said he began to explain that he believed that this was not the correct procedure but the "referee" insisted on taking the gun and test firing it. The shooter asked me the correct procedure, and was he right in that he should have retained his gun.

Clearly, this "referee" was incorrect in his action.

In Guidelines for Referees – Trap #14 It clearly states "The Referee must not restore a target if the competitor opens his gun after a malfunction. In the case of a malfunction the Referee shall visually check the safety catch is not in the on position and that the action is closed. He will request the shooter to test fire the gun once only. Under no circumstances will the Referee attempt to test fire the gun."

In setting out the issue for this month's Decision, I have placed the word referee in inverted commas as it is my belief the referee in this instance has not been reaccredited as if he had, he would have been conversant with the current ruling.

I ask that all Referee Examiners run reaccreditation, or accreditation courses, in their particular areas. I am aware that some Referee Examiners are very active in doing this and that their courses are very well attended. I know that many believe there is no requirement or kudos in being a registered referee any more. This could not be further from the truth as an informed current referee is able to readily address any refereeing issue that any shoot – National, State or Local – may present.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WAYS TO RELAX

In last month's article I examined how we can use the scoresheet to tell us about our performance or what we need to look at to improve.

The above array of ones shows that the shooter can shoot but he can also concentrate, focus his attention and he has got his level of arousal to the optimum level.

For this shooter the story is quite different. As you can see by the score he is shooting well and then seven targets to go he misses. I have often told shooters that they missed because they were scared of missing the target. This fear, which is the basis of anxiety, causes self-doubt in the shooters mind and as a result his muscles tense up and he misses the target. Most people argue that they were not scared: they look for another reason, the wind, the changing light, the colour and make of the target. They do this because they cannot see that their mind caused them to miss. They would prefer to blame some external cause.

I have written several articles about fear and anxiety: I do not want to go over those topics again but I do want to explore what you can do to limit the anxiety.

There are number of steps you can take to limit the impact of fear and anxiety. Firstly, psycho-education, that is learning about what anxiety is, how it affects you and what you can do about it. Most people are surprised to find out that anxiety/fear is normal and that there are effective ways to limit its impact. Go back over some of the past articles on fear and anxiety.

Next, focus on the present. Leave the judgements of the past behind and do not dwell on the future. Stay in the here and now.

Thirdly, breathe.

Finally, learn relaxation. If you learn it when you are not anxious it will be there to use when you do need it.

The following is a quick reference guide to relaxation published by The Black Dog Institute.

Practise these guick techniques. Use them when you are stressed or anxious. Give yourself a chance to get rid of the anxiety, and become a relaxed and focused shooter.

AUGUST 2015

They say every dark cloud has a silver lining and my attendance at this year's Skeet Nationals is definitive proof of that. Karien and I had originally planned to head off on our "winter holidays" straight after Phillip Island in early March and be somewhere in outback Western Australia en route to Darwin by the third week of May. But ongoing delays beyond our control have pushed our departure back by almost four months and forced us to reschedule that trip for next year and settle for an abbreviated journey up the east coast this year. The upsides of that disappointment were far reaching. For a start I got to attend one "extra" National Carnival that was never on the agenda until about a week prior to the event, and from there on the good times just continued to roll.

A Pleasant Surprise

The biggest surprise was my own personal shooting which exceeded my most optimistic expectations by several orders of magnitude. In 2009 I experienced a total retinal detachment and tear, that left my right eye with wrinkled peripheral vision and a jagged gap in the focal area. Early unsuccessful attempts to shoot with it provided the impetus to spend nearly three years learning to shoot off the right shoulder with the left eye via a remote sight extended off the muzzle. And without meaning to sound too egotistical, I was just beginning to really get the hang of that system and started to become genuinely competitive again. Unfortunately, after less than a year "back in the thick of it" and just before last year's Nationals. my left eve decided it was time to retire as well. However as someone once astutely said: "Putting up with the disadvantages of getting old sure beats the hell out of the alternative!"

Where There's a Will

Anyway after several months of crying in my milk produced the predictable result, I was eventually forced to "toughen up" and try to devise a method of shooting with my right eye again that is somewhat unconventional and creative but which minimizes my weaknesses and maximizes my strengths. Fortunately my "base" method is very technically correct and does not necessitate the sharp vision and reflex reactions that other more difficult methods require. However trying to shoot via peripheral vision and/or shooting where you think it should be has definite limitations. Therefore, my results during the week clearly reflected the fact that the disproportionate degree of luck and/or influence of Divine intervention that have shadowed my entire career have definitely not deserted me. Thank you God!

A Dose of Realism

However any thoughts I may have had of returning to Trapshooting or taking up ISSF Skeet or any other activities that require good vision have now been permanently shelved. Realistically I think I've run my race as my new shooting system really only works over phonos, out of the wind and has no genuine potential to shoot doubles! Fortunately Skeet shooting has great social aspects and the numbers on playing cards are fairly large. Which is just as well because the Veterans now obviously have my measure, no matter how much I tried to falsify my birth certificate I don't think I could sneak into the juniors (where I still couldn't win) and although a sex change is a possibility, the Ladies are clearly too good for me anyway. Fishing is starting to look particularly attractive!

Seasonal Alternatives

Returning to the Shoot, the most visible aspect was the weather. Six of the eight competition days were absolutely pristine. Of the other two, one was a little breezy and the other a little showery but both still provided reasonably good shooting conditions. It's just a shame that it's so damn cold in the mornings and that it gets dark at five o'clock instead of nine o'clock as it used to when we held the Shoot in late November and were close to the longest day of the year. The switch to May might have had some upsides, but it's proximity to the shortest day of the year and the subsequent loss of almost four hours of "shootable" daylight certainly isn't one of them. The nett result of this is that we now reach infrastructure saturation at around 160 shooters, rather than the 200 plus we could handle when we shot at the end of the year. There is still ongoing talk of building one or two more layouts to try to alleviate this problem so let's keep our fingers crossed.

Leaps and Bounds

The other glaringly obvious thing that emerged during the week was the dizzy heights that the standard of shooting in the various "divisions" has risen to. Not so long ago a solid A grade score would stand you in good stead in the Ladies, Juniors or Veterans sections. Forget that! Even a good AA score will now probably only get you into a shoot-off. During the four days of 100 target regular events and across the three major divisions, the lowest score that made the cut in any of the sections was a 97. And that only happened once and then only got you into a four way shoot-off. Of the other eleven instances, seven required at least 98, three needed 99 and one even took a perfect score, when 16 year old Antony Ballarino became the first Junior in history to win the National Skeet Championship after triumphing in a four way shoot-off. Even the two small guns on Sunday provided no respite. The 28 gauge needed 49s across the board in the various divisions and even in the 410 you couldn't get a look in there under 48.

Trial and Error

Over the past couple of years we've made several changes to the National Skeet program and although they have been improvements, I still don't think we have it right. Last year we brought the Opening Ceremony and Team Shoot day forward from the traditional Wednesday to nearer the start of the week. Now that everyone shoots the 20 gauge events, I think that was a "no-brainer", but failing to bring that day's 50 target event along with it probably lacked careful consideration. This year the move to make the two small guns official National Titles was both timely and popular. But the guantam leap to move the Opening Ceremony back another day was definitely too much too soon. It only provided a day that, along with several other problems, was always going to run out of time and this will only worsen as participation in these events inevitably increases.

User Friendly is Best

When we first started shooting 20 gauge events at the Nationals, we were careful to get these finished before the traditional program started, so that participation in these small gauge events was by inclination rather than forced necessity. Additionally their inclusion in the various High Guns and Team Shoots was postponed until almost all competitors had joined in for the same reason. Holding the Opening Ceremony and Team Shoots on Sunday morning this year was clearly not in harmony with our previously conservative approach. Plus being Sunday was another problem within itself. Having invited local dignitaries at the Opening Ceremony is clearly consistent with our ongoing efforts in public relations and our attempts to nullify the negative aura that previous governments have inflicted upon shooting sports. However I'm sure that most of these people would find it much easier and more palatable to give us an hour out of the their work schedule on a week day than out of their golf game or fishing trip on Sunday morning.

A Good Start

I think that the 50 target All States Championship on Saturday afternoon was a good idea as the event is one of the oldest on the Nationals calendar. Thus it would be a pity to "can" it, as it has historic significance. Plus it caters to the die-hards who can't get enough shooting, while still leaving the day available as a "travel day" for those from far away, as is the Sunday at the other end of the Carnival. Also it's popular with the early arrivers who appreciate the opportunity for some extra competition practice. And you'd be surprised how many of those there are. We trundled into the National Ground on Thursday evening figuring we'd be there on our "Pat Malone", only to find that the camp ground was already half full.

Taking it Easy

Provided you reschedule the Opening Day, then I think that 2×50 target events on Sunday for the "little guns" is just right for the time being. Eventually we may need to go to 100 targets events for these, but let's cross that bridge when we get to it as it would mean either extending the carnival by a whole day or eliminating another event to compensate. As the only available candidate for the "chopping block" would be the Commonwealth day and that would be a "hard ask", leaving the sleeping dog alone is surely the most prudent course of action at this point in time.

And the Rest falls into Place

Monday? Team Shoots, Opening Ceremony and the Handicap. As it's only a 50 target event, the shoot-off would still start at the usual time, even with the late start. And although a lot more people will be in the shoot-off, by using all the layouts and some expedient resquadding, it should still get finished on time. And if it were to spill over to the next day, that's the best day for it to happen anyway. The shoot-off for the Champion of Champions does not have the potential to run late and there are no Team Shoots or eliminations thereof either on that day.

Retain the Status Quo

For the same reason I think we should keep this event and the Hall of Fame in synch and thus hold our gala event on Tuesday evening. By default this moves the 20 gauge to Wednesday and the rest of the week can remain unchanged as it seems to be working well and if it ain't broke . . .! Seems simple and logical but as I'm only a cats whisker away from my 50 year badge, I learnt long ago that chicken counting is fraught with danger in a game where our executive decisions are made by people whose expertise and participation lies in other areas.

June's Trivia Question

SAGC in conjunction with SACTA (after it was formed) conducted five very memorable National Carnivals in Adelaide between 1964 and 1983. The first two in 1964 and 1968 were Trap Nationals as the National Skeet event did not come into being until 1970. And the last one in 1983 reverted to being a Trap Nationals as this was the year of separation and the inaugural Skeet Nationals was conducted in Melbourne that year. The only other time the Nationals were held in South Australia was 1993 when the event moved up the road to SA International Gun Club so this also was strictly a Trap shoot. This by default leaves 1973 and 1978 as the only years that the National Skeet Championship was conducted in South Australia and the winner on both occasions was a young lad by the name of Ken Lowry.

A Tough Start

1973 turned into a bit of a marathon as Ken had to shoot 155 to beat a visiting hotshot from the US by the name of Gerry Williams. Ken was working for Winchester at the time, which obviously is an American based company and his US oriented boss suggested to Ken at one of the shell breaks that it might be politically diplomatic to allow the US visitor to win. Fortunately Ken's patriotism combined with a fair dose of killer instinct outweighed any such employment obligations and the battle continued unabated.

1978 was a bit easier when he only had to shoot 83 to beat the "hot favourite" lan Hale. And just to show that he wasn't a one venue wonder, he also travelled to Perth in 1976 where he shot III to beat my old mate Gordon Wakefield to win the middle one of his unprecedented three National Skeet Championships. The first correct answer drawn was deduced by Kevin Mules with impeccable logic: "Not sure about 73 but I watched him win in 78 and if they're the same bloke it must be him". Good job Kev!

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another sporting association to which we grant reciprocal rights.
- 2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 4. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 5. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi, battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot Marshal, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 6. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
- 8. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 10. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 11. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 12. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 13. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 14. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 15. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, ACTA to adjudicate.
- 21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 23. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 24. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

ACTA NEWS

SHOOTERS ARE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE THEIR HANDICAP CARD

All shooters and Clubs are reminded that it is a condition of competition that all members produce their membership to confirm their handicap and financial membership of the Association.

This rule is for ALL MEMBERS, NO EXCEPTIONS. AA Elite shooters may elect to not have scores entered, however are required to provide their handicap book. Failure to provide a book should result in the Club not taking the nomination of the person concerned. I hear already "but we know them". Under Conditions of Competition all members are to provide the Book.

If shooters do not produce their book to confirm they are members they are not allowed to shoot. If a person shoots without producing a book this could void the ACTA insurance of the Club. The Club would then be required to show they had indeed completed the "Due Diligence" required. If the club has not sought or been provided the necessary documentation (handicap book/ license) the Club Directors could be liable for any legal action arising.

VICARIOUS LIABILITY

Depending on the circumstances, an organisation can be held responsible for the behaviour of its employees or agents. In **sporting clubs**, this extends to employees (paid or unpaid), players, coaches, volunteers and members. This is known as vicarious liability. Circumstances where vicarious liability may not apply are where a club or organisation has shown:

- All reasonable steps were taken to prevent the behaviour from happening in the first place
- Appropriate policies were in place for dealing with the behaviour when it occurred.

What does this mean for you?

- You MUST take reasonable steps to ensure that your club is free from discrimination and harassment or a person may make a claim against you.
- If you do not take reasonable steps then you may become personably liable for any damages.
- If you do take reasonable steps then you cannot be found liable and are protected by the law.

TRAP HALL OF FAME GRAND SLAM AWARD

Trapshooting Grand Slam awards are presented annually at the Trap Hall of Fame Dinner. The awards are in the form of a plaque and are given to those shooters who have satisfactorily proven their attainment of the award criteria since the last annual award ceremony.

AWARD CRITERIA

The qualifying criteria is to achieve a combination of all three individual elements of the award. The individual elements are:

15 Metres	25 Metres	Double Rise
400 Targets	50 Targets	50 Targets

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Eligible Events – Each break can be achieved in any event conducted in Australia or internationally provided that the Shoot Program detailing the relevant event was advertised in advance in the National magazine of the governing body.

Event Rules – The break must be attained in events conducted under ACTA Trap Rules or rules considered by the ACTA to be a sufficiently close facsimile thereof.

Validity – To be considered eligible, each individual break must conform to the criteria of ACTA Rule 4.23 regardless of what country the break was achieved in.

Substantiation – The onus is on the individual to provide satisfactory evidence to the ACTA of each individual qualifying achievement and is not on the ACTA to disprove any claim made by an individual. Satisfactory evidence would normally be in writing and would include a copy of the Shoot Program and the Shoot results. If the Shoot results do not substantiate the claim, then a letter from the Shoot secretary detailing the break and enclosing a copy of the relevant score sheets would suffice.

Recording – The ACTA shall keep a register of those shooters who prove eligibility of each individual element of the Award criteria and then transpose those names into an Award register once all three elements are achieved.

Timeframe – The award is for lifetime achievements and only one will be presented.
