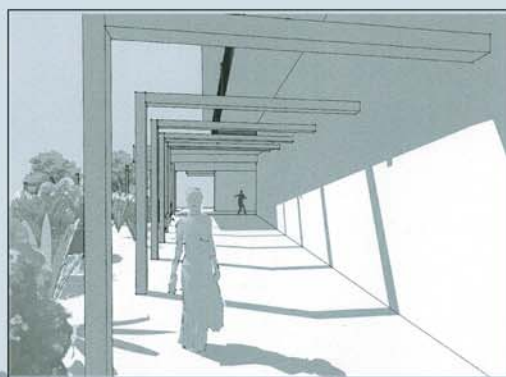

# Presidents Notes



## Trap Nationals

The Trap Nationals are almost upon us and with work continuing on the ground drainage, Ball trap layouts and shade shelters the venue will look different from last year. The introduction of a high level of guaranteed prizemoney will hopefully attract good numbers. One way to ensure this continues is to encourage your friends to attend. Let's have a great Nationals with good attendances and a great atmosphere.

## Grounds Developments

### National Grounds

Plans for another skeet layout and two more trap layouts are also being budgeted. The lead-up to 2018 and the World DTL will be a busy time on the grounds. The major development of a clubhouse complex is still being considered and the perspective drawings shown on the front cover are a step in this direction.

### Victorian Clay Target Association – Echuca

Many may not be aware that the ACTA currently have an interest in the VCTA grounds development at Echuca. The Association has supported the VCTA with a loan to help purchase the freehold. Further support may be necessary to strengthen the VCTA position in its attempt to obtain further funding from the large pool set aside by the Victorian government specifically for shooting facilities.

### Belmont Complex – Brisbane

Following a meeting with a Queensland Office of Sport and Recreation Infrastructure manager, the association has given in principle support to a major redevelopment at the Belmont Complex. Whilst much of the project detail remains confidential it became obvious during the meeting that if clay target shooting was to get any legacy from the forthcoming Commonwealth Games the ACTA needed to be involved.

## Consultations

### Field and Game Federation

Being two of the oldest shotgun based organisations in Australia the ACTA and the F&GF have quite a lot in common. A very amicable meeting took place between long standing F&GF President Mr. Ray McFarlane and members of the ACTA Board and its Executive officer. Once again this meeting covered common issues like membership, magazines and the various affiliations both organisations have with other National and International bodies. Currently F&GF control the Universal Trench discipline whilst ACTA affiliated clubs control the facilities. This arrangement sees those wishing to shoot UT being required to be ACTA members but to compete overseas they are required to join FITASC, the F&GF International body. The arrangement so far has worked well and the selection and funding arrangements the organisers have in place are simple and effective. This area of affiliation and rights

to disciplines is a complex area and one that may require further consultation.

## Compliance

Following a complaint from a member of a club, regarding their club breaching the ACTA constitutional requirements for membership the relevant state is being given the chance to rectify the problem. If the matter is not rectified promptly the ACTA will have no choice but to dis-affiliate the club and transfer all ACTA members to other clubs. Those encouraging this non-conformist attitude are not needed in our sport as they are jeopardising the good work done by thousands of ACTA members over many decades to build the facilities the sport now enjoys. If your club committee is running a shooting gallery instead of a gun club, they are not only risking the clubs and their own assets, they are voiding your protection package as well.

The ACTA has done its bit here with the provision of a club only discounted membership. The states are starting to waive the state affiliation fee to encourage the clubs to join them up so the states are doing their bit. What are the clubs doing? The cost we are talking about here for all to be protected and strengthen your association is less than two cartons of beer, a good bottle of spirits or half a carton of cigarettes. Don't support them to do this to you and your sport.

## International Clay Target Shooting Federation

The 4th ICTSF World English Sporting to be conducted in the British Isles will now most likely be hosted in the month of July in 2017. Confirmation has also been received that a Worlds Sportrap (almost identical to ACTA sporting) will be conducted with the event. The Sportrap event was also to take place in South Africa earlier this year but following action from FITASC threatening its members with suspension if they took part in the match, the South African association removed the event from the program. Agreement has been reached with FITASC that no such action will happen in 2017, a very positive result.

## Cost of Shooting/Caravanning and Insurance

The cost of competing regularly is not insignificant but the actual shooting costs are far outweighed by travel and accommodation costs. This has resulted in a larger number of our members choosing to caravan camp at gun clubs as opposed to staying in motels. This of course places greater costs on the club to host these visitors. Clubs should look at a reasonable charge for this service, to help provide the necessary facilities. I see nothing wrong with this practice as many clubs are being "stretched" by the number of campers that now stay on grounds. My club charges and finds that these campers are reasonable people and more than willing to contribute to the cost of providing the facilities. The ACTA is playing its part by arranging with the insurers that clubs hosting caravanners and campers are fully insured whether the campers are ACTA members or not. Perhaps someone with a caravanning interest might like to start the now almost compulsory Facebook page for caravanning ACTA members?

# Executive Officer's Report

Memberships have flowed in at a greater rate than previous years with clubs able to renew members online. Without mentioning names, I assisted a seventy three year old secretary renew a ninety year old member on line, he was full of praise for the system and the ease of processing renewals. He also commented on how accommodating the staff of the National office are in all aspects of his dealing with the ACTA. It was great to know that the staff is appreciated. I can assure all members our staff are dedicated and very capable of dealing with all ACTA enquires.

I would like to remind everyone however the correct process of dealing with matters is firstly through the Club, Zone and or State. Many of the enquiries we receive could be easily dealt with at club level. Each club and State are incorporated in their own right, so most of the enquiries we receive could be sorted out at these levels.

New memberships are also high, this is an opportune time to ensure all 2015 members are followed up if they have not yet re-joined. If a shooter is not financial they are not allowed to shoot on any ACTA affiliated ground until they are financial. All members should have a new sticker on their book if they are a member for 2016. This information can be checked on the "Secure" data base site, club secretaries can check any ACTA shooter details in Australia by logging in and going to the "Player Directory". This can confirm if a member is financial. Should a member have a receipt issued by the club it should be checked to ensure all dates are clearly marked.

As previously advised the Association now has the rights to Sportrap and English Sporting events, it is a matter of having these events approved by your firearms branch for inclusion on the safety template. This is a huge opportunity to attract sporting shooters who like all of us are gaining in age. Having the ability to shoot sporting events with the benefit of amenities and a clubhouse is very attractive as we mature. There is a huge opportunity to use these disciplines to attract members to your club, State and the ACTA.

The ACTA has discussed numerous topics with both shooting organisations, Field & Game Australia / Sporting Clays Australia (formerly F&G Federation), in recent months including that of shooting on other organisations grounds. We along with both of these organisations have stated that unless you are a member of

that association you will not be able to shoot on that organisation's ground. The message is simple. If you are not a member you do not shoot.

The ACTA will be, through the States seeking compliance with the Constitution, under our constitution only members of the ACTA are permitted to shoot on an ACTA affiliated ground. Should members be found to be operating outside the constitution the ACTA will take action to ensure compliance in line with this constitution. These infringements will be acted upon to ensure the safety of our members.

## Rule Interpretation

We have had an enquiry in regard to the new 2016 rules, which are now on the ACTA website.

### QUESTION

*I was just reading the new rule book on the ACTA website and I would like a clarification about Rule 2.01 (i) where a shooter having been to AA grade cannot go down to B Grade and an A Grade cannot go down to C grade. As I am often called upon to help with the hand-capping at our shoots I would like to know if after the 1st of January I come across a shooter and their book shows highest grade of AA and they are shooting in B grade do I automatically rule off their book and return them to A grade?*

### ANSWER

Good question. The short answer to the question is NO.

It is not intended that any person who has been downgraded under the previous rules will be effected by the new 2016 rules.

That is, if a shooter has been AA grade and is now B grade, that grading will remain.

If this shooter returned to AA after January 1st, they would then not be allowed to be downgraded to B Grade.

The same logic applies to A grade shooters.

Be clear that this rule can only be invoked to downgrading occurring after January 1st 2016.

Highest grades achieved before this date should not be taken into consideration.

# Australia/ New Zealand Glenn Trophy Challenge



## CHRIST-"it's bl\*dy freezing"-CHURCH

The Canterbury Gun Club must be the first obstruction that the icy cold Antarctic winds encounter on their journey northwards from the freezing Antarctic wastelands. You could almost smell the fish, penguins and sea lions in the air on this bitterly cold and windy Saturday afternoon but there was certainly nothing fishy about the Australian team who looked resplendent in their uniforms as they huddled together to prepare for this years Glenn Trophy challenge.

This most prestigious event dates back to 1966 and is conducted at the Skeet Nationals of both countries on alternate years. Odd years it is conducted in New Zealand and even years in Australia. It is a 50 target team event made up of five members from each country and a place in this team comes with its own unique type of pressure that cannot be trained nor practiced for. Nothing prepares you for the pressure you experience as you step out onto the skeet field in front of so many expectant eyes. This experience is not for the feint hearted!

With a broad range of age and experience in this years team the Australians

certainly looked like they meant business in their immaculate uniforms and it was perhaps somewhat intimidating for their New Zealand counterparts to see that the Australian spirits were so high with the team having bonded well over the preceding weeks antics of various prophylactic pranks, failed fishing forays and some dubious pigeon plundering having taken place, don't ask.

But on this penultimate day of the New Zealand Skeet nationals several New Zealand titles and trophies laid firmly and securely in the clutches of Australian arms as a jocular squad squared off for the coin toss and Australia's youngest member Queensland's Antony Ballarino showed no signs of nerves as he was chosen by the squad to 'call the toss' for the choice of fields.

It was New Zealand who won the toss but this proved to be their last win for the day as both teams took to their respective fields to shoot their first 125 targets.

Australian team and team Manager Nigel Hughes had chosen the experience and solidity of Victorian shooter Dave O'Sullivan to lead from the front as shooter 1.

Dave was in top form having literally just shot an outstanding 100 target event minutes prior to take yet another National title back to Australia and his barrels were still warm with the glow of victory as he stood on station 1 and called for the teams sighter targets.

A few nerves were visible to the trained eye and some early misses put added pressure onto the team, it was character building time for some as the pressure mounted within the squad.

With seasoned shooter Glenn

Walker giving it everything he had as shooter 2 and fellow Queenslander Nigel Hughes as shooter 3 missing some early targets it was a worrying time for the squad as they edged nervously from station to station.

But with solid performances from the team's youngest member, Antony Ballarino showing no signs of nerves at shooter 4 being backed by the experience of skeet stalwart Paul Johnston at shooter 5 the team finished the first round 6 targets down.

Neither team was aware of the others score, no eye contact made and no words exchanged as the two teams warily stalked each other as they swapped layouts for their final round of 125 targets.

Plenty of encouragement and advice from within the Australian team saw a solid and dedicated performance for this second round as cloud after cloud of vaporised target dust hung briefly in the cold New Zealand air as the Australian team found their true form in these challenging conditions.

It is said that skill, determination and a little luck will always prevail over bad targets and poor conditions and this was certainly the case for the latter part of this second round as the wind increased to send high house targets crashing to the ground on station 6 and low houses screaming towards the heavens as if seeking to break free from the pull of gravity.

With a couple of impossible to hit targets diving earthward to find shelter in it was 5 very determined men who approached station 8 to shoot their



last targets and with no target managing to travel any further then mere feet from the trap house before hitting a solid wall of lead it was with a sense of relief and trepidation that the squad congratulated each other and looked to the supportive Australian crowd for an indication of how the New Zealanders had fared in their own quest for victory.

There was a nervous wait as the final scores were obtained and several red herrings released to confuse and worry both teams but when the joking and teasing stopped it was with relief that a victorious Australia were declared the winners with a mere 3 more targets hit than the New Zealanders resulting in victory once more for the Australian team and making it a 5 years in a row win for Australia.

Dave O'Sullivan was outstanding with a perfect 50/50 and the rest of the team shone though with solid performances. Antony Ballarino showed a calmness and maturity beyond his years and on the whole the team did Australia and their sport proud and they wish to acknowledge the fierce competition and pride displayed by the New Zealanders and we look forward to the re-match in 2016 in Wagga Wagga when perhaps the warmer Australian conditions will provide its own set of challenges for our New Zealand friends.

The unique 'square' medals (a first for the Australian Masters) were glistening on the presentation table, after all had gone quiet outside and people started moving inside to check out the scoreboard and see how they had fared up. The medals were presented in 'age' categories rather than grades with a Bronze, Silver & Gold in each age group (30-39, 40-49 etc. up to 80+).

All in all, a great representation of participants of all ages from all over the country. The Games and presentations finished in good time and there wasn't a bad comment to be heard anywhere. We would like to extend our thanks to all the competitors that travelled extensive distances to participate which in turn ensured Adelaide held a successful 15th Australian Masters Games.

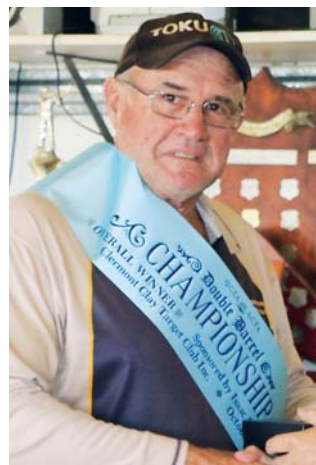

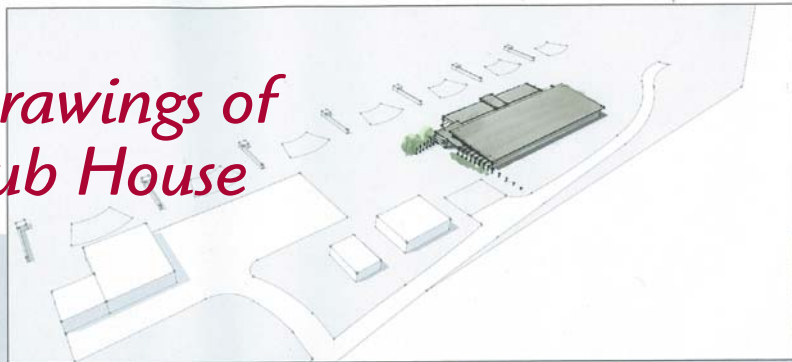

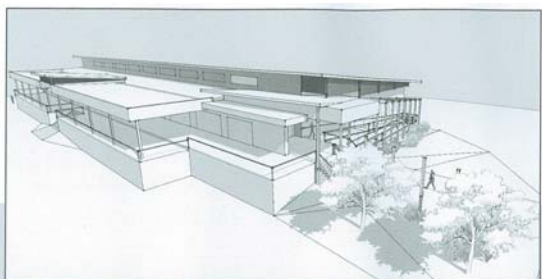




## *Additional concept drawings of the proposed new Club House*

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## What to do after you set goals: 5 basic steps

The last two articles have focused on goal setting. I would be surprised if there is a reader out there who hasn't read something about goal setting and who hasn't read about SMART goals. As I have said several times; goal setting isn't the most glamorous aspect of sport psychology but is one of the most important.

For most people, setting goals is easy, and last month I looked at having a checklist that ticked off each component and also looked at how each goal could be written to make it positive and purposeful.

The most popular goals are the New Year's resolutions. Most people make wild and wide reaching claims that they will do something to make their life better only to forget about their resolution by January 12th. This is because they cannot maintain the momentum once they formulate their goals. Goals need to be put into a plan and then there needs to be commitment to achieving that plan. What the plan will do is to provide a systematic method of turning goals into consistent actions.

So, what can you do after you set goals to guarantee you will meet them? If you have invested considerable time in setting clear goals, it makes sense to continue with the process of achieving these goals with an intelligent plan of action. Meaningful goals require serious effort, intelligent planning and a great deal of patience. This is according to Steve Pavlina who has a personal development blog for smart people, who lists the five basic steps for achieving your goals.

### Step 1. Avoid delay

Your goals will not be met in linear time. At any given moment you can work towards meeting your goals or you can direct your attention elsewhere. We often procrastinate by not giving our goals the attention they require by diverting the attention to something else. The other delaying tactic is to split our attention across too many goals. You need to focus on one or two significant goals and get them done efficiently. You need to evaluate what your goals are in a binary fashion: am I working on meeting an important goal (thereby assuming you know exactly what your goal is) or am I not.

### Step 2. Action steps

This step is the formulation of the plan. Once you have set your goals, you need to list the actions you will take to meet these goals. This is usually hard work. It requires a great deal of thinking, planning and formulating what the strategies are to achieve these goals. A word of caution, setting up an action step takes time, if it is done properly.

One way of working out the action steps is to visualise yourself doing each step. You may also want to list it at this point where you have to examine the number of goals you have. Do you have too many goals? If so, and your attention will be diverted continually. Do your goals feel real, solid and practical?

### Step 3. Put your goals in a straight line

Our brain cannot handle doing twenty things at once. Multitasking is usually ineffective because it can lead to you feeling overwhelmed because you are trying to cram too many things into your thinking and doing all at once. Go back to your plan and look at the task and break it down into its component parts and focus on these elements, one at a time in a linear fashion. Do not start the second goal until the first one is achieved. Sometimes a group of smaller goals can be linked together to make one larger goal. This is a good strategy but make sure that you do not just focus on the interesting or exciting goals. Often the tedious and boring goals have to be achieved before you can even start looking at the interesting or exciting ones. Good foundations and preparation is vital in goal setting.

### Step 4. Take daily action to achieve goals

Once you have committed to a plan and you have decided that it is the right time to tackle the goal, make sure you make the time and effort to achieve it. You need to respect the decision you made when you set this goal. Make sure that your focus is deep when you are addressing a singular goal. This is more efficient than splitting your attention between goals.

Work on your goals when you can but do not overdo it. Keep sessions short and manageable and stop when you are getting tired or you are losing focus.

### Step 5. Creating flow

Most people resist listing their action steps believing they do not have the time or the patience for it. According to Pavlina, this is how achievers actually achieve. He argues that it is up to you whether you want to rely on down to earth practice or continue to rely on wishful thinking. Whilst having a level of optimism is important, there is a difference between unbridled optimism and sensible pragmatism. Not having a plan keeps you in the foolish optimism phase and therefore you will be unlikely to achieve your goals if the goal requires serious effort over an extended period of time. Working through your goals step by step allows you to see the progress you are making and this can be exciting and energising.

In conclusion, it is not just the exercise of coming up with a set of goals to support where you want to get to with your shooting. You must have a plan to meet these goals and have a set of actions to realise the plan. This can be a lot of hard work, but it can also be very rewarding.

# 2016 National Trap Championships

## 2nd April – 10th April 2016

### OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at the National Ground, Wagga Wagga, by the Australian Clay Target Association.

## CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

### Entry

Entry into the 2016 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2016 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2016 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

### Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

### Age Qualifications

**Competitors must be over the age of 12 (NSW Firearms).**

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

### Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

### Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

### Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

### Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their

Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans sections.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

### Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

### Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

### Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

### Authority

This program shall control the 2016 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2016 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

### Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.  
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

# Cuzzo's Ramblings

**FEBRUARY 2016**

After wrapping up last month's column, I moved on to my next order of business which was finalising the Annual Results files for both Trap and Skeet for 2015. In this way we can establish not only the winners of our two Annual Performance Medals, but also the finalists in each discipline, so that they can also be recognised at our annual presentation dinners. This way the big achievers in both games get some of the accolades that they have obviously worked so hard for. However, in the process a number of interesting things came to light which I thought I would reflect upon this month.

## Too Close for Comfort

The first was the change in the number of international winners at both the Australian and New Zealand Trap Nationals in 2015. Although ACTA shooters have always been able to make a pretty fair job of holding their own at home against the Kiwis, our Tasman cousins usually manage to get at least a couple of mentions in dispatches each year. Not so 2015 when all fourteen major open placings stayed in Oz. Likewise at the New Zealand Trap Nationals, where although we managed to steal ten of the fourteen away from them in 2014, this year the international success rate dropped off to only three out of fourteen and most of that was courtesy of a fair bit of help from the Fijian contingent. As I have pointed out over the last couple of months, closing the gap between these two major events was never going to be a great plan.

## Spread like Vegemite

The next most noticeable point in the Annual Trap Results file for last year was the vast increase in the total number of major event winners. The rough arithmetic for the grid spots on the file is seven "States" by seven events equals about fifty, plus two Nationals by two places by seven or

eight events equals about thirty for a grand total of about eighty available spots. Last year the top seven shooters bagged half of these between them and then eight double winners left room for only about forty people on the list. This year the top seven accounted for only about a quarter of the total and were assisted by only another half dozen "20 pointers" which meant that nearly 60 individual winners accumulated Hall of Fame points in 2015. When I publish the results later in the year, the winners list will spill off the bottom of the page.



Of the eight major events conducted in 2015 only two people managed multiple wins. Justin Smith won the Handicap in Victoria and NSW with just over 160 consecutive hits and Socrates Pilipadis won three of the Double Rise events outright with a total score of 149/150

## Slow Starters

The Annual Results file for Skeet also included some very interesting points and comparisons. New Zealand shooters have always made their presence felt in our National Skeet arena, probably because, although we outnumber them by about five to one, they got serious about this discipline long before we did. They started a National Skeet Championship in the 1930s and we didn't follow their lead until 1970. Although we managed to protect our first one in 1970 when Newton Thomas held off a concerted Kiwi attack from Tommy Taylor, we didn't fare so well the following year in 1971. Bruce Anderson not only took our Royal Blue Ribbon back home across the Tasman, but in the process set a long run record we couldn't match for over five years.

## Kiwis flex their Muscles

And we didn't fare much better when we started trying to have an Annual shoulder to shoulder Team Shoot against them in 1966. It took us ten years before we finally managed to win one and then about thirty years before we were able to actually square the ledger up. This year although we were able to limit their "mentions in dispatches" at our Skeet Nationals to just two, they were two very large ones. For a start Andy Peter managed to shoot 192 straight off scratch in the Handicap before he finally succumbed to

a very determined local A grader in David Jones. And then that evergreen "Pommy Kiwi" Matt Fallon etched his name in our record books by not only winning our Doubles event outright, but also recording only the sixth perfect score ever shot here.

## From Little Things . . .

The other big news from the Nationals came out of the Junior ranks. And it shouldn't have been a surprise really, as a number of juniors have been winning events and/or making a name for themselves in recent times. Names like Eddie Elder, Thomas Dent, Blake Slater and Corey Rutter spring to mind immediately and I'm sure there are others who should be added to that list. But none of them have ever driven the point home by winning "the Big One" before. Until this year that is! Antony Ballarino never looked like he was going to miss in the four-way shoot-off that made him the first ever junior in 46 years to win the National Skeet Championship. So all the rest of you juniors are now on notice. About the only remaining "unclimbed mountain" is the Overall High Gun.

## Under the Radar

Before I stray away from the Annual Skeet Results file I need to make mention of a couple of pretty noteworthy achievements that occurred this year and may go unnoticed due to the installed "parity factor" between Trap and Skeet in relation to Hall of Fame points. Although Shane Bennett finished outright runner-up in our Annual Medal count, his tally could have been a lot higher and the winning margin a lot closer if half of his wins had not been in "ineligible" events. His 410 shooting this year was inspirational, finishing runner-up at the New Zealand Nationals and winning two out of the only three State titles contested with this tiny gun. Likewise Laurie Durham's efforts this year with the 28 gauge need recognising as he not only won our first National Championship with this challenging barrel size, but also triumphed with it on his home ground in Victoria.

## NZ Skeet Nationals

For similar reasons both Mal Briggs and Michael Buttigieg had better results in 2015 than the arithmetic alone will indicate. Between them they locked the Kiwis out of the small gauge events by winning the 410bore and 28gauge respectively. Mick also got a mention in the 20gauge where he finished runner-up. We couldn't get a "look in" in the Doubles or the Handicap but David O'Sullivan probably flew the Aussie flag the highest when



he won their National Skeet Championship and triumphed in a shoot-off for runner-up in their Overall High Gun. They may have had "the wood" on us years ago, but provided we keep their Nationals and ours well spaced and with the talent we currently have, I'm sure we can continue to keep making amends for the foreseeable future.

### Now or Never

And the final order of business this month is to remind everyone of the official closing time for Annual Long Run claims for 2015. The closing date is January 31 each year and as this edition of the CTSN should hit your mailbox around the middle of January, you have only about two weeks to submit a claim on behalf of yourself or anyone else whose efforts you can verify. Please review the information boxes that are posted on the website and that I have listed here for your convenience. The criteria for such claims is also listed on the website and they should be lodged with Sue Vesperman at the National Office.

### December's Trivia Question

The sixth and last of our major individual events, the National Points Score, was finally added to the Nationals program in 1962. The official name for this event is a strange and confusing one, the Australia – New Zealand Trap Championship, but that's another story for another day. Anyway, for whatever reason, it was not for another four years until 1966 that we eventually decided to present an Overall High Gun prize to the shooter who amassed the highest aggregate score over the qualifying events. Like a lot of other things during that era we lagged behind New Zealand who had been awarding a High Gun since 1957.

### An Abbreviated Start

Anyway we finally got the High Gun started in 1966, but rather than qualifying it over the entire program as we do today, it was decided to only conduct it over what were referred to in those days as the four "main" events. These were the Champion of Champions, the Grand Australian Handicap, the National Double Barrel and the National Single Barrel. They probably attained this "elite" status by being the four oldest events on the program. The Double Rise, like the Points Score detailed above, had only been added a few years prior and thus were probably considered to "johnny come latelays" and thus not worthy of inclusion at that time. Thus, as these "premier" events were all 50 target matches, the inaugural High Gun was only scored out of 200 and the first winner was Charlie Hartley from New Zealand with 196. He only just edged out Malcolm Fuller (of Fuller Firearms fame, a great shooter and one of our pioneer firearms importers) on 195 and the great Doug Smith finished third outright on 193.

### As Good as it Gets

However, the big news of the day was when Fabrique Nationale of Belgium, through their Australian agent Gollin & Co, announced that

they would be donating a special presentation model "D" grade Browning U/O shotgun to the winner. And not only to this year's winner, but also continuing this very generous sponsorship on an annual basis. Now Browning under and overs were not only the definitive gun of choice at that time but also probably the highest quality and most expensive gun on the market even in basic A grade form. So a special presentation D grade was the stuff dreams were made of! And this is probably the reason why a decision was made early on that only one gun per shooter per lifetime would be allowed and that any subsequent wins would invoke a "pass down" clause. This stipulated that the highest scorer would still be recorded as the winner and receive the Royal Blue sash and Gold Australia Badge, but the Browning shotgun would be "handed on" to the next applicable placegetter.

### Winners aren't always the Biggest Grinners

And it certainly didn't take long for this "contingency plan" to be put into action. The great Pud Burgess was just coming into his own at that time, having won the Champion of Champions Cup in 1966 and threatened the High Gun for a while. So it was no surprise to anyone when he won the High Gun the following year and took the second Browning shotgun back to Cobar with him. What was somewhat of a surprise was when Pud topped the chart again the following year in 1968 and put a "mile wide grin" on Ray Kimber who was the runner-up and only too happy to make sure the Browning shotgun didn't leave South Australia.

### A Harsh Reality

For the next four years the guns continued to find good homes, but then in 1973 the unthinkable happened and Pud won an unprecedented third Overall High Gun and was forced to allow Ron Wales to take that one back to New Zealand with him. During all this time Ken Lowry had been no more than an interested bystander and didn't give it much thought when he brought the prized gun home with him from Tasmania in 1975. But when he topped the chart for a second time a couple of years later in Brisbane in 1977, he immediately empathised with Pud's heartache and I'm reliably informed that Doug Smith had to prise his fingers off that beautiful Browning with a crowbar in order to be able to take it back to Dalby with him.

### As One Door Closes

So in all three Browning Presentation Guns got to find "alternate" homes before the "pass down" clause was finally rescinded in 1980 after big Leo Harrison took one home to America with him. And the timing could not possibly have been better for Jimmy Ellis who became the first of four shooters to acquire a second Browning before commercial realities eventually forced the withdrawal of Fabrique Nationale's sponsorship in 1987 after 22 years. Fortunately for the ACTA, Beretta were able to step up to the plate and fill this void the very next year and have continued to supply us with beautiful High Grade guns for our ultimate prize ever since.

### This Month's Trivia Question

To the best of my knowledge neither Beretta Australia or the ACTA have ever considered reinstating the One Gun Rule and so over the years quite a few of our eminent shooters have enjoyed taking additional guns home. Although I wasn't there to see it, I'm reliably informed that Glen Castellaro looked pretty happy when he trotted off home to Griffith last year with his fourth one. But as impressive as Glen's record is, he does not have the market cornered on Gold Australia Badges from the Trap Nationals. In fact he will need to win three more to gain a clear lead, as somewhere in Australia there are no less than six of them all residing at the same address. Name the eminently accomplished shooter who resides there with them. 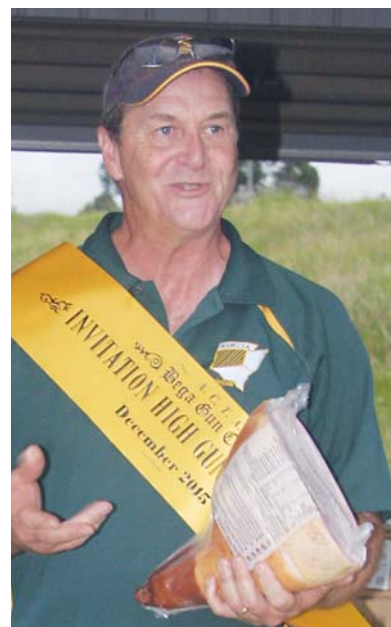
score of 19/20 with second going to George Toyne on 17/20.

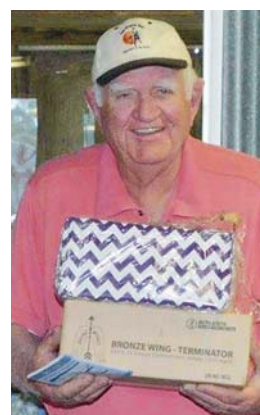
The Gemini traps and Laporte targets worked faultlessly throughout the day as they always do.

Advertisers must comply with the copy deadlines as detailed on page 2 of this issue, and your name, address and telephone number must be supplied. Copy should be typed or carefully hand-written.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer:

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

# ACTA NEWS

## VOLUNTEERS – LIFE BLOOD OF THE COMMUNITY AND SPORTING ORGANISATIONS, INCLUDING CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

Our volunteers make the sport happen. From Club, Zone and State level through to the National level people give up their time to volunteer their expertise. Successive governments over many years decided there needed to be accountability and protection for those people.

Incorporation for “Not for Profit” organisations was introduced to ensure these areas are covered to protect those who gave up their time to provide non-profit organisations of all descriptions, guidelines and support through constitutions. I realise many people do not like the concept of constitutions, they see them as a necessary evil, only looking to the constitution in times of trouble. If a constitution is written with clear guidelines, and those objectives and rules of the club then it is easily adhered to (when was your club’s constitution last reviewed). Constitutions are there to protect the club office bearers and members. There are a number of requirements of being incorporated including providing “Directors Insurance” (provided through the ACTA). All office bearers are accountable and responsible for the administration of the club under the Incorporations Act. Ignorance is not a defence under the Incorporations Act. As an office bearer you must at all times know the position of your club.

Every club constitution with a federal structure, bases their objectives on those of the National body, it is relatively easy for a club to view a national body’s constitution and “copy” the objectives of the national organisation at a level that is applicable for them. The overall objectives of growing, developing and promoting the sport need to be consistent.

We have club committees who run clubs, including processing memberships, conducting the finances of the club, attend meetings of the club to arrange activities, and ensure the club is compliant with their “Incorporations” requirements. We have volunteers who mow the grass, set up the targets, clean up, and run the canteen.

Then there are those who are referees, scorers, handicappers, shoot marshals, range officers, trap mechanics and jury members who give up their time to conduct events.

There are those members who choose to just turn up and compete or practice, without any other contribution to the club. Traditionally clubs find it difficult to engage new committee people. A simple way is to “give them a job”. No one volunteers without knowing what is required of them. Asking someone to be on a committee without specifying what you want them to do usually ends up with a polite “no thanks”.

If your club provides a “list of jobs” to be done, you will get a better response.

### EXAMPLE:

**Shoot days – Schedule (afternoon shoot)**

**Shoot Secretary** – Take nominations, money and squad shooters. Enter scores for events and extract shoot-offs where needed. Compile results. Job done.

**Handicapper** – check books and enter scores after events. Tally and regrade when necessary.

**Shoot Marshal** – Manage the day’s shooting, organise referees and scorers.

**Presentations** – (President or appointed person) Present trophies and thank sponsors and club volunteers.

**Canteen staff** – 1.00 - 4.30

**Bar staff** – 4.30 - 6.00

**If each person knows their job and how long it takes, they may volunteer, if they have no description of the job, they may not.**

Without volunteers at each level, the sport would not be well placed as it is now. To all the volunteers who contribute to the sport at club, zone, state and national level THANK YOU.

## EXCERPT FROM ACTA CONSTITUTION

### 38. REGISTERED SHOOTERS

#### 38.1 Registration with the Association

The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at an Association competition, event, or at any competition or event conducted by a Member State or Member Club appointed for that purpose, unless such person is registered with the Association as a registered shooter and is not in arrear with his or her registration fees.

#### APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP – MEMBER STATE/CLUB

#### AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED (“ASSOCIATION”)

In the event of admission as a Member State/Member Club, the applicant agrees to be bound by the Purposes, Rules, Regulations, Policies and Directives of the Association for the time being in force.
