Presidents Notes



A lot can happen in a month and the first three items in this report are updates on items from last month.

Grounds Developments National Grounds

The extra skeet layout and the two extra trap layouts mentioned last month are now becoming reality. Work is about half completed on the skeet layout and about to commence on the extra trap layouts.

Victorian Clay Target Association – Echuca

The Executive have approved a further loan to the VCTA as pre-empted in last month's column. The extra \$100,000 is to provide support to the VCTA in its bid to secure major Victorian Government funding. This grant scheme is solely for shooting bodies, and the Association wishes VCTA well with their application. The VCTA has already repaid \$40,000 of the original loan.

Belmont Complex – Brisbane

We have now been involved in a second stakeholders meeting regarding the development of a shotgun facility at the Belmont complex in Brisbane for the 2018 Commonwealth Games. Indications now are that a new facility will be developed in another area of the complex with the ultimate aim to be the relocation of the existing club following the games. Management of the new complex is likely to be in the form of an entity comprising the local club, and the major State and National stakeholders. ACTA interest here is to ensure the facility becomes available to the club and the QCTA and remains under the auspices of the ACTA. Some financial commitment may become necessary in the future to fulfil this aim.

International Clay Target Shooting Federation

It is with great pleasure that I can announce that Denmark has now joined the ICTSF and has indicated an intention to have a team at the forthcoming World DTL in Ireland.

ISSF Nationals

The ISSF Nationals have just finished and congratulations to the National Title winners, Keith Ferguson, James Willett, Laetisha Scanlan, Aislin Jones and Adam Vella. Many thanks must go to the Brisbane club volunteers who did a great job, the ACTA staff in attendance and the volunteer officials. These officials give freely of their time and I can tell you do not get a great deal of thanks, so if you see any of them about, give them a pat on the back. It is disappointing that not one winner managed to meet all the requirements of Shooting Australia's Olympic selection policies to be automatically named for RIO. A full report will be in a later magazine.

Constitution

The AGM and The Notice of Motion to move the Association to a Company Limited by Guarantee approaches quickly. By the time you have read this the Executive Officer will have already been to two

State meetings explaining the proposal and the reasons why change is needed. He will be travelling to three more States in the coming months. All States were offered this opportunity but some have not taken it up.

There is a lot of misinformation out there, a lot from people who have not even read the document or are aware of the history. One piece of misinformation is that this is being driven by the Executive Officer. I will tell you now this is being driven by me as President and the National Executive who unanimously endorsed the proposal in June. This matter has been a topic of discussion at the informal meetings following AGMs for a number of years, well prior to the current EO returning to the ACTA. This matter has been the subject of presentations by experts to Executive Committees on several occasions over the last decade. The members of the current Executive all know it is the right thing for the future of the ACTA and all should be appreciative they have been prepared to put the ACTA first as this proposal means the demise of the Executive as we all know it.

This proposal will provide the following benefits to the ACTA:

ACTA will only require the one National registration as opposed to the current two needed to operate in every State.

ACTA will be able to apply for State funding in NSW for our National Ground which we can't do currently.

ACTA will be in a stronger position to canvass other bodies including Shooting Australia and the Australian Sports Commission. A Company Limited by Guarantee is the recognised contemporary governance model for Not for Profit National Sporting Organisations.

Directors will have the ACTA alone in their mind, not their club, their zone and their State that is currently in the mind of each National Delegate.

The number of elected Administrators will be more than halved with proportionate savings to be had.

A smaller, better qualified, more responsive governing body will result.

If your club does not know whether to support this Notice of Motion, please take the time to ring the Executive officer who will be more than happy to answer your questions.

I would hate to see this proposal fail purely from ignorance and misinformation.

How quickly the year seems to be passing, the National ISSF Championships have already concluded in Brisbane. Congratulations to everyone who attended and contributed to the great feel around the event. Congratulations also to all individual and team winners at all levels. The introduction of the veteran's section was a huge hit and we expect to see the nominations increase in future years. It was great to see the Papua New Guinea contingent at the National event. They set up their own tent on the ground and were always willing to assist with scoring and refereeing when required. We will continue to invite our close neighbours to try to encourage closer competition opportunities for all in the Oceania region. I take the opportunity to thank Barry Knight and all the volunteers of the Brisbane Gun Club for their efforts. I have been to many championships and know the effort it takes to find volunteers to fill the positions required. It is not just a matter of turning up on the day, they spend weeks preparing for the event and then put in 12 hour days to ensure everything works for the competition, a further 7 day period. A huge thank you, to those at the club who made the 2016 National event a success

The Association has met the requirements of NSW Firearms in relation to the conduct of the arms fair for the National Trap and Skeet Championships for 2016. We have also had further discussion on the naming of the "arms fair" and the specific requirements for its conduct. There are new guidelines to be placed on the agenda of the "Legislation committee" a consultative body to NSW Firearms for consideration before being placed in front of law makers. The differences between an open field day event and a Club, State or National shoot were made very clear and the feeling is that there is an opportunity to provide different requirements, this would be good news for the industry.

The annual Audit is now underway with preliminary results showing that the Association has finished very close to and within the expectations of the budget.

The Annual report is now also being compiled for the 2016 AGM, which shows the results of numerous projects and developments within the organisation and also highlights the achievements of Clubs, States and individuals.

I wish to thank all of those persons who have volunteered in their Clubs, I have found many new and younger volunteers becoming

involved in the support of clubs particularly those assisting with the new data base. Clubs have contacted the ACTA to have us provide access to a designated new position just to deal with membership renewals, another person taking some of the load for the Club secretary, sharing the workload and introducing another person to the administration of the Club.

I am aware of some clubs who have introduced innovative ideas in relation to their Club memberships and participation. We hope to publicise these ideas in more detail in the near future.

Rule Interpretation

Earlier this month I was asked a question in relation to the procedure a competitor should follow in questioning the legality of targets being thrown and their ability to demand that targets be checked before shooting. My initial response would have been to say "just demand that they be checked, it's your money".

However on reading the rules carefully I can find no reference to where a shooter is able to demand that targets be checked for height etc. The only references to target checking are in Rule 4.18 (f) Duties of a Referee, where the referee must have the trap adjusted immediately it is not throwing legal targets. Rule 4.19(c) Duties of a Shoot Marshall, responsibility for checking correct height and angles of targets and Rule 1.02(n) Procedure, which also gives management the charge of seeing that targets are legal.

Consequently I advise that although a shooter may suggest to the referee that the targets may need checking, they most certainly cannot demand it. The decision to check target legality is with the referee, shoot marshal or management. Hopefully etiquette and commonsense will prevail.

The new Rule Book is now available on line and has quite a few important changes that both shooters and management should be aware of. Please download your copy. For ease of recognising new or altered rules, all changes in the 2016 Rule Book are in red type.

Of note is the new distance requirement for trap targets, now set to 48 metres plus or minus 2 metres, (double rise targets remain at 40 metres plus or minus 2 metres), the substitution of scores in grading cards is no longer restricted to a 10 target difference between scores and the last target missed in a shoot-off is not to be recorded.

Another important change is that downgrading now has restrictions depending on your grade. Specifically Rule 2.01 (i). A new date for highest grade attained has been set at January 1st 2016 to ensure that current B and C grade shooters are not upgraded by over-zealous officials to one grade down from their highest grade ever attained.

Echuca Clay Target Club committee were very pleased to see more than one hundred keen shooters arrive on the 27th of December, to do battle for some of the very attractive prizes on offer at the annual Rich River Classic. Due to a high number of sponsors to whom the club is very grateful for their assistance, trophies were of a very high standard and very plentiful. Weather conditions were in general reasonably good for clay target shooting; the only complaint with the weather was a gusty wind that was moving the targets around, making high scores difficult, although that complaint was almost nullified when the number of full scores that were recorded for the shoot off in the Double Barrel was huge.

Event One, a 25 target Goulburn Murray Credit Union Points Score Championship, and after a reasonably short shoot off, John Pay, a Bendigo CTC member, became the Overall winner and 1st in AA Grade with a score of 87/87. Jack Clerke after using a 2nd barrel shot had to settle for 2nd in AA grade with an 86/87 result. A grade 1st was Andrew Estcourt a Cohuna CTC member with an end score of 84/84, with Thomas Armstrong picking up 2nd in A grade on a 87/86 result. B grade 1st was Andrew Calandro an Echuca member with a 72/75 result, and Mark Tyson taking out 2nd in B with a 70/75 score. C grade 1st was Julie Hogan a Cohuna member with a 70/75 score, and C 2nd was Phill Defrancesco (Werribee) on a 67/75 result.

Event Two, was a 25 target, Mid State Credit Management Single Barrel Championship, and an indication that the weather really was with the shooters when the shoot off for an Overall winner brought the total shot up to sixty five targets and that shooters name was Kade Robertson. Kade a Werribee CTC member was the Overall Winner and 1st in A Grade, with an end score of 65/65, well shot, Kade Robertson! 2nd in A grade was Ray Whyte with a 27/28 score. AA Grade 1st was Carl Comensoli with a 64/65 score,

Event Three, a 25 target Handicap, sponsored by Mark and Kate Rogers, and Melbourne Cricket

Club Shooting member, Bill Preston, after being the only shooter that shot the possible 25/25, proudly put his hand up for the Overall Winners Sash in the Handicap and also for the \$500.00 1st place pay out. Congratulations Bill Preston! Werribee member, Phill Defrancesco, survived a 25 target shoot off to claim 2nd placing in the Handicap, and with his 49/50, he received \$300.00 for his endeavours. Allan Pattinson shot a 47/48 and that earned him 3rd placing in the Handicap, and that had a \$150.00 reward. Deniliquin member, Jack Collicoat, claimed 4th place in the Handicap with a 42/43 result earning him a \$100.00 reward. Nathan Harris was the 5th and last winning shooter, and his 5th place on a 37/38 score earned him a \$50.00 prize.

Event Four, the last on a very big day. Luckily with all new traps, no trap breakdowns and new phono-pulls without problems, the entire shoot ran smoothly and time did not become an issue, especially with no Overall winner in the Double Barrel Championship, there were only grade shoot off's to pursue. Jet lagged again!

By the time this article goes to print, I will be on my way home from Brazil where I had been attending my granddaughter Chloe's christening. Rather than travel from Sydney across the Pacific to South America, we have decided to travel via Dubai to catch up with

some relatives for a couple of days. This means a longer flight to Brazil, but an even longer time in the plane on our return as we will not be stopping over. On my last trip to Europe, I was hit really hard by jet lag or circadian rhythm disorder. I know it will happen again so I have been researching how to overcome it. The short answer is I will not be able to overcome it, so how can I limit the effects.

A search of the net showed the following tips for acclimatising yourself and limiting the effects of jet lag. These tips can be found on <http://consumertraveler.com/columns/getting-there/10-tips-for-limiting-the-effects-of-jet-lag/>

- **Pre-adjust eating to the time zone you are traveling to.** Several days before you travel, try to adjust your eating and sleeping schedule to the time zone to which you're traveling as much as possible.
- **Pre-adjust sleep.** There are myths about staying up all night the day before you travel but most people feel better if fully rested before they leave on their trip.
- **Arrive in daylight.** Try to plan your flights to arrive in daylight to help fit into the new time zone. It's easier to stay awake after landing during the day, than getting to sleep quickly, if you are landing in the evening. Make sure to set an alarm to wake you on time, which helps you get over jet lag. Each traveler needs to determine which of these strategies works best for them.
- **No booze, no coffee.** Avoid alcohol, caffeine and other stimulants at least three to four hours before an evening flight to help you get to sleep while aloft.
- **Change your watch.** After you're settled into your seat on the plane, change your watch to your destination's time. While that may seem only psychological, it can help you get into the mind-set of your destination's time.
- **Sleep during your flight.** Once aloft, especially if it's a night flight, try to sleep. Block out light and cabin noise, avoid caffeine and alcohol, use an inflatable pillow and layer clothing to protect against variations in temperature.
- **Reschedule your body.** Once you arrive at your destination, you should immediately put your schedule in the new time zone and forget what time it is where your flight began. The more quickly you begin sleeping, waking, eating and scheduling activities according to your destination's time, the more quickly your jet lag will disappear. Don't fall into the trap of giving in to being tired from the jet lag and sleeping in. That will only prolong it.
- **Crave sunlight.** Try to get outside in the sunlight as soon as and whenever possible, especially in the first few days in your new time zone. Daylight is a powerful stimulant for regulating your biological clock. Moreover, staying indoors can deepen jet lag.
- **Environment.** When it's time to sleep at your destination, try to make

your hotel room's sleep environment as good as possible, just like you did while flying to your destination.

- **Melatonin?** A controversial aid to get over jet lag is to take melatonin. As a psychologist, I am reluctant to suggest drugs of any sort so you would need to discuss this with your GP after extensive research.

The following is part of an article I wrote in 2013 about Circadian Rhythm Disorder.

Jet Lag or Time Zone Circadian Rhythm Disorder, is due to disturbances to the circadian rhythm, our internal 24 hour clock, due to travelling through different time zones. Circadian rhythm disorder can also cause havoc for shift workers.

When we change time zones (an increment of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK) our bodies need to take time to adjust to the new time zones. Until we are back to normal, our performance will suffer. Corporations and the military understand that performance can be affected by not having proper rest after a long haul flight. The proper rest time varies from individual to individual but age, flight duration, time-zone translocation, climate variations, noise, immobilization, low humidity, etc., all factors that will influence the severity and duration of jet lag. When I asked friends and colleagues how they dealt with jet lag they said "the only way to deal with it is when you arrive back in Sydney, book a motel room and sleep for 16- 20 hours. So armed with the discomfort of "being out of it," and my personal need to have some sort of scientific understanding of the problem and the solution, I decided to do some research into the problem. I found an old book, *The Sleep Book* by James Paupst who described the Buley rest formula for air travellers. Back in the sixties, Dr L Buley developed a rest formula to determine how long a person had to rest following a flight.

The rest formula is relatively simple: It states that the sum of one-half flight duration (T) in hours, plus the number of time zones (z) crossed in excess of 4, plus two special coefficients representing departure times, equals the required period of rest expressed in tenths of a day.

$$T/2 + (z-4) + Cd + Ca = \text{rest period.}$$

If z is < 4 it is eliminated.

The departure and arrival coefficients introduce gains and losses of time: the table follows:

Period of day (hrs)	Departure time co-efficient	Arrival time coefficient
0800-1159	0	4
1200-1759	1	2
1800-2159	3	0
2200-0059	4	1
0100-0759	3	3

For example, for a flight from London to Sydney, you travel across 10 time zones. If you depart at 20.00h on Monday you will arrive in Sydney on Wednesday at 05.00h with a four hour stop-over in Singapore. Therefore the equation would look like this:

$25/2 + (10-4) + 3 + 3 = \text{rest period, therefore for this example it would be:}$

$12 + 6 + 3 + 3 = 24$, divide 24 by 10 and this means that the required rest time is 2.4 days.

When using this formula, the following rules must be applied:

1. The answer in tenths of days should be rounded to the nearest 1/2 day. However rest stops amounting to less than a day will not be given unless it is an overnight flight.
2. Travel hours are the number of hours of elapsed time required for the journey.
3. Time zones are computed as increments of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK.
4. Departure and arrival times are local.

So according to Buley, you would need to rest for approximately 52 hours

following a flight from London to Sydney. This is significantly different to my friends and colleagues unscientific approach of sleeping for 16 hours upon arrival. Paupst states this formula has been used since 1967 and has benefited many travellers – provided, of course, that they are willing to give in to the fact that their biological clocks exert a force that is stronger than they are, either physically or psychologically. This was the most significant sentence of the whole chapter in the book.

I now know that I cannot beat the biological clock. Armed with all this information maybe this time the impact won't be as great. I hope so.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

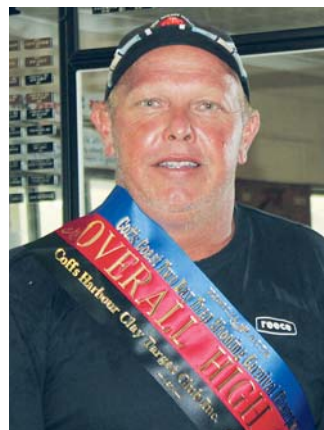

Rules for State Postal Competition

160th Anniversary of Trapshooting in Bendigo

The following Advertisement placed in the Bendigo Advertiser in 1855 well and truly confirms that Trapshooting was already underway in the City of Sandhurst (Bendigo) in 1855. The difficulty in establishing just when Trapshooting commenced in Bendigo is governed by a number of factors including the lack of records from that time and the proliferation of newspapers at the time. We do know from the following advertisement trapshooting was underway in the area at this time.

The Bendigo Advertiser, under the section "Amusements", had the following advertisement which was placed Thursday the 20th of December 1855. The initial advertisement reads:

PIGEON SHOOTING. Grand Shooting Match at Pigeons. On

New Year's Day.

Charles George Dose, of
The Prince of Wales Hotel
Lockwood.

Begs to inform the Sporting Gentlemen of Sandhurst, and the country around Lockwood that he intends having a Grand Shooting Match at Pigeons when a great number of prizes will be offered for competition, of which the following are a few,-

Splendid gold guard chain.

First-class silver hunting watch.

Handsome silver snuff-box.

Superior Victoria gold nugget ring.

Also, several sweepstakes varying from 5s to £5.

N.B.-C.G.Dose has made arrangements for the supply of between two and three hundred pigeons, for which only 6s per couple will be charged.

Shooting to commence at 11 o'clock a.m."

Initially named Bendigo, the city changed its name to Sandhurst in 1854 and back to Bendigo in 1891. We do know that a trapshooting match took place ironically on the 26th January 1856 in Sandhurst.

The following advertisements were placed for shoots on the 11th and 25th April 1856 at Long Gully – almost what is now close to the centre of Bendigo.

The 22nd April 1856 saw the re-emergence of a second more detailed advertisement for the silver Mines Hotel . . .

ONE DAY'S SPORT.

'A Shooting Match.

To come off at Edward Brinlaw's, Silver Mines Hotel, Long Gully, on Friday 11th instant, at 12 o'clock.

Entrance fee, £2.

To be paid at ten o'clock same day.

Prize money £5'.

TO SPORTSMEN.
A GRAND PIGEON SHOOTING MATCH will take place
On **FRIDAY** next, 25th inst.,
at the Silver Mines Hotel, Long Gully, at One o'clock,
under the patronage of
S. Jones, Esq.
J. Harney, Esq.
F. Saltern, Esq.
Prize, £5; Entrance, £1.
3 Birds each; 21 yards rise; 40 yards boundaries.

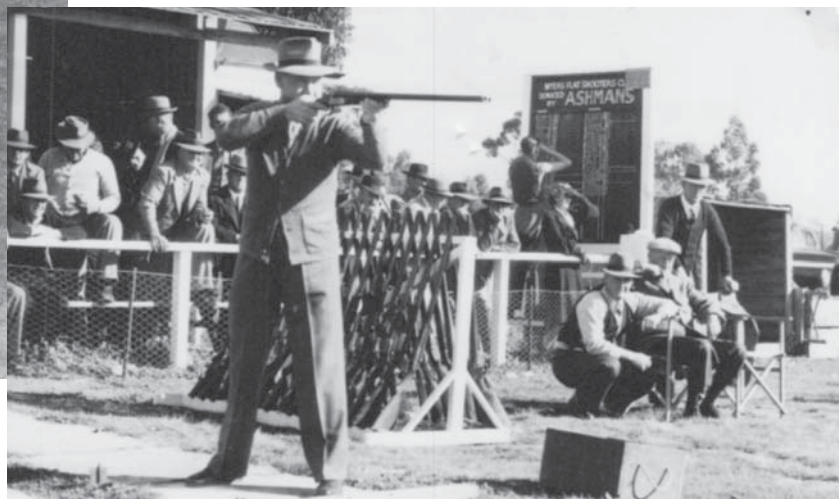
From these beginnings the Bendigo Clay Target Club has been through a number of name changes and has had a number of locations for its grounds.

Cuzzo's Ramblings

MARCH
2016

In July last year I decided to publish the Hall of Fame points chart for Trapshooting for 2014. I thought it may be of interest to a minority of people, plus it was a handy "filler" on a month when my column was shorter than usual. However I was totally unprepared for the degree of enthusiasm it generated. As soon as it arrived in letterboxes I started getting e-mails and phone calls about it. Most were from trapshooters and for a change all the feedback regarding one of my columns was actually positive. Obviously I'm not being controversial enough these days! Anyway the general consensus was that this unprecedented format for shooting results on a condensed annual basis was of considerable interest to a great many people. Most people asked if I could continue to do this each year on an ongoing basis. Therefore as part of my job as Historian is to collate these annual charts, I shall publish them each year after the Hall of Fame Dinner that utilises the results has been held.

Another Discipline

However, not all the response emanated from the Trap fraternity. A number of Skeet shooters expressed interest in viewing their annual results in the same format. Consequently I published the previous year's Skeet chart a few months later and it received an equally positive reception. Plus quite a few people from both disciplines enquired as to the possibility of seeing similar charts from previous years. As my long term intention is to expand upon the great work initiated by Mark McInnes and produce detailed Annual Results charts for both disciplines as far back in time as possible, there's no reason not to publish them. With a bit of luck I hope to be able to prepare the two current ones as well as half a dozen historic ones each year for as long as it takes. So if I don't either get the sack or fall off the perch any time

soon, I'm hopeful of detailing 1947's results just before dementia sets in and I can't remember breakfast. To get the ball rolling I am including the 2013 Trap results this month. Enjoy!

AA Elite Clarification

Although it's been up and running for several years, I still get enquiries as to what it is and how it works. It actually started out as a result of a "car park" meeting at the Skeet Nationals where several prominent shooters were looking to address the situation of a minority of competitors with demonstrated levels of ability electing to shoot in grades below that level. This not only vandalised the grading and handicap system here, but also caused International embarrassment when it extended overseas. As graded shooting works on the "honour system" any attempt to legislate the problem away simply won't work, so it was decided to try to lead by example and a couple of seasoned shooters asked the ACTA if their Handicap Books could be marked "AA For Life". At their next meeting the full Executive not only endorsed the concept but expanded upon it, applied it to both Trap and Skeet and called it AA Elite.

Gaining Admittance

So in effect it has become a "premium" grade for competition shooting. However, unlike the other grades it is neither mandatory nor percentage based. It is simply a voluntary permanent upgrade. Once you meet the required criteria and reach a point where you believe that any further participation in lower grade shooting is not in either yours or the sports best interest, you simply submit an application to Head Office. The criteria for both Trap and Skeet is similar. First you need to be in AA grade already. Skeet shooters must also accumulate 50 or more Hall of Fame points. Trap shooters are eligible if they either accumulate 50 points or progress their handicap mark back to 25 metres.

In for the Long Run

Following this your name will be added to the

Elite Shooters Register which is maintained at the National Office and displayed on the ACTA website. Then at the first prestigious opportunity of your choice, you will be presented with a very tasteful polished silver AA Elite lapel badge. And the downside? The decision to submit an application for inclusion into the realm of AA Elite status involves a moral commitment to raising the integrity of our grading system. Therefore AA Elite is accessed through a one-way entrance. Once you choose to enter, there is really no way back out again. You consciously elect to set a good example and shoot in the highest grade and from the least advantageous handicap position for the balance of your career.

Opting Out

The only exception to this is a carefully worded escape clause that we expect will gather dust. It states "... until an application to be removed (from AA Elite) has been approved by the ACTA". Firstly I'm sure the Hall of Fame Committee would only approve such an application under extremely unusual and extenuating circumstances and secondly why would anyone apply anyway? Surely not age impairment! That's one of the main objectives of the exercise. To protect elderly Elite shooters from the embarrassment of a potential downgrade! Could you imagine someone like Ken Lowry accepting a prize in B grade no matter how old and doddery he may get? And personally? I went partially blind in my master eye some years ago and shot 27/100 at my first attempt with an "offset" sight. Following this someone suggested that eventually I might be competitive in C grade. I can't print most of the words here that my reply contained but I assured them that I'd shoot in my birthday suit before that came to pass! Many of you won't remember it, but I was a pretty handy shooter once. Please let me grow old with dignity!

Advantages

Admission into AA Elite has other advantages. For a start you will be issued with a new sticker for the front of your handicap book which will indicate your elite status. From that point on you will no longer be required to have your scores entered into your handicap book. This will then become optional and as most people are not expected to continue with it, this will certainly decrease the workload of the club, State and National handicappers. Your handicap book will in effect simply become a handy place to keep your annual membership sticker.

Nominating in AA Elite

However you will still need to **show your membership sticker when nominating** to prove that you are a financial member for the current year. But it can then be immediately returned to the safety of your shooting bag. However be mindful that some States are beginning to require proof of need for your Firearms Licence. So even if you don't want your scores entered, it probably wouldn't hurt to ask for your book to be dated and club stamped while they're scanning your barcode or checking your currency before returning it to you. A couple of other handy by-products of this system will be a reduction in the unnecessary stress, time and telephone and postage costs involved in reuniting absent minded shooters with their forgotten handicap books, along with eliminating the inconvenient necessity to issue duplicate handicap books to these people.

January's Trivia Question



November 1965 – Don Scowcroft has just shot 261 to be runner-up to Ron Hodges in the Monaro DB Championship at Berridale Gun Club, but can still smile for the camera. Now that's real class!

The largest collection of National Trap runners-up, without ever winning one belongs to Don Scowcroft from Newcastle in NSW who eventually amassed a grand total of eight. Although clearly the unluckiest shooter in ACTA history, he was also a master of consistency, accumulating Hall of Fame points every year for nine consecutive years between 1959 and 1967. He opened his account in 1957 with 10 points via success in the NSW Single Barrel Championship and continued adding to this for the next 13 years, fittingly closing his account in

1970 by winning the very same event. His total of 150 Hall of Fame points currently places him just outside the top ten NSW Trap shooters of all time as he is tied with John Maxwell and Tommy Turner for eleventh place.

Against the Odds

His heartbreak at the Nationals began in 1959 when he was runner-up in both the Champion of Champions and the Macintosh High Gun. And

as if to prove that lightning can strike twice in the same place, he did exactly the same thing the very next year in 1960, effectively doubling his runner-up tally. 1961 provided a State Double Barrel, but 1962 provided more disappointment at the Nationals with a runner-up in the Double Rise. More NSW State titles followed in 1963 and 64 with a Double Rise and another Double Barrel. In 1965 he travelled further afield winning the State Double Rise in Queensland, but found the New Zealand Nationals no kinder than his home variety when he finished second in their National Single Barrel. Undeterred he soldiered on at the Australian Nationals, but lady luck continued to look the other way. In 1966 he added an unprecedented third runner-up in the Champion of Champions event and finally closed his "nearly there" file in 1967 when he managed a second runner-up in the National Double Rise.

Maybe Forever

Although the Nationals provided a lot of disappointment for Don they also provided a tremendous amount of achievement. In 1967 at Southport in Queensland he was the first person ever to shoot 50 straight from the back mark of 27 yards and his participation in the Australian Macintosh Team was extraordinary. His first appearance was in 1955 and then in 1958 he began a run of nine appearances in ten years, missing only 1963 between then and 1967. Returning to National runner-ups, it's unlikely that this unenviable record of "8 and 0" will ever be eclipsed, as in the entire history of the ACTA the next closest person is Steve Guest from Leeton with "4 and 0" on his resume. And I'm pretty sure that Steve will put a Silver Australia Badge on his jacket before he betters that mark, as he has also been a very consistent shooter over a long period. He has accumulated Hall of Fame points every decade since the 1980s and has seven appearances in the Macintosh Team. He's due for a change of luck! 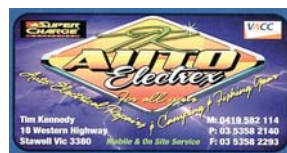

Dear Sir,

I note that the President of our association has in the January 2016 edition of the journal, noted that there have been no letters to the editor.

I would like to contribute the following for possible inclusion.

We are moving forward with a new constitution and formally setting the association on the path to the future. This I applaud. We should recognise that times are changing and we should become more accountable and also protect the interests of our members. With that in mind I would like to ask the following:-

Do members expect that, as a forward thinking association, we should expect that clubs would and should abide by the rules governing our sport? That being the case in the affirmative, then why is it that I continually visit clubs that not only set illegal targets, but

do not provide equipment that is maintained or capable of throwing such targets? How many times have I heard shooters say "up a bit" when the rules clearly say what the target setting should be?

If I were, for instance, a grade player in rugby league, would it not be the case that where ever I play, the rules of the league would follow? Should I expect, as that player, to visit grounds that favour left hand placed (not legal) goal posts, because the goal setter favours them himself? Or, in our case, visit clubs that throw high targets (as is the case the most Australian clubs)? I think not. So why should we, as shooters, expect that to be the case?

For us to move forward then member clubs should, as part of their charter to be members of our association, be not only obliged, but required to attend to this matter urgently. I love this sport, so much in fact, that I have attempted to change thinking in clubs and have taken the necessary steps to be trained by a trap manufacturer, at my cost. This has lead to a gathering of knowledge, not only from the manufacturer I learned from, but from experience and travel throughout this country we call our own. I now feel more than competent on any brand of equipment and have proven this to be the case many times. Then I ask why is this shunned? Why do clubs not take advantage of higher scores, more members, when I believe that this would be surely the case.

For me, given the experience I have gathered and the number of clubs I have visited, also the large number of clubs taking advantage in the investment of knowledge, gives me the right to place my thoughts on this page. We must, as a matter of urgency, correct this discrepancy.

I have travelled to world title matches in many countries to date. Aussies (your members) have proven us capable and winners on many occasions. If we were to practice, at all clubs, on legal targets, I feel that confidence would improve and results such as No1, No2, No3 in the world at a title competition, is not without possibility?? Would you be proud of that?

Personally I have given up. I still enjoy my sport, your sport, but I also feel that it has lost direction. Maybe, after the changes now being put in place, this may change? Do you want it to change?

RAY PEATLING APPOINTED NATIONAL HANDICAPPER

Victorian Handicapper and long time handicapper at the ACTA Trap Nationals, Ray Peatling, has been appointed as the National Handicapper for the ACTA.

Ray's experience as a shooter, handicapper and administrator makes him ideal for the role and includes continuing to oversee the National Championship events as well as being the point of call for States in regard to handicapping.

The process for Clubs is still through your Zone, then State.

Ray is already working on a handicapping guide to assist handicappers at all levels of the sport.

NEW CONSTITUTION FOR ACTA

The major Changes proposed for the 2016 AGM are explained below.

The full executive Committee in June 2015 agreed unanimously to move to a company limited by guarantee. The Board and the Executive Officer were given the role of compiling a new constitution in line with best practice for modern Sporting organisations.

The changes proposed are for the benefit of the ACTA as a National Organisation. The requirement of the incorporations act is that notices of motion along with the agenda and annual report are sent to clubs 21 days prior to the AGM. The ACTA have put these changes out for public scrutiny three months before the AGM. We are giving members the opportunity where required to ask questions to clarify areas of the constitution they are not familiar with. There are very few changes to the current constitution and none that affect any individual club.

The ACTA membership has many highly qualified members in a myriad of fields, the opportunity to have a performance based Board has been discussed for over 20 years, the Association is now in a position to move to this "professional" model. Within the membership we have the quality and diversity to fulfil the vision of having a "professional" Board. By

selecting those through our membership base we can achieve the best of both worlds so to speak. Having members experienced in the sport as well as having business acumen would allow the Board to select the best possible people for the co-opted positions. Specific expertise in the area of marketing and sponsorship are one and legal and accounting are two other mandatory positions that would need to be filled.

The setup of the Board will be structured in the same way as many other national Sporting Organisations, the membership (States) elect the board and the Board then elect the President and office bearers. These members then have the power to co-opt members to the Board.

Nominations would be directed to a Nominations committee who would "rate" the applicants on what they bring to the Association. A needs analysis of the ACTA would form part of the structure in the nomination process (what we are looking for in terms of experience). The nominations committee however do NOT select or reduce the number of candidates. That is done at the AGM.

The major items changed in simple terms include.

1. Clubs nominated ACTA members directly to their State for the ACTA Board.
2. The State can nominate four of those received to the Nominations committee
3. States vote at the AGM (usually on the acceptance of the Annual Report and for nominated Board members)
4. The Board elect their President, Vice President etc as they do now.
5. The Board can select up to three "appointed" directors
6. Clubs can still place items on the National agenda, through their State.
7. The State are invited to attend the annual Directors "forum" in June.
8. States have a direct line to the Board for agenda items through the Executive Officer.

There are other minor changes that are reflective of the new constitutional requirements by moving to a company limited by guarantee.

<p>Office Holders' and Directors' Duties and Liabilities <i>Similar standards for office holders and directors</i></p> <p>Office holders of incorporated associations are subject to equitable and common law duties. (e) The reporting requirements for incorporated associations vary depending on the association's total revenue for the financial year. Under the Corporations Act companies limited by guarantee are subject to the disclosure requirements that apply to public companies. The Australian Sports Commission's *Mandatory Sports Governance Principles* (March 2013) states:

The Corporations Act provides for a very robust and structured platform for the operation of organisations and provides clarity in areas silent within the Association Incorporation Act (particularly in the context of internal management and corporate governance). In addition, changes to the Corporations Act in 2010 have created a system of tiers based on revenue. For National Sports Organisations that fall within the lower tiers, the reporting requirements have been made less onerous than they were previously.

For these reasons, the Australian Sports Commission recommends that National Sports Organisations should be companies limited by guarantee.
