He has now completed the first double in ICTSF history having won the World Junior DTL Championship in Wales in 2012. This win was the last in a series of top level finishes by the Australians. The team competition was a highlight with Australia winning overall in the Ladies, Juniors, Veterans, and taking a second in the Super Veterans teams events. Unfortunately the Open team never placed.

Daryl Stevens took out the Veterans Overall, Michael Veenstra I st in AA and Laura Woolley took out the Ladies Overall and a second in the Juniors. Tracey Barton took out second in the Ladies. Other Australians were also successful in the European Championships leading up to the World. A great achievement for Australia. The Australian contingent of Team and Individuals entries totalled 45 and it is pleasing to say that how they conducted themselves, presented themselves and performed made us all feel very proud to be Australians. Many have made great new friends, renewed old acquaintances, and experienced the great Irish hospitality, which is up there with the best. All of this harks well for the 2018 event to be held at Wagga Wagga.

# Shooting Australia

The situation at the moment created by the SA strategy to openly criticise ACTA actions may have significant impact on our ongoing relationship. I feel confident that we all know what our membership expects, and what our sport needs to again grow and thrive at the grass roots level in the Olympic Disciplines. SA do not appear to have a problem with setting policies that severely impact our domestic competition participation levels but then say that participation is ACTA responsibility, and therefore our problem. If we are being criticised for simply not agreeing with SA policies then our relationship does not have much of a future. Your full Executive is meeting in early August to consider our position. By the time this goes to print the situation will be clearer.

We must remember that through the States and with the support of the clubs with ISSF facilities the ACTA has and will continue to control ISSF shooting in Australia. These disciplines in Australia belong to our members, and should be controlled domestically by your Association. Regardless of the outcome, it is now more essential than ever for all members, clubs and States to unite behind your Executive so we are unified going forward.

# Government Grant – VCTA

Great news from the VCTA that their application to the Victorian Government to further develop facilities at Echuca has been successful. We understand the amount to be over \$700,000 so expect some great facilities to be developed at the grounds. The application by VCTA was fully supported by the ACTA with a loan of \$200,000 to assist in meeting the applications requirements.

# Consultations - SSAA

A second meeting with SSAA National President Geoff Jones and Past President Bob Green has taken place. ACTA was represented by myself and EO Tony Turner. Items discussed included membership, insurance, and common ideologies. With the SSAA national membership of 180,000 we see it as a high priority to continue dialogue with them. Further meetings with both F&G Australia and F&G Federation are also planned. We are attempting to closer align the bodies with shotgun disciplines as there are many common interests and opportunities to explore.

The full National Team for the Olympic Games grace the cover of the magazine, a fitting tribute to those selected. We hope to be able to provide front page coverage of medallists in the next edition.

Meetings of the National Executive over the next six to nine months will be very important in setting the course for the future of the Association. There are numerous threats and challenges that face the Association in the future. We are expecting to hear from the Federal Government in relation to the National Firearms Agreement (NFA) and any proposed changes to come from meetings conducted in 2014-2015. The ACTA will oppose any further restrictions on licensed gun owners and oppose any reclassification of firearms. We will continue to meet with other Shooting Associations to discuss issues of commonality including the NFA during the rest of 2016.

The Association has received a funding grant to develop a Business Case Study to support our application to the NSW Sports Minister for funding of the proposed Clubhouse and National Office on the National Ground in Wagga Wagga. I met with the NSW Sports Minister Mr. Stuart Ayres and the member for Wagga Wagga Mr. Daryl Maguire on the ground on Friday 15th July where we provided the minister with a tour of the facility and explained the overall plans we had for the complex. The Business Case Study will detail economic benefits to Wagga Wagga and New South Wales based on previous events as well as upcoming and potential events.

The proposal includes the establishment of three ISSF Traps and upgrading of infrastructure to support the development including roads, paths, and landscaping of the ground. This would ensure the National Ground is of international standard, therefore being in a position to attract further international standard competitions.

The scope of the study will also provide a complete masterplan of the site required to support a National Sporting organisation in conducting Club, Zone, State, National and International events. When not in use the Association would also be in a position to

hire the venue as a function and conference centre.

The ground is a resource to further the objects of the National body, this development would provide the Association with a solid platform for further development of the sport throughout Australia.

I was asked early in 2013, why do the ACTA not have a "Lang Park", or "MCG", something to show the success of the Association and its members.

Hopefully this question will be answered with this development.

The Association is continuing to monitor the issue of lead deposits on grounds. The ACTA has a draft management plan for the National Ground, this plan could be made available to all clubs, however it is designed specifically for the National Ground. We have discussed the issue of lead management (as well as target and wads) with PCM Enviro Directors Paul and Craig Mitchell. The ACTA Executive will discuss the options and make recommendations at the next Executive meeting.

All clubs are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure they reclaim lead from their grounds and pick-up wads and targets. The onus is on clubs to ensure they are compliant with regulations of all descriptions.

Round three of the Premier Teams Event was held at the Melbourne Gun Club on a very cool wintery day the 4 of June, 134 shooters representing 23 teams and 5 Junior teams nominated for the day.

Event one the25 Target Handicap saw only two possibles, Kade Robertson and Gavin Boyd. It took a further eight targets to get a decision with Gavin the winner 33/33, he also collected a couple of metres, welcome to 25 metres Gavin. Kade was second 32/33. The shoot off for third was between six with 24's again the shoot off lasted eight targets with junior Luca Grapiglia 32/33 collecting the third prize. The junior Front Marker was Mason James 23/25 and the Back Marker was Chris Brown 31/33.

On completion of the Handicap the Morwell team had 110 to lead by one from Metro and Nepean on 109, Werribee Vic next closest on 107. In the Juniors Werribee Vic had 43 and all the other four had 44 just as even as it could have been.

The Double Barrel produced 26 possibles and these five squads were reduced to three after a further 30 targets. These three squads were then reduced to one final squad after another 30 targets. This consisted of Jeff Tonna, Roger Esplin and Paul Drennan. Jeff won Overall 137/137, Roger first in AA 136/137 with Paul second AA 119/120. A 1st C Bugter 72/73, A Tullio 64/65, B K Freiberg 37/38, J Bell 36/38, C M James 25/25, C Marshall 24/25.

The High Gun was a battle between the only two with 50/50 Kade Rob-

# NOORAT CASH BONANZA

In the past few years, the weather for our cash bonanza has been kind to us, providing us with lovely sunshine, no wind and perfect targets. Unfortunately, 2016 wasn't what it has been like in the past, with the weather gods teasing us with some magical sunshine in the morning only to change for the worse with bitter cold winds and misty rain blowing in throughout the day but still giving us some tiny bouts of sunshine to keep everyone positive.

This year we had over \$4500 in cold hard cash up for grabs, spread out over all the grades so even the C graders could go home feeling as if they had just won the lottery. A big thank you must go to the generosity of the sponsors, providing the club with extra cash across all events, as well as some fantastic trophies for the winners. Without the help from sponsors, running an event like this is very difficult financially, so the generosity of the sponsors is greatly appreciated!

Unfortunately, numbers weren't as high as we expected, the predicted weather most likely being the cause, but none the less, we welcomed 57 shooters to the club, with many travelling shooters from up to 5 hours away came to support our shoot which was fantastic. It was great to see many new faces that have never ventured to Noorat before as well as shooters that hadn't visit the grounds in many years.

The first event on the program was the Corangamite Water Transport 25tgt Handicap. With the weather rolling in at the start of the event, the possibility of anyone going clean was seeming less and less likely as only three 24/25s were on the board out of 8 squads. Finally, a young local gun shooter, Matt Molan came in with a 25/25 from 19m, and would end up being the only possible, crowing him the Handicap Champion for the second year in a row & taking home \$500! Since the event payed to 5th place, that meant that 10 shooters had to shoot off for one place, all on 23/25. After 11 targets Jim Moustos came out on top, shooting very well from 22m. The shootoff for 2nd to 4th lasted a little longer, with John Gardiner holding onto 2nd place after missing his first target in the event, ending up with 42/43, Steven Foster

3rd with 41/43 and Ethan Domney 4th with 32/34.

The second event was the W.A Molan & Sons 25tgt Double Barrel, 17 shooters shot the possible, with shooters clean across every grade. The shoot off lasted quite a while, even being put on hold so the Points Score event could be shot and completed in the afternoon. In the end, James Hayden & Steven Trembath both putting on a great display of skill, shooting very difficult targets in low light decided to split the winnings of \$500 at 200/200. Ryan Fratantaro shot very well & held on for as long as he could, shoot-

ing a personal best of 156/157 to take home 2nd place on his first visit to Noorat. Matt Molan yet again shot exceptionally well, shooting the only possible in A grade, while Ian Fratantaro won a shoot off for 2nd place with 36/37. The seasoned veteran Mick Rocca & a young Harry Clark fought out for 1st & 2nd in B grade, with at one stage, both missing the same target in the shoot off. Neither wanting to lose they pressed on but in the end Mick came out on top with 37/40 while Harry still managed 2nd place with 36/40. In C grade, Harrison Lee, shooting his first ACTA competition, managed to shoot a perfect 25/25 to win, while Tim Mahony claimed 2nd with 31/33.

The final event was the Western Ag Services 25tgt Points Score. Five possibles were shot, all in AA, surprisingly as the targets were getting harder as the afternoon progressed. The double barrel shoot off was put on hold so the event could be run before it became too late, allowing shooters to begin the long drive home at a reasonable time. The overall shoot off saw each shooter drop out one by one, but after a further 25 targets on the first barrel, James Hayden & Alan Pollock decided to split the winnings, both at 150/150. It was a great show of skill from James, shooting 150 in the double barrel, then shooting 50 targets straight on the first barrel to split the points event then going on to shoot another 50 targets to split the double barrel

event. James Blain shot 84/87 after a shoot off with Courtney Watt, all the way from Byron Bay, to take the win in A grade. Megan Trembath shot very well to claim 1st in B grade with 68/75, beating the gentleman Ian Dickins on 65/75 while Jovan Janevski shot 70/75 to beat John Gardiner on 69/75 in C grade.

At the end of the day, the Junior & Overall High Guns could be calculated. Matt Molan shot so well all day, to finish up only 3 points down to take the Junior High Gun & \$100 sponsored by Corangamite Water Transport. Matt narrowly missed out on the Overall High Gun by only I point, allowing Steve Trembath to fly in and take the \$250 kindly donated by Andrew Smith Contracting with a final score of 123/125.

Thank you to all the shooters that made the long trips to come and support our shoot. These kind of events are run for the shooters, and it is great to see people travel countless hours to come and support an event like this. We look forward to seeing you all again next year at the 2017 Cash Bonanza!

of success as they encroach on their final stages of preparation ahead of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio De Janeiro.

It was a privilege to have a true supporter of the Shooting Sports, and an active participant, Senator Bridget McKenzie, Nationals Senator for Victoria, in attendance as well as Sonya Kilkenny, State Member for Carrum.

The Team Members and Coach Valeriy Timolkin were all presented with a personalised photo album capturing their Shooting achievements over the years. Valeriy, together with Senator McKenzie and Sonya Kilkenny, also presented the Team with their Rio Olympic ID cards which was a great surprise.

Despite some of the challenges the sport has faced this year, one thing that cannot be discounted is the amazing ability the 8 Team Members possess. The ability to hit that 11 centimetre fluoro dome as it flies through the air at speeds of 85 to 100 kilometres per hour. Clay Target Shooting, not dissimilar to any other sport, can teach you about failure, joy, disappointment, excitement, winning and losing. About maturity, teamwork, humility and self-lessness. When the Team puts on their uniforms and walk out onto the Range in Rio in August, hopefully they will remember that the Clay Target shooting community is very proud to have them representing Australia and they are all there because they have what it takes!



The dust has well and truly settled on the 2016 National Trap Carnival and Darryn Nicholls has pinned another Doug Smith Medal onto his newly acquired green Hall of Fame jacket. So I decided it was time to frame this month's column with all the notable Trap shooting results from last year. Enjoy!

### Separation

Speaking of the Nationals, the "pointy end" of ACTA Trap and Skeet competition was combined at the National level for thirteen years. It spanned the era between 1970 when the first National Skeet Championship was held during the Nationals at the old Perth Gun Club and 1982 when the final combined Nationals were held in Brisbane. However this joint Carnival concept never existed in most States. The main reason for that is because State Clay Target Associations did not begin to form until the late 1970s, by which time there were already moves afoot to split the Nationals anyway, so starting State Carnivals off as separate entities was pretty much a walk up start.

## In the Beginning

As Skeet shooting had the strongest following in the South Eastern corner of the country back then, it's only natural that the first two Associations to kick off State Skeet Carnivals were NSW and Victoria, who started within a week of one another in October of 1977. Somewhat coincidentally Queensland and South Australia followed suit next by each conducting "prototype" events in 1980, followed by the "real deals" in 1981. The ACT held "State" Skeet Carnivals in the early 1980s but they sadly disappeared off the radar with the closure of the old Canberra Gun Club



overlooking the Queanbeyan racecourse.

### The Exception

Tasmania continued to hold "stand alone" events until 1990 when they took the plunge and held their first dedicated Skeet Carnival. Western Australia continued selecting their State Skeet Champion via lone 50 target events until the mid 2000s when an expansion exercise culminated in the first full blown Skeet Carnival in 2010 and they haven't looked back since. So this leaves just the Northern Territory, which is the only place where a "genuine" Combined Carnival has ever been held. Their State Championships have evolved over the years to now be five full days of competition with 500 targets encompassing equal amounts of Trap and Skeet.

# A Winter Paradise

And, in my opinion, this is the only place where such a concept continues to be the most viable long term option. The reasons for this are both internal and external. Internally you've got less shooters in total than some metropolitan Gun Clubs and they're spread out over an area six times the size of Victoria. And externally, without getting wet, you can't get much further away from the bulk of the shooting population in the rest of the country. So once you allow for the fact that the timing is within a stone's throw of the winter solstice, it's hard to think up a good reason not to come to NT in June each year.

## Getting Organised

It certainly works for me. I start planning it each year straight after Christmas. And so it was this year. Even though we left home at the start of April, by taking the long way around and stopping regularly along the way to smell the roses, we didn't arrive in Darwin until the first of June. lust in time to settle in and help Victor (the Godfather) and Nicky (the President) and the rest of their tireless committee put the finishing touches on the current renovation project at the Darwin Gun Club in preparation for the big event. The weather was still a little hot and sticky for the first couple of days, which kept the Skeet shooters looking for some shade, but then the dry season finally eased in and made the Trap shooters pretty comfortable.

### First the Skeet

A fairly healthy contingent of "southerners" probably doubled the Skeet attendance without overloading the facilities, which still allowed a timely finish each day. Shane Bennett and Mark Corbett got off to good starts by winning the 20 Gauge and the Handicap with 54/54 and 112/112 respectively. In the process Mark extended the NT Skeet Long Run Record from 98, where it had sat since 1995, to a new high of 125. However, the last day and a half was all about "the

## Two Great Losses

Unfortunately, I need to close off this month on a couple of sad notes. As many of you would by now be aware, the Skeet fraternity lost one of its great stalwarts recently. Neal lames Dimmick passed away early on Saturday July 2nd, which brought to a close a long and distinguished

career. How long? I don't know for sure but it exceeds 34 years because by the time of my first trip to the Queensland Skeet Carnival in 1982, he was already "one of the boys". And by 1988 his skills had progressed to the point where he was able to open his Hall of Fame points tally by winning the Queensland Skeet Championship.

# A Worthy Inductee

He continued adding to this total regularly over the next 11 years, eventually closing his account in 1999 with another win in the same event. Along the way he amassed a total of 150 points, which was more than enough to see him inducted into the Queensland Hall of Fame in 2015. Call it a biased opinion if you like, but I believe his greatest triumph occurred in 1996 at the Skeet Nationals when he won the Overall High Gun. And why do I think so? Because it was me he flogged in the shoot-off to claim this ultimate prize. RIP Grandpa!

## Under the Radar

Perhaps not so well known unfortunately was the passing away of Alex Crikis a couple of months earlier on Monday the 11th of April. Sadly Alex disappeared off the Skeet radar quite a few years ago due to personal and business responsibilities, along with some serious health issues over recent times. Thus it's a great shame that many of our current crop of Skeet shooters have not even heard of Alex, let alone had the opportunity to see him shoot. By the time I started to get serious about Skeet shooting in the late 1970s, he was already at the top of his game and was unquestionably amongst the top half dozen Skeet shooters in Australia at that time.

# Multi Skilled

Alex burst into the big time by winning the Victorian Skeet Championship in 1975 and then bounced back to successfully defend that title the following year. Then in 1978 he won the

Overall High Gun at the second Victorian Skeet Carnival. Shortly after this he devoted himself almost exclusively to Olympic Skeet, representing Australia numerous times over the next decade. I still remember the sadness he shared with Ian Hale with Australia's withdrawal from the 1980

Moscow Olympics left them both sitting around the Melbourne Gun Club watching the Opening Ceremony on TV and wondering "what if".

# Just when you thought . . .

However, during this period he would occasionally pop up at American Skeet events when the Olympic calendar was guiet. And whenever he did, he was always a force to be reckoned with. I remember him winning the Victorian Skeet Championship again in 1986 and the number of people with three of these can be counted on your fingers with enough left over to still play euchre. Plus he put his ISU skills to good effect at the Skeet Nationals in 1989 when he won the Doubles event. If I ever get around to publishing my memoirs, the life and times of Alex Crikis will fill a whole chapter. A wonderful character, a great champion and a tremendous competitor who always displayed those two great traits that we should all seek to emulate. Gracious in defeat and humble in victory. RIP Mr Tree Cat!

# Dealing with Trauma

This morning I was interviewed on the local ABC radio. This is not rare or new, I have been the resident psychologist for the local ABC Riverina for the past fifteen years. Last Friday the incident at Nice in France occurred. On the weekend was the failed coup in Turkey, The week before was the shooting of police in Dallas, Texas and before that the bombing at Ataturk Airport in Turkey. The

list of traumatic events over the past twelve moths is quite substantial and it is likely that by the time this article is published there will be others that will grab the interests of journalists all over the world.

The ABC presenter asked if I would talk about dealing with trauma and how we can support children and teenagers who may be scared or worried about what is happening. This would be an easy task as I several years as a "specialist Counsellor: Dealing with Trauma" with the NSW Department of Education. Schools are affected by trauma and the department has supported students and staff when school communities have been impacted by trauma.

According to the Australian Psychological Society, potentially traumatic events are powerful and upsetting incidents that intrude into daily life. They are usually defined as experiences which are life threatening, or where there is a significant threat to one's physical or psychological wellbeing.

The same event may have little impact on one person but cause severe distress in another individual. The impact that an event has may be related to the person's mental and physical health, level of available support at the time of the event, and past experience and coping skills.

Situations and events that can lead a person to experience psychological trauma include:

- Acts of violence such as an armed robbery, war or terrorism
- Natural disasters such as bushfire, earthquake or floods
- Interpersonal violence such as rape, child abuse, or suicide of a family member or friend
- · Involvement in a serious motor vehicle or workplace accident.

Other less severe but still stressful situations can also trigger traumatic reactions in some people.

Traumatic events have three factors that impact on our ability to cope.

*Firstly, they challenge our sense of justice.* This cannot be fair, why is this happening to me, how will my life ever be the same? Those of us watching the planes crash into the Twin Towers or the footage of the Nice attack, have a sense that it is not fair to the people experiencing the trauma as we know their lives will be impacted on forever.

Secondly, the events expose our own vulnerability. When we see death and dying all around us, and the media is very good at portraying what has happened, we are reminded that we are all mortal and that we will all die sometime.

Finally, the events are so out of the ordinary that they overwhelm us. It is what we talk to to our family and friends about and what we also freely talk to strangers about as well. This overwhelming events binds us all together.

After the events we experience a range of short-term psychological impacts. Again the Australian Psychological Society, tip sheet indicates that many people have strong emotional or physical reactions following experience of a traumatic event. For most, these reactions subside over a few days or weeks. For some, the symptoms may last longer and be more severe. This may be due to several factors such as the nature of the traumatic event, the level of available support, previous and current life stress, personality, and coping resources.

Symptoms of trauma can be described as physical, cognitive (thinking), behavioural (things we do) and emotional.

above are normal reactions to trauma. It must be realised that following our exposure to trauma, **the way we are acting, thinking and feeling is a natural response to an abnormal event**. Although these symptoms can be distressing, they will settle quickly in most people. They are part of the natural healing process of adjusting to a very powerful event, making some sense out of what happened, and putting it into perspective. With understanding and support from family, friends and colleagues the stress symptoms usually resolve more rapidly. We need to understand that what we are going through is similar to what most others are going through as well. Our feelings and thoughts need to be normalised, legitimised and validated.

As long as they are not too severe or last for too long, the symptoms described

Intrusive thoughts and memories of the event

Avoidance of places or activities that are reminders of the event

There are several things you can do to look after yourself and promote recovery from a traumatic event or situation. The following points provide some general advice.

- Recognise that you have been through a distressing experience and give yourself permission to experience some reaction to it. Don't be angry with yourself for being upset.
- Remind yourself that you are not abnormal and that you can and are coping.
- Avoid overuse of alcohol or other drugs to cope.
- Avoid making any major decisions or big life changes.

- Do not try to block out thoughts of what has happened. Gradually confronting what has happened will assist in coming to terms with the traumatic experience.
- Don't 'bottle up' your feelings share your experiences with others when opportunities arise. This may feel uncomfortable at times, but talking to understanding people that you trust is helpful in dealing with trauma.
- Try to maintain a normal routine. Keep busy and structure your day.
- Make sure you do not unnecessarily avoid certain activities or places.
- Allow yourself time to rest if you are feeling tired, and remember that regular exercise is important.
- Let your friends and family know of your needs. Help them to help you by letting them know when you are tired, need time out, or need a chance to talk or just be with someone.
- Make time to practise relaxation. You can use a formal technique such as
  progressive muscle relaxation, or just make time to absorb yourself in a relaxing
  activity such as gardening or listening to music. This will help your body and
  nervous system to settle and readjust.
- If the trauma that you experience stirs up other memories or feelings from a
  past unrelated stressful occurrence, or even childhood experiences, try not to
  let the memories all blur together. Keep the memories separate and deal with
  them separately.
- Express your feelings as they arise. Whether you discuss them with someone else or write them down in a diary, expressing feelings in some way often helps the healing process.

#### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY WACTA STATE TRAP CARNIVAL

#### GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the State Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 2. Shooters will be NOT be pre squadded at WACTA run State Carnivals. Pre nominations are for the sole purpose of competitor numbers and monetary advantage to the competitors. Competitors providing 24hrs notice of inability to attend will be provided a full refund.
- 3. A strict Nomination cutoff time will be imposed at each WACTA run State Carnival. These times will be advertised prior to each Carnival.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONETARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONETARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, and must be ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfill their responsibility will be penalized one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, if the replacement fails to fulfill their responsibility, the penalty of a LOSS OF ONETARGET shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits (\$20) must be lodged with the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 14. Any eligible competitor paying full nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open Section.
- 15. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun, before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nominations paid.
- 16. Nominations will close at the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director's Discretion.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the WACTA Executive Committee or the Tournament Director, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in the State of Western Australian.
- 20 Squads of five to shoot 50 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of five to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 21 Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program, including the number of targets shot, will not make the shooter eligible for any refund.
- 22 Shooters should be aware that any photographs taken by the WACTA "official" photographer may be submitted and displayed on the WACTA website. If shooters DO NOT want photographs of themselves or their minors on the WACTA website they are to inform the office before the end of the last day of events.





During his 40 or 50 odd years of shooting in C & B grades everything comes together over a 6 month period, he gains his first break badges, jumps up quickly through the grades to AA due to some long shoot-offs and now the lowest he can go is A grade. With approaching years, the joints ache, the sight fades and the reflexes are slowing. He now shoots average to poor C grade scores but the new stupid grading system locks him into A grade. He is not super competitive but used to enjoy going to shoots with the knowledge he may have some chance to win something. Now he knows he has no chance of being competitive against A grade shooters and is wasting his time & money. Very soon this once 'supporter of small clubs' will be so annoyed with the system he will say good bye to the clay target sport and spend his money in another shooting discipline. By the way, this is not a fictitious story, I know this person.

The grading system was introduced so shooters of similar ability could compete with each other but this is now a thing of the past. The sport is not attracting many young shooters so the older shooters are the life blood of the sport. Why have our rule makers decided to push the older shooters out by making the sport less attractive for them? if the older shooter is discriminated against they will leave and make it more attractive for the younger generation. All they will do is bankrupt the smaller clubs and make larger clubs smaller.

#### EDITORS REPLY

The Rule you are referring to, namely 2.01 (i) was specifically re-introduced into our rule book this year, hopefully to essentially assist the shooter who you mention in your letter and others who are in a similar situation.

My electronic records at hand only go back to 2006, but up to and including 2008, the rule where you could only be downgraded AA to A and A to B was certainly in place. This portion of the rule was removed in the 2009 edition of the Rule book with the aim of more easily adjusting the grading of shooters who found themselves in similar circumstances to those you describe. Unfortunately not only did it let genuine shooters transverse back to lower grades it also assisted some of the not so genuine competitors to move back to B and C grade and shall we say, grade-rob.

At the National Rules Supervisors' meeting in 2015, it had become quite evident that we needed to re-introduce the rule, with several States asking for its re-introduction. The decision was unanimous.

To enable the genuine disadvantaged shooter to move back to a lower grade, Rule 2.4(g) should be applied.

#### 2.04 ADJUSTMENTS

(g) Club Management, Rule Supervisors, State or Zone Handicappers or a member of the ACTA Executive Committee have the right to re-handicap or re-grade any obviously underhandicapped or over-handicapped, under-graded or over-graded shooter immediately. The Association is to be notified within 14 days with the reason given on a handicap return form.

Any genuinely disadvantaged shooter can move outside the general downgrading rule, they simply need to see any of the authorities listed in the Rule 2.4(g) above.

You should also note that the date for "Highest Grade Achieved" has been re-set as January 1 st 2016. This was established so that overzealous club handicappers who remembered someone, perhaps in the position of the person you describe, having at one time been in AA or A grade and applying the rule.

# 34th Anniversary for Monarto

#### Monarto Clay Target Club March 18 – 20, 2016

I can't remember a time over the past 34 years when our club hasn't been ready for a major shoot. Club members had worked feverishly over the past three months, insulating and then finishing off the lining of the clubhouse in preparation for our 3-day Anniversary shoot.

The traps had recently been fully serviced, clubhouse finished, and grounds well-manicured; we were certainly ready for a big weekend. Even the humid Darwin-type weather over the past week had gone, and the forecast for the weekend was set out as three brilliant days of perfect shooting conditions around 26°C. Someone, it seemed, was smiling down on us, or so we thought, until the weather changed and in came the gusty cold winds from the south, blowing into the faces of the shooters.

Chaos reigned, and President John (ready to tear what little hair he has on his head, out), trap mechanics and council members of SACTA who were present. tried in vain to nut out the problems. Questions were asked and comments were heard: "Is it the traps?" or "Is it a problem of a dodgy batch of clay targets?" NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


